FMQB ALBUM REPORT

Hard Choices

RAINBOW, "STONE COLD", POLYGRAM

Another killer song from Rainbow to follow their most successful track, "Jealous Lover". We saw saturation airplay on the last album. "Jealous Lover" took the radio regard even higher, now the coup de grace "Stone Cold" hits like a ton of bricks and builds from there. Quite simply, can't miss.

POINT BLANK, "ON A ROLL", MCA

Their last record was one of 1981's most impressive success stories. Stations started with several tracks, the Lp hung in the lower 40's for a month and then fell off the chart--then "Nicole" broke wide open and put "American Excess" back on the Index and kept it there for months. Overall the #36 Lp for 1981 with "Nicole" the #62 song. Obviously they are on a roll, and the smart move is to consider this an automatic. Only question is what to play: We like "Great White Line", "Don't Look Down" and "On A Roll".

TOTO, "ROSANNA", COLUMBIA

Since "Hold The Line", their album rock stock has dropped dramatically. "Rosanna" is their best song ever. Will be a giant Top 40 tune, and is guaranteed to bring them out of the deep freeze on rock stations.

JOHN COUGAR, "HURTS SO GOOD", RIVA/MERCURY

As strong as "Hurts So Good" kicks in the FMQB sampler, we're confident it will jump out of the radio, too. He's a real rocker and sounds much more at home when the heat's up.

Chain Reaction

GREG KINN, "KIHNTINUED", BENSERKLEY/ELECTRA

Coming on the heels of "The Breakup Song", Greg could have easily piled on the gloss and found himself too slick for album radio--but nooo, he's done a great job of keeping the energy up without losing his pop appeal...Overall our #1 most added with 74 reports...There's still a wide spread on lead cuts, with "Testify", "Happy Man", and "Everyday/Saturday" all active...radio action: Buck McWilliams, WIOT, "Greg has come up with an album I can't stop playing. Lyrically it's one of his finest, and musically the most consistent record yet"...J. David Holmes, KDKB, "'Happy Man' sounds great on the air. The good-time feel of this tune is irresistible. Simple and honest rock and roll"...Lanel Dalar, KZEW "Greg's latest is exceptional. 'Happy Man' and 'Testify' are perfect radio songs, and just right for summer. Real toe-tapper"...Dick Bascom WQXM, "Greg has a tasty follow-up. I think 'Testify' has all the makings of a hit"...Ron Phillips, WQDR, "The album is full of smooth, smartly produced, tight rock and roll numbers. We'll 'Testify' out of the box"...and WKQQ's Dave Krusenklous says, "The first time I listened all the way through I was a little disappointed. It didn't seem to have the energy of 'Rockinroll' but the second listen proved decisive. This record sounds better than the last one--more interesting and deeper."

FRANKE AND THE KNOCKOUTS, "BELOW THE BELT", MILLENNIUM/RCA

Much like the Kinn lp, the success of "Sweetheart" could have motivated Franke in an MOR direction, but unfortunately, he is rocking more. With the effective pre-promotion job and songs like "Keep On Fighting" and "Never Had It Better", they're blasting out of the box--#2 Most Added with 66 stations, #1 in the Top 30 markets with 28 reports...As WQFM's Mike Wolf says, "Franke has come up with a solid sophomore effort. On the first album it seemed that Franke couldn't decide whether to rock and roll or MOR. 'Never Had It Better' and 'Keep On Fighting' show that he's definitely decided to do a good rock album"...Bobbin Beam, WLPX, "Franke is gonna shed the image of being a pop singles band and expand their horizons with 'Never Had It Better'"...Jose Diaz, WBLM, "Franke and the KO's come to us with a much more rock and roll approach on this lp. The last one set their base on a more mass appeal level, this time album rock will have to take them seriously"...And from Craig Martin, KZOK, "I think Franke and the Knockouts have found that formula on the new album. It dispels the image that many of us, including myself, stuck them with on the first album."

DAVID BOWIE, "CAT PEOPLE", BACKSTREET

We logged in 38 adds last week (including WMMS, WDVE, WMMR, WYSP, KDKB, KROQ, WNEW-FM, AND KZEW), and 15 more rolled in this week, with WMJQ, WIOT, KISS, WLAV-FM, and DC101 leading the way. We've noticed a number of majors are still holding off, possibly due to the bizarre intro, and we can't understand the hesitation. Considering his recent triumph with Queen and the basic strength of the track itself, "Cat People" should be on the air everywhere. New at #54 on the Song Index.

Enclosed in this week's FMQB--Volume 1 of our advance cassette album sampler. Obviously the most efficient way for programmers to get acquainted with new releases is to put key tracks from different artists and different labels on one cassette. Our belief in this concept has been reinforced by the fact that we find many radio people have the same advance tapes we do sitting on their desks, and just don't make time to listen until it's absolutely necessary...We've been working on the sampler idea for quite some time, but frankly, it's a pain in the ass to put together. You have to get the music well enough in front to pick the strongest tracks, get a clean master tape made from the various program sources, then allow time for duplication, all with a concern for the overall quality of the sound. Then, get it to the stations before it's last week's news...Now that we've developed a system we hope to be able to deliver these samplers on a regular/irregular basis, and all that we ask is that you NOT air any of the advance material, for obvious reasons and also that you listen to the entire cassette. This ain't no "forget it after the first track" endeavor...Here's what we have this week...Side 1--The new Rainbow single "Stone Cold" on Mercury, which we think is a total out and out mo-fo, as indicated by the Hard Choice this week. You'll have the vinyl momentarily...2) From the Dave Edmunds album on Columbia due next week, "D.E.7th", a song Bruce Springsteen wrote for Dave called "From Small Things Big Things One Day Come", an excellent twang-rocker...3) Point Blank's "Don't Look Down", an office pleaser from the new album...4) The new John Cougar single "Hurts So Good" on Riva. See front page...5) Chas Sanford is a new artist on Elektra shipping next week. The production and writing on this effort knock us dead, and here's a version of his song "Surrender" which you've already heard on Sammy Hagar's album. When you get the vinyl, also check out "Still Crazy For You" which Rick Springfield has covered on his latest...6) Sparks "I Predict", Atlantic. No one takes these guys seriously, but this is an interesting, quirky, and witty song. We think it has very high phone potential. Guaranteed not to get lost in the clone rock...Side 2 starts with the new Toto single "Rosanna". A few potato heads may shout "too pop" initially, but they will soon be smothered by hooks and requests, and will give up with a whimper, crowded into a corner by the competition. Can you tell we like it?...2) Another hot one from Mr. Edmunds, "Other Guys' Girls". Being a long time fan and admirer, I'm aching for Dave to come through with a pop crossover hit, and this one sounds to us like a strong candidate. We're also looking for instant heavy spins on his version of "Me And The Boys"...3) Point Blank's "Great White Line" is next. The blowzine theme, long slow build, and nifty guitar and keyboard work will make this a radio and audience favorite...4) Chas Sanford. There was so much material to choose from on Chas' Lp that picking only two trax was tough, but "Limelight" will give you a good feel for his personality and sense of studio dynamics...5) Finally another smoker from what we think will be a major airplay item for the Spring. Rainbow's "Straight Between The Eyes" hits your desk next week, and this tune is titled "Bring On The Night"...So, we hope you enjoy the tape and find it helps in your music selection decisions. Happy motoring!

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

KROKUS, "ONE VICE AT A TIME", ARISTA

Straight ahead metal with an unavoidable hook and those sexual overtones teens love put Krokus right on the radio--no problem. #3 Most Added with 47 stations...WSYR's Tommy Mast says, "The album amazes me. Sure it sounds like AC/DC, but the power on this record is awesome. 'Long Stick Goes Boom' is blowing the phones out"...Ken Martin, KZEL, "Another new entry generating tremendous response is 'Long Stick Goes Boom'. This lp should firmly establish them with the best of the heavy metal rockers"...Ilyse Gottlieb, WRXL, "'Long Stick Goes Boom' is all over the airwaves. Krokus really knows how to latch onto a winning powerhouse sound"...Mark Vos, KKRQ, "The new Krokus cranks with the best of them, but I must say everybody thinks that Bon Scott has gone from dead to Dutch"...Ditto, Alan Speed, KSRR, "The voice is definitely very familiar to the earth dogs"...Also a few comments on "American Woman"--Mark Miller, WWCK, "Their version of this song lets the band's individuality stand out. Admittedly the AC/DC influences are there, but the band can really stand on their own two legs"...And from Bobbin Beam at WLPX, "'American Woman' stands out and the song speaks for itself."

GRAHAM PARKER, "ANOTHER GREY AREA", ARISTA

Klhn and Franke rock more to best advantage, and Graham makes points by toning it down. Jack Douglas' more subdued production provides the needed counterpoint to Graham's rather aggressive style. The rough edges are smoothed out on the vocals and ultimately the artist should appeal to a much wider audience...Our #4 Most Added with 26, including WMMR, KDKB, WNEW-FM, WSYR, and WPLR...KDKB's G. David Holmes is impressed, "'Another Grey Area' is going to be one of my favorite lps of the year and maybe of all time"...Ron Sorenson, KBLE, "The Jack Douglas production finds Graham in a slightly more controlled setting. It puts Graham's voice and songs in the spotlight they deserve"...Bob Keller, KZAP, "Graham bristles with controlled excitement and superior production. This is about as slick as he can get without losing his spark and he pulls it off so fine"...Ron Nenni, WPYX, "I think the slicker production balances the anger of Parker's lyrics and style, and could make the album more mass appeal."

CHARLIE DANIELS BAND, "WINDOWS", EPIC

Charlie's blowout slides into week two with 22 more stations for #5 Most Added--that's 105 reporters in just two weeks, right behind Asia...New at #20 Index, #24 Metro, with 'Still In Saigon' on the Top 100 at #10...Comments: Bill Simmons, WMYK, "Getting good to moderate response on 'Saigon', and no negs yet"...The Doctor, WYFE, "Charlie moves to heavy with us. 'Saigon' is a top phone item"...Buck McWilliams, WIOT, "Charlie is following the route of Joan Jett with a light to medium to heavy move, all in one week. The phones are still hot for 'Saigon'...Also active phones reported at KOME, WSYR, WWCK, WPYX, WRXL, WKZL, and WKQQ."

ASIA, GEFFEN

Last week's 109 adds set a record for first week activity on a new group, as does this week's #6 Index/#8 Metro debut...19 more adds rolled in, and that should challenge number one in our next report...More request and retail reaction: Jeff Kauffman, WTPA, "Asia is burning up the phones. It's nice to have an Lp you can go as deep into as you want"...Tom Starr, WOOR, "The sales surge of Asia has retailers around here pinching themselves to make sure they're not dreaming. It's good to see that the stampede of radio acclaim can translate to immediate sales, even in a 1982 economy. Debuts #1 retail in Central New York"...Stew Schantz, WPDH, "#1 in sales in the Hudson Valley, pushing Joan Jett down to #3 after 2 1/2 months"...Jim Kinney, WTUE, "Asia debuts at #18 in sales"...Dick Bascom, WQXM, "Asia debuts at #11 retail with incredible phone reaction"...Ron Nenni, WPYX, "Phones have been massive and #1 sales after one week. Quality is the key to success here"...Marc Miller, WBCN, "Asia continues to amaze--top 10 in sales and airplay"...Bobbin Beam, WLPX, "Asia is #4 sales first week"...Bill Simmons, WMYK, "Out of the box heavy rotation has paid off in a big way with a #2 retail debut and real good phones"...Rob Roman, KLAQ, "Look for Asia to jump into top 10 sales next week. Already they show at a #3 requests, and it's just gotten into the stores"...Kid Leo, WMMS, "Very good phones, and the concert sold out 1/2 of the house without having the record out. Now that it's on the air, ticket sales are going like hotcakes"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "It's a bona fide phenomenon. Heavy sales at every retail account in the city, and the concert sold out in 90 minutes. We're already getting reports of kids calling Asia their favorite band"...And Dana Jang at KOME, "Top 25 sales and a lot of street interest"...

DREGS, "INDUSTRY STANDARD", ARISTA

With a 39-30 move, the Dregs lock up strongest chart move this week...Up 47-34 Metro, with "Crank It Up" advancing 34-20. #8 Most Added with 12, for a total of 85 FMQB reporters to date...On this week's Checklist, 29 not playing, 16 considering, none dropping, 30 maintaining, and a strong 37 building...Sales: WLAV-FM, KLOL, KSMB, KTIM, WLIR, and WLPX...Phones: WBRU, KLAQ, WYFE, WNEW-FM, WRCN, KISS, WRXL, WCCC, WRKK, KWXL, WOVE, KYYS, WPYX, and KTXQ...Sales and phones: WZZO, WRAS, WMYK, WKLS, WPDH, WKZL, KTIM, WDHA, and KOME.

SCORPIONS, "BLACKOUT", MERCURY

A big Metro move from the Scorps 20-15, also a prime mover on the Back Page, 24-18...Play increases: KDWB, WMMR, WYFE, WQFM, WQXM, WYNF, WILS-FM, WIOT, WBLM, WYFE, and KWXL...Also 28 steadies and 2 decreases in play...#7 Most Added with 17, for 99 FMQB reporters to date...Looking equally awesome on the Checklist, 19 not playing, 7 considering, none dropping, 19 maintaining, and a bombastic 58 building. "No One Like You" is up 12-8. More raves: Bob Bittens, WHCN, "If first week phones are any indicator, Scorps may have a bona fide hit with 'No One Like You'...Charlie Logan, WYFE, "'No One Like You' is a real barn burner. It smokes, and should hold up well. Plus the cult is ringing the phones off the hook already"...Doug Clifton, KAZY, "Scorps enter at #18"...Bobbin Beam, WLPX, "Scorps #1 after just two weeks"...Rob Roman, KLAQ, "After two weeks, #2 sales in the city, and you can't do that with just a cult following"...Steve Feinstein, WYSP, "'No One Like You' is a textbook example of how to combine clean, well crafted production values with gut wrenching heavy metal power. Every time we play it, I imagine thousands of kids turning up their radios full blast. Already impressive sales in Philly"...And from Dana at KOME, "Another great week, top 25 sales and top phones."

IRON MAIDEN, "THE NUMBER OF THE BEAST", CAPITOL

#5 Most Added with 22, and Skyboy is on the money, "Record of the Week is "Number Of The Beast". Shades of 'Speed King'. Now this is heavy metal, and heavy is the operative word. If you understand the metal cult, you know they live by the credo 'harder/faster'. As groups add polish and take off the edge to gain commercial success, the cult will adopt harder groups as heroes: Rush begat Priest, begat Scorpions as heroes. As everyone reaches for the upper demos, teens languish saying 'fuck you' to radio, except for the stations that unleash Eddie"...More from Bruce Bond, WZZO, "If you're looking for quality heavy metal, try the new Iron Maiden. The album reminds me of 'The Omen'...Roberta Haber, WMJQ, "The new album just might get them some airplay. 'Number Of The Beast' fits right into the Black Sabbath, Ozzy weirdo rock mold"...And again, to Buck at WIOT, "One of the best heavy metal albums I've heard. The rapid maturity of this band from 'Wild Noise' two years ago, to refined slickly produced kick-ass rock is impressive. This band will grow out of cult status very soon."

HUMAN LEAGUE, A&M

I keep hearing programmers saying they're concerned about "image"--but WMMR is playing the piss out of the single, and it sounds great. Joe Bonadonna tells me the phones and sales are building like a mo-fo. I say, if WMMR can play it, don't sweat it--the record gets reaction and sounds beautifully contemporary...WQDR's Ron Phillips reports, "The Human League is for real. After a week of airplay, it's a top 10 request item from males and females alike. I look for a rotation increase next week"...Bruce Goldsen, WRKI, "The hooks in the record are so strong that we're going to test it out heavy and see what kind of reaction we get. It sounds like a hit after the super saturation I've been hearing on area college stations"...Art Phillips, KILQ, "We're on it, and it sounds like an infectious hit on the air. With the recent success of Soft Cell, Go Go's and Tommy Tutone, Human League is different enough to become the next big thing"...Dale Wolter, WMAD, "On our request lists this week Human League came in at #5 with Soft Cell right behind at #6, and they both have solid sales trends also"...And from Jack Snyder, KMET, "I think this is a real important record. People out here are buying it up--one of the best sellers in town. And there is no image problem, no complaints at all"...Stats: Prime move 50-45 Index, 49-42 Metro underline. New on KMET, KBPI, KISS, WRKI, KEZY, WXUS, WXLQ, and KILQ..."Don't You Want Me" goes 51-42.

RICK SPRINGFIELD, RCA

Rick edges up on the Index 8-7, but steps on the gas Metro, with a 13-7 Underline...Airplay: 2 down, 19 increases, including KGB-FM, KYYS, WABX, WKLS, WYSP, WAAF, WDIZ, and WQDR...On the Song Index: "Calling All Girls" #9, "Don't Talk To Strangers" 31-23.

BONNIE RAITT, WARNER BROTHERS

Bonnie climbs 32-28 Index (one shy of a prime move), and is up to #37 Metro...New on DC101 and WMJQ...Airplay: 1 down, 27 steady, and 10 building, WBCN, WMET, WMMR, WNEW-FM, KATT, KMOD, WPYX, WRNO, WLIR, and KLAQ...Key trax: "Keep This Heart..." at #44 and "Me And The Boys" 74-70.

DUKE JUPITER, COAST TO COAST/EPIC

Steady on the Index at 27, but up 28-25 Metro, with a substantial add week: WQMF, WKLS, WLPX, KSJO, and KAZY among the new believers...Airplay: 42 steady, 2 down, and 9 up: KDWB, KYYS, WSHE, KATT, WPYX, WQDR, KWFM, KLAQ, and WPLR. New last week on WLRS, WYSP, WNEW-FM, WYNF, and KLOL...On the Checklist: 44 not playing with 23 considering, none dropping, 28 maintaining, and 24 building including KMET, KYYS, WCMF, WEBN, WMJQ, and KDKB.

TOMMY TUTONE, COLUMBIA

If you're still not a believer, try this on for size--11-9 Index, 11-5 Prime Move on the Metro Chart as "Jenny" jumps 6-4 on the Song Index...Also note the play increases this week alone: WYMS, WMMR, KGB-FM, KGON, KYYS, KZEW, WKLS, WLUP, WSHE, among others, and don't forget the amazing Checklist performance: 24 maintaining, 6 dropping, and 58 building...Attention 8 holdouts: You're blowing it!!"

GIRLSCHOOL, STIFF

Another solid add week--11 adds, including WSYR, DC101, KOME, WMAD, and WLIR...Already making noise in Cleveland, as Kid Leo reports, "It's already attracted immense interest from older males and females"...David Filipov, WBRU, "Choice of the week: Girlschool combines the enthusiasm of the Go Go's with a much harder rock and roll sound which sounds great on the air. 'Race With The Devil' is my fave."

SOFT CELL, SIRE/WARNER BROTHERS

Up 34-31 on the Index, nice momentum considering the Asia, and Charlie Daniels' debut...New on WAQX and WOVE with an undeniable Checklist showing: 29 not playing, 13 considering, 10 dropping, 14 maintaining, and 30 building. Sales and phones reported at WMMR, WZZO, KNAC, WNEW-FM, WRCN, WHCN (top 10), KWXL, WQBK, WPLR, WCMF, WOUR, KILQ, WPYX (#8), WMAD, and KOME...Other builders include WHJY, WLUP, KMET, WMJQ, KLOL, and KQRS.

UTOPIA, "SWING TO THE RIGHT", BEARSVILLE

You can always count on Todd's faithful to rally behind any new Utopia offering, and with "One World", those fans have real radio track to get behind...The LP hits the Back Page at #50, as "One World" grabs #86 spot on the Song Index...Adds to date include WYMS, KEZY, WZZO, WMMR, WBAB, WLIR, WNEW, WTUE, KRQR, KSRR, WRKI, KZEW, and WHJY.

ROGER DALTRY, MCA

"Martyrs" leads a group of building stations which include KGON, WCOZ, WNEW, WMJQ, WLUP, and KSRR. Calls like this and the 49-41 prime move should motivate the 21 considering stations. Checklist shows 56 not playing, 21 considering, 3 dropping, 23 maintaining, and 14 building. Goes 48-41 on the Index.

WAITRESSES, POLYDOR

We've seen a slow but consistent station build since January and the impressive retail story (100,000 shipped), will keep the growth pattern alive. New at #50 on the Metro Chart and new in the past three weeks on WOVE, KOME, KMET, DC101, KNAC, KILQ, WPYX, WOUR, and WZZO.

'Testify' is a continuation of brilliant rock from one of the most outstanding pop artists of today...Franke & The Knockouts have come up with a top quality rock and roll Lp. We strongly recommend: 'Never Had It Better'...And this week we go with a local band. It's always a pleasure to go out and see a local band that can still come up with refreshing original material. It's even more exciting to see that come out on a record. Attention, check out: 'O' from the Flamin' O's. It's their second release. This one has much better quality, and is available through Fat City Records here in the Twin Cities. Call myself or Esa at Lieberman's, and we will send you one...Got a chance to hear some new CBS product today. Toto sounds like it has the goods to get them back on the air...Dave Edmunds finally has a hit. It's a tune written by Springsteen. The sound is distinctly Dave Edmunds...The McCartney/Stevie Wonder single has me in total MOR depression. Here's hoping for something from the Lp. Otherwise, it should make a great Christmas gift for my mom...Hot phones for: Asia, Soft Cell, and Scorpions...The breakout Lp goes to #3 in sales. The Scorpys have proven they're more than just a heavy metal band. 'No One Like You' adds class to this act...Angel City is also starting to pick up...If you're having trouble with Jay Ferguson's Lp, check out: 'Tonight'--loaded with hooks, lines, but no sinkers...Personal to Jim Sotet: Hey, hey, hey. It was great to talk to you again...Finally, does anyone know what happened to John O'Leary?...P.S. To Sky Daniels: I'm mailing you a copy of the Flamin' O's album."

KDKB, PHOENIX, AZ M.D.-J.DAVID HOLMES: "No matter what else is released in the next 9 months, Graham Parker's 'Another Grey Area' is going to be one of my favorite Lp's of the year, and maybe of all time...I'd like to say radio's jury is already in on Asia. When was the last time you heard as many superlatives used to describe one album. It's unanimous. Fresh new music with all the right elements to encourage listeners to once again turn up the radio and go back to the record stores. We're starting with the track 'Heat Of The Moment'. And when that one burns, there are at least five more tracks to consider...We're having a great time thinking up titles for future Greg Kihn albums. How about: 'Citizen Kihn', 'Kihn You Dig It', 'How Long Kihn This Go On'. But seriously, folks, 'Happy Man' from Greg's newest sounds great on the air. The good-time feel of this tune is irresistible. Simple and honest rock and roll...The new Toto Lp is also hot and is going to be a must next week. The tracks 'Rosanna' and 'Africa' are a couple of the best things they've ever recorded...One final note. Someone please send me Karla Bonoff's phone number. I'm in love. Who knows, maybe she'll deliver it personally."

KSHE, ST. LOUIS, MO P.D.-RICK BALIS: "Sorry, George, but I really don't have the time to do any comments today. I'm busy answering the phones and taking Asia requests."

WNEW-FM, NEW YORK, NY M.D.-JIM MONAHAN: "Drum roll, please...Monahan comes out of the closet... We have a series here at WNEW-FM called 'Prisoners Of Rock And Roll'. It's something we do four nights a week and Sunday evenings, and it's music comprised of local, unsigned bands. We give them a shot at New York radio. Just as a point of clarification, one of our Prisoner's wrote the song 'Still In Saigon' that is on the new Charlie Daniels album. His name is Dan Dailey, and he's a local musician who has recorded a number of songs, including 'Still In Saigon'...If you're in Los Angeles, ask Ron Farber if he likes Danish pastry."

KSRK, HOUSTON, TX P.D.-ALAN SNEED: "We added: Krokus. The obvious cut: 'Long Stick'. The voice is definitely very familiar to the earthdogs...Point Blank's single is a natural for us here in Texas. We're also very impressed with the album's title cut...We're giving Le Roux one last shot and sticking in a third cut, 'Last Safe Place', which we understand will be the next single...Genesis rolls on. 'Man On The Corner' and 'Like It Or Not' are both giving the album new life...As is 'Fits Ya Good' from the Bryan Adams Lp...UFO, unfortunately, didn't happen. I liked 'The Writer' a lot... Glass Moon did fairly well with their second release, but the group still hasn't quite caught on... With Asia, we're homing in on 'Heat Of The Moment' and 'Sole Survivor'. Some additional play on: 'Only Time Will Tell'...Good initial sales on: Scorpions...Some initial retail action on: Dregs, Utopia, and Charlie Daniels Band...To the Arista guys: Congratulations again on getting the Dregs on KLOL. I always like it when other stations use my Arbitron slogans on the air. It's unfortunate that the people at 101 construed my comments to you guys as negatives about their station."

KZOK, SEATTLE, WA M.D.-CRAIG MARTIN: "When I first heard about Asia a couple of months ago, I was interested, but not too sure what to expect. If rock and roll eats its young, then Art Rock committed genocide. With the exception of the Moody Blues, who really can't help themselves, this form of music self-destructed on its own pomposity a long time ago. Only Genesis was able to change direction in time to save itself and become more successful than ever. Considering the background of the members of this band, I was awaiting the album cautiously. So while, to be quite honest, I'm not blown away, I'm impressed by the restraint shown by the musicians on this record. The playing is under control with no endless space soloing, and the lyrics never get too silly. It's a time when we're told we must economize, and that included veteran Art Rockers. It will be interesting to see what Asia does in the future. That is, if they don't break up, since the supergroups do have a tendency to do that. But for now, they have given us a fine Art Rock album for the 80's...If there is such a thing as formula rock, guaranteed to get a band airplay, I think Franke & The Knockouts have found that formula on their new album. It dispels the wimpy image that many of us, including myself, stuck them with with their first album. Three cuts in particular sound perfect for album rock radio today: 'Keep On Fighting', 'Never Had It Better', and 'Just What I Want'...I just got the new Point Blank record in, and from only one listening, it sounds hot. The title track 'On A Roll' is the initial standout to my ears. But the album, as a whole, sounds like it has a whole lot to offer. The last album was a major breakthrough for this hard-working band, and this should really get things rolling for them."

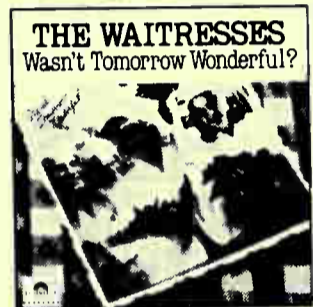

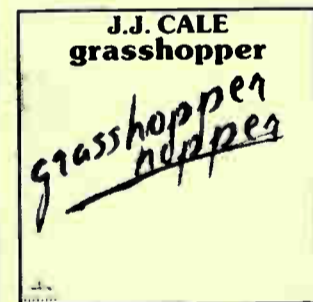

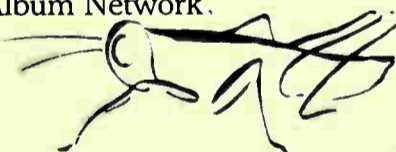

KGON, PORTLAND, OR ASST. P.D.-GLORIA JOHNSON: "Requests: #1 Joan Jett, #2 Aldo Nova, #3 J.Geils Band, #4 Loverboy, #5 Sammy Hagar...Sales: #1 Joan Jett, #2 J.Geils Band, #3 Loverboy, #4 Foreigner, #5 Sammy Hagar, #6 Scorpions, #7 Aldo Nova, and #8 Rick Springfield...Sammy Hagar has a number one record just about everywhere. And after witnessing his concert Friday with 12,000 screaming fans, I can honestly say no one deserves it more. Sammy gives 100% on stage and you leave feeling like you've been entertained. Many thanks to: Ed Lessler and Larry Butler, and Greg Lee of Geffen for treating KGON like royalty. Sammy, you are welcome on my show anytime. Quarterflash opened the Hagar concert, and I was blown away by how much they've grown. Both bands were inducted into the KGON Hall Of Fame and awarded plaques after Sammy's last encore. When Sammy says there's only one way to rock, we know he means it...Lots of interest on the phones for Girlschool since we announced their upcoming concert. Those of you who think Aldo Nova's album has only one hit on it, try: 'Heart To Heart'...Congratulations to: Ivy and John Bower for scoring a major coup in getting Johnny And The Distractions booked on the Asia tour. Let It Rock!"

KGB-FM, SAN DIEGO, CA M.D.-JUDY McNUTT: "To Ron Reger, P.D., WNOR: I loved your comments in last week's Hard Sheet. Magic and Power are important to me as well. We have become jaded over the years, and these moments are crucial. So thanks, Ron, for bringing my awareness to a feeling that's been brewing inside me for a long time...Last week I told Bill Hard that I felt my vocabulary was lacking. That may be true, but we in radio are quick to fault ourselves. We have worn out quite a few magical words like: 'Love', 'Terrific', 'Excellent', 'Heavy', 'Important', 'Fresh', 'Powerful', 'Bright', 'Favorite', 'Unbelievable', 'Exciting', 'Tremendous', 'Great', 'A Killer', 'A Smash Hit', and 'A #1 Smash Hit'. Even the word 'Hype' is overworked. ('It's in heavy rotation' what? 'Stairway To Heaven' is in heavy rotation. I've played that song every day for the last 11 years, or is it 12?) These words have been in heavy rotation for years! We radio (and record) people have been bombarded with all manner of fairly intense stimuli, so it's no wonder we are easily moved to magic. We're so busy searching for what touches the spirit in others that we leave ourselves out. Enthusiasm has become transitory: This week's raves are next week's burnouts, sensory saturation. And while listeners, especially young trendies, scream for more, more, more--we pray for less, but higher quality. This year's hero is next year's Dead Fish, and so it goes. I began to turn more to my inner awareness--intuition, guts, people call it. After all these years in this business, it seems like the body itself knows what it craves and needs from music. But for my radio station, guts and professionalism are the winning combination."

KTXQ, DALLAS, TX M.D.-DRAKE HALL: "What a nice surprise from Greg Kihn. I didn't think that he had two good albums in him (especially in a row), but 'Testify' is a great little song--and it sounds wonderful on the air--bouncy; and shit--I wish him the best of luck...We played the debut from Franke, and I loved that record. This time, Mr. Jenner has brought us a nice slick record that could probably go both ways (get my drift--I'm talking multi format)...Now, speaking of testify, let's rave about Point Blank. I've watched these fellows develop over three or four albums, which they have done real well. This time, the album is there. The Southern rock image may have hurt them in the past, but ix-nay on that bullshit. These guys are for real. So Don--please, no more long lunches till you break this record...Johnny And The Distractions goes to heavy rotation with 'Complicated Now'. I don't care what the hell Marko says about changing trax (what does he know anyway?), 'Complicated' is the tune. It's short, it's hooky, and it's timely. I'd like to dedicate it to all the midwives of America...Great calls and incredible sales for: Aldo Nova...Huey Lewis & The News doing beautifully...Getting real burnt on Prism and Sammy Hagar, but I really like them...And if you're not playing Novo Combo's 'Tattoo', you're missing a great sounding radio record...Some interesting calls on: 'Death Wish II'."

WYSP, PHILADELPHIA, PA M.D.-STEVE FEINSTEIN: "Asia is a bona fide phenomenon. Heavy sales at every retail account in the city. The concert sold out in 90 minutes, and we've already gotten reports of kids calling Asia their favorite band. 'Sole Survivor' and 'Heat Of The Moment' are leading for us right now. I can also hear: 'Wildest Dreams' and 'Here Comes The Feeling' on our air someday...Soft Cell also continues to sell heavy at every account, both the 12" and the album. I understand the new pressings of the album will, at some point, include the 'Where Did Our Love/Tainted Love' segue...Scorpions 'No One Like You' is a textbook example of how to combine clean, well-crafted production values with gut-wrenching heavy metal power. Every time we play it, I imagine thousands of kids turning up their radios full blast. We've also gotten impressive sales movement on the album...Greg Kihn hooked me with his perky brand of power pop years ago on the early Beserkley stuff like 'Any Other Woman', 'All The Right Reasons', and 'Kid From Louisville'. I can't think of anyone to whom the term 'irresistible' is more applicable. 'Happy Man' is an absolute delight...Nice seeing Charlie Daniels again, along with the suave and debonair Walter Winnick...It's rewarding to see Loverboy finally crank Top 10 sales here in Philadelphia. We're now four songs deep on the album...Kudos to: Donnie Jenner, Bill McGathy, Bob Catania, and Bobbi Silver for another well-coordinated effort on the Franke & The Knockouts project. 'Never Had It Better' is our lead track. It's really helped out by immaculate production by Pete Solley. What are other ex-members of Procul Harum up to?...Condolences to the Randy Rhoades Family...FLASH--just in: We got a 4.8 in the February monthly. That's up from January's 3.7. Now 1/2 point away from Brand X. Watch the fun as the gap narrows...We're committed to Huey Lewis & The News. The man delivers the goods that the 'pop rock' movement of a few years back promised...Upped rotation on: Dwight Twilley this week. 'Somebody To Love' proves that Twilley is still 'On Fire'."

WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS: "Record Of The Week: Iron Maiden, 'Number Of The Beast'. Shades of 'Speed King'. Now this is heavy metal, and heavy is the operative word. If you understand the metal cult, you know they live by the credo 'harder-faster'. As groups add polish and take off the edge to gain commercial success, the cult will adopt harder groups as heroes. Rush begat Priest begat Scorpions as heroes. As everyone reaches for the upper demos, teens languish saying 'fuck you' to radio, except for the station that unleashes Eddie...In my mind, there is no more forward looking artist in rock than David Bowie. Repeated listenings of 'Cat People' have shown that the thin white Duke leads us up another path again...Last year, Craig Lambert, as well as the regional RCA team, busted their ass to establish Franke & The Knockouts. As a result, OTB's this year everywhere in the Midwest...Speaking of OTB's, Greg Kihn is rapidly taking off with 'Testify'. He'll be opening four sold out shows for Journey, which really will add fuel to the first in Chicago. Schvar, you gotta get your T&E together for this...Charlie Daniels came by and we sat around discussin', fussin' and cussin' everything under the sun. 'Windows' is busting wide open in the Windy City...Forget foreign car sales, Asia cracked Top 40 sales in its first week...And in the 'believe-it-or-not' dept.: Both Marko Babin and Jeb Brien have been to Chicago in the last 10 days, and it's still standing!"

WIOT, TOLEDO, OH M.D.-BUCK McWILLIAMS: "I'm getting an eargasim for two records this week. One is Iron Maiden and the other is Greg Kihn...First off, Iron Maiden is one of the best heavy metal albums I've heard. The rapid maturity of this band from 'Wild Noise' two years ago, to refined, slickly produced kick-ass rock and roll is impressive. My favorites include: 'Number Of The Beat', 'Run To The Hills', and 'Hallowed Be Thy Name'. This is a band that will grow out of cult status very soon... Former cult hero, Greg Kihn, has an album out that I couldn't stop playing. Lyrically, it's one of his finest. Musically, the most consistent album yet. If only it didn't sound like it was produced in a garage. Get Keith Olsen to help out next time...Elsewhere on the tunetable, Franke & The Knockouts have scored an impressive followup--more geared to album radio this time...The Scorpions are getting phones at night, so it moved to medium after a week...Charlie Daniels is following the route of Joan Jett with a light to medium to heavy move all in one week. The phones are hot for: 'Still In Saigon'...J.Geils has now set the all-time record for Chart King--16 weeks in a row at #1... Rick Springfield is literally stealing the kids' allowance as evidenced by the leap in sales to #11... The addition of 'Man On The Corner' has pushed Genesis to an all-time high on the retail chart at #3... Thin Lizzy and Asia debut at Top 20 this week."

WWWL (LOVE 94), MIAMI, FL M.D.-STEVE HUNTINGTON: "Our Renaissance show was a complete sell-out. We did a 'Camera Camera' giveaway, with a couple of cameras, plenty of Lp's, and tix. The band came by for an interview, and then did a great show to a full house to close their current tour. Thanks to: Michael Plen from IRS and A&M's Richard Pachter...The B Side of Elton John's 'Empty Garden' is a good one. It's called 'Take Me Down', and we're on it...All the good new music still can't dampen my enthusiasm for the forthcoming album by Wendy Waldman, Toto, John Martyn, Jimmy Hall, Talking Heads, Jethro Tull, and more. And that's not to mention 'Ebony And Ivory'."

WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RAY WHITE: "Many thanks to: Allan Rosenberg, Valerie Goodman, and all at Warner Bros. for setting up and recording last night's 'Eye To Eye' broadcast. It was an honor to host their first show ever and put it over the airwaves. It was a real pleasure working with such superb and enthusiastic musicians. The audience was bowled over, demanding encore after encore. What amazes me is the way rock radio is ignoring this group's record. It was wonderful meeting Gary Katz and Jon Scott for the first time. Even Harvey Leeds was there checking out the show. Do me a favor, folks, put 'Nice Girls' on your home stereo and crank it up. That's all I ask...DeBella's Screamer Of The Week goes to: Asia for 'Heat Of The Moment'. The Lp is our #1 airplay record...Greg Kihn has knocked me over one more time. 'Kihntinued' shows off another aspect of the band. The whole record seems to be vocal based this time around. The singing and vocal arrangements are superb. And after all, good pop tunes need to have great singing before drums, bass, and guitar solos...The Scorpions are getting great audience response. The cult is out there, and bigger than I thought...Saw The Stray Cats at an unannounced gig at a local Long Island bar, and these boys were stunning. If an American label doesn't sign these guys soon! Longhairs, punks, rockers, preppies, bikers--you name it, Stray Cats had 'em cooking...Happy anniversary to WBCN. You guys and gals have one of the finest stations on the planet...And finally, good news coming soon for NRBQ fans. Don't miss them--currently on a West Coast tour."

WLAV-FM, GRAND RAPIDS, MI P.D.-DAVE LOGAN: "Here it is, the first week of the Book and no one in my market is playing Tommy Tutone yet. Personally, I still think it's a real exceptional piece of music. But with the constant badgering, excuse me, make that 'effective promotional input', the record has become such a programming tool it's now stupid not to heed its presence...Records keeping us on top: Paul Collins' Beat, The Clash Ep, X-15, Police, Loverboy, and Aldo Nova...Records that need help: Light, 4 Out Of 5 Doctors, Dwight Twilley, and Utopia...Boy that sounds good: Haircut One Hundred, Flock Of Seagulls, and Talking Heads Live...An LAV recommendation: Lewis Heidelmeyer of Progress Distributing in Detroit. A good number of records have made their way onto our playlist through his humble and knowledgable persuasion. X-15's Top 20 performance here is a testament to his ability to get the job done. He gets 4 stars from us. I meant to tell that to Progress, but all I got was their answering machine."

WAAF, WORCESTER, MA M.D.-ROB BARNETT: "We're just back from the annual WAAF Ski Trip. We took 150 listeners, a bunch of the staff, and the group New England up to Smuggler's Notch in Vermont for a weekend of skiing, partying, and a private concert with the group. Big success overall. Big thanks to: New England. If you're A&R oriented, New England comes highly recommended for great talent and a great attitude...Here at the C.R.B., Sammy Hagar's strong airplay is building a strong sales story...Rick Springfield's new album debuts at #7...Secret Policeman's Other Ball starts at #17...Huey Lewis & The News is shaping up as well (Where are our vans?)...Not-so-hot stories on: Thin Lizzy, Angel City, and 'Death Wish II' Soundtrack (interest fell off very quickly)...Gamma is up in heavy rotation with 'Right The First Time'...Added Scorpions 'No One Like You'. Undeniably, a must play record...Although I'm just a boy, Uncle Bernstein told me all about Vietnam, and we added Charlie Daniels Band; winning last week's Asia's 'Runner Up' for the most mentioned...Mike Bone. And now here's Roy: 'Added to the Stiff List: Randy Rhoades. 'Flying High Again'."

WPYX, ALBANY, NY M.D.-RON NENNI: "Obviously, Asia sounds magnificent on the air. Let's face it, Asia is a new band with new sounds. But after one week, the phones have been massive and it's #1 in sales. Quality is the key to success here...With a harder edge (great guitar work), the new Franke & The Knockouts album is more easily accessible than their debut. 'Keep On Fighting' is the key cut for us, while 'Never Had It Better' is the track to cross CHR and album rock radio...There's a wealth of promising material on the new Graham Parker. I think the slicker production balances the anger of Parker's lyrics and style and could make the album more mass appeal. 'Hit The Spot' reminds me of Petty's 'Breakdown'. And I think 'It's All Worth Nothing Alone' is the song that has it all. However, 'Temporary Beauty' makes the most sense to start with. It's a great upper demo female record...Charlie Daniels 'Still In Saigon' is in power rotation, and we can't miss with 25-34 males...Watch out, Black Sabbath. The new Iron Maiden 'Run To The Hills' is a screamer, and the phones are screaming for it. The new vocalist is outrageous...Waitresses 'I Know What Boys Like' is getting terrific AM drive response...We're getting sales and phones on Duke Jupiter's 'I'll Drink To You'...Aldo Nova is up to #5 in local sales; Bonnie Raitt #6; 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' #7; Soft Cell #17 to #8; and, Gamma is on the move, #25 to #17...The Dregs is holding its own with Top 20 sales and phone support as well...We're also using the brilliant remix of 'Man On The Corner' by Genesis...Couple of things I'm listening to include: Girlschool. 'Hit And Run' is a good song--somewhere between Joan Jett and the Go Go's...Listen to: 'Words' by Missing Persons. It's a great song...Drake Hall: I agree, the Scorps are a respected heavy metal band from way, way back. 25-34 year-old men love 'em...And Jay Miggins: After our St. Patty's Day bash, we belong in the Columbia space shuttle...Going to listen to the new Toto. I hear it's terrific...Got to go."

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY P.D./M.D.-ED LEVINE: "The topic today is 'Tainted Love' by Soft Cell. I have watched that record in markets across the country over the last 6 weeks. And I have watched it make success story after success story, including a station I'm affiliated with in Buffalo, where the album is getting airplay only in WZIR and the clubs, and has been a Top 10 record for a month. Unfortunately, in Buffalo, no one will admit that WZIR has broken that record, so all the other stations are shying away from it. But in Syracuse, we're gonna add the record here at AQX because, to put it bluntly, 'Tainted Love' is a monster. Top 40 record along the same lines as 'Cars' by Gary Numan. I'm not saying it's gonna be a recurrent a year from now. But right now, while it's current, it's important to play the record and we intend to play it...The Krokus album would have been an add this week. But since it arrived a day late, I haven't had a chance to really sit down with it yet. The tunes that strike me off the top are: 'Long Stick' and the re-working of 'American Woman', which just might be the perfect time for that tune to come back...Greg Kihn's album has got three tunes that I feel are just about equally as strong: 'Happy Man', 'Every Day/Saturday', and 'Testify. Here's a guy who's paid his dues long enough, and certainly deserves a break with this album...You can't keep Ozzy out of the news. And with a date coming up in Syracuse in just a couple of weeks, you can't keep the album out of heavy rotation. It's just incredible to me that he managed to play the gig the night after his infamous accident...Go Go's stayed #1 in retail this week...Other interesting developments: 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball' up to #9; and, two 'new' artists, Bryan Adams at #10 and Aldo Nova at #11. New acts are breaking in Syracuse. They just might not be the kind of new acts that certain factions in the record industry would like to break, but, nonetheless, they are now...Duke Jupiter doing well at #17 retail; Gamma at #21; Tommy Tutone at #22; Huey Lewis & The News at #24; and, Dwight Twilley at #25...Probably more new acts are on our Top 25 sales report right now than at any time I can remember in the last two years...The Asia album is pulling down requests. However, after reading everyone, including myself, come across as if they had gotten a new Beatles album last week, I must say that the reaction has been satisfactory, but not mind-blowing at this point...Personals. To Joel Webber: It obviously was Sonny Bono and not myself on the Scorpions cover. There's no way my nose is that big...To Steve Leeds: Keep watchin', you never know...To Tom Starr: Congratulations on your latest and most import add. With our marriages occurring a week apart, you realize now that you have put tremendous pressure on me. By the way, if you've ever seen their concert patches, Tom, the best thing you could hope for is that they give them out at the Utica Auditorium. Nothing would benefit OUR more."

WZZO, BETHLEHEM/ALLENTOWN, PA M.D.-BRUCE BOND: "We have a new 8PM-Midnight jock. He's originally from Allentown, coming from State College, Pennsylvania. He's also the guy I replaced here at WZZO. Rick Strauss starts April 2nd...In music: Joan Jett has been the leader in retail sales for 7 weeks. She's second in requests (next to Ozzy), and we're playing a total of five cuts from the album. We even have photos and ID's from when she stopped by the station. Quite a success story. But we have some reason to believe she might be burning with the older demos. Is anyone else experiencing this?... Also on Retail: J.Geils, Go Go's, Loverboy, and Ozzy Osbourne...Requests were light this week. The Top Five were: Ozzy, Joan Jett, Human League, Soft Cell, and J.Geils Band...I'm very impressed with both the Human League and Soft Cell, and how well they're being accepted by retail and requests. I mean, that's what radio wants and they're delivering...I've been getting some great buzzes on XTC's 'Senses Working Overtime' from friends, other jocks, other stations, and record stores. We've had success with XTC in the past. We'll start it in a light rotation...In Other News: Tom and I were finding cuts on the new Greg Kihn, and 'Every Day/Saturday' blew me out of the meeting. What a great track! My intern wanted to know what song it was after the second time I played it. I can't wait to see this guy in concert again...If you're looking for quality heavy metal, try the new Iron Maiden. This album reminds me of 'The Omen'...And after playing Roger Daltrey for a few weeks, we finally added it...By the way, Aldo Nova and the new Loverboy single go to heavy...Tommy Tutone went last week...Asia gets better and better...Considering: Franke & The Knockouts and Krokus...Thanks to: Biff and Debbie Gould for the visit...It was nice to finally meet Mr. S.L.I.C., Don Wasley from MCA, Bubba Keith of Point Blank, and Sharon and Susan of the Hard Report... P.S. When you get the cassette from FMOB, listen right away."

MWCK, FLINT, MI P.D./M.D.-MARK MILLER: "Krokus goes in this week with their version of 'American Woman'. They're great, and it's a great cover that really let's the band's individuality stand out. Admittedly, the AC/DC influences are there, but the band can really stand on their own two legs... Good stuff in the wings for: Moon Martin, Iron Maiden, Greg Kihn, and Franke & The Knockouts. Unfortunately, limited space prevents early adds, but they do look good for next week...Asia continues its assault with Top 5 sales first week out. Really no surprise when you think about it. If the record's got it, the people will buy it, no matter what you call it. Asia is the closest anyone's come to a perfect record in years...Charlie Daniels 'Still In Saigon' sends chills up my back; and apparently does the same thing to listeners, judging from the phone response. Very topical song and, undeniably, one of Charlie's best."

I look forward to his April appearance with Aldo Nova...When you hear the Rainbow 45, be sure you're sitting down or it'll knock you right over...How can I forget the most exciting record of the week? Hey, I didn't forget. I'm just saving the best for last. Asia--already an overwhelming favorite with WEBN jocks. A beautiful record and well worth all the hype...In closing, Randy Rhoades should become this year's rock and roll poster child."

KAZY, DENVER, CO M.D.-DOUG CLIFTON: "Adds: Asia. What else can be said about this album? We'll start with 'Only Time Will Tell'...The rockin story is 'Kihntinued' on the latest album from Greg Kihn and his band. 'The Breakup Song' has worked well for us for quite sometime, and I can hear lots of possibilities on his latest effort. 'Happy Man' is our first choice, but 'Testify' is my personal favorite. I also like: 'Higher And Higher' and 'Every Love Song'...Franke & The Knockouts is another with lots of material to work from. We'll start with 'Without You'...Other Adds: 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball', 'Roxanne'; Jay Ferguson, 'White Noise'; Dwight Twilley, 'Somebody To Love'; Johnny And The Distractions, 'Complicated Now'; Duke Jupiter, 'I'll Drink To You'; Scorpions, 'No One Like You'; UFO, 'Back Into My Life'; and, Glass Moon, 'On A Carousel'...Plus, Donnie Iris, 'Love Is Like A Rock'; and, Peter Cetera, 'Livin In The Limelight' added and going into a Recurrent category...I guess that will do for now...Retail: Joan Jett still on top...Major Moves: Bonnie Raitt from #16 to #11...Maintaining: Gamma looks strong at #13...Debuts: Simon And Garfunkel enters at #9--not bad for a double Lp...Also, Scorpions enter at #18; and, Huey Lewis & The News at #20...Phones: Joan Jett and J.Geils Band still lead, with: Rick Springfield, Cars, Tommy Tutone, Sammy Hagar, and Huey Lewis & The News building."

WLTX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: "Ear grabbers, pre-release advance cassette: New Jethro Tull and Toto...Just listened to the brand new Point Blank album. Side One sounds awesome...Franke & The Knockouts are gonna shed the image of being a pop singles band and expand their horizons with 'Never Had It Better'...Duke Jupiter sounds like it was made for radio. The melody is a hook in itself...Krokus 'American Woman' stands out. The song speaks for itself...Greg Kihn: I will 'Testify'...We're considering: Charlie Daniels Band and Point Blank for next week...Sales: Scorpions scored #1 after just two weeks out; Asia #4 first week; Rick Springfield #5; Aldo Nova #9; Prism #13; and, Dregs at #16."

WQXM, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-DICK BASCOM: "First, to whoever sent me the lemon and lime: Thank you. They went well with my Marguerita...Tommy Tutone pulling incredible phones. Most notably from the gentleman who has the same phone number, with threats to sue and everything else. We have forwarded his complaints to Ma Bell...Greg Kihn has come up with a tasty followup to 'Rockinroll'. I think 'Testify' has all the makings of a hit...Riggs will keep the modies happy and quiet in their cages for a while. They've been in the area for a couple of weeks, and we're already showing decent sales...Franke & The Knockouts' new album gives just what their name implies--knockout rock and roll...Extremely impressed with sales development on the Scorpions' new album. Second week, a 19-10 jump. Not bad...Asia debuts at #11, with incredible phone reaction...The Rick Springfield continued its great sales pattern, moving 6-5 on the Index--and it's not just kids buying the album. I've checked with the stores selling the most units and the age bracket seems to be 16-25 with wide dispersal."

WQFM, MILWAUKEE, WI ASST. P.D.-MIKE WOLF: "Greetings from Cloud Nine, where the QFM staff is celebrating its designation as Billboard Magazine's AOR Station Of The Year. Hopefully, this will give more attention to the Milwaukee market from those people who have tended in the past to put it off as just a big suburb of Chicago...As far as new music, Franke & The Knockouts have come up with a solid sophomore effort. On the first album, it seems that Franke couldn't decide whether to do rock and roll or MOR. The songs 'Never Had It Better' and 'Keep On Fighting' show that he's definitely decided to do good album rock instead of MOR music. It's got to be one of the best produced albums I've heard so far this year. Looking at the album cover, it's hard to image them getting much done with the speedometer stuck at 120!"

WYNF, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL P.D.-GEORGE HAWRAS: "95YNF in Tampa has a rare full-time air shift open. Also, we need a part-timer. Rock and rollers send a cassette and a resume to me: c/o WYNF, 504 Rep Street, Tampa, FL 33609. M/F EOE."

KBPI, DENVER, CO M.D.-JOE FOLGER: "Thanks for all your help, Pete Schwartz. Everybody at KBPI loves the Asia album. 'Sole Survivor' is mine and Strider's favorite...Also like: Franke & The Knockouts and Krokus. Burton Cummings and the Guess Who have always been one of favorite bands...Charlie Daniels is one of the friendliest musicians I've ever met."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "Franke & The Knockouts have come up with a tremendous left to follow their great solid right. I actually believe that they have skipped an album and progressed to their third in terms of the total package--songs, writing, production, playing, and just a sense of what's right for album rock. 'Keep On Fighting' is a definite heavyweight contender...Krokus may 'out AC/DC' AC/DC on this one. Their rank, their file, and they're just what those kids want...On the other side of our metal twins, Iron Maiden appeals to the more intelligent followers of their genre, a la Black Sabbath and Uriah Heep...Greg Kihn has always been thought of very highly here in the rock and roll capital. With the success of 'The Breakup Song', the rest of the country has caught up with the street, and Mr. Kihn's followup to his first real big hit had to be right on the money. I'd say he came up with a C Note. 'Testify' and 'Happy Man' could find their way onto all formats...Requests on Charlie Daniels seem to be way ahead of sales--I'd say that's a stock problem rather than consumer interest. The problem could be rectified as I'm speaking...Immense interest in Girlschool--seemingly from older males and females...Huey Lewis is finally making headlines...Very good phones on: Asia. Their concert sold out about one-quarter of the house without even having the record out--and now that it's on the air, ticket sales are going like hotcakes."

WSHE, MIAMI, FL KIM FULTS: "The SHE rock and rollers destroyed the team from Rocky's last week in their first softball game, and their next one's coming up this Sunday. We're going to destroy the team from Duncan Volkswagen, because we are the mean machjane."

WTUE, DAYTON, OH M.D.-JIM KINNEY: "It still boggles my mind how nobody plays softer tunes till they are released as singles, even if they're the best songs on the album. Latest example of this is: 'Man On The Corner' by Genesis. Since the album was first released, there was no doubt in our minds that this cut would at least tie for the best song on 'Abacab'. How it could have been avoided till now is beyond me...Other examples are: 'Tonight' by Ozzy Osbourne; and, 'Leather And Lace' by Stevie Nicks. Two top tunes by major album rock radio artists...A light week of adds: Duke Jupiter is the only album...And we Re-Added: Rolling Stones 45...We also put in 'Kristina' by Rick Springfield and 'Get Lucky' by Loverboy...Besides the first three cuts on the Asia album, we're also playing: 'Here Comes The Feeling', which is just as good as the other three--sounds like a single...Joan Jett and J.Geils Band are still way out front in sales...Loverboy takes over #3; Ozzy and Quarterflash still in the Top 10; Rick Springfield moves up to #11...Asia debuts at #18."

KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER: "I'm back after a week-long bout with the Saigon Scum or whatever. That's why I didn't report last week. Anyway, I'm healthy, happy, and ready to roll for another week. The stuff we added in my absence was: The Jam, an incredible effort from one of England's premiere bands. Good strong album with a few R&B tinges as well...Also, my main man, Graham Parker's new release on Arista. We're playing 5 strong cuts off that...Another release from Arista is an English sextet called Haircut One Hundred. This is a nice blend of some jazz, real good sax, funky, but there's a rock and roll base to it. I suggest you check it out. It's good for any format...Greg Kihn, the boys from the Bay, are back on Berserkly, and we're going with 5 songs off the new Kihn album called 'Kihntinued'. There's a nice version of 'Higher And Higher', the old soul tune, on that album as well...David Bowie's 'Cat People', from the movie of the same name, has a real strong single in 'Putting Out The Fire With Gasoline'...A local band, called Q, on MAO Records has an Ep out that we're experiencing real good phones--particularly for 'Playback' and 'Video Girl', which features Stacy Swain on vocals...Missing Persons, a band we've been high on for over a year and a half, finally got picked up by Capitol. They are now nationwide on Capitol with a four-song Ep called 'Missing Persons'. We hope they will do as well around the country as they have for us here in Southern California...We did the following promotions over the last couple of weeks: We had the Midnight Movies, KNAC presents 'Dance Craze' for \$.05 at the UA Theater and, in celebration of the OMD show at the Country Club on March 25th, we had listeners call in and identify OMD songs. They won a souvenir kit which included scarves, an OMD pin, an OMD tie, and an album with the grand prize winner receiving a Casio synthesizer."

WHFS, BETHESDA, MD P.D.-DAVID EINSTEIN: "Good to see The Blasters was picked up by Warner Brothers. We've been on it since the beginning. Even as a smaller label (Slash) Lp, it chalked impressive sales and requests. For initiates, try 'I'm Shakin'' or 'American Music'...A hefty new package from Talking Heads. Good to see years of great music from a great band documented. 'P' rotation--live option--late nights, of course...Genesis B side 'Submarine' mixes Crimson's 'Prince Rupert Awakes/Bolero' with Vangelis a la Pink Floyd, equalling Pink Gelisis."

KBLE, DES MOINES, IA P.D./M.D.-RON SORENSON: "A slight slow down after the deluge of last week. For a change, we look like a normal album station--only 4 adds...Jack Douglas' production of Graham Parker finds G.P. in a slightly more controlled setting. It puts Graham's voice and songs in the spotlight that they deserve. We're leading with the title, 'No More Excuses' and 'Crying for Attention'...The left-fielder here is Haircut One Hundred. Sounds like a cross between The Specials and Dire Straits with the horn section from Chicago and Airto on percussion. Yet, it's still pop enough to be played. Try 'Fantastic Day' or 'Snow Girl'... 'Testify', 'Dedication', and 'Sound System' are out front for us from the new Greg Kihn. Tell me--if Rolling Stone Productions features Greg for a week, will it be the 'Kihntinuous History Of Rock And Roll'?...Adds: Graham Parker, Greg Kihn, Haircut One Hundred, and Alabama."

WQBK, ALBANY, NY P.D.-JOHN COOPER: "Congratulations to Tom Starr on his new arrival. It's great news... Thanks to Jay Miggins for the Nick Lowe promotion, and for the advance listen to Dave Edmunds fine new record...The Springsteen song is a sparkler...Interesting to see that the B52's are outselling the Sammy Hagar (a consultant across-the-board #1 pick) 2 to 1 according to Warners...It's exciting to see records like the B52's, Waitresses, Human League, and Soft Cell actually moving out the doors, as opposed to all the soundalikes just gathering dust in the bins..."...ELLEN MCKINNON: "I gotta try 'Jah Love'--Third World is too cool for words so just play it...Bonnie Raitt is racing up the sales charts. Q104 is presenting Bonnie in concert in late April. It'll be her only area appearance this season. I'll eat Lin Brehmer's socks if that show doesn't sell out. (I'll buy extra tickets myself to save myself from gastric distress)... That new Jam Lp is a real gem. 'Town Without Malice' is, of course, a killer, but there are several real strong cuts on either side that are guaranteed to put some pizzazz back into the airwaves should you (gasp) actually program this band during your broadcast day...Happy Birthday to Dianna Ross--always a personal favorite of mine."

WOUR, UTICA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR: "The sales surge of Asia has retailers around here pinching themselves to make sure they're not dreaming. It's good to see that the stampede of radio acclaim can translate so immediately into sales even in a 1982 economy. Asia debuts #1 retail in Central NY! Go back and read Ray White's comments about the record last week. They're probably not destined to find their way into a print ad but they present, what I think, is the real truth of why this band and this album can survive all the pre-release hype with flying colors. Syndicating those comments could have saved a lot of ink and space in Radio Action last week. Now stop supporting tyranny by being a Yankee fan...There was a time when WOUR was about the only East Coast radio station that had ever heard of Greg Kihn or his label. We're happy to have his new one in and happy to see it 'Kihntinue' developing him on the national scale... Listening with interest to: Haircut One Hundred, Graham Parker, and Moon Martin...Listening with obligation to: Krokus (why do so many macho metal bands have castrado lead vocalists?)...I heard about a new heavy metal concert snack called 'Bone Crunchers'. Are franchises available?...Sorry to see Record World bite the big one. Alan Wolmark steps into the running for the Career Move of the Decade award...Congratulations are in order for: Mavis Brodey, Mike Harris, and WMJQ for landing one of our favorite red heads, Ginger Caldwell...Lin Brehmer, your softball team rules base-paths in the Capitol District, but it has yet to tangle with the legendary WOUR Cellar Dwellers--the Diamond Kings of all of albumrockdom. .750 ball over a 58 game schedule last season ain't chopped liver. So we'll see ya on down the thoroughway this summer, Jack. As for your bowling team, no matter how retched yours is, ours is worse. It seems the members have their minds in the gutter so often that their shots usually end up there too."

The reggae influence could have been great if the songs didn't sound so monotonous. Over all, I had higher expectations...There seems to be a rebirth of late of heavy metal. The Scorpions, Krokus, and now Girlschool all sound great on the air, and we're also seeing really quick reaction, which we haven't found with a new metal record in quite awhile. Also, Girlschool marks the first time a Stiff record has been added here. Welcome to town, Jimmy Mack!...We're keeping busy here with an Asia listening party at Connecticut's largest recording studio, and a CBS/Tommy Tutone video party tomorrow (31st). Plus, a big thanks to Marty and Larry from E/A for the Gamma promotion. It's going to sound h-o-t!..Personal: Condolences to Michael Caplan on the loss of his Dad... Thanks to Harvey and S.L.I.C. for yet another Chinese meal--I was in XTC...And to Robyn: 'Making Love' was an OK movie, but why did you keep telling me, 'Bruce, it's only a movie!?"

WTPA, HARRISBURG, PA P.D.-JEFF KAUFFMAN: "First I want to introduce our new morning man, Lee Arthur. Lee's got great air-shift and production credentials from all over the State. Torrie is our new rock lord, holding down 7-midnight with some very creative programming...FM104 wishes Joanie McCarthy good luck in her new pursuits of happiness. (Film-making and aiding Agent Orange victims). Joanie spent 1½ years of growing into a great job here and if you're looking for a part-timer who knows the business up in New Haven, call me (717-238-1402), and I'll put you in touch with one of the best. (Sorry, part-time is all she has time for)...Asia is burning up the phones! It's nice to have an Lp you can go as deep into as you want...One last thought provoker: Ever notice how some people never call unless they need something?...On the other side of things, thanks to Biff and Debbie at Epic for keeping us informed on Ozzy and his guitarist, and the CDB interview...Added: Krokus."

WPDH, POUGHKEEPSIE, NY M.D.-STEW SCHANTZ: "A light week for adds. Especially standing out is the new record from Graham Parker. Side 2, track 1 is a good follow-up to 'Temporary Beauty'...'Testify' from Greg Kihn is a natural follow-up to the 'Breakup Song'...And, Franke And The Knockouts hit hard below the belt...These songs did especially well on our 'rate a record' test: The Scorpions 'No One Like You' a 7.6; the Jam 'A Town Called Malice' a 7.2; and Bowie's 'Cat People' a whopping 8.0...We had a St. Patty's Day/Cabin Fever party at The Ace In The Hole, a local club. On Wednesday night 600 people turned out for a bikini contest, WPDH beach towels, and various other items of attraction. Not bad for a Wed. night... The Asia record debuted #1 in sales in the Hudson Valley, pushing Joan Jett down to #3 after 2½ months... Also selling well, surprisingly and happily, The Jam, XTC, and the Dregs...Till next time!"

WMAD, MADISON, WI M.D.-DALE WOLTER: "With little or no doubt, my favorite cut this week is 'Yea Right' from the Girlschool record. We've had fine success with 'The Hunter' and 'Race With The Devil' and now that the Lp is finally ready for Americans, it's time to uncork the big one...After evaluating all the positive comments on Charlie Daniels, we've decided to try it out for a while...The Greg Kihn is very good with 'Every Love Song' as my own personal pick...The big news in this area is the emergence of Soft Cell and the Human League as sure-fire phones and sales getters. On our request list for this week, Human League came in at #5 with Soft Cell right behind at #6. They both have solid upward trends saleswise also. If you're not on these records, I humbly advise that you do so. If you are on them, isn't this fun?... It's 3 weeks in a row now for the Go Go's at #1 sales, followed up by J.Geils, Joan Jett, Bonnie Raitt, and Tommy Tutone...Thank you and have a good night!"

WWNV, CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA P.D.-JAY LOPEZ: "Official adds: Point Blank, Franke & The Knockouts, the Beatles, Iron Maiden, David Bowie 'Cat People' 45, 'Death Wish II' soundtrack, Hall & Oates 45, Graham Parker, Karla Bonoff, and the Greg Kihn band...Top record sales: Go Go's, Joan Jett, and J.Geils Band...Would you believe Bob & Doug McKenzie just had their best sales week ever?...Personals: To Rich Bloom: Thanks for coming down. Hope to see you soon...To Ilyse Gottlieb: Our mystery guest. We're never going to be the same!"

WKWF, KEY WEST, FL M.D.-BRUCE YOUNGBLOOD: "Lp adds: Gamma, Asia, Nowherefast, Russell Smith, J.J.Cale, and Lou Ann Barton...Singles: Genesis 12"...New Wave feature: Jam and Visage...All that Jazz: Jeff Lorber Fusion."

WOWD, TALLAHASSEE, FL P.D.-DICK BLACKMON: "Okay, you got me! I'm finally convinced on the Duke Jupiter. It still sounds like the Four Tops but I can't get it out of my head...I finally heard the Bowie too. Once you get past the macabre intro, it's just a good old rock song. And still there are no real negatives on it...Considering: Greg Kihn and Nowherefast...This Nowherefast group has got a great piece of product out, and we should go with that soon...To Doug Sorenson and Doug Podell: Keep up the great work up there...A welcome to the thruway chain to: Frank Holler at WCMF...And, congratulations to: WGRQ's Paul Heine."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL M.D.-CHARLIE LOGAN: "Record of the week: Greg Kihn. Once a year it seems a major musical smile grows on my mug with the release of a veritable vinyl masterpiece by Beserkley's own Greg Kihn. 'Testify' kicks off the shoes of programmers' preconceived notions of Mr. Kihn being too popish; it picks up in even better places than where 'The Breakup Song' left off. I find the reggae-flavored feel to 'Sound System' and 'Tell Me Lies' really refreshing, especially as the warm weather comes upon us in the Southland. I've always been a sucker for old R&B tunes done by rock bands, so 'Higher And Higher' has me hooked too. Twist one up, roll down the windows, and crank it up. I'm impressed, and continually amazed that Greg is not yet a star. I guess that's the price you pay for not conforming in the new music you play. Let's not Tommy Tutone this record...Echoing Bob Bittens' comments of last week about pre-Arbitron paranoia and the consultants game of 'I can be tighter than you can be!', here we go with this week's add: The Scorpions. I'm not really a heavy metal freak, but I've always kinda liked these guys. 'No One Like You' is a real barn burner. It smokes and should hold up well. Plus, the Scorpion cult is ringing the phones off the hook already for this one...Some late comments on 'Secret Policeman's Other Ball': Sting's and Phil Collins' acoustic versions are beyond description, bringing new life to some heavily played material. Another Brockport State grad makes good. Dave Kane, Paul, Louise at SYR, and myself all graduated within a year or two of each other. And who would have believed there was life after BSU! But then again, is this the life we really dreamed about? Oh well, in the immortal words of Steve Tyler--Dream On...P.S. Sure am glad I work nights. It would be murder on my body not to be able to pee until after six."

WMJQ, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-ROBERTA HABER: "Additional thoughts on the Asia Lp: Although Steve Howe's guitar is easily recognizable, the sound of the album owes the most to Emerson, Lake And Palmer at their peak. The obvious conclusion is that Carl Palmer is the driving force behind this band...I just want to 'Testify' what Greg Kihn has done for me. Last year's 'Breakup Song' brought Greg to the brink of superstardom. Maybe this album will push him over the edge into platinum heaven. I don't hear a 'Breakup Song' on this one, but there are a few that come real close. That choppy, 'Start Me Up'-ish opening chorus on 'Testify' got me hooked. 'Happy Man', 'Every Day/Saturday', and 'Higher And Higher' were mighty tasty. But c'mon, Greg, how long can you keep coming up with those hunny album titles? Have some kihnsideation, guy...With each album, Graham Parker's work becomes increasingly settled, which could cause him a few problems with radio in the modern age. This new one is the kind of album that reveals more depth with each listen. 'Fear Not' comes as close as any to being an all-out rocker. My favorite is an incredibly infectious reggae (or is it ska?) tune called 'No More Excuses'... I'm not much of a Jam fan, but I love 'A Town Called Malice'. 'Temporary Beauty' and 'You Hit The Spot' exemplify the best of his new style. A somewhat mellower approach to his still burning compositions...Choice Of The Week: Girlschool--combining the enthusiasm of the Go Go's with a much harder rock 'n roll sound, which sounds great on the air. 'Race With The Devil' is my fave."

KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-TRISH ROBBINS: "Hot on the turntables: Lou Ann Barton, Dregs, "SPOB" (especially Sting), Eye To Eye, Michael Smotherman, Lee Ritenour, Winton Marselles, Rita Marley, Gamma, The League, Frankie Blue, Carole King, Full Moon, Karla Bonoff, Jeff Lorber, Jools Holland -- Shall I go on? Okay. Levon Helm, OMD, Graham Parker, etc...Also (I'm indicating now), Chubby Checker 'Harder Than Diamond' is a HIT. Play this record on all stations and see...KTIM is right in the thick of things in the next few weeks. 'Happy Man' and 'Testify' bring out standout tracks...Plenty to choose from on Franke & The Knockouts. 'Keep On Fighting' gets our technical KO in the third round award, and 'Just What I Want' has some well-placed guitar...Asia is wiping up! The term 'supergroup' is finally applicable, and I mean supergroup in the sense of an aggregate of significant talents from past super bands...Senses now working time and a half. Now, where's our bottle of Cuervo, Leeds?"

WKQQ, LEXINGTON, KY ASS'T. P.D.-DAVE KRUSENKLAUS: "Got some good concerts coming to town next month. Looking forward to the Police and Joan Jett on April 4th. What an interesting cross-section of audiences this show should provide. Joan Jett catching the younger set, and the Police the older age groups and college folks. The show is selling well and I understand the bill is selling well elsewhere...Also, Charlie Daniels is on the way. The new Charlie Daniels' single is getting early positive phone reaction. The ballads sound good on this record. The quality sounds on par with the first record. I think the improvement lies with the rock tunes. More hooks and better thought out. My favorites are 'Keep On Fighting' and 'Never Had It Better'... 'No One Like You' from the Scorpions will be a monster album rock track, no question. I've heard it a couple of times on the radio and it sounds great...I also expect the kids to fall in line on Krokus' 'Long Stick'. This cut sounds so much like AC/DC the kids are gonna think we resurrected Bon Scott. With a song like this, I think it could present a double-edged sword. Since it sounds so much like AC/DC, it should present good recognition for the song, but perhaps not immediate recognition for the band...The first I listened to the Greg Kihn album all the way through, I was a little disappointed. It didn't seem to have the energy of 'Rockihnroll'. But, second listen proved decisive. This record sounds better than the last one. More interesting, and deeper. It was tough to choose between 'Testify' and 'Happy Man' but we'll start with 'Testify' here...Sales maulers: Joan Jett, Go Go's, new Rick Springfield, Loverboy, and also Simon & Garfunkel and Bonnie Raitt are showing up well."

WRNW, BRIARCLIFF MANOR, NY M.D.-PAT PRINCIPATE: " Franke & The Knockouts, 'Below The Belt' is like their last record--a delight! The record rocks a bit more than the last one, and I'm betting 'Never Had It Better' to be the single and the first s-m-a-s-h from the record! So many bands have a homogenized sound, and speaking honestly, I never expected to hear from this group again--I'm glad I was wrong. 'Below The Belt' is a cut above!...Exploding onto the add list, along with the Knockouts, is The Jam. When we added the single, 'A Town Called Malice', I told you I felt it was contagious and outrageous. Well, it still holds, except I have to say that for the entire Jam album--so here goes--it's contagious and outrageous, and this record should finally awake the American audience up to the sound of The Jam!...Glad to be seeing Gamma 3 is doing so well. I really didn't want to eat all the Gamma records in the studio!...I'm having a bout of the vapors since last week, so I'm going to keep all the comments short and go right to our adds: Franke & The Knockouts, The Jam, Greg Kihn, Graham Parker, and Joan Jett's 12".

KLAQ, EL PASO, TX M.D.-ROB ROMAN: "Adds: Iron Maiden, Krokus (as an album), and Greg Kihn...I'm here to testify that Greg Kihn is definitely continuing where he last left off. 'Testify' is definitely stronger than 'The Breakup Song', and we know how successful that was. The man has finally found his niche, and if he continues he should pump out the hits for a long time...I can't say enough about the new Scorpions. After just one week, #2 in sales in the city and you can't do that with just a cult following. It certainly appears these folks have finally arrived--tune in next week to see that it's not a fluke...#1 in sales: Rick Springfield. The man continues to show that he has gained acceptance with our core audience and even with a harder edge to his music, has not lost his mass appeal...Look for Asia to jump right into Top 10 in sales this week. NBC Radio's Young Adult Network

Denny Somach procudes the report for the NBC Source Radio Network, fed daily to over 174 stations. You can get in touch with Denny at 19 Rock Hill Road, Bala Cynwyd, PA 19004; 219-667-5118. The following are excerpts from this week's report.

The new JETHRO TULL Lp called "Broadsword And The Beast" will be released April 1st. It is the first time in 10 albums that they've called on an outside producer, PAUL SAMWELL-SMITH. The former YARDBIRDS bassist had production credits for albums by CARLY SIMON and CAT STEVENS, among others. TULL will start a world tour in the Summer in Europe, before heading to the States in the Fall.

We are told that the new PETE TOWNSHEND album is in its final stages and now has an expected release date in June. The full title of the Lp is "Only The Best Cowboys Have Chinese Eyes". TOWNSHEND says that it's some of his best stuff yet.

The ROCK REPORT has learned that Santana has just finished their as-yet-untitled follow-up to "Zebop" at the Automat in San Francisco. The new record was co-produced by the band and keyboardist GREG ROLLIE, an original member of SANTANA who recently left JOURNEY to pursue a solo career. We can expect a May release with a tour to follow.

NOVO COMBO's guitarist JACK GRIFFITH has left the band. He was replaced by CARLOS RIOS who is known for his work with QUINCY JONES and STANLEY CLARKE, among others. NOVO COMBO has just begun rehearsals for their second studio effort.

BILLY THORPE has completed 15 tracks for his next record which he expects to release the beginning of July. They are deciding on a title. The new one could be called "All Hell Broke Loose" or "Rock And Roll Religion". THORPE's producer SPENCER PROFFER described the Lp as "harder hitting, more melodic, and recorded in a way that gives it a live sound"...PROFFER also told the ROCK REPORT that TED NUGENT is about to return to Pasha Records with CARMINE APPICE and engineer LARRY BROWN to record his next album. After that, PROFFER will produce a tune that APPICE and RICK DERRINGER just wrote and hope to release as a single.

FM is currently doing demos in a Toronto studio for an upcoming Lp. The band says they'll have a surprise producer when they get into the studio to record the album by early May, with release expected for early July. FM just completed a short Canadian tour where they debuted tunes for the new Lp. We can expect to see FM on RUSH's next full-world tour starting in August.

Former LITTLE FEAT guitarist PAUL BERRERE has started recording a solo Lp at studios in Atlanta. Backed by the DREGS, and former KANSAS vocalist and keyboardist STEVE WALSH, BERRERE's recording the album with former KANSAS producer, JEFF GLIXMAN, and hopes to have it finished by June with a tour to follow in July.

Question Of The Week

This week's Question was inspired by all the Krokus/AC/DC comparisons we've been hearing lately. What are your thoughts on similar sounding bands? Who is it okay to sound like? Who is it not okay to sound like? And who are the most imitated groups?

JOEL WEBBER, INDEPENDENT: "Rock and roll is based on somebody sounding similar to somebody else and taking it from there. So artistically, there's precedence for copping a similar sound in rock and roll. These days it's obviously cool to sound like Bon Scott, but very uncool to sound like AC/DC's current lead singer...Most imitated would be Robert Plant, Pat Benatar, Lou Graham, and David Bowie. There are some people I would love to see more imitations of if it could be done, like Brian Ferry, Gaddy Lee, and Neil Young.

MIKE BONE, ARISTA: "Wow! I never noticed that AC/DC sounded like Krokus before! (Just kidding, folks). Obviously, 'Long Stick Goes Boom' sounds like the pre-Brian Johnson AC/DC. As a big fan of the old AC/DC I think the song 'Long Stick Goes Boom' sounds better than anything on the last AC/DC album 'For Those About To Rock'. It's surprising that no one has picked up on the catchiness of the lyrics in 'Long Stick Goes Boom'. Several of the lines are from previous Krokus songs that got significant airplay ('Mr. 69', 'Burning Bones', 'Bedside Radio', etc.) Simply put 'Long Stick Goes Boom' is a well-crafted song and Marc Storate sings his ass off. Now that everyone has the entire Krokus 'One Vice At A Time' album, a simple skip through both sides produces a wealth of great songs. My favorite is 'Down The Drain'. Let me state flatly that for this genre Marc Storate has the definite voice. The timbre of his voice speaks directly to the AOR market...Who is it okay to sound like? Foreigner, Styx, Journey, Kansas, and Yes. (Ask Asia)...It's not okay to sound like Placido Domingo, Hoge Carmichael, John Denver, Kate Smith, or Ravi Shankar...Most imitated: Beatles, Stones, Free, Led Zeppelin, or Skynyrd."

KEN BENSON, EMI: "Similar sounding bands are an obvious part of musical evolution. The faceless syndrome is not unusual. We know what Elvis looked like, but how many people would recognize Gene Vincent and the Blue Caps? The same is true in the 60's with the Beach Boys imitators such as the Safaris. Thousands of bands sound similar to the Beatles. That was the sound of the mid-60's. But who complained about the Hollies, Jerry and the Pacemakers, etc. The point is, whenever a sound is successful, there are imitators who are usually one shot artists such as the McCoys, Swingin' Medallions, etc. If the big selling bands of the day seem faceless, it's probably because the critics refuse to see...I think it's okay to sound like a hit and not okay to sound like a stiff...The top 5 imitated bands are usually the top 5 selling bands. So I guess it would be AC/DC, Journey, Foreigner, Yes, and Led Zeppelin. My nomination for the most imitated artist of all times is Chuck Berry--so let it rock."

JIM MCKEON, COLUMBIA: "My thoughts on similar sounding bands are essentially the same as similar sounding disc jockeys and similar sounding radio stations. Basically, it's okay to sound like yourself and not okay to sound like The Knack, Ozzy Osbourne (or look like him), the Monkees, Bruce Springsteen, or Jimi Hendrix. The most imitated groups are: The father of us all, the Beatles, for which nearly everything is derived. The Stones, who spawned the Yardbirds and Led Zeppelin, who spawned Free and Bad Company, from which we get power chords and power vocal bands like Journey, Foreigner, etc. King Crimson, ELP, Yes, David Bowie (the so-called art rocker), who begot synthesizer bands and 'the' bands like Talking Heads, Cars, Soft Cell, and B52's. The Creedance and Allman Bros. Bands gave birth to Southern rock. My only comment is as we used to say in the 60's, 'Do your own thing'."

ALAN WOLMARK, ATLANTIC: "After 30 years of rock and roll, it's virtually impossible to not sound like someone. The essence of good creative music is music that can take existing sounds, adapt them, synthesize them, and innovate upon them to create a new form. Because in any great artist's music, his roots should be fairly easily recognizable...The top most imitated bands are Foreigner and the Beatles, along with Roxy Music, AC/DC, Free and the Police...It's cool to sound like Foreigner, Roxy Music, It's A Beautiful Day, and Genesis. It's not cool to sound like AC/DC, the Beatles, Police or Led Zeppelin...I find today's most popular copy/sound alike bands to be Loverboy, the Cars, Ozzy Osbourne, Shooting Star, and the Police."

STEVE LEEDS, S.L.I.C.: "The quote that's most relevant here is 'imitation is the highest form of flattery'. Since music is supposed to be creative, bands that imitate instead of initiate prove that they are only in it for the money. Of course, in this age of tight playlists and conservative politics, it doesn't speak well to be different or unique, so the artist must decide whether he wants to be a true artiste or business man. If you consider this, you'll probably note the more successful ventures have been a combination of both. The difficulty in electing who to sound like is you're trying to second-guess the fickle face of the public. So if music is truly art, then go create and see how the marketplace responds...Beatles, Foreigner, AC/DC (as of late), Chuck Berry and anything Phil Spector ever touched."

JIMMY MACK, STIEF: "It creates a Catch 22 situation where there isn't anything new or exciting enough to stand out and make the difference that translates into record sales. It's an old axiom, but radio encourages similar unchallenging familiar sounds from new artists; henceforth the record companies respond with such, and anything remotely adventurous or groundbreaking is left to the cut-out bins. It's a vicious cycle. It's okay to sound like any band who can inspire you to do something different. Not everyone can sound completely different for everyone else. People have been playing the same riffs since Chuck Berry. It's not okay to consciously emulate the sound of a successful band in order to cash in on its success...Foreigner, Stones, Ramones, Elvis Costello, and the Pretenders."

CURT GARY, WEBN: "I think it's quite alright to have a similar sound as long as your material outweighs the similarity. But let us not forget that there are those bands that polarize their audience. I'd say one of the toughest acts to sound like and not get away with is Bruce Springsteen or David Bowie or Pat Benatar...It's okay to sound like AC/DC, Tommy James, Count Basie, Etta James, and Big Joe Turner... Top 5: Leonard Skynyrd, Led Zeppelin, Deep Purple, The Who, and Blue Oyster Cult. The most imitated bands are other local bands."

JIM BUCKLEY, WRCN: "There has to be room for them 'cause there are so many. What they are basically doing is riding on the coattails of an established sound or artist. At the time, it's probably okay to sound like Journey or AC/DC, but don't try to duplicate the Stones or Beatles 'cause groups like that are second to none...Top 5: AC/DC, Journey, REO, Styx, and Hendrix."

JACK DANIELS, WROQ: "I think it's okay to a point. If you have too many bands that sound like AC/DC, then you have to start looking at the individual song. I think it's okay to sound like anybody if you do it well. But you should stay away from sounding like artists that have already peaked...Top 5: AC/DC, Van Halen, Styx, Molly Hatchet, and Yes."

ILYSE GOTTLIEB, WRXL: "So long as it's not direct plagerism, I think it's okay to follow in the tradition of someone else's sound. If it's a direct hit on another band and is intended to be just that, then it's an insult to the person doing the copying. I think an artist has to develop their own sound; and if it happens to sound like someone else, they should follow-through regardless. After all, there are only so many sounds that there can be. Combinations of styles that make up your own original style is what it is all about...Top 5: Led Zeppelin, AC/DC, Eagles, Jimi Hendrix, and the Beatles."

J. DAVID HOLMES, KDKB: "Springsteen, obviously is cloned a lot. He's the first real person that comes to mind. Of course, there have always been Beatles' sound alike, but none that have really come close to capturing the magic of that era...I think it's okay to be a sound alike band, if you also incorporate a style of your own and have a flare for songwriting. For instance, Johnny and the Distractions' record does sound an awful lot like a Springsteen-ish band, but it's still got enough of their own identity to come across and make you want to listen."

QUESTION CONTINUED

BOB LINDER, WDHA: "Would you repeat that? I'm going deaf...Imitation may be the highest form of flattery, but frankly, originality is what we're looking for...I expect to see a rash of female rockers suddenly coming out imitating Joan Jett, and I'm sure we're going to see Police clones shortly."

BOBBIN BEAM, WLPX: "I think it's sad when a band thinks it has to clone another band in order to cop an identity. It's okay if a band cops or derives a band from an older band, because then a band is drawing from rock and roll roots...Top 5: AC/DC, Van Halen, Pink Floyd, and Southern rock bands."

RICK BALIS, KSHE: "It's always great to run across a new group with a fresh innovative and/or unique style. But there's certainly nothing wrong with new groups drawing from those groups that have already made a niche for themselves in the rock and roll world. We've got to keep in mind that it appears typical for industry people as well as listeners to compare new group 'A' to old group 'B'. The comparisons are made simply in an effort to describe the new group in terms that are easily understood. Again, I don't see anything objectionable to trying to draw from established groups-whether they are the Fleetwood Mac or AC/DC type, unless efforts are made to outright duplicate that group. I think many listeners object to new groups that seem to try to Xerox the musical style of another group."

MIKE LYONS, WDIZ: "There's really no problem as long as they have the songs. It's not okay to sound like Bruce or Megan McDonough. Better to sound like Zeppelin, Floyd and The Who...Top 5: Zeppelin, Floyd, REO, Springsteen, and Blue Cheer."

DRAKE HALL, KTXQ: "There are fair and unfair comparisons, and being compared to AC/DC or Springsteen is the kiss of death for a whole lot of bands. For instance, I've noticed that Thin Lizzy is sounding a lot more like Quarterflash, and has Huey Lewis been listening to his Scorpions albums again? Come on, Hugh Baby, cut it out...On the other hand, all these guys who have graduated from the Steve Marriot School of Singing can't help but sound alike...I'm hard-rocked out, and these tortured vocal cords are giving me a pain where the sun don't shine."

ALAN SNEED, KSRR: "I think it is very dangerous at this point for Krokus to sound like AC/DC because we are starting to see a tremendous burn on AC/DC at this particular point. With successful mass appeal bands, on the other hand, the exact opposite could be true. Obviously sounding like Journey is not hurting Prism or Survivor...I'm hearing a lot of Slick, pop rock, for lack of a better phrase, bands that sound a great deal like Journey. So, I'm going to have to say that bands are recording a lot of material in that particular Journey/Foreigner vein I think."

SKY DANIELS, WLUP: "In this particular instance, Chicago obviously is the heart of the metal midwest, so having a heavy metal sound is a plus. Personally, I do not like direct derivation that shows no original vision. However, in the case of Krokus and AC/DC, the uncanny similarities of the ability to reach that highly successful sound is a plus in Krokus' favor. Let's fact it, as Keith Richards once said, 'For the last 25 years everybody has been running over Chuck Berry riffs, anyway'...Most imitated bands: Styx, Journey, Foreigner, Axis, and then you have the old line Geffen Axis--the Asylum days of Jackson Browne, Eagles, Poco, et al...Then there is the Southern rock scene, etc."

STEVE FEINSTEIN, WYSP: "It's an easy way to make a fast buck, but it's lethal in the long term. The band gets pigeonholed as being a rip-off. I've got a new name for this kind of derivative music--ersatz rock...Most imitated: I'd say 5 different schools: 1-Yes/Genesis pomp rock; 2-Bowie's mannered art rock; 3-Foreigner/Zeppelin mach rock; 4-Neil Young singer/songwriter/desert rock; and 5-Sex Pistols/Ramones nihilist rock...The most egregious example is with Starcastle's blatant Yes ripoff a couple of years back."

WARREN WILLIAMS, KATT: "One thing that sticks out to me is that any album that's engineered by Tony Platt has that specific sound. Starfighters had that sound as well. It seems that there's a lot of Loverboy-sounding bands. Loverboy seems to be a genre of sound, and I don't know if I can criticize people for sounding like other people or not. Maybe they think that's what it takes to get airplay. Can they be faulted for that--trying to get on the radio? I don't know who's to blame. I certainly would like to see a diversity of sounds, but you got to get started somehow."

ROB ROMAN, KLAQ: "It's hard for me to be very objective about Krokus, because I've been following that particular band for quite some time. When you use the producer who made AC/DC's sound, you're gonna come out sounding like AC/DC. I don't believe it was a conscious effort on their part because they're just producing the best rock and roll they can...In general, it depends on how the album stands up cut to cut. If they make one track to sound like an already successful song, it doesn't hold up for me. If the whole album sounds that way all through, that says to me that this group has decided this is their appropriate sound. If the band copied is a favorite, it will not matter at all. If the sound is from their favorite artist, we do get negative calls...Most imitated: Springsteen, AC/DC (right now)."

TOMMY NAST, WSYR: "I would say it would be cool to sound like a Journey or REO Speedwagon, or any kind of a heavy guitar, vocal sound...It ain't cool to sound like Ted Nugent these days, because, sorry Teddy, you just ain't happening no more...The Krokus/AC/DC thing--sure there's similarities there, but a lot of power and emotion that comes out of some of these records and people have been sounding like other people for ages now, and I'm sure it will still continue."

THE DOCTOR, WYFE: "No problem in sounding like other bands if they do it well. It doesn't matter to me if they are cloning themselves, it's basically the sound I'm gonna be looking at. One band in particular that was around the Champagne-Urbana area was a band called Starcastle. They were Yes clones. A comment that I heard which I thought was kind of funny was that they sounded more like Yes than Yes. And in some ways they did, but that didn't alter my thinking of the band. I still liked the band. It didn't matter to me that they sounded like Yes. That wasn't their original intention, I believe."

ED LEVINE, WAQX: "First off, as I mentioned in my comments, new acts are breaking in Syracuse, i.e., Aldo Nova, Bryan Adams, Prism, Dwight Twilley. Now I mentioned this to a certain record person the other day and he tried to put aside Aldo Nova by saying 'Yeah, but that sounds like everybody else'. To me that's not important. What's important is that a new act is breaking. Now if you want to qualify it as a new act that sounds totally different than everything else, then you're gonna have a hard time breaking acts on the radio. But I think new acts are definitely breaking. It's a mainstream sound that the bands are doing because, very bluntly, that's what people want to hear on the radio and if you want to become rich and famous, like most folks do, that would seem to be the easiest way to do it...The most imitated bands on the radio? That's a tough question--is Journey imitating Foreigner, or is Loverboy imitating Journey, or is Aldo Nova imitating Jimi Hendrix? How far back do you want to take it? You could say a band is imitating Foreigner, but then again, Foreigner is imitating Bad Company, and Bad Company was really imitating Free. So, I think it's probably just easier to say that any of the bands that are top bands right now--will have imitators. The Police have already had imitators. The Go Go's have a few imitators out there that shall remain nameless...I think it would be uncool to imitate Ozzy Osbourne at this point. His act is his act--and anyone who would try to imitate him would just come across as a total imitation. One of Ozzy is enough."

- TOM STARR, WOUR: "What?! I can't hear the question. I'm tired of listening to them..!"
- RON PHILLIPS, WQDR: "I think it may be helpful for radio purposes to deliver a more consistent sound, but I don't think that it's going to sell many records...I prefer not to hear imitations of anyone... Most imitated: Led Zeppelin, Pink Floyd, Bruce Springsteen, AC/DC, and Brinsley Schwartz."
- ART PHILLIPS, KILO: "In this day and age, it seems to be the song that's more important than the band. So if 'American Woman' or 'Long Stick' sounds like AC/DC, as long as the song stands on its own that's what really is important...It's never cool to sound like the Beatles or Stones. I think it's fine to sound like Dickey & The Don'ts...I think there's a major Loverboy sound-alike and then AC/DC, Zeppelin or any other bands from the Great White North."
- DAVE LANGE, WDVE: "My thoughts are probably similar to someone else's...It's okay to sound like yourself and it's not okay to sound like Brenda Lee...REO Speedwagon, Kevin Cronin, and Gary Rich Rasmussen's guitar work."
- DAVE KRUSENKAUS, WKQQ: "I think if the song is good it's healthy for song recognition, but could be a problem in establishing the identity of the band. I don't think it's a problem for radio when the sound-alikes are kept to a minimum. I don't want every record coming in here sounding like Bon Scott... It's not okay for a rock and roll band to sound like Air Supply. As long as it's kept to a minimum, it's okay to sound like anything that's been successful in the past...AC/DC, Cars, Steely Dan, Journey, and Styx are the most imitated."
- DICK BASCOM, WQXM: "Diane, our midday lady, came up with a real obvious sound-alike. Aldo Nova's 'Fantasy' sounds extremely like 'Jane' from the Starship. I'd have to say that unless it's a blatant ripoff, there's nothing really wrong with sounding alike, or maybe a better word is familiar...I would have to say it doesn't really matter who you sound like, as long as you don't sound too much alike, and therefore, have trouble establishing your own identity...Top 5: AC/DC, Loverboy, Quarterflash, Pat Benatar, and Styx, and Wazmo Nariz."
- LIN BREHMER, WQBK: "Boy, do I have thoughts on similar sounding bands. The proliferation of clone bands on records and clone bands in nightclubs is destroying the music business. People don't want to spend \$8.00 for a new record that has no distinctive qualities. People generally seem much more interested in records that strike them in some way as unique. I think that's being demonstrated currently by the success of a wide variety of new music bands...As far as the record company seems concerned, it's okay to sound like REO Speedwagon or AC/DC. I don't think it's okay to sound like anybody... Definitely I have to say Styx, REO Speedwagon, AC/DC, Lynyrd Skynyrd, and a tip of the hat to Roxy Music for their pervasive influence."
- BRIAN LEONARD, WDKE: "They're as hard to distinguish as Fernando Lamas and Ricardo Montalban. It shouldn't be desirable to sound like anyone, but to sound like your own artistic instincts...It's not okay to sound like Boxcar Willie."
- ROBERTA HABER, WMJQ: "I don't think it does anybody any good to sound like an exact replica of someone else. To me it says that they can't come up with anything original of their own. To listen to a good band and take what they have to offer and then interpret that in your own way is another story. We've been doing that with the Beatles and the Rolling Stones for years. But clone bands are a waste of everyone's time...Top 5: Beatles, Stones, Led Zeppelin, Pink Floyd and The Doors."
- DUKE MEYER, WQMF: "I really don't think it's their fault. I think it's radio or listeners of radio that dictate a sound they want to hear. And too many bands go for the sound instead of really good music. I don't think it's okay to sound like anybody. They should go for their own style. AC/DC, Journey/REO sound, Zeppelin sound (like on the Billy Squier album), Supertramp sound (like Light)."
- TED EDWARDS, WCOZ: "So few people ever have original ideas that if I were to discount any given band because they sounded like another band, that would probably be about half the ones I'm playing now. Certainly there are many bands that sound so much alike that it becomes a programming problem, such as, AC/DC and Krokus. I more or less have to leave it to the songs themselves, rather than the sound of the band, to influence our decision on whether we'll play it or not. It's okay to sound like all my favorite bands and not okay to sound like the bands I hate. I don't think it would be fair to make a top 5. I think what it basically comes down to is that a lot of people have the same idea at the same time and the one that finds itself with success first is the one that everyone else finds themselves being accused of imitating."
- BRUCE BOND, WZZO: "If the group is doing a better job, let 'em do it...Foreigner, Journey, and REO Speedwagon all seem to get imitated a lot...Also Pat Benatar and probably soon, Rick Springfield."
- JIM KINNEY, WTUE: "To a certain extent, just about everybody sounds like everybody else. There are, of course, obvious exceptions--Pink Floyd does not sound like Molly Hatchet. I think it's really impossible to generalize--each individual case has to be dealt with individually. One person I can think of that it didn't really work out well for was Robin Trower sounding a lot like Hendrix towards the beginning of his career. Even though I do not think it was a rip-off, I think Starfighters suffered to a certain extent because, besides the lead singer, they sounded exactly like AC/DC...Asia sounds like Yes with Greg Lake as the lead singer, and I don't think they are going to suffer at all."
- DAVID FILIPOV, WBRU: "Imitation of a style, especially if it hasn't been exploited, is usually okay. For example Dire Straits and Eric Clapton have pretty much taken J.J. Cale's style as their own. It becomes annoying when you have 10,000 Boston or Foreigner sound-alikes...Nick Lowe, The Jam, Joe Jackson, Greg Kihn and Dire Straits all sound a lot like several different groups."
- JUDY MCNUTT, KGB-FM: "Yawn...Five most imitated are Buddy Holly, Stones, Foreigner, The Cars, and Sun Ra."
- DAVE LOGAN, WLAV-FM: "I wish I worked for K-Tell records. I'd put out an album with music from Loverboy, Prism, Le Roux, Wrabit, and Franke and the Knockouts and call it 'Head-Band Rock'. The key would be not identifying any of the bands--it would sell a million...It's okay to sound like Pink Floyd and Led Zeppelin--although no one can. Asia seems to do pretty good sounding like Yes and ELP with Greg Lake singing...All the heavy metal bands that still use dry ice machines are the most copied."
- RON NENNI, WPYX: "It seems to be fashionable for a lot of new bands to emulate Foreigner and Led Zeppelin, obviously. Did you ever notice how much Steve Perry of Journey models his vocal phrasing after Sam Cooke?...I think it's okay to sound like anybody as long as the band creates their own identity within the clone. Definitely not cool to sound like The Beatles, Stones, or Pink Floyd--just can't do it. I've already mentioned Foreigner and Led Zeppelin--also Chuck Berry, Loverboy (recently) and REO."
- BUCK McWILLIAMS, WIOT: "Blame it on Mutt Lange...It's not okay to sound like Joan Armatrading if you want your album to sell. If you want your album to get played, sound like Foreigner, Journey, Shooting Star, etc."
- JIM MONAHAN, WNEW-FM: "I think more bands should sound like the Monkeys. They made great pop records... The Top 5 sound-alikes--everything to me in terms of clone rock seem to sound like Foreigner and Journey and REO."

QUESTION CONTINUED

JOSE DIAZ, WBLM: "In general, I think the ones who make it are the ones who end up maintaining a melodic content to their songs. So, if there's anybody out there that can do AC/DC in a more melodic way than AC/DC does, and with that intensity, they do have a potential to overtake AC/DC in their same audience... It's not okay to sound like a skinny-tie, new wave type of band. It is okay to sound like Journey, and REO... Most imitated right now are Journey and REO. But, if you go back and get into the history of rock and roll, a lot of credit should be given to Toto. With all due respect, because their new album is great, but Toto, on their first album defined a certain type of rock and roll that has now become a part of album rock and who knows, this could bode well for this new LP because they've come back to sort of reclaim what they had going there a few years back!"

CRAIG MARTIN, KZOK: "Always being a big fan of music, sometimes I'm full of distain from the face that they seems to sound alike and are kind of going for that formula sound to get on the air. But, when you think about it, it's not such a bad thing because what the people seem to like these days is good rock and roll with good production and strong vocals. I think one of the groups that the newer ones are modeling themselves after has got to be Foreigner. Loverboy took that Foreigner sound and added to it and the new Franke & The Knockouts album reminds me of Loverboy a lot in general style and production. Maybe artistically it's not the greatest thing, but it gives the people what they want and as long as people keep buying them, it's what we're here to serve them with!"

DANA JANG, KOME: "I think with similar sounding bands, it's a little difficult to hear the song because you're always comparing it to the original band as far as airplay--if it's a good song, we're still gonna play it. For instance, Quarterflash, on first listen sounded to us like Pat Benatar but eventually 'Harden My Heart' and 'Find Another Fool' had enough merit that we began playing the record and obviously it has been very successful... What I get from listeners is that they are confused initially and then it depends on how well the company does marketing the product. The song usually emerges first and then the artists' name comes second... Most copied: Recently AC/DC, also Steely Dan, Foreigner/Bad Company sound."

STEVE HUNTINGTON, WWL (LOVE94): "Is it too much to ask for something original?"

RON SORENSON, KBLE: "Sure, it's okay to sound like someone else. As long as there is a successful band, there will be people who try to cop that style. I don't have any problem with it, and as long as we're not getting a Steely Dan album, I'm real glad to have a Sneaker record."

MARC MILLER, WBCN: "It's really not okay to sound like anyone except yourself because it's boring. The most imitative band I can think of right now is Franke and the Knockouts. They sound like everybody... The most imitated band is Foreigner, who sort of imitated Bad Company, who sort of imitated Free, who sort of imitated the early Kinks and Yardbirds, who sort of imitated old blues records--you figure it out!"

DOUG PODELL, KQRS: "I think it sounds to me like a lot of people are starting to copy the Police, in particular, The Jam, on this new album. It looks like it's cool to really copy AC/DC right now, with the blatant voice returns from Krokus. It also looks like it's very popular to sound like Rick Springfield. More and more people are coming up with that pop sound for young audiences, but I can live with it. Another band being imitated right now are the Go Go's. If not by sound, by name alone... It's not cool to imitate Led Zeppelin anymore."

Record Action

MIKE BONE, ARISTA (212-489-7400): "In late May of 1976 I walked into the Marquis Club in London to be introduced to what would become an obsession with me, Graham Parker. This little British guy from Deep Cut hit the stage like an atomic bomb and sang his ass off for an hour and 45 minutes. The Club was packed and needless to say went crazy. Since that day I have had the good fortune to be able to promote all of the Graham Parker albums except 'Squeezing Out Sparks'. In my humble opinion, Graham Parker's collection of songs will be remembered by music historians in the future as a significant contribution to rock music during our time period. Graham has not made millions. He is not one to tour the large arenas, nor has he had that much sought-after item, a hit single. He is one of the greatest living songwriters and performers. In the past he has worked his ass off at every dive, coast to coast, and certainly deserves mass recognition. If you haven't taken the time to really get into 'Another Grey Area', you should be ashamed of yourself. You are not doing your job. If you are not programming 'Another Grey Area' due to all the other alleged heavy releases, you are doing your audience a disservice, and speaking one on one, can these 'heavyweights' songs match up to Graham Parker's songs? You be the judge."

MARKO BABINEAU, A&M (213-469-2411): "Life on the road again. I just finished one of the most pleasurable road trips through the lush and beautiful Midwest. First stop Chicago: I've finally seen Bryan Adams live. Wow! What a show! Now I know why Foreigner won't let him go. By the way, it's good to see you again, Skyboy, but is it true when you were at Enrico's you were really hitting on all those waiters? Well, that's what Dana told me... And Dave Benson, you're still beautiful and I'll meet you at the Palm at 6... Without a doubt, one of the high points of my trip was going into the heartland of Kentucky with Denton Marr to see his world renowned Rockduster at Le Grange Penitentiary. I must admit this band held a captive audience. The only stipulation was you'd be shot if you left early. I had a wonderful time, Denton, thank you... Moving right along, off to the Motor City. I don't know about you, but the first station I stop at is Lafayette Cooney Dogs, the meanest hot dog in the Midwest... To Mark Miller: The only man I know who has ever convinced me to buy a record. It's true Asia is great, and where's my jacket, you creep?... To the boys at WLAV-FM, David and Tony get the Sickness Award of the Year. Tony, you are one wild and crazy guy. I won't even get into it, but you're the cat's meow, or is it the hair of the dog?... To me bucko--I owe you one... Favorite Record of the Week: Haircut One Hundred, 'Love Plus One'. I even like it better than Flock Of Seagulls... New on the A&M horizon: Watch for the new Split Enz album titled 'Time And Tide', and also Squeeze 'Sweets From Strangers'. Two records you can't miss... To Tommy Nast and the boys in Upstate New York: Lookout, I'll see you in April."

JIM SELLERS, CHRYSALIS (212-935-8750): "The biggest 'News Story' of the year continues--Huay Lewis and the News have announced a national tour! After video appearances on 'Friday's' and 'American Bandstand', you'll now get to see one of America's most exciting new bands in the flesh. Thirty-six cities have already been booked with more coming. Radio has come through with flying colors in support of this LP, and this tour will show everyone that this is no flash-in-the-pan unit, but a true star band. From all of us, thank you radio for your support... UFO continues on their successful tour in support of the Madman Blizzard. They've gotten great response at every show. If you haven't given this album a shot, you're missing some great songs that are the essence of what album radio is all about. 'Doing It All For You' does just that. It gives your listener everything they wanted to hear on your station. Go back and give it another listen... Personal: Condolences to Ozzy and the band on the loss of their lead guitarist... Personal faves: Leisure Process, Bowie single, Silencers... Congrats to Wynn Jackson's Fort Nox... Enjoyed the Beatles interview on the B side of the promo single. John Lennon is conspicuous by his absence. Unless there was some sort of contractual problem, seems his words were worth hearing... Until we meet again."

DREW MURRAY, POLYGRAM (213-277-1412): "But once upon a time there were two Kingdoms, one was ruled by the wise and benevolent kid from Chicago. His land was populated by superstars. The other kingdom consisted of many small free-form fiefdoms; some emulating the kid from Chicago's concept, others poo-pooing them as the end of all that was good in the world of radio. The merchants tended to side with the free-formers because they exposed more of the merchants' trinkets in their bazaars--but that's another story. Anyway, one traveling minstrel named Eric was very popular in both kingdoms. Another minstrel named John was popular only in a few of the free-form fiefdoms, but his tunes had a profound influence on Eric. One day Eric decided to play one of John's songs and everyone was glad. The people in the kid from Chicago's kingdom were so glad, in fact, that they invited John to come and play in their land, especially the tune 'Eric Did' about the wondrous white tooth powder. And they all lived happily ever after. The moral: Play J. J. Cale now before he shows up on 1983's master music list...For more on the Waitresses and the Jam, please refer to the comments of my friend and compatriot 'Dogsbody'. Anybody wanting an explanation of what a 'Dogsbody' is without the accent, call me...Personals: Mike Bone: Thanks for the Dregs Lp. We're testing it. Plus check your mailing list. Arista Lps are coming in addressed to some short New York guy who used to work here. (We love you Jimmy, come clean out your desk)...Judy McNutt: Thanks for coming out to our little bash. Your prayers (and mine) will be answered in mid-April. IT is coming out then. If I say anymore, they'll kill me...Shipping this week: The highly acclaimed and much anticipated Rainbow single. It'll freeze your ears. And you ain't heard nothing yet, the album is a mo-fo, with a cover done in the same tasteful style as the Scorpions...Coming next week: The latest song stylings of our boy from Bloomington, John Cougar. Please check out Jon Scott's comments last week...Welcome back to two other graduates from Dick Meter U: Frank Holler, and, of course, the other pro from Dover, Rich Piombino...Last but not least, XTC's 'Senses Working Overtime' has an infectious hook that has not left my head in two weeks. Please listen to this record."

JOEL WEBBER, INDEPENDENT (212-255-7408): "Things may be bad for everyone financially, but The Jam album has sold almost 50,000 units in its first week of release! That's more than Survivor has sold in its 27 weeks on the Album Index. It seems to me that in times of a strained and small entertainment dollar, the rock and roll bands with image and personality should do pretty well. Every English band that breaks reaches the point where The Jam now is. They have a huge cult following that has the potential to break them. They have a repertoire of classic songs that have not been hits here, and they have just released an album with a song on it that could finally break them--'A Town Called Malice'. The Who were once in a very similar situation, when in 1969, after releasing such songs as 'My Generation', 'I Can See For Miles', and 'Can't Explain', to no commercial avail, they broke big with a song called 'Pinball Wizard'...I heard the Toto single in Bill's office the other day. 'Yipes, Stripes'--it's gonna be big."

ALAN WOLMARK, ATLANTIC (212-484-6017): "The Atlantic debut 12" of Sparks 'I Predict' should now be in your hands, and it sounds great. The production by Mack (Queen, Billy Squier) is immaculate and driving. And the song has truly funny lyrics. After 10 years and soon to be 11 albums, we believe Sparks' time has come...Also waiting in the woods ready to ambush you is the Duke Records' (Genesis' own label) debut release of John Martyn, produced and played on by Phil Collins, Eric Clapton, plus; the movie soundtrack of 'The Boat' by Klaus Doldinger of Passport; and some great, previously unreleased, live performances from the master soul man, Otis Redding...Great sounds are coming, and we've still got some out now. Everyone seems to love the British remix 12" of Genesis' 'Man On The Corner'; 'Death Wish II' is doing extraordinarily well, especially for a soundtrack, and it's selling, too; and watch the solid build on Carole King. The record is selling, particularly to a demographic from which you can always use some help. Don't miss the boat...Every week Glass Moon picks up more ground as the Song Index seems to be solidly behind this one. The single 'Carousel' is a bulleted hit on the charts...And if Godley and Creme is so well liked by programmers, put it on the air. Your listeners will find it as excitingly different as you do...Wow! Lots of records!...Note to all collector freaks: Anyone who has 'Mars Attacks The Earth' bubble gum cards from 1963, I'm searching...Heavy rotation at home: Nick Lowe, Human League, Sparks, Go Go's, Hendrix (all Lps on heavy recurrent rotation)...P.S. 'Scuse Me While I Kiss The Sky' is a great book--(not someone in Chicago)...Sorry, good night."

STEVE LEEDS, S.L.I.C. (212-977-5170): "There're no more excuses not to be programming Graham Parker. In fact, the walls of my office are painted grey. This album hits the spot...The musical geniuses at WBCN are at it again. From the station that first programmed the Vapors and the Soft Cell medley, once again they found the right track first, 'Crimson And Clover' by Joan Jett. In fact, it will be the next single as it climbs the Song Index...The new McCartney album will devastate you. Hey, Rapp, what's that you're doing? I really wonder...Some new music coming from the State of Texas with Point Blank and Joe King Carrasco, who happens to be assisted on vocals by the Michael Jackson...If you think Girlschool is good hard rock, just wait till you hear the Australian all-woman band, Cheetah. Even Bruce Kirkland will have to be proud that they come from Down Under...Bow Wow Wow, with the production expertise of Kenny Laguna, have recorded their most accessible Lp to date...Album radio loses another top personality to Top 40 with Howard Stern...It's interesting that the majority of superstar programmers are choosing to ignore the superstars flow sheets. After all, we can't rush the new sound of the 80's...Don't forget, Rapp, take it away...Thanks to the Pollack Organization for their open door...Stay Wilde and carry a big stick."

ROBIN WREN, EPIC (213-556-4700): "Congratulations to Mr. Hard for being a most deserving recipient of this year's 'Tom Donahue Award'."

PAUL RAPPAPORT, COLUMBIA (212-975-8616): "Who would ever think that a surfer boy from Southern California would ever be so enamoured with the Northeast? Thank you, Marc Miller, Tony Berardini, Oedipus, and Mawk Arento for the gnocchi and the blast!...A tip of the hat to Sal Ingeme for the greatest wine I've ever experienced. Where did all those extra bottles come from anyway?...Excellent to see the amazing Stephen Clean again as well...Also a big Irish toast to those fine fellows in the Cocaine Building (I saw it but I still don't believe it) at WAAF. Be on the lookout for a really cool Stones book coming from that whole happening. Special thanks to Rob for appreciating the greatness of the Third World Lp...Also, special thanks to the big man, Rich Bloom, the ultimate roadmaster. How many more nights in a row can we stay awake?...Attention to anyone who is still not playing Soft Cell. This record is beyond infectious. It's shear mind control! I swear you can't miss with it, and I'm not getting paid to say this stuff either...By now, all of you should have the Toto Lp. How's that for a comeback record?...The Bonoff story continues. As Uncle Kal said, it's a 'certain #1 female, phones-that-clear-the-boards'. We know that some of you rockers can't be playing this during afternoon drive, but please find a spot somewhere on your playlist for this great talent. 'Personally' is a smash, but also check 'Please Be The One' and 'Wild Heart Of The Young'...Very soon you will be receiving a hot-off-the-press 12" of 'Roadhouse Blues' live by the BOC. It smokes with a great lead vocal by Eric Bloom and features Robbie Kreiger from the Doors on lead guitar! Robbie takes the first lead and then passes the baton to the equally amazing Buck Dharma who sounds like the Yardbirds on this...McCartney is just around the corner, and it's fuckin' great!!!...Leeds: I know you have that tape. Surrender before every radio station in America starts calling you...Shulman: I'm returning your call...O'Hair: How much for the snapshots?"

RECORD ACTION CONTINUED

DEREK, 'THE DOG'S BODY' SHULMAN, POLYGRAM (212-399-7100): "Gutten tag, Wie man sehen kann die deutschen haben endlich die ganzen welt erobert und 'Blackout' ist die geheimwaffe gewessen der 'Blitzkrieg' ist unterwegs. Get your local sausage-maker to translate!! You all know the Scorpions are going all the way with this! The tour will start at the end of May till summer 1997 or so Cliff Bernstein tells me!...Question: Why does the Dog's Body take it on himself to work the difficult acts? It must be something to do with his background. You know empathy and all that stuff. O.K., I've now thought of a real creative way to get radio to add both the Waitresses and the Jam without any problem. Everyone knows about sales--Waitresses over 100,000, Jam now at 50,000--but does everyone know about the Led Zeppelin connection on both bands? NO! Well seeing 'Death Wish II' got added on major AOR stations--I thought it was about time to tell you about the Zep connection on: 1) Waitresses: Chris Butler visited England last year and sat in at the Marquee Club with Robert Plant's cousin, who has a soul band in Birmingham, UK. 2) Paul Weller's mother's best friend cleans Jimmy Page's modest mansion! Two good reasons why both bands should have been out-of-the-box. Easy stuff next week...Back to Scorps, Rainbow (red hot), Cougar and The Zep question!!...Personals: Simon Dupree and the Big Band (amazingly wonderful)...Heard the news that Record World is back. Good! We need it...Until next week, TTFN."

JIMMY MACK, STIFF (212-431-1600): "It takes a major commitment for a minor company to go head on with the major companies, the minor major companies, and the major major conglomerates. When it comes to 'Hit And Run' by Girlschool, the Stiff staff is stuffed with commitments. If you haven't heard from us lately, consider it the calm before the storm. Our front line promotion team of Major Disaster, General Confusion, Corporal Punishment, and myself, Private Parts, are ready to take the offensive and a more offensive bunch you couldn't find anywhere. KOMA, WBCN, WMFS, and WGCI have already seen the light this week, and WMMS, KLOS, and KMET are among the heavyweights where airplay and requests have already kicked in. These 4 girls can burn rubber on any male heavy metal band alive. Put up your Krokus, put up your Def Leppards, Ozgies, and Scorpions. Put them all in a room with these female firestorms, and see who stumbles out on crutches with hickies. If you haven't seen a copy of the record yet, walk, crawl, run, and bossanova to your nearest Stiff distributor and demand it. If that doesn't work, call me and make fun of my taste in clothes...Personals: Ken Benson--Call your pediatrician...Joan Jett--No word on the child support or maternity clothes. What gives?...Liz Taylor--Please, no calls if it's after 3AM...Charlie Kendall--Is that a roll of quarters, or are you just glad that I'm back?"

ROGER LIFESET, PEER PRESSURE PROMOTIONS (213-507-0771): Leesburg, Florida--GUITARIST FOR OZZY OSBOURNE 'KILLED IN CRASH.' Three weeks before it read 'Ozzy Osbourne arrested at the Alamo'. Several weeks before that 'Ozzy bites bat's head off'. It all reminds one of a warped James Dean diary. Yet, the Oz mystique is growing bigger by every sordid event. Is this the prophesy of rock...? The final conflict of rock...? For our boy, Damien...life goes on. Too bad somebody as talented as Randy Rhoades will never see to his end. Only 25 and recently named Guitar Player Magazine's 'Best New Guitarist of the Year. Open auditions are taking place now in Los Angeles for his replacement. And the road goes on in about 7 days time...Seems my favorite band, Krokus, is again spreading alternating and direct current and their delightful brand of musical warts. Again this Spring, I find myself in the middle of things, as it seems Jet/Epic's latest M'A'G'N'U'M has been out touring the Continent with the head-bangers: Kroak Us. All the English press I've seen describes Magnum as 'grandiose, complex, and raucous'. 'This is the band for all seasons.' 'Leaves me stunned, leaves me numbed.' Watch for 'Chase The Dragon' next week, and give me a reason to go a couple of more rounds with Bone and the Aristocats...Thin Lizzy is pulling out all stops for a shot at breaking their mid-chart image. Increased support in Dallas, Houston, Detroit, Cleveland, Baltimore/Washington, and Philadelphia should put our campaign just right for Thin Lizzy '82 tour in mid-April. Do check the title track 'Renegade' one more time, as its subtle qualities make it the real musical milestone on this Lp... To Bruce Youngblood: Happy Birthday to album radio's Methusala, 44 years old and still the youngest set of ears in the business...Marko: Thanks for the L.A. Reggae Festival tickets. Dennis Brown and Third World were killers! Why is reggae a force?? Ultimate truckin' music with inspiration. Jah Heights, mon!"

HARVEY LEEDS, EPIC (212-975-8661): "1,2,3,4,5 senses working overtime...Trying to taste the difference 'tween the lemons and the limes. Yes, XTC is our theme song for those of us overweight and underpaid. No, I mean, overworked and underpaid! XTC is our 'cause."

MICHAEL ABRAMSON, MICHAEL ABRAMSON PROMOTIONS (212-243-2972): "Good evening Mr. and Mrs. America, and all ships at sea, let's go to press...Aside from the Asia Lp that is absolutely stunning, the second most automatic add of the year will be to TOTO. If you haven't heard the advance cassette as of this reading, threaten your Columbia rep with his or her life and have them bring it to you A.S.A.P! This album is SUPERB! There's enough great music on the album to keep you and your listeners smiling for many hours...Now, onto Fay Ray. Too many programmers like this record and are perplexed as to how it should be handled. Well, first off, sit down and listen to it in its entirety. Then pick out the cut that's right for your format and PUT IT ON THE AIR. The record has the goods, and I'll tell you again that Fay Ray could be one album that you'll end up kickin your own ass for missing...For those of you who are currently programming the X-15 album, please shift attention to the cut 'Jennifer'. This is the single and will be shipping in one week. For those of you who haven't checked out X-15 yet, give this track a serious listen...Musical faves from the Rocker Doctor: Greg Kihn (best to date) 'Testify', 'Higher And Higher' (smash single), 'Every Love Song' (listen to the killer sax solo on this tune); Girlschool 'Race With The Devil' (these ladies are stone mo-fos); and for godsakes, go back and pull out the Nick Lowe Lp and immediately put 'Stick It Where The Sun Don't Shine' on the air. I can't believe this track isn't all over the radio...Last but not least, the Human League 'Don't You Want Me'. This song should be programmed on every station in the United States. It can't miss. Til next week."

STEVE BRACK, BOARDWALK (213-656-2840): "Joan Jett and the Blackhearts are currently playing packed auditoriums everywhere, opening for the Police and headlining a few shows here and there. With album sales now over one-and-a-half-million copies, let me remind you that Joan and the Blackhearts haven't played any dates west of Kansas City, but look out West Coast, you ain't seen nothin' yet! Have you noticed the difference in the mix of the new 'Crimson And Clover' 12"? It's hotter and a lot cleaner. This song will be bigger than 'I Love Rock And Roll' if concert crowd reaction means anything. Every night she kills 'em with 'I Love Rock And Roll', and then 'Crimson' comes along and buries them...Speaking of hot concerts, The Innocents have been getting encores as the opener for Rick Springfield and Tommy Tutone. The live crowds have been surprised by The Innocents non-stop energy on stage. You'll hear what I'm talking about on the 12" sampler with 'Stop Shooting Up Stars' and 'Directly From The Heart'. This band has been together for over two years, and deserves to be judged in the grooves, not on the tube. Listen for yourself, you'll be surprised at what you're missing. Miami Steve and The Boss bought The Innocents cassette at Music Plus just last week. Call for details...If you enjoy the new Dwight Twilley, you're in for a big rush when you hear what's new from Phil Seymour. His second album 'Talk To Me', will be out in three weeks, and has some great AOR tracks."

THOM O'HAIR, AUDIO INDEPENDENTS (415-864-0700): "A fable in three acts. The sticky job always falls to the unsung hero of broadcasting, the program director. Now PD's of America, with united action, the 'dive bomber decade' of the music industry can be pulled out. Program Directors have the power. They add records. For instance, if you only add one or two records a week, and it's the same ones that every other program director adds, look what happens. Record companies only need a small staff to keep all their bases covered. A&R departments only need to sign 'hit' acts so musicians tend to bunch up around hits. No cash, no smash. The water hole gets smaller and smaller--only big powerful animals survive. Tighter and tighter the circle closes. Less and less people are needed to get more done with less, from less, for more. People, a lot of people, your friends, my friends, are now out of work, 'streamlined', no T-shirts, no tickets, no giveaways, no spot schedules. The pits. Here's where the program director hero-bit comes in. Pick a Tuesday, any Tuesday, soon, and add 10 great records, whatever your format. Ten records that hit the groove. Listen with your ears. Don't touch your research. Add 'em, report 'em, play 'em. And the ones that wiggle, play 'em through. The next Tuesday, do the same thing. Add 10 great records. The next Tuesday, again, and again. The response from Tin Pan Alley is that they will have to promote more records. That means bigger staff. That means rehiring your out-of-work friends. Bigger expense accounts. Better record service. More adds in the trades (those that survive). And this is just the first phase where Doris gets her oats."

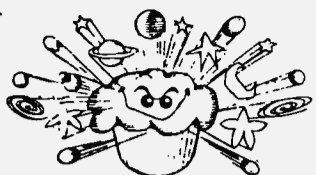
J.B.BRENNER, A&M (404-455-7504): "The Human League album is currently over 100,000 units in a little over 5 weeks since its release. 'Don't You Want Me' is happening on album radio in Philadelphia, Dallas, Syracuse, Buffalo, Rochester, Albany, L.A., New York, San Francisco, Cleveland, Boston, and the nation's Capitol. Both the single and album continue to bullet up the charts while listener reaction has the phones buzzing and cash registers ringin' wherever it's played. With the Go Go's #1 for the 5th straight week in Billboard and a top 20 fixture on the Airplay Charts after 8 months, the 'I don't think it fits our sound' excuse becomes rather thin. Album radio cannot ignore hit mass appeal songs like 'Don't You Want Me', a 'Breakup Song' for the 80's. We're building our story week by week, and we've got the facts and figures to back up our commitment. So quit watching the League and join it...Johnny and The Distractions roll into Texas this week after opening for J. Geils in the Midwest. 'My Desire' (the consensus cut in the Portland and Seattle area where Johnny's Lp is over 25,000) is the track generating both sales and phones. It's a grabber, and if you're looking for response, try 'My Desire'--up on the Song Index 70-66 ...Bryan Adams is still out there opening for Foreigner with radio picking up on the 'Fits Ya Good' track. This raunch and roller seems to be the catalyst in keeping this album happening after 8 months...The Police continues to hang tough well into the second leg of their tour. The new single will be 'Secret Journey' coming A.S.A.P...New from A&M in April: 'Thunder In Rock' by Fist; a new Split Enz titled 'Time And Tide'; a new Squeeze Lp 'Sweets From Strangers'; and in early May get ready for 'Special Forces' from our latest platinum act, 38 Special...Hot at home: XTC, Willie Nelson, The Jam, Asia, the German version of 'Heroes' from the Bowie album, as well as 'Cat People'."

BETH ROSENGARD, INDEPENDENT (213-462-4204): "There are two ways to focus your attention on the new Moon Martin album 'Mystery Ticket': On the one hand, there's the Robert Palmer-dominated sound of 'X-Ray Vision' and 'Witness', and on the other, there's the traditional Moon energy of 'Firing Line', 'Dangerous Game' and 'Aces With You'. Try both phases of this new Moon--there's at least one for you...Other songs to check out: 'Be My Baby' by Carmine Appice, remixed and re-energized in 7" form and on your desk now; two cuts on the album 'Wasted Youth' by Girl--'Old Dogs' and 'Ice In The Blood'; 'Stop Shooting Up Stars' by The Innocents, out now on a new 12"; and, finally, every track on the Aldo Nova album--take your pick 'cause you can't go wrong...The Warner Brothers service of The Blasters album is now completed, and there's already new action. How about WMMR for starters? Please listen again to 'American Music', 'This Is It', and the single 'I'm Shakin'...Coming soon: 'Chase The Dragon' the new album by Magnum. If the name of this band suggests to you loud guns and heavy metal, your picking up on the wrong connotation. Think instead of a magnum of champagne, because this is indeed a sparkling, tasty collection with a very special and unique energy. The album ships April 2nd, so you'll have it in about a week...Personal to the Dogsbody: Thanks for the call and TTFNY!...And to McNuttski: I'm testing your record. So far it seems strongest with younger demos, but look for an add next week anyway...My favorite from Asia is 'Time Again', but I guess you can't go wrong on this album...Also, I'm intrigued by Haircut One Hundred. Thanks for the tip, Lange...And, since I'm naming names, how's your x-ray vision, Buck? You're aces with me too!"

BRUCE MOSER, COULD BE WILD (716-885-5200): "I spent an enjoyable St. Patrick's Day in NYC seeing U2 at the Ritz. The band turned in its usual awesome performance, and if you don't believe me, call Jim Sotet...Last week was a big week in Utica as Tom Starr became a proud papa, & Jeff Chard celebrated his birthday. Congratulations and best wishes to all...Trivia of the week: 'Tainted Love' was written by Ed Cobb, who also wrote 'Dirty Water' for the Standells. Soft Cell is a smash, the record is blowing out of the stores, even where airplay is light...Same story goes for the Waitresses...Thin Lizzy continues to build. It went to heavy on WMS with WKLS and WSYR. 'Angel Of Death' and 'Hollywood' are two great songs and deserve to be on the radio...'SPOB' is selling top 10 in most American cities...As is the Aldo Nova album which is over 200,000 in sales this week...Duke Jupiter's 'I'll Drink To You' is all over the airwaves, coast to coast, and will become a summer anthem...One record that managed to sneak by everyone was the Girl album on Jet. Give the cut 'Old Dogs' another listen...415 Records have a great album from a Rochester band, 'New Math'. Call me if you need copies. Coming soon, a live Blue Oyster Cult album with a great version of 'Roadhouse Blues' featuring Robbie Kreiger on guitar."

JOHN SCHOENBERGER, RADIO RECORDS (305-565-7700): "The Glass Moon single keeps gaining ground Top 40, and as I'm sure you've noticed, is also making continuous gains on the FMQB Song Index Chart. The majority of the album stations on the record are performing quite well with it. I think if you're not on it, you should give it a chance. You need some fresh music for Spring, not to mention the new ARB sweep and 'On A Carousel' is a perfect roll-your-window-down and crank-it-up kind of record... For you closet R&B freaks, I'm a little late getting into this one, but if you like early Bobby Womack such as 'Communication' and 'Understanding', you'll love 'The Poet'. It's great!"

KATE INGRAM, DB RECORDS (415-928-6952): "Obviously anyone who likes the B52's as much as I do goes in big for the fun element of rock and roll...But without getting too heavy for just one moment, I'm going to bring up something that's not so much fun--mainly the situation in Eastern Europe where dissidents and political prisoners are being tortured, if not worse, by Facists. Granted, a Sheet like this is not the normal forum for expressing opinions of this nature, but I do feel deep injustices overseas concern all of us. It's parallel to the situation prior to World War II where most Americans ignored reports of Jewish atrocities by Nazis until they were forced to participate in a devastating war. FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

- PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and MIDNIGHT on an average day of the reporting week.
- PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
- AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 5. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 5 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 3 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

The Airplay Index is our ranking system for the amount of play on albums as a whole. We determine rankings by converting all daily and weekly play reports to a 1-10 emphasis system and totalling the points on a given Lp. We use a simple percentage breakdown to indicate the amount of play on each track.
