WALRUS STATISTICS

Our statistics are a quantitative reflection of current Lp acceptance based on our contributors' reports. Progressive Retail Reaction is derived from Top 15 retail reports while New Retail Action is derived from New Reaction reports. Both are weighted to compensate for the size of the store chain. Radio Emphasis is computed by counting radio reports of Audience Reaction and Heavy Airplay. (Heavy Airplay new additions are not included.) New Releases to Watch is calculated by counting all indicated New Additions and weighing them according to heavy or moderate play. All calculations are first done regionally then combined to form the national totals.

NEW RELEASES

Below is a catalogue of new releases. They are divided into categories designed to give you an idea of their relative musical worth. These first impressions are not meant to relate in anyway to past, present or future sales, nor should they be taken as the word of God.

SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(These recordings which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

Osamu Kitajima/BENZATTEN/Antilles AN-7016 (Like nothing you have ever heard. Osamu has done the impossible, he has fused, into an organic whole, traditional Japanese music and Western music. His Kabuki-rock, if you will, manages to be faithful to both feelings while it challenges and entertains the listener.)

STRONGLY MERITORIOUS

(The following Lps are Merit Albums which we feel have an extra edge.)

Billy Cobham/LIFE & TIMES/Atlantic SD 18166 (Dexterity is the issue. Billy is the Olympic champ - no doubt about it. But, does he have the taste to sublimate his drum kit for the music? Yes he does, and that is the difference between an athlete and a musician. Well played.)

Alvin Crow & The Pleasant Valley Boys/Long Neck (It may be their barroom attitude which endears Alvin Crow's aggregation immediately but, it is their western swing which lingers beyond the hangover. Sons of Austin, these fellows don't miss a lick anywhere on the Lp. Fun. No address for Long Neck was provided.)

Les Dudek/Columbia PC 33702 (An auspicious debut as a solo artist casts Les in an Allman Brothers derived set of substantial quality. His excellent writing, singing and mighty guitar rush into a vacuum left by the inactivity of his mentors and the death of Duane.)

Jean-Luc Ponty/AURORA/Atlantic SD 18163 (Even the acoustic passages are electrified by uniformly exciting melodies. Ponty has brought together a group of players with equivalent abilities and with wedded tastes. Superior.)

Sailor/TROUBLE/Epic PE 34039 (Previously reviewed as an import. Georg Kajanus is a skillful writer nowadays and this production of his songs is gracefully mounted. Rupert Holmes is listed as the associate producer but, the sparkling arrangements show his hand. They enhance this Lp measurably.)

Thin Lizzy/JAILBREAK/Mercury SRM 1-1081 (Phil Lynott's writing and singing are never less than super - a little Springsteenish, though, that isn't entirely fair since Thin Lizzy pre-dates him. Further, the band deploys the best guitar duo in the biz. A strong performance.)

STRONGLY MERITORIOUS CONTINUED

Nanette Workman/Big Tree BT 89514 (In workmanlike manner, Nanette starts with a batch of super rock and roll songs of which she is co-author. Engulfed in a nasty rhythm track they emerge fired. Side one is percentage points better than two, it is mighty.)

Collin Walcott/CLOUD DANCE/ECM 1062 (Even if Collin were half the sitar player he is, he would find a place for himself among players of the Abercrombie-Holland-DeJohnette level. The fact that his music fits into the jazz context so easily is not surprising. The surprise is that the concept hasn't been done too frequently before, beyond Oregon.)

MERIT ALBUMS

(Our recommendations for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all Merit Albums are suitable for all stations.)

The Alexander Review/Voya XUS-16 (The urban density of New York City ghettos injects this R&B band with a nasty streak. A not-so-hidden anger sparks "A Change Had Better Come" and a stimulated jam expands "Snidely Whip-lash." Other things are of interest also.)

Ayers Rock/BEYOND/A&M SP 4565 (In a shortish album Ayers Rock proves, beyond doubt, its instrumental ability. While the songs are good enough, they always convey a feeling of unnaturalness until the breaks, then they fly.)

David Batteau/HAPPY IN HOLLYWOOD/A&M SP 4576 (Batteau operates a sound built on soft rhythm shuffles. They set off his melodies well. The mood is easy. When his tunes are right, not always, the formula works well. Distinctive.)

Norman Blake/WHISKEY BEFORE BREAKFAST/Rounder 0063 (Though it is probably a little esoteric for some, Norman's Lp is a fine one by any standard. Superb recording quality projects the organic sounds of the acoustic guitar which he plays with commanding ability. Blake's songs are good too.)

Randall Bramblett/LIGHT OF THE NIGHT/Polydor PD 6064 (Randall's lyrics don't always marry the melody line but, when they do the funky flows. His voice is always on target with that lived-a-lifetime tone.)

Brother to Brother/LET YOUR MIND BE FREE/Turbo TU 7015 (Billy Jones' tunes are pretty good though the Sly Stone derived vocals on some may be offensive to the offendable. While that stuff is acceptable, a few other things grow to tasty. Try "Plattenin" and "Take My Love."

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

The Stanky Brown Group/OUR PLEASURE TO SERVE YOU/Sire SASD-7516 (A muddy, inarticulate mix interferes with the enjoyment of some good songs. The tunes save the album in spite of the pervasive feeling that we haven't yet heard The Stanky Brown Group.)

Charles Browning/A CHOIRBOY'S LAMENT/SRI 83319-76 (A liberated folky, it takes Charles most of the first side to begin to get uncorked. While it is O.K., side two is the winner. It shows melodic superiority and creatively developed arrangements. Contact SRI at 2000 P St., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20036.)

Phil Cody/Reprise MS 2232 (Two or three tunes on each side meet both requirements of quality and arrangement purity. Some of Brooks Arthur's beautiful production gets too beautiful as the sweeteners billow in the background. Cody is an interesting writer.)

Shirley Collins & The Albion Country Band/NO ROSES/Antilles AN-7017 (The Albion Country Band is a conglomerate of favorites from Steeleye and Fairport and various other British folkies and drifters. They provide the backing for notable Shirley Collins and her collected songs of an Anglo past. Shirley's voice is adequate, not special. Her vocation is laudible.)

Nick Drake/FIVE LEAVES LEFT/Antilles AN-7010 (A moody album. Subdued but, warm and enticing, Nick's quiet melodies propel his inner thoughts. In a voice not much more than a whisper, Nick tells his story.)

Jonathan Edwards/ROCKIN' CHAIR/Reprise MS 2238 (His signature is that soothing tenor and the natural round to his tunes. Jonathan is a mellow pill to take in times of psychic emergency. Welcome anytime.)

Eon/ECM 1054 (Previously reviewed as an import. Acoustic trio jazz of the new school. Very intellectual, mostly mellow, involving music. Richard Burack, piano, Frank Tusa, bass, and Jeff Williams, drums, make space for themselves.)

Ethos (Adour)/Capitol ST 11498 (Undeniable is the precision playmanship and presentation of rather complex material. However, the quality of their material is less sure. Ethos is a band who asks the listener to whistle their technique. Most everything is for the intellect while little remains for the soul.)

Maynard Ferguson/PRIMAL SCREAM/Columbia PC 33953 (After some disparate attempts Maynard has broken the old big band grasp on his thinking, at least on side one. He starts with intense, R&B derived rhythm and continues to make the point by moderating his big horn section. The combo feeling emerges and Ferguson breaks through. Side two loses the focus as it floats off into both a black-tie disco thing and simulated reggae. Stick to an explosive side one.)

Lee Garrett/HEAT FOR THE FEETS/Chrysalis CHR 1109 (A combination of super songwriting and a powerhouse performance makes Lee an artistic factor. Some overdone performance can be forgiven in the face of the man's dynamism. Lee will heat your ears.)

Genesis/A TRICK OF THE TAIL/Atco SD 36-129 (For the preservation of the Genesis sound Peter Gabriel's leaving has had a minimal effect. Their performance could suffer more without his showmanship. This album is carefully done. It favors the quieter, less pompous tunes which spend their time developing themes.)

The Steve Gibbons Band/ANY ROAD UP/MCA 2187 (The Steve Gibbons Band is another good rock band which needs a more identifiable hook. Gibbons' writing is good enough - each song manages a catchy phrase or two.)

Al Green/FULL OF FIRE/Hi SHL 32097 (Again, the musical marriage of Al Green and Willie Mitchell produces a tasty album. Like reggae rhythm, Willie's rhythm is an infectious kind of repetitive. Good songs throughout.)

Grimms/ROCKIN' DUCK/Antilles AN-7012 (Previously reviewed as an import. Quality. The diversity of writers and lead singers could cause unity problems to lesser talents. Style and humor weave through and around the music. The Bonzo spirit remains alive.)

Steve Hackett/VOYAGE OF THE ACOLYTE/Chrysalis CHR 1112 (Previously reviewed as an import. Hackett's classical rock music is reminiscent of Emerson, Lake and Palmer if you can imagine them devoid of their show biz. The instrumental parts posture and strut with a strain of low-key pomposity throughout. It ain't soulful.)

Tim Hardin/NINE/Antilles AN-7023 (Previously reviewed as an import. Good tunes, Tim's unmistakable vocals and a setting that is just right. Simplicity.)

Infernal Blues Machine/ADIOS AMIGO/London PS 666 (Credit producer Wm. Mickey Stevenson for wisely making an album out of songs originally written for a film. More than a soundtrack, this is an album of very good R&B. Side one is hot while the second side is filled with strong ballads.)

Jane/III/Capitol ST-11425 (Previously reviewed as an import. Jane plays a very dense form of rock music related to heavy metal and simultaneously, to the German avant-garde. Since they don't come from the same traditions as their counterparts in America and England, they are able to bring a fresh touch to what would be a tired format.)

Syl Johnson/TOTAL EXPLOSION/Hi SHL 32096 (Rhythm and blues music in pure form is almost a forgotten joy. Willie Mitchell seems intent on not letting us forget. This time he does it through the considerable talent of Syl Johnson. That penetrating voice cuts through Willie's booming drum sound.)

Greg Kihn/Beserkley BZ-0046 (Basic music. Greg's writing is as good as is his voice. The presentation and production stays within limited bounds accomplishing the first goal of getting the music recorded competently.)

Lavada/Pye 12126 (Two things are important when considering Lavada. First, she is different, a unique artist and second, she is real good. Her writing ranges from O.K. to solid, but it is her unbridled dramatic presentation which makes the songs live. Peter K. Siegel wisely did not impose himself - he captured her essence.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Lenny Le Blanc/Big Tree BT 89515 (With country flavoring built in Lenny's creamy vocals get a light treatment bordering on M.O.R. The gently rocking bottom manages to keep his mellow harmonizing in bounds. Good songs punctuate the effort.)

Nils Lofgren/CRY TOUGH/A&M SP-4573 (Lofgren's writing, as distinguished from his presentation, is now adequate on a regular basis. His presentation, on the other hand, is superior and getting better. The groove never falters.)

Steve Marriott/MARRIOTT/A&M SP-4572 (Start with side two if change is bothersome. Steve powers it in standard manner. If, on the other hand, you appreciate a refreshing change from the expected, try the rhythm and bluesy opening side. Marriott scrambles well both ways - up or over.)

Buddy Miles/BICENTENNIAL GATHERING OF THE TRIBES/Casablanca NBLP-7024 (Buddy has written a strong melody or two in his time and he maintains that tradition here. In a hotly forged production he force feeds his message in swirling sound.)

Nektar/RECYCLED/Passport PPS-9811 (Lots of work went into this Nektar album in an effort to reinstate their pompous rock momentum. A powerful, unrelenting Lp results. The melodies concede something to the mechanical.)

Osibisa/WELCOME HOME/Island ILPS 9355 (Previously reviewed as an import. Leading what appears to be a divided existence the African spirit of Osibisa seems separated from their western influences. A more significant contribution would be made if they'd find ways to maintain their native essence as they explore the outside.)

Pousette-Dart Band/Capitol ST-11507 (Norbert Putnam's production is always crystalline. Here, without his sweet side in evidence, the Pousette-Dart Band gets his best. Jon's songs are not as consistent as they should be but, most are acceptable.)

Slade/NOBODY'S FOOLS/Warner Bros. BS 2936 (Though the basic Slade sound hasn't changed since the beginning, their style shows maturation which cannot be ignored. Always good writers, their songs remain enjoyably light-hearted.)

The Earl Slick Band/Capitol ST-11493 (Repetitive, basic drumming can get unnerving but, it does help solidify the Slick Band sound. A few convincing songs come out of their relentless underpinning.)

Dan Smith/NOW IS THE TIME/Biograph BLP-12053 (The combination of Dan blowing air and Nicky Seeger's guitar accompaniment seems so natural. Their interplay is a union which belies their different backgrounds. The result develops an unusually attractive intensity in the old man's blues.)

William D. Smith/A GOOD FEELIN'/Warner Bros. BS-2911 (Another tight little Toussaint production provides the springboard for Smith to deliver what he's got. A slow start is bolstered in the middle as the Lp gathers some funky steam. Smith's identity isn't singular enough.)

Robin Trower/LIVE!/Chrysalis CHR 1089 (Trower's success is a credit to those hard rockers who normally get no respect. He is an impressively sensitive guitarist - he knows when to turn up and when to lay off. Solid performance. Side one is stronger.)

Various Artists/HAVE MOICY!/Rounder 3010 (Any recording which includes the Holy Modal Rounders promises the crazies. They start immediately and spice the whole album. Michael Hurley & Jeffrey Fredericks among others also take part in this meld of looney tunes and good pickin'. If entertainment is the purpose of a record, this one is a winner.)

Aj Webber/Anchor ANCL-2007 (Aj's album generates an easy, appealing flow. Her mixture of original and chosen songs shows both talent and judgment. The real character of the effort doesn't become evident until the middle of side one. Solid.)

Wet Willie/THE WETTER THE BETTER/Capricorn CP-0166 (Their easy rambling rhythm sets you up for a good time at once. A pleasant tune or two and you are hooked.)

Larry Jon Wilson/LET ME SING.../Monument KZ-34041 (His rough exterior telegraphs a funky soul. Larry has put some living into his songs and his baritone bends around them easily. Side two is good but, it shows a much gentler aspect of Wilson's talent.)

Wishbone Ash/LOCKED IN/Atlantic SD 18164 (Wishbone barely squeaks by. Always plagued by borderline material and merely adequate vocals, this Lp shows no advancement on either front. Some catchy tunes invest side one with value and the final song on side two is also worthy.)

Bill Wyman/STONE ALONE/Rolling Stone COC 79103 (Given the support he gets from an extraordinary group of musicians Bill would have had to do more than write several bad songs to fail. Two or three songs on each side reach an acceptable level of entertainment. Wyman ought to hire a singer.)

Jesse Colin Young/ON THE ROAD/Warner Bros. BS-2913 (Jesse is one of those rare entertainers whose presence on stage unites the audience in a mellow cloud of joy. His show makes you feel good - so does this album of his show.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

Good Rats/RATCITY IN BLUE/Ratcity RCR-8001 (Their album is cut like a single with no regard for full range frequency response. That problem set aside, the Good Rats have made a second Lp which, like their first, is strong on determination and weak on writing. It is a shame Peppi's potent pipes have to sing his songs. Try "The Room" and the title track.)

Greezy Wheels/RADIO RADIALS/London PS 667 (Greezy Wheels is a cross between Dan Hicks and David Bromberg. Though their idea and attitude is lovable, their best performances did not always get onto this record. More and better in the future.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Eddie Harris/THAT IS WHY YOU'RE OVERWEIGHT/Atlantic SD 1683 (Eddie's diffuse production suffers from a lack of focus, which unsteadies the whole project, and some questionable material. Though there are some nice performances, the album doesn't say anything. It never gets together.)
- Heart/DREAMBOAT ANNIE/Mushroom MRS 5005 (Previously reviewed as an import. These Canadian ladies, Ann and Nancy Wilson, are on the verge of becoming solid songwriters. Though, based on their sequencing, they don't seem to recognize their better tunes. Try "Crazy on You," "I'll Be Your Song" and "Dreamboat Annie.")
- Anne Romaine/GETTIN' ON COUNTRY/Rounder 3009 (Whether it is the playing or the mix on these sessions which lacks purpose, it is hard to determine. In any case, some fine Anne Romaine country songs get underperformed. The producer is ultimately to blame for the missing punch.)
- Brian and Brenda Russell/WORD CALLED LOVE/Rocket FIG-2181 (The overall quality of the Russell material is not enough to overlook some of the overproduction. Reviving the classic male-female duo is a great idea but, the songs - as in any other context - must be more consistent. This is the kind of spotty album which could succeed on a few tracks like "You'll Never Rock Alone," "Tell Me When...," "Highly Prized Possession" and "Backstreet Lovin".)

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous musics.)

- Frankie Armstrong/SONGS & BALLADS/Antilles AN-7021 (Ms. Armstrong's voice isn't a thing of great beauty but it sure has the right attitude. She sings the traditional music of Britain in traditional manner. Good roots music.)
- Marion Brown/AFTERNOON OF A GEORGIA FAUN/ECM 1004 (From 1970, this LP is Marion Brown in his most difficult space. Some of those aiding in this effort are Braxton, Corea and Manpin. Both pieces are mind altering.)
- The Chieftains/3/Island ILPS 9379 (That beautiful music passes the centuries before your ears with unerring grace. The Chieftain performance is disarming.)
- Country Gazette/LIVE/Antilles AN-7014 (Mountain music always makes you feel good. Isn't that what music is all about. Country Gazette speeds through this exhilarating set.)
- Hugh Delain/HARRY WARREN'S PIANO VIGNETTES/Antilles AN-7009 (Ordinarily a Hollywood songwriter, even of Warren's stature, would be out-of-bounds. Delain's rambling piano voicings, however, give these moody pieces a melancholy charm.)
- Ebenezer/TELL IT TO ME/Biograph RC 6007 (Ebenezer is a string trio which chooses not to dazzle with speedy picking. Instead, they do a nice job of harmonizing and articulating their songs. Entertaining musical choices solidify the effort. Pure.)
- Duke Ellington/THE AFRO-EURASIAN ECLIPSE/Fantasy F9498 (This "suite in eight parts" moves with standard Ellington ease. It points to sounds from the East mostly. But, the track which catches an ear first is "Afrique." "Chinoiserie" and "Gong" beg for attention too.)
- The Bill Evans Trio/SINCE WE MET/Fantasy F-9501 (Bill's unerring sense of melodic beauty and his unique style of saying so deserve the acclaim they get. His music has a lovely, mellow flow built into it. A strong live set.)
- Charlie Rich/SILVER LININGS/Epic KE 33545 (It took a collection of traditional church songs to get to hear Charlie Rich au naturel. He's always had a really soulful vocal quality hidden under his normal production. Many of these tracks could fit into regular programming contexts but, the album as a whole could be perfect in the right setting, i. e., Sunday morning and Christmastime.)
- Angel Romero/SPANISH VIRTUOSO/Angel S-36094 (Guitar soloists, particularly of Romero's quality, have a standard place in a format so guitar oriented. Imagination is the key to its use.)
- Angel Romero/CLASSICAL VIRTUOSO/Angel S-36093 (There must be a rule that guitar virtuosos of this caliber emanate from Spain. Christopher Parkening aside, Angel is another Spaniard with a romantic flair and a precise technique.)
- Tony Trischka/HEARTLANDS/Rounder 0062 (Placing a jazzy track "Sage Age" in the middle of a bluegrass album is weird but, not half as weird as putting a saxophone part in the middle of the grass itself. Tony has the gall to do both. Somehow he brings it off. Still, it is for grassers.)
- Various Artists/FOX HOLLOW LODGE STRING BAND FEST/Biograph RC-6008 (Pretty much for the purist, although anyone with a pure heart could have fun with this pickin' and singing. A highlight is "South Wind" lead by Jerry Jenkins' recorder.)
- Various Artists/FOX HOLLOW 10TH ANNIVERSARY VOL. I & II/Biograph BLP 12051-52 (Variety is the story in these two albums. The standard banjo pickin' is wedged between every complexion of hillbilly music possible including a bagpipe solo. The endless parade yields high quality performances.)
- The Watsonsons/FOR PENCE & SPICY ALE/Antilles AN-7020 (High order a cappella versions of traditional English music set the Watsonsons apart. Their sturdy harmonies never waiver. Joined here by Martin Carthy, The Watsonsons will impress the fussiest folks.)

FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

- Ashford & Simpson/COME AS YOU ARE/Warner Brothers BS 2858 (Ashford and Simpson are a positively dynamic performing and writing duo. However, their albums tend to get overproduced as they try to stuff the records with energy. Try "One More Try", "Tell It All" and "It Came To Me."

FRINGE ALBUMS CONTINUED

- Bay City Rollers/ROCK N' ROLL LOVE LETTER/Arista AL 4071 (Their music, though error free, is antiseptic. For rock and roll, it is singularly unfunky. Acceptable pop?)
- Larry Gatlin/WITH FAMILY & FRIENDS/Monument K2 34042 (Larry is a writer of distinction. He is a story weaver similar to the Goodmans and Buffetts though lacking the humor. Another significant difference is the way he chooses to present himself. He is squeaky clean.)
- Jim & Ginger/AIN'T IT GOOD TO HAVE IT ALL/ABC ABCD-938 (A few good songs jump out of the mediocrity. They save an already too saccharine production mood from disaster. M. O. R.)
- Stan Kenton/KENTON '76/Creative World ST 1076 (Kenton's music may have stopped its growth a while back but, his search for the perfection of it continues. This most careful recording captures all of the textures of big band music as they rarely are captured.)
- Olympic Runners/DON'T LET UP/London PS 668 (Blue-eyed disco from England has a note of humor in it. Pete Wingfield and Mike Vernon among them, The Olympic Runners manage to sneak a melody into one or two tunes. Try "In the Can" and "The Kool Gent.")
- Lee Oskar/United Artists UA-UA 594-6 (Lee's harmonica lays on top of rhythms of varied intensity to create a mostly innocuous set. However, on "Blisters" he gets bluesy and the result is enticing. Also, try "Down on the Nile.")
- Rocco/20th Century T-505 (Previously we have expressed reservations about drummer lead bands. However, in a mostly disco context - such as this one - it makes sense. The included songs aren't too good on the whole but, the rhythm never quits.)
- Rush/2112/Mercury SRM 1-1079 (The Rush power-play remains the same as before. Their main trick is to juxtapose opposite textures, acoustic guitar into ultra-fuzz electric. With sturdy melodies the band is good at what they do. Especially note side two.)
- Margaret Singana/WHERE IS THE LOVE/Casablanca NBLP-7026 (Margaret's pop R&B is O. K., but, the three reggae tracks on side two are of real interest here. Specifically, her reggae versions of the classics "Stand By Your Man" and "Tears On My Pillow." Her "Many Rivers to Cross" is good but, must stay in the shadows of the definitive Cliff version.)
- Soul Children/FINDERS KEEPERS/Epic PE 33902 (Trends come and go while basic R&B music lives on and on. The Soul Children are part of that grand tradition - always substantial, never trendy.)
- Nat Stuckey/INDEPENDENCE/MCA-2184 (An eclectic country approach puts Nat Stuckey in a position of interest. Mixing some rock rhythm and even some clarinet gives Nat his appeal. This careful production can get too slick. Still he's worthy.)
- Kenny Wheeler/GNU HIGH/ECM 1069 (Previously reviewed as an import. Partially eclipsed by the backup trio - DeJohnette, Holland and Jarrett - Wheeler establishes a mild manner. The groove is pleasant rather than compelling.)

Glyder/Warner Brothers K56167 (Glyder is a good pop band. Their melody writing is fully developed but, lyrically they are somewhat childish. They have time to grow. Fringe.)
Mallard/Virgin V2045 (Mallard starts off one step ahead because the band includes Art Tripp III, alias Ed Marimba, late of Beefheart's Magic. His drumming adds its distinctive essence to the backup which supports a not unBeefheart-like vocalist Sam Galpin. The music is sane rock and roll with a twist. Merit.)

Ralf Nowy Group/ESCALATION/Atlantic ATL 40556 (After a collection of nicely brought off rhythm pieces [side one] the Nowy Group launches a side long jazz-rock concerto [side two]. It too, is well done though a little long for radio tastes. Credit them for the adventure. Merit.)
Tiger/Retreat RTL 6006 (There seems to be a ratio of over-kill arrangements to melody pervading Tiger. When the song isn't as sure they pull out all of the stops in an attempt to force it home. Of course, it doesn't work that way but, they try. A few successes on each side. Merit.)
U-Roy/DREAD IN A BABYLON/Virgin V 2048 (U-Roy's inarticulate speech is perfectly wedded to reggae rhythm. It doesn't matter whether you can understand him. Suffice it to say, we are still listening for the first weak reggae album. Special Mention.)

CONCEPTS

Planning For Cable Radio

Our fabled broadcast watchdog, the FCC, is now under fire for its alleged inhibitions on the growth of cable broadcasting in favor of the established network interests. Most of the discussion centers on television. This masks an aspect of the cable story which is of interest to us, the potential effect of cable on the radio industry.

Our tendency is to accept the broad allegation that the FCC has thrown all possible obstacles in the way of the development of cable. On a slightly different but, convergent issue, we tend to side with those who prefer the expansion of all media into as many different operating hands as possible. That position leads us to favor cablecasting. However, cablecasting could cause problems for many of our friends in radio because, in spite of the emphasis on television, there is the probability that radio lines will be built into most cable systems.

The same fears of fragmentation of audience and tighter programming source competition which are the root of T.V.'s objections are of even more moment to the radio broadcaster who suffers with an already fragmented audience. Further, a cable radio station, with far lower costs (no transmitter) would have an easier time competing in a highly fragmented marketplace.

What will radio do? That is an intriguing question we cannot answer but, one which we believe all radio people must begin to contemplate. Our reading of the momentum of this issue sees the growth of cablecasting in the near future. Its intrusion into a stable media picture will force an adjustment just as the movie industry had to adjust to the growth of television. If radio people - programming and management - are wise they will begin to confront the issue now so that the inevitable realignment is less chaotic than was the movie-television adjustment.

There is a continuing and real danger that the business side of things will completely engulf every other aspect of a station's affairs; that the "music side" will increasingly be totally defined by the Big Disc companies. It would be valuable to have some voices around to remind "the industry" about some of the other goals of communications. (e. g. the public interest and goody ideas like that).

Our recent news and public affairs programs have included: George Bush, George Bush -- an imaginary episode in the life of America's new spymaster inspired by Mary Hartman, Mary Hartman. It is a thirty minute examination of the Freedom of Information Act, in which I discuss my own effort to pry personal files from the FBI and CIA. Some of those files are read on-the-air, along with a discussion featuring Peter Biskind, a writer for Rolling Stone and John Rheinstein of the Mass Civil Liberties Union.

The program is available to other stations.

In a related front, our You Don't Say interview program spoke with two members of the Fifth Estate. They are the people who publish Counter-Spy, the magazine which has been naming CIA agents. Other guests on this program in recent weeks have included author Barbara Garson, the woman who wrote MacBird years ago and has now published a book about the deadlines of so many ordinary jobs; Bo Burlingham, a writer with a piece in the new magazine Mother Jones, discussing the state of the left around the country; and Anthony Lukas, the ex-NY Times reporter who has just written a well received book about the Nixon years.

Other recent Community reports have included Susan Sprecher's examination of the impact of state cutbacks in the medicare program, and on the rent control front. Dave Gilton did a half hour on the recent Hard Times Conference which had a hard time itself trying to mobilize a national approach to fighting against the depression. Recent women's shows have looked at the struggle of Third World women in Vietnam, Panama, and Puerto Rico. Program consultant Jan Gadson had a look at local women artists on a separate program.

If you want current up-to-date information about Angola and don't feel the Establishment press is providing the whole scoop, write for the Angola Weekly News Summary, Apt. 14F, 825 West End Avenue, New York 10025.

If you want some of the best reggae output - and want it directly from Jamaica write to Micron Music (an exclusively reggae company run by some very hip people at 14 Retirement Road, Kingston, Ja. W1). A fine new record is Life of Contradiction by Joe Higgs, the ex-Wailer who also accompanied Jimmy Cliff on his recent tour. Joe has no American label yet. He is very talented.

On a different front, a group of radical economists have got together to form The Economics Rock and Roll Band. They've recorded an album of funny, spoofy, irreverent tunes like "Understanding Marx," "Commodity Fetishism" and "Hunger." It's called Red Shadow - Live at the Panacea Hilton. Write for a copy to The Physical World, Box 125, Cambridge, Mass. 02140.

Congrats are in order to Susan Sprecher and John Scagliotti whose public affairs program What Ever Happened to Gay Legislation? was an award winner in this year's coveted New England UPI Awards. The program was a winner in the public service category.

The usual Monday morning calm was broken this week by reports that a team from Sea World, Inc. had trapped five killer whales in the south end of Puget Sound and planned to take the huge mammals to various Sea World operations around the country. Although the team had a permit from the National Fish & Wildlife people allowing them four whales a year, public reaction was swift and local conservation groups are screaming in protest. They have some official clout behind them... less than a week before the hunt, Sen. Warren Magnuson proposed that Puget Sound be turned into a sanctuary for the whales. Last week a local newspaper did a series pointing out that the Sound's whale population was probably 65 instead of 300. Joining the protest was Danny O'Keefe. O'Keefe, from Seattle, happened to be in town and called KZAM to offer to do something on the whales. He spent an hour and a half in our studios playing his guitar and also playing some tapes he has of whales and snow geese from our state's lush Skagit Valley. Turns out that O'Keefe has done extensive research on endangered species.
