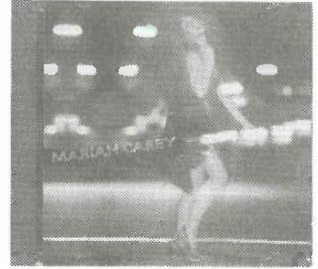

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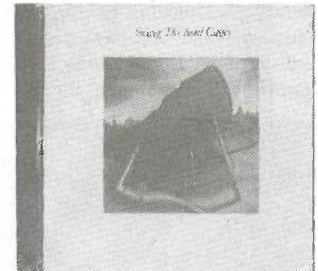

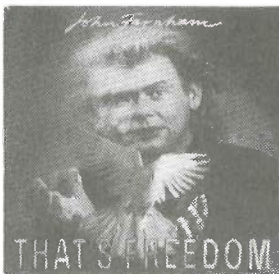

## Jannetta promotion tour supports AIDS education

Jannetta, an artist signed to Backstage Productions is in the midst of a promotional campaign for her new album, *Mark On My Heart*. The album is described as pop/dance and was produced for Backstage Productions by Ross Munro and Todd Booth.

An extra hook that the current promotional tour has is that it is in support of national AIDS education, and is being sponsored by Julius Schmid, the manufacturer of Sheik condoms.

"A very good friend of mine recently died of AIDS," says Jannetta, "and I know that there are a lot of people out there who have friends who have it."

Backstage Productions and Jannetta will be donating a portion of the sale of all CDs and

cassettes towards AIDS education in Canada and Julius Schmid has provided Jannetta with tote bags containing promo material which are being distributed at club dates.

Already *Mark On My Heart* is getting very positive reaction internationally, and is slated for release in Japan, France, Korea and Scandinavia.

Here in Canada the album will ship to retail in the next couple of weeks, once the album's lead single, *I Know You'll Wait*, starts picking up some good airplay, something which Steve Thomson, President of Backstage Productions, says is already happening.

"We are going about this promotion with an old school approach. We're taking Jannetta

out to as many radio stations as possible so that she personally becomes known among the broadcasters. And already we are getting a lot of adds." Thomson explains that this strategy dictates that there is no rush to pump the product into retail before its time. "We're going to keep pounding the pavement. There's no need to push it. We've got a great album here and we want to encourage the longevity factor. This album will be around for a good eighteen months."

After a stint in the western part of the country, Jannetta and team will be making their way east for the better part of March, wrapping up in London on the 21st.

Murray McLauchlan has just completed the Vancouver and Toronto taping of his winter series for CBC Radio/Stereo's *Swinging On A Star*. He will begin taping for the spring series

McLauchlan's solo guest on March 16.

The March 23rd show will feature RCA's Cowboy Junkies (Margo and Michael Timmins) and John Bottomley, a new RCA signing, who was featured on RPM's front page on Jan. 26/91.

Joni Mitchell makes a rare radio performance to be McLauchlan's solo guest on March 30. Mitchell made a special trip to Vancouver for the date. Her husband, Larry Klein, provides back-up bass guitar. The only audience was Mitchell's parents who travelled to Vancouver from Saskatchewan for the taping.

As well, Mist Productions and the studio have teamed to provide complete voice and music production for the A/V, Film, TV and jingle industry. This will allow the studio to offer clients what in-house composer and producer, Michael Stanutz describes as "the best of both worlds."

Wellesley Sound has chalked up an impressive clientele in the recording business which includes albums in the stores by Zappacosta (*Quick Don't Ask Any Questions*), Lorraine Segato (*Phoenix*), The Phantoms (*Pleasure Puppets*) Cottage Industry

(*The Winter's Tale*) and George Banton (*I'm Still In Love With You*).

Albums ready for release include Nancy Cassidy (*Kids Song 4*), Norm Orenstein & Molly Johnson, Betty Moon, Eliyah (*A Language Of Peace*), Scott B Sympathy (*Neil Yonge Street*) and Fifth Column (*To Sir With Hate*). The studio is also busy with dance mix singles and extended mixes.

Activity also includes A/V, film, TV and jingle projects "locked to picture and digitally recorded and mastered" for all the acoustic music for *Road To Avonlee*, all pre-recorded music for the Gemini Awards '91, the NFB film *Unnatural Causes* by Lillian Allen and corporate clients that include Toyota, GM, Ford, Bell Canada, 7UP, Pepsi, Molsons and more.

## Sony preparing release of Bob Dylan box set

In the wake of Bob Dylan receiving the Lifetime Achievement Award at the Grammys a few weeks back, Sony Music is readying the release of Dylan's box set entitled *Bob Dylan - The Bootleg Series Vol. 1-3 (Rare And Unreleased) 1961-1991*.

The set consists of three CDs or cassettes or five LPs, featuring demos of famous Dylan tunes, previously unreleased material and rehearsal versions including the original version of *Tangled Up In Blue*, *If Not For You* with George Harrison, and an acoustic version of *Like A Rolling Stone*.

The package comes complete with a 72 page booklet of comprehensive liner notes and some rare and previously unpublished photographs of Dylan.

On March 11 a promotional CD single of *Series Of Dreams*, a song from the Oh Mercy sessions produced by Daniel Lanois will be serviced to radio with the complete set following on March 21. The set ships to retail on March 26.

A video directed by Meriert Avis has been produced to document Dylan's career. The video, too, contains some never-before-seen archival footage of Dylan.

Bob Dylan - *The Bootleg Series* will retail for between \$50-\$60 for the cassettes, \$70-\$80 for the CDs and the limited number of vinyl sets will go for \$55-\$65.

There's a move on to get out of the MAJOR major markets and into the safer smaller major markets. (EC: I'm confused, but I hear what you're saying . . . !)

**Nice guys finish off camera . . . !** What a shame that Mel Shaw, the man who did more than anyone to get the Juno Awards on television, was shuffled off-camera to be presented with his Walt Grealis Special Achievement Award. A shorter trilogy to Cohen, a couple of seconds off here and there, and a great industry figure could have had a memorable and well deserved minute and a half on camera. (EC: To quote an on-camera recipient: "To get THAT award, it would be an honour to accept it in a parking lot," and maybe that's next . . . !)

**Alberta honours Ronnie King . . . !** While his boss and mentor, Mel Shaw, is honoured at this year's Juno Awards, Ronnie King, who soared to international stardom with The Stampeders, gets a little recognition from his home province of Alberta. Ronnie received the AIRA Award of Distinction a couple of weeks ago. Ronnie is still pickin' and his trio are seen regularly on Calgary's Cable 10. (EC: Once Ronnie tasted Sweet City Woman, there was no turning back . . . !)

**Women in high places . . . !** I remember a few years ago at one of RPM'S 3 Days In March communication meetings, when we had a panel on Women In The Industry. Joanne Smale, Linda Dawe and a few others mounted a very impressive and controversial argument in favour of women having more of a say in the industry. Well, like many good things, not much happened. Not until this year that is. Sony Music chief Paul Burger brought in Lisa Zbitnew as Director of Artist Marketing, a very important position considering the number of directors and managers who are reporting to her. Bob Jamieson, the new head of BMG Music Canada, didn't take much time in scouting for a Director of Marketing and Promotion. He appointed Carol Wright to the position and her credentials are very impressive. As well, Lou Anne Wheaton gets the nod at Justin Entertainment as Director, National Promotion, Publicity and Artist Relations, Jill Snell moves up to the position of Label Manager at Island Records and Vicki Walters takes on the important post of Director of Publishing at TMP The Music Publisher. Joanne and Linda can be proud of the work they did in laying the groundwork initially, for more recognition of women in the industry. (EC: What am I, chopped liver . . . ?)

**The story will unfold . . . !** I'm really tempted to start telling the story of the missing tribute video tape. Since no one is willing to take me seriously, I think I'll tell the story and start asking questions. (EC: Maybe a few people will stop taking bows . . . !)

**Good point! Good Point . . . !** Somebody asked me recently how we get all the charts and faxes and information on record play and sales to do our charts when we don't mention the names of these people. Well, the answer is that we have developed a reputation over the years and these people just believe in RPM like some

kind of a bible. We don't have any trouble at all. Strangely enough, it's the retailers who are troublesome when it comes to helping, but look at the mess they're in. (EC: The middlename of retail is "politics".) A very costly game . . . as the record companies and artists know!

**RECESSION! What recession . . . ?** While everyone's watching their bosses for tell-tale signs of distress, usually followed by a pink slip . . . a downtown Toronto hotel is going through a \$40 million facelift. (EC: A few record launch parties could lessen the cost . . . !)

**Get the figures straight . . . !** The dailies and the trade press jumped in with both feet to grandstand the financial trouble facing A&A. Some of the figures and facts quoted are way out of wack. If the figures and facts are for public record, wouldn't it be proper to double check rather than run corrections? (EC: They don't teach that at journalism school . . . !)

**Another retail opening . . . ?** Is it true that a giant retailer has taken over a huge health club in the Scarborough Town Centre, which will be turned into a record store? (EC: That mall needs a good record store . . . !)

**Time marches on . . . !** Just about a month from now the industry will take a sharp turn and there will be some real changes. Ellie has looked into her crystal ball and told me that the news will be updated, and shocking. (EC: Have I ever been wrong . . . ?)

**I've never seen shortbread go so fast.** Muffins are okay, donuts are out . . . bad for the skin, but shortbread, and real, honest to goodness Royal Edinburgh Petticoat Tails shortbread. 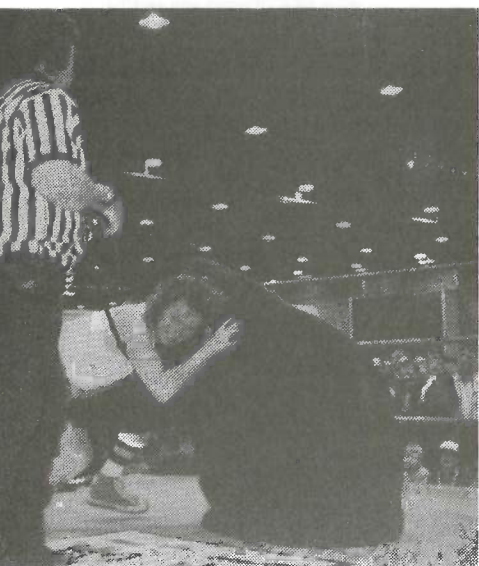

Keith Chinnery, CIMX-FM Promotions Director, explains that a chef from a local restaurant was on hand to cook breakfast (including flapjacks) for contest winners and the other members of Melanie's family. Clay and Melanie passed along pancake recipes and other Shrove Tuesday tidbits throughout the broadcast.

**Two of 1290 CJBK's listeners**, Rosemary and Jim Sealey had the opportunity to legally renew their wedding vows live on the Steve (Garrison) & Heather (Hiscox) Morning Show. The renewal, the brainchild of the popular London morning show hosts, was complete with a Minister, flowers, wedding cake and more. As a wedding gift for the pair the station sent them on a second honeymoon to the Radisson Hotel, in downtown London. In addition to staying in the Bridal Suite, dinners and brunch was provided by the hotel. They were also guests at Second City and limousine transportation was provided by Classic Touch Limousine. The first time Rosemary and Jim were married, the weather was bad and Jim was very sick, "not a memorable day for a wedding," says Nelson Millman, Program Director of CJBK, who indicates that the Sealeys "had a super time... and we were very happy to make it all possible." He concludes with, "Steve and Heather are always coming up with ideas to make days like Valentine's Day just a little more exciting... and it makes for great radio."

**The FOX provided Vancouverites** with a little GST "good news" when the station launched its Give Some Tankfuls promotion from a secret Mohawk gas station location. FOX Morning Team Larry & Willy offered free fill-ups to the first 99 vehicles that pulled in with the drivers shouting "The FOX Rocks." More than 260 vehicles responded within 20 minutes, "and it was mass excitement," reports Mary Ann McKenzie, Director of Promotions for The FOX. Joining Larry & Willy in pumping gas was the FOX mascot and several other station personalities. Over \$3,000 worth of gas was given away during the event. "a nice way to turn something negative (GST tax) into a fun and positive event for everyone," says Program Director Jim (JJ) Johnston.

**The Hip is it!** It appears The Tragically Hip's new album, Road Apples, is going to be one of this year's biggest. It has already surpassed the peak of their previous album. Road Apples jumps all the way to No. 10 in just its second week. That's one spot higher than Up To Here peaked last year.

**The ladies turn.** Last week I asked you to name the one-name male artists who've hit No. 1. It only seems fair to test your powers of recall and find out how many one-name female artists you can name who've hit No. 1 (there are seven of them).

**Another number one . . .** Mariah Carey has her second No. 1 hit as Someday tops the Hit Tracks chart. Vision Of Love was at No. 1 for four weeks last year. Her other release, Love Takes Time, just missed as it peaked at No. 2.

**New in the Top 20 . . .** Enigma hits No. 1 on the Dance chart with Sadness, it also enters the Top 20 on the Hit Tracks chart, bulleting to No. 18. World On Edge is enjoying big success with Only The Lonely climbing to No. 16. Their debut release, Still Beating, peaked at No. 31. However, Londonbeat has the biggest jump into the Top 20 as I've Been Thinking Of You jumps 21 places to No. 14.

**Is that a law degree?** It's getting tougher to tell the artists without a decoder ring. There's Timmy T, Stevie B, Stevie V, MCJ & Cool G, R.E.M., AC/DC, ZZ, and C&C. The only way to keep track of them all is to load them into my IBM AT ASAP!

**COVER STORY** by Alison Mercer**De Keyzer releases Hard Working Man as solo debut**

Hard Working Man is the WEA debut for guitarist/singer/songwriter Jack De Keyzer, a musician who has made an impressive name for himself in Canada, particularly in Ontario where he has earned a substantial following and established himself as a powerful club draw.

De Keyzer was signed close to a year ago after Hard Working Man was recorded. Currently, the lead single That's The Way, is making it's way up RPM's Hit Tracks chart and has gained a lot of radio airplay.

As well as being one of Eastern Canada's best known live acts, De Keyzer is an experienced studio musician. He has recorded with his own bands the Bobcats and the Rock Angels as well as doing work with such greats as Etta James, Robert Johnson, Bo Diddley and Ronnie Hawkins. De Keyzer's list of associations with musical legends is long, and has earned him the reputation of being a musician who "knows a thing or two about the blues." At this point in his career, however, De Keyzer is pleased to be solo.

"I'm at the point now where I don't really want to be in a band. That's what I used to want to do, be in a band," he laughs. "Now I have a band, but I'm in charge."

Growing up in Hamilton, De Keyzer began honing his guitar skills in his very early teens and soon left school to head out into the music scene where he began earning a living as a musician at the tender age of fifteen. His writing career started much later, particularly after his stint with the Bobcats, which gave him the taste to write his own material.

When De Keyzer decided that he wanted to make a solo album, he made the choice to record the album independently and then look for a distribution deal.

"I have a problem with spending extraordinary amounts of money on an album," says De Keyzer, who believes this happens easily under the record company wing. "I wanted to

It was produced by (former David Bowie/Iggy Pop guitarist) Stacey Heydon and Danny Greenspoon, who produced Spirit Of The West. Many of the tracks feature the talents of De Keyzer's friends and fellow musicians, including Jim Cuddy and Greg Keelor of Blue Rodeo, Jerome Godboo of the Phantoms and the late Stan Szelest of The Band.

Despite the fact that the De Keyzer name has been well known for years now, he acknowledges there is a stigma about artists who have spent much of their career playing the club circuit. "I've been identified and compared with other artists that I have absolutely nothing in common with musically," says De Keyzer. "Simply because we both played a lot live and didn't have a record deal." But he has always remained calm about the callousness of

The CFCF group is experiencing serious financial difficulties and, unfortunately, the two radio stations were being tarred by the same brush.

Dufault points out that "The radio stations CFCF 600 (AM) and CFQR 92.5 (FM) are wholly-owned and operated by Mount Royal Broadcasting Inc. and have been since September 26, 1988."

Dufault also reveals the signing of a four year deal with the Montreal Expos who will be back on CFCF for a 20th year.

"CFCF/CFQR is growing in leaps and bounds," says Dufault, who continues with, "CFQR is the talk of the town with the hottest morning show in English Montreal and CFCF is back on track with the Expos, Bobby Winkles, Buck Rodgers, Dave Van Horne, Ken Singleton and Elliott Price." Price becomes a full time partner with Jack Curran on the morning show, handling all sports.

# Dion and James lead parade of Juno winners

Aside from Paul Shaffer being a lacklustre and too hip a host, a set that resembled a sewer pipe when seen on the small screen, not very fitting for CBC-TV's national jewel, the Juno Awards obviously satisfied the award-hungry Canadian record industry. Unfortunately, in their attempts to make the Junos bigger and hopefully draw a larger TV audience, this nationally-televised showcase for Canada's best in entertainment has become a little too reflective of American music awards. Perhaps a bit of humbling parochialism might help.

Nevertheless, there was one important and comforting factor that hasn't been evident with past Juno Awards. The audience, even watching at home on the small screen, was respectful, vibrant and spontaneous in its appreciation of what was going on. This audience energy was transmitted to the players on stage, a major accomplishment, rarely seen at an awards show. There was also a few pleasant surprises; the Tragically Hip taking the award as Entertainer of the Year and Rita MacNeil

winning the Top Country Female Juno.

It was also satisfying to have a Hall of Fame inductee with something concrete, indeed electrifying to say. Leonard Cohen's appropriate and exquisite reading from his *Tower Of Power* song was the highlight of the evening. The "trilogy" of three of his works by Suzanne Vega, Aaron Neville and Jennifer Warnes was a little lengthy, but nonetheless dynamic, particularly Warnes' version of Cohen's *Joan Of Arc*. The musical tribute however, was much better than the meaningless meanderings of the siblings of last year's inductee.

Performers, for the most part, were bang on in the professional handling of themselves, as were the presenters and winners. It was refreshing not to hear the usual dribbling, off-the-cuff inanities by the presenters, although Murray McLauchlan took the opportunity to make a statement of sorts. The winners kept their acceptance speeches remarkably short and, again, very professional.

Sony recording artist Celine Dion, who won two Junos; Female Vocalist of the Year and Album (for Unison), displayed the confidence of a seasoned and highly professional artist, both in her performance and acceptance. It was obvious that her album win was a complete surprise, accepting with much class and humility. She certainly solidified her status as an international recording artist of note.

Colin James, whose searing rock performance opened the show, and which may have turned off some of the more adult viewers, looked like the fresh-faced kid next door. Later, in accepting his Junos for Male Vocalist and, still later, for Song of the Year (for *Just Came Back*), still looking fresh-faced, he paid homage to his "Mom". When accepting the second Juno, the cameras picked out his proud "Mom" in the audience, a nice touch.

Another double winner was David Tyson, who brought much needed attention to the Canadian songwriting field. He won honours as Songwriter and as Producer of the year.

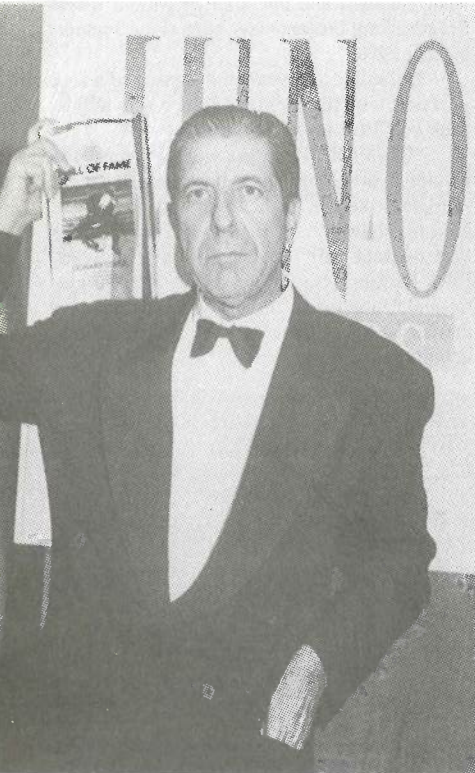
Perhaps in an effort to make amends to Canada's country music industry, performances on this year's Junos were heavy on country; Michelle Wright, Blue Rodeo, Prairie Oyster, and Sue Medley, all of whom were definitely in the refreshing country mode. Medley, however, scored a Juno as Most Promising Female and Blue Rodeo, took home their third Juno as Group of the Year. Country winners were also afforded their share of the television spotlight. Rita MacNeil was on tour so

Also showing a high degree of professionalism in their performances were Holly Cole, who did a very difficult a cappella number, *Alias*, and *The Northern Pikes*. M.C. Hammer, with his posse spilling over the stage, hip-hopped predictably displaying an amazing amount of energy, but not really adding that

## Warner's Child wins Dance Recording Juno

Canadian Jane Child, who in 1990 sold upwards of a million units with her self-titled Warner Bros debut, won a Juno last week for Best Dance Recording Of The Year for her song Don't Wanna Fall In Love (Knife Feel Good Mix).

Although Child took one Juno home, she was nominated for four of the awards. As well as in the dance category, she was up for Most Promising Female Vocalist, Songwriter Of The Year and Producer Of The Year.

A singer/songwriter/musician, Child grew up in Toronto where she studied classical music and then made her way onto the contemporary scene, namely by putting a band together. Eventually her career required that she move to New York and then to Los Angeles.

It was in Los Angeles in 1988 when Child signed the deal with Warner Bros., one of many major labels that had an interest in her material, but the one that Child felt would be most supportive to her needs. Child wrote all the songs on the album as well as producing it and doing all the work musically. The album was released in October of 1989.

Although the album sold half a million

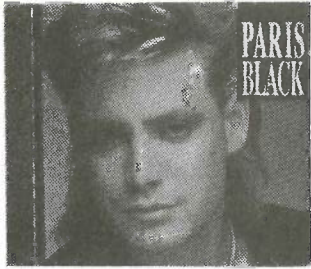
copies in the U.S. alone, Child never did a support tour. Not that she didn't have the chance. Child's talents attracted the attention of many artists and was offered various tours with prestigious acts, among them MC Hammer, but she felt that with only one album released, it would be better to take a pass at the time.

Currently, Child is working on her next album, which she is hoping will be released in late August of this year. She is also putting together a band which she will take into the studio with her and on the road, among the recruits is her brother, Rick, a guitarist who is also contributing a song to the new project.

Not having performed her material has left the artist with a strong desire to hit the road. "I'm really looking forward to touring this time," she says. "The show will be about music, and very much about the band. I won't have dancing girls or a thousand costume changes."

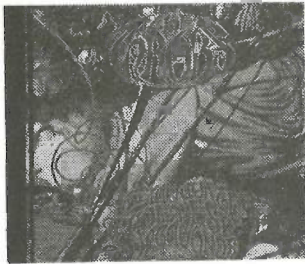
Child says she will also happily play the smaller sized venues because the intimacy is very important. "I want people to see my face, I want them to be able to see my fingers move. You can't do that in stadiums."

There is an interesting melange of songs, even the ballads differ in style, for example the stylistic construction duet with Valerie Hallman on My Heart Is Still Young and the more traditional Letting Go. 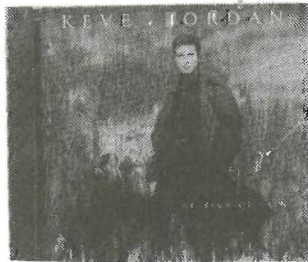
**THE THROBS** - Hard Rock

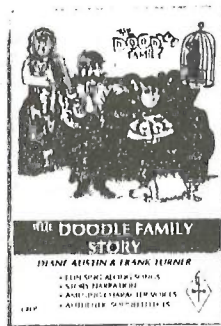

He points out that "Ted Farr, Program Director, and myself have been through virtually every single selection in the WX library as it pertains to the current format of country music," continuing with, "We strive to not just play the right records, but to create great radio entertainment."

Weird has tagged The Hottest Hits of Today On The Chart as "A" which will be given 20 plays a week; The Up & Coming Hits of Today as "B" with 12 plays a week; and Recurrents (must have been a Top 10) on the chart as "C" with three plays a week.

Hottest Current Canadian Hits On Chart gets a "D" listing, Canadian recurrents an "E", Power Gold "F/G", 1980's Traditional (all of which must have been Top 10) an "H/I", 1970's Traditional (all of which must have been Top 10) a "J", Country Classics (definitive songs for the artists - most titles from the '50s, '60s and some from the '70s) an "L", and Canadian Gold an "M".

"I have tried to set up the current playlist in a manner that will simply allow our audience to hear the biggest hits more often," says Weird, concluding with "There's more to good programming than just rolling the right records, that's why we've done what we've done."
