### 6 A Decade Of Memories

Throughout 10 years of making music and nurturing the dance community, Underworld has survived being dropped from recording contracts and personnel changes that would have sidelined lesser acts — but the electric duo remains as meaningful as ever. To celebrate their 10th year in the business, Underworld's Karl Hyde and Rick Smith have released *1992–2002*, a historical retrospective of not only the group's own history, but also the development of the entire U.K. dance community. This week, Hyde takes CMJ back to the beginning.

It's amazing how many people will come see a show with the promise of half-naked girls."

DeVotchKa frontman Nick Urata is more than pleased that his band was recently able to consistently play before rather sizeable audiences on the road. And he's well aware that, while drawing folks in with your music is always commendable, it never hurts to have a little added incentive.

"This past summer, we toured as the house band for Burlesquefest, which was a traveling show made up of a couple of troops of burlesque dancers," Urata explains. "It was basically like playing an amazing opening slot for a large band, as we were able to play in thousand-seat rooms all around the country."

Meaning that, while some may have showed up for the girls, they were actually treated to something even more enchanting: DeVotchKa's incredibly creative spin on making music. The Denver-based band puts a slant on indie rock that allows it to veer from harmony-laden pop to cinematic orchestration without jarring the listener in the slightest. "Queen Of The Surface Streets," the lead single off the group's new album, *Una Volta*, is a lively, captivating, string-drenched affair — so captivating, in fact, that it has already been getting steady airplay from KCRW/Santa

Monica, CA's "Morning Becomes Eclectic," as well as from KVCU/Boulder, CO and KGNU/Boulder, CO. However, the song sits side-by-side with Latin and Eastern European-influenced tracks, as well as songs that would fit nicely on the soundtrack to any *Godfather* film or Spaghetti Western, with the main commonality being the diverse use of instrumentation.

"Everything is definitely under the blanket of a rock band, so I think maybe there is more of an edge or roughness that's prevalent in the songs that sound more like authentic tunes from other cultures," reflects Urata, who refers to DeVotchKa's music as "Eastern Bloc indie rock." "We've taken what we've heard through life and thrown it into this band without any real preconceptions as to what kind of a band we are, so I think the instrumentation lends itself to a lot of experimentation as far as our sound goes. We're able to orchestrate a lot of the pop songs better than some bands (with the same tiny budget), just because we have choices between tubas, violins, accordions, and more traditional rock instrumentation."

"We've all been exposed to a lot of film scores, as well as bands," adds multi-instrumentalist Tom Hagerman. "So, I think a lot of our influences come from such composers as



Ennio Morricone, the early scores of Danny Elfman and the music from the films of Jean Pierre Jeunet — not to mention all of the dead European composers. We've also been heavily influenced by Eastern European music and tango, from performers like Taraf De Haidouks and Astor Piazzolla."

Lest we forget the gypsy aspect of things, the band itself has actually followed in that tradition in more ways than just musically. Initially formed in Chicago by Urata and founding member Johnny Ellison, who bonded while busking, the group migrated to Colorado before coalescing. Only, after the recording of its first album, 2000's *SuperMelodrama*, the urge to move struck again — just not for everyone. "The entire band got struck by wanderlust and left Nick with an unreleased record," relays a suitably amused Hagerman.

Yet, while the faces have changed, DeVotchKa remains, better than before. As the ultimate in flexibility, one can't help but wonder if the group will still be around, even in the far-flung future. Chances are there's a crystal ball somewhere in its traveling tent that has the answer — but then, who wants to spoil the surprise?

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## CONNER

**The White Cube** (Lenore Adora)

Finding Conner's debut album, *The White Cube*, is a lot like digging through a box of dusty records and coming across a rare lost and forgotten garage band from the genre's early days. Despite the elements of nostalgia, however, the Lawrence, Kansas-based band sounds anything but prehistoric. Singer James Duff's warbled vocals bring to mind a young Ray Davies from days of the Kinks past, while Tom Wagner lends a talented hand, backing him up on both vocals and guitars; take "Easy" and back it with "Silent Film Score" and you've got prime single material here, on an album that, as a whole, never falters once. Meanwhile, the fact that it was recorded entirely in analog, using reel-to-reel tape, gives the disc a sound as fresh and crisp as a virgin LP, hot off the press and just out of its sleeve. The rock rejuvenators at work here are bound to make their mark in the current garage revival scene — especially as they add an approach to songwriting that's notably original; if anything, Conner is a trailblazer in the resurgence.

# A DECADE OF MEMORIES

After 10 years, **Underworld** still remains the most significant name in dance music.

**S**ince its inception in 1992, Underworld has meant more to the foundation of modern electronica and dance music than just about anything else. The act is cherished by a worldwide legion of diehard fans for creating some of the most unforgettable dance music and hosting standard-setting live shows. Underworld's recently released career document, 1992–2002 (V2), is a spectacular listen, working on an emotional level much as the feeling one gets when perusing a cherished photo album — wonderful memories drift back with each listen to its timeless songs. "This is beyond any dream that I could've had," says Karl Hyde, who helms the group with partner Rick Smith.

Starting off in the late-'70s and throughout the '80s, Hyde and Smith recorded and released records together in bands such as Screen Gemz and Freur before creating the first incarnation of Underworld. In those days, the group produced electronic music more in the vein of groups like Human League, Orchestral Manoeuvres and Depeche Mode — but with very little success. In fact, the band was dropped from a number of record deals, allowing for a great deal of downtime and music experimentation, which ultimately prompted Underworld to push its direction towards its present form.

"Throughout the '80s, whenever we got dropped from our record deals, we'd make this machine music that was based around grooves and human text, but we just didn't know where to go with it. We didn't know about the dance scene that was happening in the States and things that were happening in the U.K. underground," remembers Hyde. "Finally, it was listening to acid house on pirate radio in London that reminded us of our roots — lis-

tening to dub reggae, Tangerine Dream, Kraftwerk and just kind of repetitive beats, really. Even things like Hawkwind — that was about traveling, or a film in your head, and it just touched a nerve in us, and we realized that this is where we had to be."

Perhaps the one event that played the biggest role in transforming Underworld was the arrival of DJ Darren Emerson. While at the time only a teenager, Emerson was recommended to Smith when the bankrupt Underworld began searching for someone with a solid understanding of the club scene to join the group. "We had been together for about 10 years at that time, and really got ourselves into a rut, so we needed a kick up the arse from youth," says Hyde. "Darren was very single-minded and had a very particular view of the scene that he was involved in — the kind of dance music that he was playing out. The knowledge of what worked for him on the dance floor was very important. This knowledge was quickly assimilated by Rick into the working process."

With Emerson's arrival, Underworld was officially reborn as a trio. After borrowing £600 (approximately \$1,000), the band printed up 1,000 copies of its first single, 1992's "Mother Earth" b/w "The Hump," to sell from the back of Smith's car. A small profit resulted from the sale of the records, but more importantly, it gave the band a sense that it was finally onto something.

Flashing forward over 10 years to the present, Underworld has come a long way from its days selling records out of its trunk. From its 1994 debut CD, *Dubnobasswithmyheadman* and the classic tracks "Dark And Long," "Mmm Skyscraper I Love You," "Dirty Epic" and "Cowgirl" to 1997's *Second Toughest In The*

*Infants*, including the smash "Pearl's Girl" to 1999's *Beacoup Fish*, featuring "King Of Snake," "Push Upstairs" and "Jumbo" to 2000's live album, *Everything, Everything*, and, finally, to 2002's *A Hundred Days Off*, with "Two Months Off" and "Dinosaur Adventure 3D,"

Underworld's catalogue is a true document of the best in dance music over the last decade.

While the above albums and tracks made major waves within the dance community, however, the group's most globally significant moment was "Born Slippy." Originally released to little acclaim as a B-side in 1995, a remix of the track took on a life of its own after being included in Danny Boyle's massively successful film, *Trainspotting*, as well as on its companion soundtrack. The song went on to top charts around the world, and became the drinking anthem for many parties, with clubbers raising their glasses and chanting, "Lager, lager, lager!" in unison. In America, the track helped to bring electronica into the mainstream, and soon, labels started gobbling up dance records. Thanks to this one song, dance music reached a new level of global popularity that saw the dawning of a new age.

In 2000, Underworld was running on all cylinders when Emerson shocked the dance community by announcing that he was leaving the group to concentrate on his own DJ career. As a result, many people questioned what would become of Underworld, with its club kid now departed. What happened is that the band decided to carry on as a twosome and triumphed once again with *A Hundred Days Off*.

For Hyde, the ability to be successful creating music with his longtime partner, Smith, is clearly one of his most rewarding achievements. "The *Hundred Days Off* album was the

first platinum album we ever had, and that was after the event of Darren leaving," he recalls. "It was just nice to go on and make something — Rick and I have been together for 23 years now, and we had never been a two-piece. We've been a five-piece, six-piece, seven-piece — all different numbers. Rick and I have been like bookends for years; we can talk straight to one another and cut the crap, and it works."

Even with 10 years' worth of hits under its belt, though, Underworld was originally very hesitant about even discussing the notion of a "greatest hits" package. When Steven Hall from Junior Boy's Own (the band's U.K. label) originally approached it about doing

the project, he was set with the task of making a case for why Underworld should release such a compilation. "Steve came up with this running order and played it to us and he told us that, to him, having been around us for so long, these were significant tunes in the development of the group," explains Hyde. "They marked very significant periods in our journey, and many of the tunes were very significant in developing the dance scene in the U.K. We kind of listened to them and went, 'That's interesting — so this is more of a historical document, rather than a repackaging of the past to try and wring a little more cash out of people.'" Finally convinced that the collection would be fitting, 1992–2002 was born.

Throughout its career, Underworld has performed at exotic locales, including mountains, beaches and Roman amphitheaters, and has held headlining spots at major music festivals around the world. Despite all the journeys the band has taken both physically and musically, however, what's especially shocking is finding that Hyde's most meaningful musical moment came last summer — in, of all places, New Jersey. "I think the most spiritually rewarding experience of my life was playing at Giants Stadium in New Jersey," he explains. "It was part of the Field Day Festival. The license had been revoked, so the whole festival had to move to Giants Stadium. The two-day event had to be put on in one day, and we'd go from headlining Stage Two on one night to being on at 3:30 in the afternoon. The stadium only had like 15,000 people in it; I was soaking wet because I was out there in the pouring rain — everyone was wet, and the equipment was breaking down, but nobody grumbled. Everybody backstage just smiled and got on with it. It was more than just 'the show must go on.' It was this determination that we're going to enjoy ourselves and walk away from this and have a positive experience. As the hours went by after the end of the show, it kind of dawned on me that it was probably the most moving musical experience of my life."


Underworld has succeeded for over 10 years by embodying the spirit of dance music and by showing a real love for its fans and making a unifying connection with them. It would be hard to imagine what life would be like without Hyde and Smith. For giving us everything and more, Underworld, we thank you. **NMR**



## HART OF THE MATTER

We're used to things having an end. Things start, they finish. Something new starts, it finishes, a new thing comes to take its place and the whole cycle begins again *ad infinitum*. What am I talking about? Well, in broader terms, I'm talking about pop culture, a beast whose survival has unfortunately only been tested with Scooby snacks. Celebrities come and go, fads and Macarenas go faster than they come, and music... well, the majority of the industry has built itself to produce and discard with blinding speed.

There are so many good people at labels who believe in the projects they work, who are passionate about artist development, who want to see their corporations' expectations be humble enough to let their favorite artists last to make another record, *especially* after all the hard work they put in to getting them through the first. But unfortunately, the machinery within which they try and sustain these passions is built for Christina, Justin and Britney. That isn't to say that there's anything particularly wrong with the Holy Trinity, but let's get real: the record business is becoming the movie business more and more every week (thank you, Rand Foster). The existence of the corporation, the shareholder, the senior executive is a direct result of building a business model on those kind of expectations. And in order to keep the corporation, the shareholder and the senior executive alive, you don't give them five-course meals that require the utmost patience from the palate, you feed 'em Scooby snacks to get them through the day.

Although, if you've noticed, it's become very hip for media to say,

"I'm a closet Justin fan," or, "You know, that Britney's really grown up. Look! She's workin' with the Neptunes now!" Give me a break. There's nothing brilliant about these artists or records. Sure they can dance in synchronicity with others: *head whip, feint, shoulder shrug, feint, pirouette, pause, pirouette... lick thumb and repeat*. Stunning! It's almost absurd the media attention these artists get, almost as if the media itself wants to convince itself that the system works. Accordingly, fairly average records are considered "great," or "breakthrough" when in reality all that's happening is MTV's pretending they've discovered a new talent in, of all people, Justin Timberlake... from \*NSYNC! That's really going out on a limb. That's really keeping your finger on the pulse of... well, pop culture. Of course, it's really what creates it.

There are so many releases this year that are really worthy of that kind of "Eureka!" Records that shouldn't be forgotten because pop culture being what it is, makes us think the 30-minute sitcom is about as long as we should ever be asked to pay attention to any one thing. This issue marks the 196th Point Of Impact we've done this year and the 420th we've done since CMJ Retail was born. Every single one of these is a labor of love with a lot of care and attention going into choosing these artists and working with the labels to make sure we get the stories right. This week we're running the original POIs of four breaking artists from 2003... before they were stars ("Before The Impact"). Next week we'll give you an update on where these artists are now and what to expect from them in 2004 ("After The Impact"). See you next week. *Shuffle, step, Shuffle, step.*

You should see our consumer message boards...]*

My last Weaselworld was forwarded to a young lady who had just closed her indie record store after seven years. She Emailed me asking for advice on what to do next.

Just what do we do when we are erased from the equation by the bookkeepers?

Lately, I have been involved in a spirited discussion of economics. I know that I have a

slanted, ignorant view of the topic and the discussion wound up with me being told to bone up on some basics. Again, admittedly, I am ignorant of the book learnin' brand of economics. I do know how to creatively balance a checkbook and fly a kite on the lag time between the post office delivery and cashing. I also know how to feed a couple of kids on a limited budget and baby a Barracuda with 200,000 miles on an original engine through a Michigan winter. **W**hen we opened, there was one other store in town," says Side 1 Music owner Duke Ward, "and they were selling music very badly." After filling the Richmond, Indiana niche 14 years ago, Side 1 Music has been selling music like no other—with career employees building career customers. Their staff, including general manager Jim Willis, is there for the long haul (the shortest amount of time any of Ward's employees have been there is 10 years) and forges unbreakable bonds with Indiana's record-buying contingent. Says Ward, "We have customers come in, walk up to the front counter and ask 'What am I buying today?'"

Side 1 was one of the first stores to have a Muze machine, one of the first to have an Isis listening station, an early SoundScan reporter and a Concrete Corner store. Ward, currently pretty upset about the new UMVD pricing strategy, remains dedicated. "We believe very strongly in this industry," Ward says. "Hopefully the downsides of it are very cyclical and will come back to where it's a strong, vibrant industry again."

## Q&A with Duke Ward, Owner, Side 1 Music

### What local press affects sales most?

Probably more TV, the cable music channels. We don't have a lot of local press. Our local newspaper, the *Palladium-Item* has a "Get Out" section once a week, covering live music, but there isn't much here. We advertise a lot in high school and college newspapers.

### What radio station affects sales most?

There's a pop station called WFMG-FM and a country station called WQLK.

### Do you have in-stores?

We have in-stores, but they're mainly local bands playing acoustic sets. We have a fairly large local section and the bands get 100 percent of the profits. Sometimes we get larger bands, like Fear Factory's Dino Cazares came through once.

### What is your most effective program?

We have a used program: if you buy 12 CDs, you get one free. We have Email programs and do couponing too. Coupons don't work as well for music as they do for grocery stores.

### What other programs do you offer? Are any of them discretionary?

We have a promotion for new CDs where, if you buy 10 CDs, you get a free Side 1 T-shirt. This is a great promotion as it also gets our customers advertising for us.

### What types of non-traditional promo-

### tions have worked best?

We have something like a Kroger Card that we set up with WQLK. It's called the Side 1 Music/Kicks96 Country Club Card. We're able to get demographics tracking and Email addresses that way to be able to keep in touch with our customers.

### What display materials work best for you?

Stand-ups do really well for us. We also really like Sony's varying product stand-ups. Epic has a counter display that works kind of like a light box, where you can slide a different album flat in and out when you want.

### What records are your current and all-time favorites?

A new four-song sampler from Train that has them doing an Aerosmith song and a Led Zeppelin song, as well as a couple of their own. My all-time favorite is the Beatles' *White Album*.

### What's the first record you bought and where?

I bought a 45 of the Beatles' first release, "I Want To Hold Your Hand" somewhere in Sumter, South Carolina.

### What's the best concert you've attended?

Heart in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1980 or 1981. The guitar solo on "Magic Man" was really amazing.

- "Adds" are the new and current albums that a CMJ Airplay Reporter makes available for airplay and reasonably expects will receive airplay during the forthcoming week.
- Albums reported in a CMJ Airplay Reporter's Top 30 playlist *must* represent the 30 most played current albums on the station during the preceding week. Because we are a "new" music publication whose charts are album-based, reporting re-currents (or recordings more than a year old) or singles is not necessary.
- Airplay reports that do not correlate with actual airplay, also known as "paper adds," are not permitted under any circumstances.
- When CMJ cannot vouch for the accuracy of an artist and/or recording on a station's airplay report (we do so by investigating our own internal database, searching the Internet and/or consulting with online music retailers), the listing in question will remain in its position on the playlist — however, it will be preceded by an asterisk, as in \*Beatles, to designate that it could not be verified at press time. 
