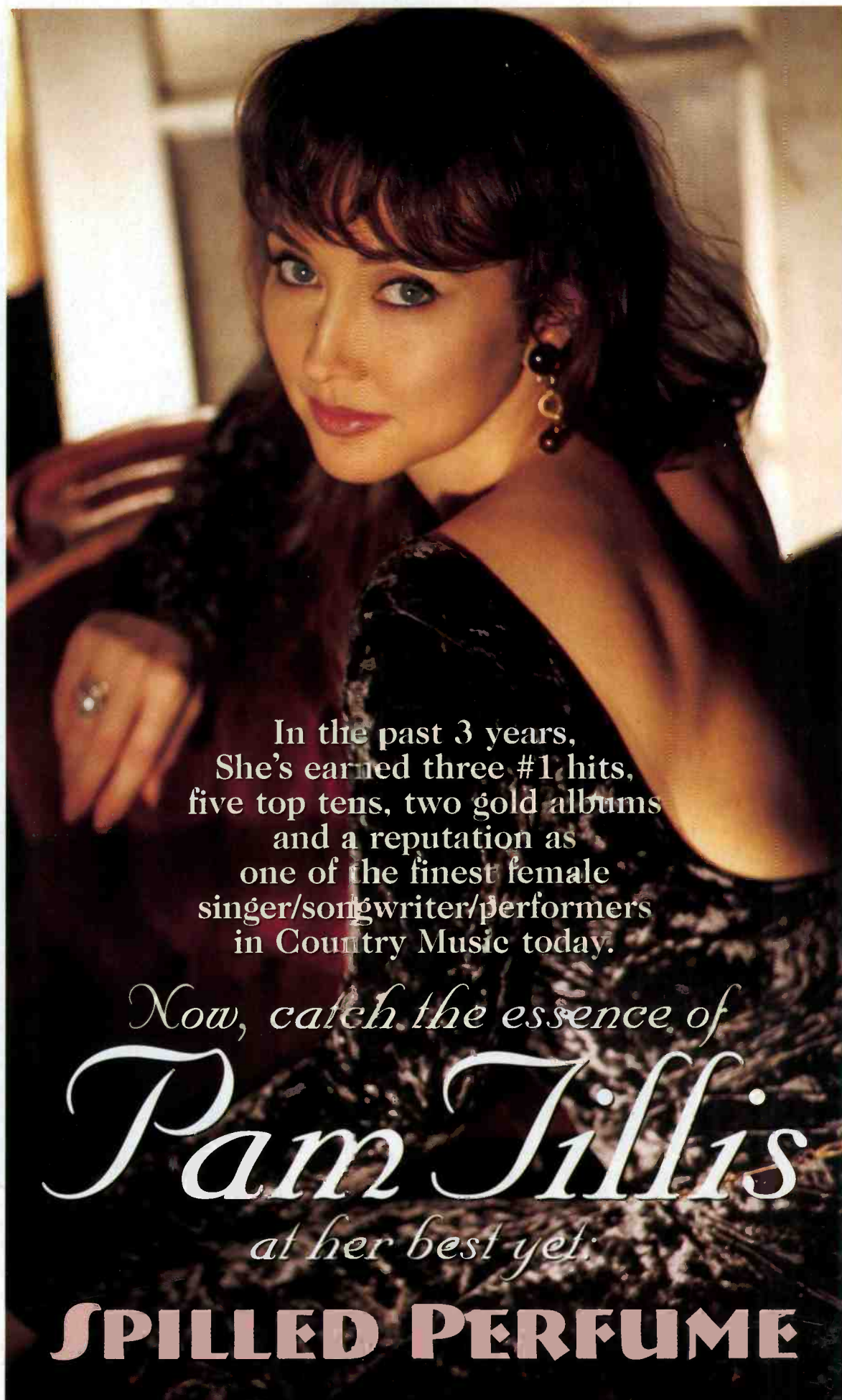

# High-Frequency Romance

'New Faces' Stars Recall Their First Blushes With Radio's Buzz

As we head into CRS '94, country radio is healthier and drawing more new listeners than ever before. Obviously, the main attraction for these new fans is the music. The term "country music" means a lot more things to a lot more people here in the '90s. Over the past several years, country radio has grown up and out, wisely opening its arms and welcoming those refugees from other formats who are tired of computer-generated beats and who long for lyrics and music that speak to their everyday lives.

The up-and-coming artists you'll see and hear at CRS this year clearly reflect country's new diversity. Everyone at the seminar, from performers to record company executives to program directors, grew up on radio and was impacted by what they heard. Let's face it, it changed our lives.

We asked the performers on the bill of this year's New Faces showcase to share with us some of their early memories of radio. What we found was that, like lots of people working in country radio today, many of these artists came over from other formats, and, thankfully, what you hear on country radio today reflects their wide-ranging influences.

## JOHN BERRY

Growing up in Atlanta, Liberty's John Berry had plenty of country music around him, but it was the soulful sounds of bands like the Chi-Lites and the Stylistics that initially caught the youngster's ear.

"At that time, Gary McKee was the big DJ on WQXI in Atlanta," says Berry. "It was Top 40 like most kids listened to, and he was really funny. He was one of the guys where these Zoo crews came from, I think. He'd have Red Neckerson on, who went on to Y106 in Atlanta for a long time."

Listening to the country/soul voice on "Your Love Amazes Me," it's easy to hear how Berry's outside influences might have come from Top 40, but he's quick to point out where his heart really lies.

"I'm a country person," he says. "When everybody was accusing Dolly Parton of crossing over, she said that country is what you are in your heart. Well, country is what I am in my heart."

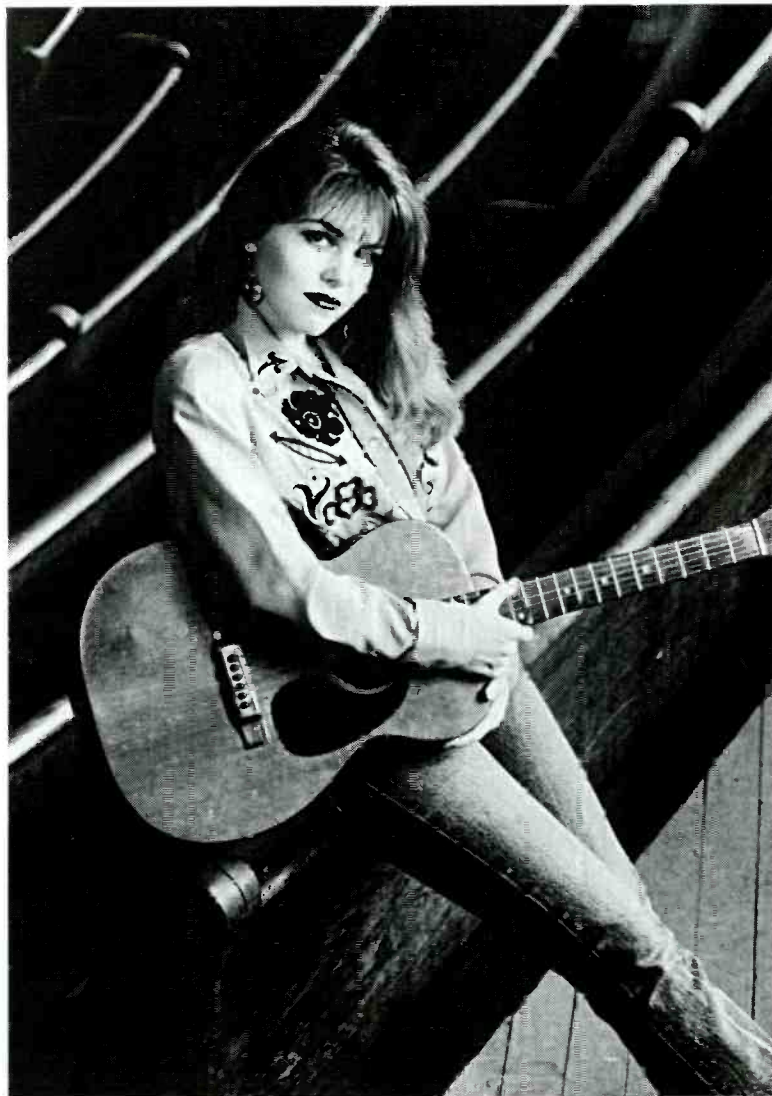

## JOY LYNN WHITE

With her rowdy red hair and feisty way with a song, it's not hard to believe that Epic's Joy Lynn White grew up rocking. Her home in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, was well within the range of Chicago's WLS, and the station was a constant in her life.

"I grew up listening to Dick Biondi," says White. "WLS was a very funny radio station. They had that Chicago sarcasm where everyone is a little bit like David Letterman. My big sister had a little radio that she carried everywhere, and I can remember WLS just cranking while we washed the dishes. The Jackson Five, Diana Ross, Tony DeFranco, Paul Revere and the Raiders—I knew all the words to everything, and it irritated the hell out of everybody that I'd never shut up."

It was on that same station that White heard the song that turned her musical life around. "I was in the car with my mom when I heard Linda Ronstadt sing 'Silver Threads

And Golden Needles,' " she recalls. "That song really changed my mind about country."

## TIM MCGRAW

Maybe it's his Louisiana upbringing, but, from the very start, Cur's Tim McGraw has been steeped in country music. Even after all these years, and with hits like "Welcome To The Club," "Memory Lane" and "Indian Outlaw" under his belt, this young singer has no trouble remembering when he first got the bug.

"My earliest memory of radio is probably around the first grade," McGraw says. "I'd listen all the time driving in the car with my mom, and my stepdad drove an 18-wheeler, so I rode with him a lot listening to Merle Haggard, Charlie Pride, Charlie

Rich and stuff like that. I'd lay in bed at night with the AM radio, and it seemed like every night for a year there was this song playing by Johnnie Duncan and Janie Fricke, 'Come A Little Bit Closer.' It seems like it always came on just before I went to sleep, and I remember it plain as day."

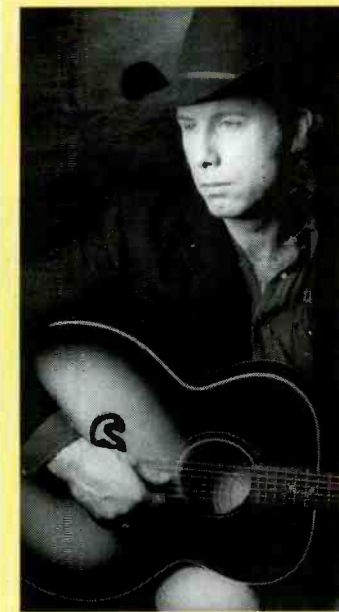
## TOBY KEITH

For the purposes of this showcase, he may be a new face, but you'd have a hard time finding anyone at CRS who doesn't recognize Toby Keith. The exciting new artists you'll see and hear on Showcase Stages around CRS this year are the heart and soul of country radio's future and the real reason we're all here. [While the Showcases lineup may be subject to late additions and cancellations, the following represents the complete roster of artists scheduled to appear as of presstime.]*



Bob Woodruff

In a business where an artist's image can sometimes overpower his or her music, Bob Woodruff is a welcome double shot of what-you-see-is-what-you-get reality. And, from the first moment you hear his music, you'll realize that this young singer/songwriter's uncluttered, straight-ahead approach makes total sense. The best way to put across concise, hard-hitting lyrics like these is with whiskey-soaked, guitar-fueled honky-tonk music, and that's exactly what Woodruff has

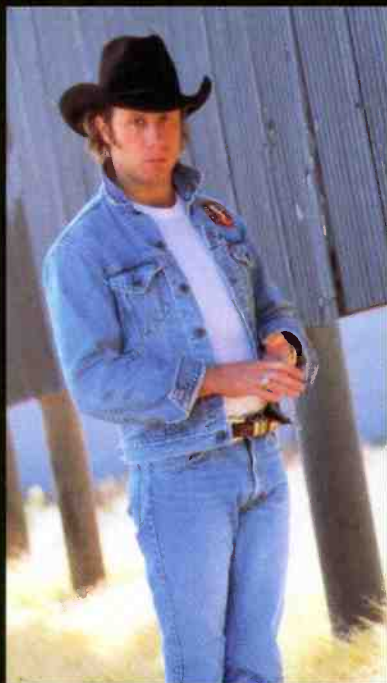

already influencing countless young radio listeners with his music. Growing up in Moore, Oklahoma, Keith was as much a slave to the radio as the rest of us, but, perhaps surprisingly, his most vivid memory comes not from any particular song or station, but from his personal contact with radio people.

"In 1984, a local DJ named Steve Rich at KEBC in Oklahoma City took me to an Eddy Raven concert," Keith says. "I got a chance to meet him and get some insight into the music business."

## FAITH HILL

Faith Hill broke into country radio last year like a ray of sunshine. "Wild One," the singer's debut single, went on to sit at the top of Billboard's Hot Country Singles & Tracks chart for four consecutive weeks. That's the first time any female artist has done that since Connie Smith's "Once A Day" held the No. 1

II.' I still have it. That was my first big influence, and it came from radio."

## BROTHER PHELPS

As key members of the Kentucky Headhunters, Rickie Lee and Doug Phelps helped light a fire under country music and kicked down doors at radio for such rowdy rocking outfits as Confederate Railroad and Hank

Flamingo. As Brother Phelps, with songs like "Let Go" and "Were You Really Livin'," this duo is getting back to what they love best: hardcore country music with a sweet acoustic edge. Rickie Lee Phelps' most vivid memory of radio doesn't relate to any song or DJ or station, but to the radio itself.

"My family had this huge antique radio that had all these bands so you could get ships at sea and stuff like that," he says. "When I was a kid, I'd sit in front of it for hours and listen to songs and sing along with 'em. We listened to the Grand Ol' Opry, and every morning during the week there was a local show called 'The Old Camp Meeting' that played gospel music for about an hour while people got ready to go to work. Rudy Plyant was the DJ there. I finally met him a few months ago after listening to him for years and years. He's a character."

## LARI WHITE

Between the records that always cluttered her family home, a radio that was always playing and the constant harmonies of her gospel-singing family, RCA's Lari White can't remember where the music was coming from at any particular time. It was just always *there*. On her way to Nashville, White sang everything from Top 40 to jazz to a Spanish-language Toyota commercial. With "Lead Me Not," her debut album, White proves that it's possible to incorporate even these disparate influences and

spot for eight weeks in 1964. With this kind of momentum and talent, Hill is sure to break a lot of records before she's through, but she heard the record that changed her life while sitting by the radio back in Star, Mississippi. "Radio made me go out and buy my first album, and that was Elvis," Hill says. "I was probably 7 or 8 years old, and I was in love with this man. I asked my mom and dad to please buy me a record by this guy, and they went out and bought me 'A Legendary Performer, Vol.

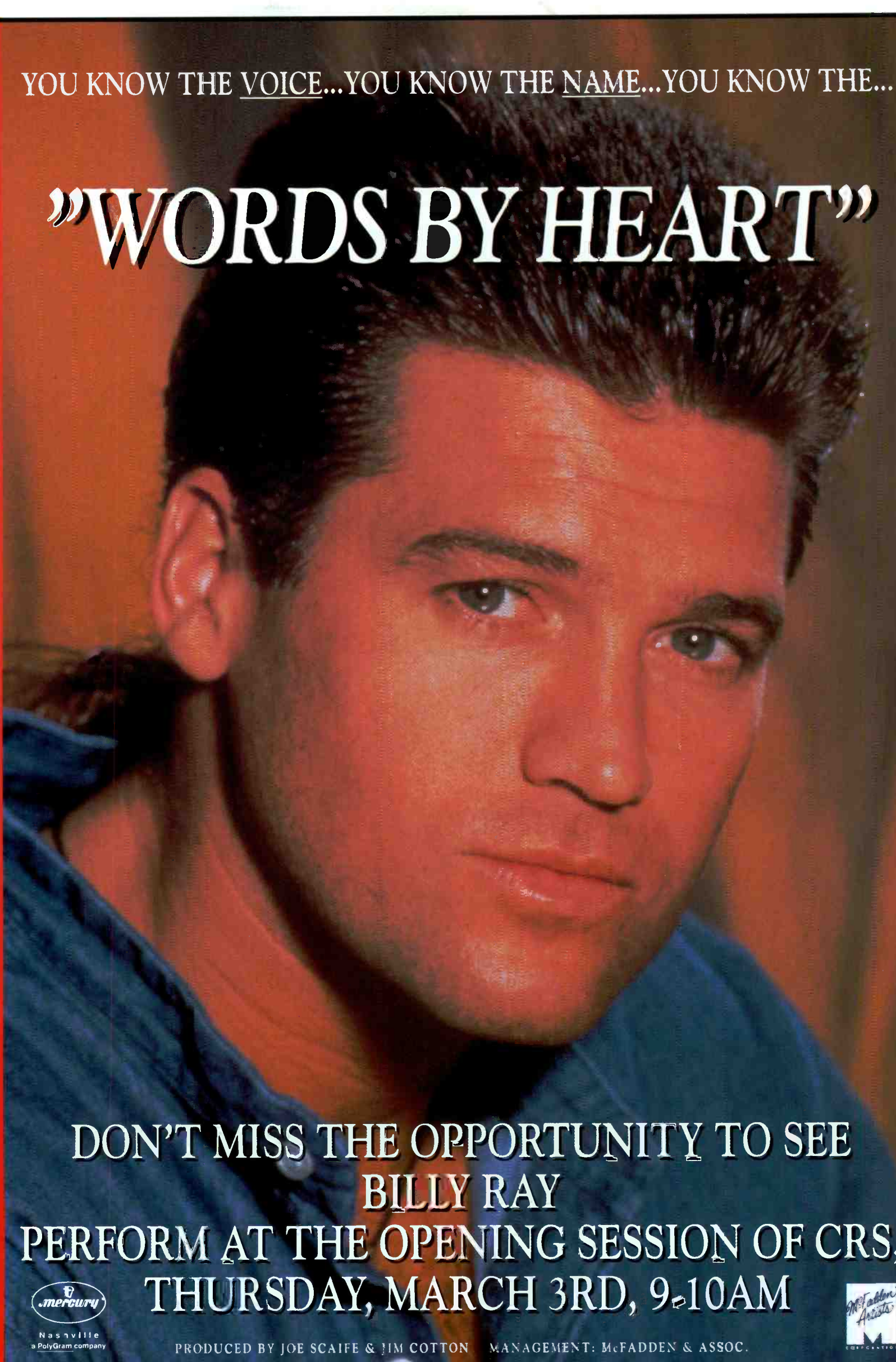

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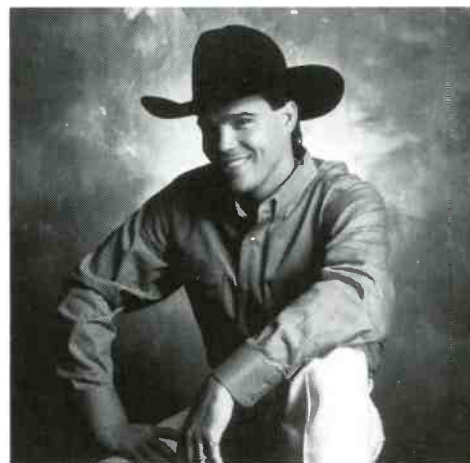

come out sounding country to the bone. The thread that ties her songs together is the raw emotion that White brings to everything she sings, and that's what she remembers most about the radio.

"All I remember is that the radio always seemed to be on—around the house or in the car with my family or wherever," she says. "And I always connect it with the big events in my life. Like having my heart broken or something terrible happening or something really great happening. For me, there's almost always music attached to those kinds of things."



Clay Walker

**CLAY WALKER**

They say good things come in threes, and Beaumont, Texas native Clay Walker's leap to the top of the country charts (following close behind his Beaumont buddies Mark Chesnutt and Tracy Byrd) is definitive proof of that theory. Comparisons to those hometown boys are inevitable, but, with solid radio hits like "What's It To You" and "Live Until I Die," Walker has carved a unique niche for himself among the glut of new country artists. As Walker was growing up in Beaumont, the radio became his teacher and led the youngster steadily to his destination at the top of the country charts.

"Radio really shaped me as far as my writing and my emotions," Walker declares. "It allowed me to be a sensitive kind of listener. There were two formats, the easy listening kind of stuff, which was 108. Now that station is K106, but back then they played Lionel Richie, Boston, Peter Cetera and Chicago. I really dug that stuff. My father was a hardcore country fan, and we'd listen to KAYD and KYKR constantly. I paid attention to the lyrics, and I learned a lot about life through radio."

**DOUG SUPERNAW**

Doug Supernaw is not a shy, retiring kind of guy—onstage or off. He knows what he wants and he speaks his mind. And when he wraps his dusty Texas voice around a country lyric, by God, you're gonna believe it. True to form, BNA's honky-tonk hero didn't hesitate when we asked about his early days beside the radio. With his "I Don't Call Him Daddy" just coming off its run at the top of the charts, it's ironic that Supernaw's first favorite song had a similar theme.

"I remember very clearly my first memory of radio, he says. "We had one of those stereos that was about as big as a refrigerator. I think it was tuned to KILT, 610 AM in Houston, but I know it was "Don't Cry Daddy" by Elvis Presley. This stereo had one of those little red lights on it. When I was just a little bitty kid,



The Gibson Miller Band

**THE GIBSON MILLER BAND**

The Gibson Miller Band has had a hell of a year burning up the road in support of a rocking debut album that's still yielding hit singles. Country music hasn't been the same since the pure country songcraft of Dave Gibson collided head-on with the forged-in-steel Detroit muscle of Blue Miller's guitar, and Gibson Miller's sophomore release promises to be one of the big records of '94. For guitarist Miller, stardom and the radio have always been inseparable.

"There were two stations that I listened to," Miller remembers. "One was WKNR in Detroit and the other was CKLW, which was actually in Windsor, Ontario, right across the river. Those were the two that I grew up on. The first DJ that I can remember relating to was a guy named Tom Shannon at CKLW. During the summertime, he'd host these big outdoor concerts up there. When my first band played there, we thought we'd made it, because we were there with Tom Shannon from CKLW."

been playing since his days in the dingy bars of Manhattan's Lower East Side. Even in a writer's town like Nashville, the songs on Woodruff's Asylum debut, "Dreams And Saturday Nights," stand out, and his live showcase here at CRS is a must-see.



### Ken Mellons

Some folks might call Ken Mellons a "baby act," and, in the case of this gifted young singer, that's a lot more accurate than they might think. Mellons has literally been singing country music since he was barely able to walk. To the puzzlement of his rock 'n' rolling classmates, Mellons was obsessed with country music even as a schoolkid in Nashville. And growing up in Music City gave the young fan plenty of chances to feed his habit. Frequent trips with his dad to the Grand Ol' Opry inspired Mellons to perform his own little Opry shows for his parents at home before he was out of nursery school, and all that studying has paid off. Mellons possesses one of those rare voices that cuts like a knife through a country lyric, and he's easily one of the brightest lights on today's honky-tonk horizon.



### Rick Trevino

Rick Trevino is one country singer who gives new meaning to the word "roots." Utilizing a gift that was evident from a very early age, Trevino has taken a musical path that's led him from childhood piano lessons deep into Texas honky-tonk tradition and finally back to his Tex Mex, or Tejano, beginnings. Growing up in the suburbs of Austin, Trevino fell under the spell of that city's blues-inflected honky-tonk sound. At the

same time, with his father playing professionally on the Tejano circuit, the youngster felt the pull of the Mexican-American culture so dear to his parents. With his eponymous Columbia debut and its Spanish-language counterpart, Trevino has successfully bridged the two cultures and has begun to forge his own uniquely exciting brand of country music.



### BlackHawk

When you think about all the disparate elements that make up a great country record, it's no wonder that a big hit is such an elusive thing. But every once in a while a band comes along that seems to have everything in place *plus* that intangible something that separates the great from the merely good. In BlackHawk, Arista has found just such a band. Lead singer Henry Paul brings the edge and urgency of his years with the Outlaws, a band that helped define the term "Southern rock" back in the '70s. Van Stephenson and Dave Robbins round out this trio with songwriting credits that include some of Restless Heart's greatest hits. And when these guys put it all together, with cutting-edge songs and heavenly harmonies, BlackHawk soars above the pack.



### Jesse Hunter

It's no secret that to get to the top of the music-business mountain you've got to pay a lot of dues. On his way to a major label deal, Jesse Hunter paid more than most, but this young singer sees that as an advantage. Coming up country in the musical melting pot around Memphis, Hunter was forced to inject a fiery edge into everything he played just to compete with the rock 'n' roll and R&B acts all around him. He emerged from that trial-by-fire a better musician and a truly dynamic performer. Thankfully, Hunter has one of those impossibly big Southern voices that can stand up to night-after-night, honky-tonk abuse (his doctor refers to his vocal cords as "vocal cables"). Otherwise, the singer would never have survived the countless gigs that prepared him so well for the full vocal assault of "A Man Like Me," his BNA debut.

### Don Cox

It was a long road to Nashville for Don Cox. From the days when he would attend his grandfather's garage jam-sessions as a kid in Belhaven, North Carolina, this newcomer paid his dues on the country club circuit around Virginia and the Carolinas before finally attract-

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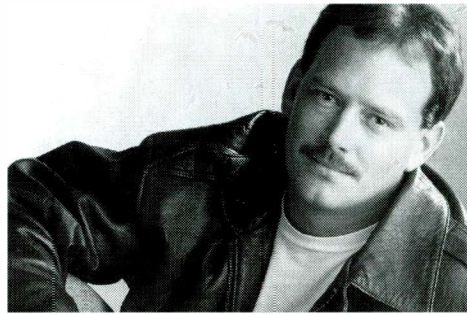

### David Lee Murphy

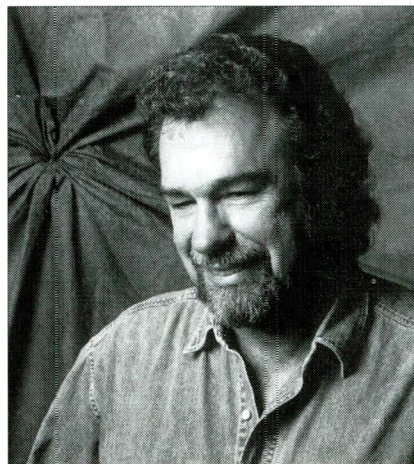

And, with a roster that includes Reba McEntire, Vince Gill, Marty Stuart and George Jones, an artist has to be pretty special to make the cut. For 1994, David Lee Murphy is that artist. Discovered and produced by Grammy-nominated producer (and MCA/Nashville president) Tony Brown, Murphy is a rare bird among the plethora of new acts coming out of Music City. To put it simply, he's the real thing. On his way to MCA, the singer worked stints as a lifeguard, country DJ, ditchdigger and construction worker. Today, Murphy is writing and playing the kind of workingman's country that transcends trends and time. Don't miss him.

ing the attention of Nashville's Step One Records. Those countless gigs helped Cox build up his chops and prepared him for his upcoming assault on country radio, and, although he's learned a lot about how to please an audience and how to get ahead in the jungle of the music business, this young singer's philosophy is still basically the same. When Cox talks about his music, words like "feel" and "heart" come up again and again. And when he hits the stage for his CRS showcase, he'll prove that these are more than mere words.



### David Ball

Seeing David Ball perform onstage is like climbing into a country-music time machine and rocketing backward and forward at the same time. A certain vocal turn may bring George or Hank or Lefty to mind, but Ball's is a decidedly forward-looking take on tradition. His songs, from "Thinkin' Problem" to "Look What Followed Me Home," are straight-on looks at the ups and downs of modern romance, and it's been ages since hardcore country tradition sounded this fresh and brand new. That tradition is at the base of everything Ball does, but, on his way to his major label deal with Warner Bros., this Carolina native spent time in Austin, where he fell in love with the Texas dancehall sounds of artists like Bob Wills and learned, as he puts it, "to put jalapeños in my coleslaw." If you're hungry for a taste of country music's future, don't miss this one.



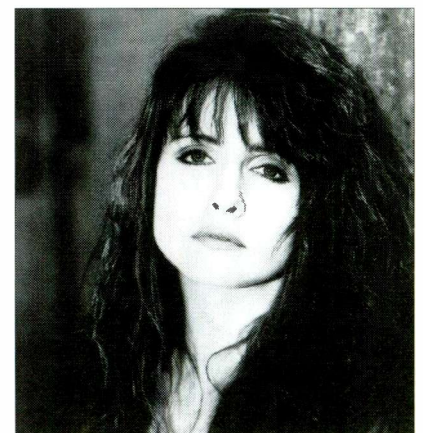
### Gene Watson

world by storm back in '84 with "Baby I Lied," and her artistic journey was just beginning. You'll have to wait until May for the anxiously awaited follow-up to "Delta Dreamland," Allen's stunning Giant debut. But in the meantime, you can catch this artist's unbeatable blend of hard country and Memphis soul live on the Showcase stage at CRS. Already well established in Music City as a songwriter, with "Delta Dreamland" Allen cemented her reputation as one of country music's most fiery singers and performers. And the best, as they say, is yet to come.



## Daron Norwood

Country music's boom has made for a crowded field of new artists and a smaller-than-ever bottleneck when it comes to getting airplay. But every now and then an artist appears who just breaks through the pack and can't be denied. With incredible energy and drive and an unforgettable vocal attack, Giant's Daron Norwood is one of those artists. This Lubbock, Texas, native has been on a steady course toward country stardom since his first performance, at age 2, with his Baptist Evangelist father. He just always *knew* what he wanted to do. "If It Wasn't For Her I Wouldn't Have You," his first single, is currently climbing the charts, and his go-for-broke performance will be one of the highlights of CRS.



## Davis Daniel

When Davis Daniel talks about his life in country music, he always refers to himself as

"fortunate."

But when this Mercury artist opens his mouth to sing, country music fans are the ones who feel lucky. If hard living is the education that informs a great country song, then Daniel has already earned his master's degree. Over the course of his nomadic childhood, Daniel and family lived everywhere from Chicago to Montana to Nebraska before finally landing in the Denver area. When his father died at age 42, Davis' mother was left to support the family's eight children all by herself. Despite the hard times, the youngster always found a way to smile, and then, when he was a teenager, he found Willie Nelson. Inspired by the venerable country music legend's expressive voice and heartfelt songs, Daniel got himself a guitar and dug in, unearthing the pure country voice and electrifying stage presence that will ignite onstage here at CRS.



## Kimber Clayton

Country music stardom is a big gamble, but, for Kimber Clayton, whose grandmother was a circus trapeze artist, taking chances is in the blood. Clayton was attending the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, when she got her first taste of performing, in a musical theater. It was that discipline that convinced the fledgling performer that she could go for her dream, and she was soon gravitating toward any country gig she could find. With a voice as striking as her mane of blonde hair, it wasn't long before the young singer found herself in a Nashville studio, recording her debut album for Curb, a record that showcases a fresh new force in country music's future.



## Jackson Claypool

It seems there are more than enough duos to go around in country music, but Jackson Claypool is something else altogether. The moniker is a composite of names from the family trees of band co-founders Ron John and Philip Claypool, but the pair is quick to point out that Jackson Claypool is more a band than a duo. The tightly knit ensemble playing between pedal-steel guitarist Leo LeBlanc and the rhythm section of bassist Hendric Ric and drummer Michael Lawrence are as integral a part of Jackson Claypool's cutting-edge country sound as the razor-sharp songwriting and singing of its frontman. Onstage and on record, it all comes together to form one of the most sizzling "duos" in country music memory. —P.C.
