THANKING THE LITTLE PEOPLE: Congratulations to all our **Country Chrome Lizard** winners. Thanks for all your votes, especially



Looking Back

With the holidays fast approaching and the year almost over, I feel myself looking back on the past 12 months. I vividly remember this time last year, when we were beginning to build our reporting panel, our relationships with Country radio and the record labels. Fast forward to March '95 when, after months of anticipation, there we were! Our debut issue arrived at CRS and the response was overwhelming. With Alan Jackson on our cover and our special interview with Alan and Arista president Tim DuBois, we hit the ground running.

I remember some of the highlights that make me realize how much I love this business and especially *our* Country music format.

The response and participation from the radio community has been nothing short of sensational. From Hot Picks and our new Country's Most Requested feature to special music reviews and commentaries, radio has expressed their excitement not only vocally but in their willingness and desire to share information. From day one, our goal has been to build relationships with radio. Not only have we done that, but we have made some real friends along the way. Personally, KZLA Los Angeles APD Cary Rolfe is not only a close friend, but he has helped me immensely in learning about research, music rotations and station operations. Two of the best examples of *Network 40's* impact were recent phone calls from WUSN Chicago PD Dean McNeil and KMPS Seattle MD Tony Thomas. They both admitted that although they were initially reluctant to report, they've become very impressed with the quality of the magazine. Calls like that make my job worthwhile and confirm that we are on the right track.

Then there's the music. To these ears, we had a stellar year. Some promising new acts have begun to develop. Jeff Carson, Terri Clark, Shania Twain and David Lee Murphy had #1 records that excited everyone. Wade Hayes has a voice that just won't quit and John Berry is amazing on the radio and in concert.

And what about all the shows this year? I was totally blown away by 4 runner at the Polydor showcase in Los Angeles last February. I've been excited about this band ever since that weekend and hope the future holds the success they deserve. I couldn't wait to hear more from Kim Richey after seeing her at CRS. She is so talented and just plain cool. My first Fan-Fair was a very hot (literally), but it was an eye opening revelation to see the passion of the fans for the artists and their music. What other format brings the artists so close to the people whose lives they affect? From Neal McCoy hanging from the rafters, singing "Beverly Hillbilly Rap," to Collin Raye rockin' the fans and the stage, that week was all about the music.

So what do we have to look forward to in '96? *Country Network* is excited and very proud to roll out our stand-alone insert beginning in January. We'll offer a fresh look and some new features including a Crunch Page to give you a concise yet comprehensive overview of the hottest records. In addition, we'll feature more cover interviews with artists, labels and the movers and shakers of radio. We are committed to being part of the Country community and in providing the most accurate, useful and fun-to-read information.

As for the music, I was fortunate enough to be in Nashville recently and heard some of the upcoming new acts for next year. Get ready for some incredible music. Magnatone's Rich McCready is set to hit with a thunderous first single, "Hangin' On." Career's Denise Nichols previewed some of Tammy Graham's upcoming cuts—this girl can sing. Epic just had their showcases for Stephanie Bentley and James Bonamy and have given their staff two great projects to break next year. MCG's Smokin' Armadillos have completed part of their Roadkill Radio Tour and the buzz is huge. That's just a glimpse of the great music we're going to be hearing.

Granted, the Country music *business* has to deal with pressing issues in 1996, but let's remember why most of us are working here. We have the best music, created by the most talented artists and songwriters. After all the stuff that goes into our daily lives, from remotes and dealing with GMs to jumping on and off planes to work records, it really boils down to one thing.
