WALRUS STATISTICS

Our statistics are a quantitative reflection of current Lp acceptance based on our contributors' reports. *Progressive Retail Reaction* is derived from Top 15 retail reports while *New Retail Action* is derived from New Reaction reports. Both are weighted to compensate for the size of the store chain. *Radio Emphasis* is computed by counting radio reports of Audience Reaction and Heavy Airplay. (Heavy Airplay new additions are not included.) *New Releases to Watch* is calculated by counting all indicated New Additions and weighing them according to heavy or moderate play. All calculations are first done regionally then combined to form the national totals.

## NEW RELEASES

Below is a catalogue of new releases. They are divided into categories designed to give you an idea of their relative musical worth. These first impressions are not meant to relate in anyway to past, present or future sales, nor should they be taken as the word of God.

### SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(These recordings which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

David Bowie/STATION TO STATION/RCA APL 1-1327 (Apparently one cannot count out Bowie. Here he draws the line between his past and the recent R & B thing. He puts the last album in the context which it lacked, in spite of its success. Soulful, funky, spaced, rock and roll has its guru and his continued vitality amazes.)

### STRONGLY MERITORIOUS

(The following Lps are Merit Albums which we feel have an extra edge.)

Bad Company/RUN WITH THE PACK/Swan Song SS 8415 (To be devilish, one must note that their cliché ridden lyrics almost sound like a satire on cliché ridden lyrics. Still, Bad Company's rockin' audacity moves their music to a classic beat. Their style is the backbone of R & R. Some super tunes enhance the Lp further.)

John Blair/SOUTHERN LOVE/Columbia PC 33950 (While John didn't do what one would have expected on his first album, he did everything one could imagine him doing. Divided evenly between spicy instrumentals, mellow instrumentals and vocals, his record manages to unify around a sound-fabric woven of flowing rhythm and that vitar of his. A delicious first step.)

Burning Spear/MARCUS GARVEY/Island ILPS 9377 (Resting on that reggae rhythm - possibly the most exciting new rhythm feel since rock's big beat - is all Burning Spear needs to win praise. Ear-pleasing melodies reinforce the positive flow. Stress consistency rather than the intensity of the Wailers.)

### MERIT ALBUMS

(Our recommendations for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all Merit Albums are suitable for all stations.)

Cayenne/Bucksnot BR-01 (After tracking a good, but deceptive opener, the Lp settles into a mellower country rock feeling. It flows easily on warm harmonies making one wonder what their first track is all about. Bucksnot, Box 7807, San Francisco, Calif. 94120.)

### MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Chris de Burgh/SPANISH TRAIN & OTHER STORIES/A & M Sp. 4568 (Solid tunes build the foundation for Chris' word pictures. He can take you from the dance hall to outer space and make the transition believable. A big, well ordered production carries it.)

Klaus Doldinger/JUBILEE '75/Atlantic SD 18162 (Previously reviewed as an import. Doldinger is a journeyman musician whose playing always drives forcefully while it tends to lack a certain inspired explosiveness. Relentless, controlled energy is the formula. His match-up with Les McCann exudes joy.)

Finch/GLORY OF THE INNER FORCE/Atco SD 36-124 (While nothing Finch had to say in this instrumental album needed 9 or 10 minutes to be said, they do display other virtues. As players they command respect, their training shows. They are moderately musical.)

New Grass Revival/FLY THROUGH THE COUNTRY/Flying Fish 016 (Here is a bluegrass band which would sound one peg better with the addition of a drummer. Their bluegrass style music is effective, bolstered by solid original material, but it misses a percussive drive. They should forsake absolute purism and go for the throat.)

Brian Friel/ASHES & MATCHSTICKS/Pye 12113 (A writer of obvious ability, Brian's album turns with comfortable assurance. Peopled by notable English players, the album's songs are also spiced by nice ideas.)

Jerry Garcia/REFLECTIONS/Round RX-LA 565-G (Jerry's thin voice covers the ground adequately. Easy melodies paced at an equally easy gate move effortlessly. The back-up is split between the Dead and Garcia's recent touring band. Mellow.)

Stephane Grappelli/LIVE AT QUEEN ELIZABETH HALL/Pye 12123 (At the risk of Grappelli overkill, another album of this inspired player is released. With the exception of the tin pan alley standards, all of Stephane's playing is as stylistically valid today as it was in the thirties.)

Mike Harrison/RAINBOW RIDER/Island ILPS 9359 (Harrison is a strong singer who is unconcerned by a muddled voice. Like Joe Cocker, he communicates. Kenny Buttrey's drumming works an uncomfortable vertical rhythm pattern which tends to make the Lp choppy. Good song choices overcome any deficiencies.)

Speedy Keen/Y' KNOW WOT I MEAN?/Island ILPS 9338 (Spiced by a few captivating Keen melodies, Y' Know Wot I Mean? gets its point across. "Something In The Air" doesn't repeat itself but Speedy motivates through an easy going pleasantry.)

### MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Mahavishnu Orchestra/John McLaughlin/INNER WORLDS/  
Columbia PC 33908 (This is the album in which the  
Mahavishnu concept falls apart. The total unity of spirit  
and function that once was, is now completely fractured.  
Even the essential musicality comes under question here.  
Superior playmanship keeps the high intentions afloat while  
"All In The Family" and "Lotus Feet" find purity.)
- John Mayall/NOTICE TO APPEAR/ABC ABCD 926 (Mayall  
and Toussaint are a natural alliance. Still, it is strange  
for a man who used to produce albums single-handedly to  
give himself completely over to another. It is good ther-  
apy and it turned out O. K.)
- McKendree Spring/TOO YOUNG TO FEEL THIS OLD/Pye  
12124 (McKendree Spring has restrained their career by  
not finding quality outside material to augment their own  
good stuff. Credit their wisdom for taking the step here.  
A straight ahead performance of solid songs yields their  
best effort.)
- Idris Muhammad/HOUSE OF THE RISING SUN/Kudu KU-27  
(Beyond the moments when substance fades in a disco  
washout, Idris' Lp maintains a generally funky feeling.  
Start with the title track then skip to side two for more  
musical intensity.)
- Pretty Things/SAVAGE EYE/Swan Song SS 8414 (Showing rare  
maturity, Pretty Things are rockers able to genuinely com-  
mit themselves to a ballad. Ballads separate the pimples  
from the face. They really come up winners with Savage  
Eye.)
- Phoebe Snow/SECOND CHILDHOOD/Columbia PC 33952  
(Phoebe's magical voice and Phil Ramone's super sound  
combine well. Though her own writing does not always hit  
the mark, she always sounds good. Her special place is  
retained.)
- Rosalie Sorrels/ALWAYS A LADY/Philo 1029 (A full range  
of emotions and attitudes, from raucous to sentimental,  
define Rosalie's broad talent. She is an accomplished  
writer, performer and raconteur. A pleasure.)
- Starcastle/Epic PE 33914 (They try hard. But, for Starcastle  
to do anything really significant they will have to write the  
great song. As it stands, their adequate tunes are laced  
with the false drama of Yes. Acceptable.)
- Clifford Thornton & The Jazz Composer's Orchestra/THE  
GARDENS OF HARLEM/JCOA LP 1008 (A solid Latin rhythm  
influence keeps their improvisational wanderings from  
getting away. Don't be frightened by the JCOA brand. This  
challenge is a rejuvenating experience. Pressing problems  
are unfortunate.)
- Tom & Theresa/CARRY ME BACK/Orygun TTM 973302  
(Homegrown albums are always sentimental favorites but,  
rarely do they sound like anything other than homegrown.  
Tom & Theresa transcend their locality by singing uniformly  
good material and by working in a pleasant folk mode.  
Worth a listen. Write Orygun at 2580 N. E. Seavy Circle,  
Corvallis, Ore. 97330.)

### SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality which, of themselves, require  
only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

- Nickey Barclay/DIAMOND IN A JUNKYARD/Ariola America  
ST-50006 (Packaged and produced with a high gloss but  
substantively weak. Nickey's songs are never better than  
average and they are often played at a non-committal rock  
tempo which is neither ballad or rocker. The album drags.)
- Wayne Parker/OKLAHOMA TWILIGHT/Ariola America  
ST-50005 (Under the direction of Mike Curb, Wayne's  
music tends to get unnecessarily sweetened and somewhat  
misunderstood. He has potential as a singer/songwriter  
beyond the fact that he looks the part. A modern Texas-  
country-rockin' sound would move Wayne out of the ordinary.)
- Spiders From Mars/Pye 12125 (Bowie's former rhythm  
section joins with two front men, Pete McDonald and Dave  
Black, to rock around. Ordinary writing is the element  
which holds them back in a Lp which has no highs or lows.)

### UNDISTINGUISHED ALBUMS

(In our opinion, below standard Lps except where noted.)

- John Bailey/BEFORE MAN LEARNED TO FLY/Swallowtail  
ST 5 (John's album is not bad, it is just primitive. Neither  
the writing quality or the production approach is consistently  
mounted from track to track. Though it shows potential,  
this album wasn't conceptually ready to record. Swallow-  
tail, Box 843, Ithaca, N. Y. 14850.)

### FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some inter-  
est for progressive audiences.)

- Hank Crawford/I HEAR A SYMPHONY/Kudu KU 26 (This  
album has almost nothing to do with Hank Crawford. He  
is a sideman on his own record. A disco-pop concoction,  
the album is well recorded.)
- Isaac Hayes/GROOVE-A-THON/ABC ABCD 925 (Isaac has  
been known to use big orchestrations to excess but he has  
also shown an uncanny sense of melody. Side one is tasty  
providing a couple opportunities, especially "Rock Me  
Easy Baby".)
- Willis Jackson/HEADED & GUTTED/Muse MR 5048 (After a  
heated rhythm piece which titled the album, Willis settles  
into his mellow phase. The record cruises evenly to a  
super smooth landing. "My One And Only Love" is painted  
in vinyl with an impressionist's stroke.)
- Dick Wellstood & Jane Harvey/FATS WALLER REVISITED/  
Classic Jazz CJ 15 (Waller, needless to say, was a legend-  
ary writer. This band, including vocalist Jane Harvey, work  
at a super club level. Competence, but no essence limit  
the concept.)

### SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous musics.)

- Ronnie Boykins/ESP-Disk ESP 3026 (Constructive avant-  
garde. Boykins', a bassist, wisely keeps the rhythm  
harnessed, even when they are operating in 7/4 time. This  
gives the soloists complete freedom without risking anarchy.  
Though it gets away from them on occasion, Ronnie's al-  
bum works.)
- Lester Raymond Flatt/Flying Fish 015 (There are no defi-  
ciencies in this pure hillbilly music. For the true believers  
this record has to be satisfying, especially since recent  
Lester Flatt recordings have been scarce. Fun.)
- Leroy Jenkins & The Jazz Composer's Orchestra/FOR PLAY-  
ERS ONLY/JCOA LP1010 (Jenkins gathers the spacemen of  
avant-garde jazz in an orchestral setting which multiplies,  
geometrically, the challenge in music normally performed  
in small groups. The lesson for us is that the word pro-  
gressive, as applied to music, is relative. JCOA music  
is a necessary experience.)

## CONCEPTS

### One Small Stroke - An Industry Object Lesson

It is part of the nature of this business to measure success in big numbers. We are impressed by million selling records which draw masses of people into stores and we are impressed with gigantic concerts which draw many thousands into a concert hall. The battle of the giants - Columbia vs. Warner Communications - is always fun to watch as is the marked growth of a newcomer like Arista Records. Similarly, the push-pull relationship of competing radio stations is a fascinating sight for those outside the brawl.

Here we would like to change that field of vision. We would like to take some space to point out a much smaller stroke on this business, but one as significant as any mentioned above. From the unlikeliest corner of this industry comes Chick Corea's organization, Return to Forever. The whole conglomerate consists of the four players in Chick's group plus three or four behind the scenes workers. They have succeeded in multiplying themselves like none of the big time rock bands have been able to.

Their cornerstone, of course, is the group. Chick's vision of a high-level mass appeal fusion band is the basis for everything. Starting with good music and players, they set out to

play concert after concert using Chick's name as the draw. Booked and publicized by the organization, Return to Forever began to make a name for itself. Their recordings helped to spread the already spreading word. But it was the power of the organization which made it go.

Now here is the delicious part. Instead of the band's members reading their own notices and leaving the root organization to fly on the wings of celebrity themselves, they chose to remain. Staying, in spite of pressure, Stanley Clarke began to release albums. Now three albums later Clarke is established in his own right. His star has risen and the group has grown even stronger.

Several months ago, Lenny White's Lp let loose and began the process of building his position. And there is more to come.

Eventually, this group and its compact retinue will be forced to disband, whether sooner or later it has already established a pattern which should be studied by artist and manager alike. The rule is: Keep a good thing together while allowing individuals the room to stretch.

I say this after listening to Bob Marley and the Wailers Live. It's an Lp that captures the true reggae feel, not some watered down caucasian arrangement. (Listen to "I Shot the Sheriff" from the Wailers Live Lp, and

Clapton's version becomes humorous.) Yet this new Marley album is as well-produced as any live album on the market, a quality which earlier Wailers and Maytals albums have lacked. Bob Marley & The Wailers Live has the commercial appeal American audiences require (hot guitar licks, strong rhythm section, concise arrangements) that will get reggae over to the masses, and the nice part about it, Marley has done it without compromising one Ganga stick. Progressive stations on the East and West coasts have tried hard to get reggae over to America, and if Island Records plays their cards right, ... Wailers Live can be the culmination of those efforts.

A Beatles reunion is in the wind again. I give it one more time around, and if they don't do it, then the next time nobody's gonna give a shit.

Oct./Nov. '75 ARB's have looked good for progressive stations across the country. Do you get the feeling that because of the increasingly tight playlists of many AM rockers, a listener backlash is occurring, and people are turning to stations with a wider variety of music to escape hearing Elton John twenty times a day.

Lots of live music coming to Pittsburgh this year, and WYDD is involved in co-sponsorship of many of those concerts. It helps us, it helps the promoter bring a broader spectrum of acts, and most importantly it gives the people a chance to be exposed to many different types of music, and therefore, become more musically aware, which brings them to the more musically aware station. That makes sense... doesn't it?

NEWS & PUBLIC AFFAIRS:

Does anybody out there have an active intern program? It turns out to be a valuable resource, especially when news/public affairs is always such a low budget item. Working with several of the colleges and universities in Puget Sound country we get communications/journalism majors for a quarter and they get credit toward their degree. In one case we have an intern eight hours a day, five days a week. In return he gets a full fifteen credits, or one quarter's worth. In other cases it's just a couple of hours a day for three credits. And rather than having interns do all the lowly tasks reserved for interns, we have involved them in the daily information gathering process, teaching them how to track phoners and letting them slowly work their way toward voicing some of their own material. With that as an incentive they attack their work with much more enthusiasm and seem to learn a helluva lot more than just pulling cuts from a UPI audio feed. We have turned many interns on to the concept of quality rather than quantity and many have requested time beyond their official internship. One intern, with a background in environmental law, uncovered a story that played a part in temporarily delaying the start of construction on a nuclear power plant. It is rewarding to everyone involved, especially to the students who learn more than editing tape and rewriting wire copy. It is rewarding to us to see people really turned on to what radio news can do.

Women in the Arts '76... On the station involvement calendar, probably the biggest event for KZAM to date has been Women in the Arts '76, January 23 - 25th. It was a three day festival featuring the top women artists in music, dance, theatre, visual arts and crafts, film and video, and written arts. The festival was co-sponsored by KZAM, the Seattle Center, Seattle Parks & Recreation, and the University YWCA. KZAM served as the major informational outlet, giving listeners detailed information about everything going on such as dance workshops, slide shows etc. During the weekend KZAM featured music by top women artists, and sponsored a concert in conjunction with the festival featuring Wendy Waldman and Rachel Faro. At midnight the first night of the festival KZAM aired a radio theatre piece called "Carmilla." It's a vampire story featuring three female roles. On Sat. and Sun. of the weekend KZAM broadcasted live reports hourly from the Seattle Center. Although there is no official count yet, there were thousands of people there over the weekend. It was standing room only for poetry readings. All the events were free to the public, except for Wendy and Rachel, which cost \$3.00 per person. All the performers and participants in the festival were paid, which required funds from various arts commissions, bicentennial grants, performers unions, and private donations. Active radio station involvement can really make a difference in the success of any venture such as this and the rewards from that involvement are great.

Accompanying themselves on piano, guitar or harmonica (Zeller plays an excellent harmonica), they tried awfully hard to involve an otherwise apathetic audience. Their harmonies are their highpoint, and there's not enough of that. In general, their spirit overcomes their amateurish lyrics. Swan's first visit to New York made a clubful of people hope it wasn't his last. Swan achieved and passed perfection, with an incredibly professional, competent and tight band composed of studio musicians. Having been one himself, he sure can pick 'em well. They not only accompanied him, but added enough style and zest (while still having fun) to make the music sound better than the record. He began with what should have been his finale, "I Can Help," and proceeded to rock and roll in his own way--not exactly country, more like pop examining its own roots. He makes music fun and pleasant. I was disappointed only in that he stuck to rhythm guitar for the whole show, while on record he plays keyboards as well. But not knowing what to expect, I found myself reeling to some old and new, original rock that Swan does so well. The man deserves every rave he's ever gotten--including this one.
