OUR RELATIVE CHARTING, AS SEEN BELOW, RESEMBLES BASEBALL'S BATTING AVERAGES. IT ESTABLISHES A RATIO BETWEEN THE IDEAL, (HEAVY AIRPLAY AT EVERY STATION WHICH REPORTED); AND THE WEIGHTED COUNT THAT A RECORDING HAS ACTUALLY EARNED. THIS MATHEMATICAL FORMULA IS APPLIED TO EACH RECORD—FIRST REGIONALLY, THEN NATIONALLY. A DUAL WEIGHTING SYSTEM IS USED TO DERIVE THE COUNT. IT ADJUSTS FOR MARKET SIZE AND FOR HEAVY OR MODERATE AIRPLAY. THESE CHARTS SHOW THE RELATIVE INTENSITY OF RADIO AIRPLAY FOR BOTH NEW AND ESTABLISHED RECORDINGS.

NEWS/PUBLIC AFFAIRS:
(1) WBCN's New Public Affairs Program -- 'BCN has launched a new weekly two hour public affairs-interview-music-call-in program, hosted by myself Danny Schechter. Called "Night-Talk" the program has been aired on Monday nights from 11pm to 1am and then rebroadcast. The first program was structured around the question of the relationship between music and social commentary. It included interviews with Pete Seeger, James Talley, Joan Jet (of the Runaways) and Bernie Taupin, the "one who writes the lyrics for Elton John." It included music to illustrate the various points of view -- and an opportunity for listeners to call in comments. The prevailing view seemed to be that music has become too self-indulgent and a-political. Other features on the program include an exercise consultant and a rap with a psychiatrist who diagnoses the meaning of the ways we sleep. A second program featured pre-recorded interviews with an unlikely pair: former Nixon hatchetman Charles Colson and poet Alan Ginsberg. Ginsberg talked about his experiences on the Rolling Thunder Revue and says that Bob Dylan is still maintaining an interest in the Hurricane Carter case, and believes, with Carter, that he was railroaded once again. Dylan is now finishing a film of the tour and plans to include an interview segment with the Hurricane. The 3rd "Night-Talk" program will include interviews with ex-CIA agent Harry Rossitzke and the people from the Assassination Information Bureau (AIB). As always, I am quite willing to share these pre-recorded segments with other stations and hope that other stations will be open to exchange. I am getting a very positive and lively reaction to the program, although it is taking a lot of work to keep it balanced, diverse, and well paced.

(2) In these days when great films like Harlan County can win Academy Awards, and we all can celebrate the integrity of folks like Woody Guthrie, there are apparently people in this industry - announcers at various "progressive" stations who have no compunctions against strike breaking and scabbing against their brothers and sisters. I don't know this for a fact, but that's what I was told, as our staff union at WBCN wrestled in early April with the sticky question of how to deal with a management demand for extra days on-the-air without additional compensation. As of this writing, all of us hope that a strike here can be avoided.

Reviewer's Reaction: The "warm-up" band before the appearance of ELO was the Elliott Murphy Band. Thinking that he was going to knock this predominantly Notre Dame crowd off its feet (or chairs), the band "danced" out on stage and blasted away tunes like "Drive All Night" and "Rock Ballad" from their current album. They were surprised, however, when the N. D. crowd blasted them instead, showing what could be understated as a mild dislike for both Murphy's lack of choreographic talent and his style of rock 'n' roll. Besides, the guitars were so loud that you couldn't hear the vocals, anyway. Needless to say, poor Elliott did not return for an encore. The folks from Notre Dame came for just one thing - ELO. And what they got was ELO at their best. A trademark of ELO in concert is their superb laser show. These were used profusely throughout the concert. The lasers flashed on forming a pentagonal pattern as they began their concert with "Fire On High" using both live instruments and recorded orchestral lines. They were very successful in using "pre-recorded" tracks to blend with the live instruments. The technique provided enough reinforcement to give the "classic" ELO sound, yet was not overdone to the point of becoming just another Mike Douglas Show. Also, the light show was well timed and impressive. The group played for almost 90 minutes cranking out their hits as well as their lesser known tunes. By the end of the concert, they had worked the crowd into a frenzy akin to what you might find at a Communist Youth Rally, and still the N. D. fans chanted for more. ELO came back out on stage to do an encore of "Roll Over Beethoven." The crowd would still be in that place had ELO not done that tune. Other highlights of the concert were fine performances by Mik Kaminski on violin and Hugh McDowell on 'cello. These guys are really talented - Elliott Baby, start taking notes.

Dickey Betts & Great Southern/Arista AL 4123 (Just as America inherited the space created and abandoned by Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young, Dickey Betts, here and now, takes possession of the space left by the demise of the Allman Brothers Band. His Songs and that guitar ring true.)

Al Di Meola/ELEGANT GYPSY/Columbia PC 34461 (Dexterity and musicality fight it out for dominance. In fact, it is the juxtaposition of power and beauty, and their always shifting relationship, which fires this album. The title track is a genuine effort at advancement.)

Oneness of JuJu/Black Fire BF 19754 (From the outside looking in JuJu is a homegrown, semi-pro effort. But, viewed from the inside, the cover art is its only amateur element. The Oneness of JuJu is a masterful, musical whole. Latin, jazzy and free, it is joyfully melodic.)

Ralph Towner/DIARY/ECM 1032 ST (Previously reviewed as an import. Towner is a gifted player who is recorded beautifully. He meanders through uniquely constructed phrases and melodies which are cleanly and clearly superior. Though a powerful virtuoso performance it is not as musically uplifting as one would like.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(All Merit and Merit Plus Albums are recommended for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all of these recommendations are suitable for all stations. The Merit Plus Albums distinguish themselves with an extra vitality.)

Hoyt Axton/SNOWBLIND FRIEND/MCA 2263 (Like a musical divining rod Hoyt's ear finds or constructs melodies of constant quality. Combined with a sense of humor and a highly developed verbal skill the man is a true songman. Hoyt Axton never disappoints.)

The Dusty Chaps/HONKY TONK MUSIC/Capitol ST-11614 (This is the kind of band which can't be bottled. You can hear how much fun they must be when seen live in the right environment, a bar. The studio can be a dampening factor. Still, The Dusty Chaps deliver a pile of round tunes well.)

Bryan Ferry/IN YOUR MIND/Atlantic SD 18216 (You've heard it all before but, Bryan makes you want to hear it over again. Such style. He is at once totally unique and the embodiment of the rock and roll past.)

Lonnie Mack/HOME AT LAST/Capitol ST-11619 (Smooth and countrified, Lonnie Mack's album never stops its revolving fun. Fine material permits the loose air of confidence which emanates from these grooves. Enjoy.)

Mandre/Motown MG-886SI (Mandre, probably a pseudonym for Andre Lewis, is working in the area of spacey R&B. It's not the cluttered, angular music of either Funkadelic or Bowie. Instead it's smoothly innovative.)

Pharoah Sanders/PHAROAH/India Navigation Co. IN 1027 (In spite of the demo-like sound quality Pharoah Sanders' melodic power bursts through. "Love Will Find a Way" is an extraordinarily beautiful song. Long tracks will inhibit airplay but, the return of Pharoah has to be greeted affirmatively. Write: Box 559, Nyack, N. Y. 10960)

Zbigniew Seifert/Capitol ST-11618 (The final Lp copy better contain a pronouncer for Seifert's name. He drives out of a fusion formula with a blazing violin in hand. Journeyman work is done at each level of production to project real dynamism.)

Supertramp/EVEN IN THE QUIETEST MOMENTS.../A&M SP 4634 (Craft is their signature. Supertramp cares about even the little things in their presentation. Sound quality is elevated to a preoccupation. The band has only one flaw. They don't muster a completely individual musical identity.)

38 Special/A&M SP-4638 (A beautifully coordinated concept ties their name, packaging and sound into one tight little media lesson. With a touch of the South in their manner 38 Special's mild rock is a winner.)

MERIT ALBUMS

Andy Adams & Egg Cream/Pyramid PY-9008 (Some decent songs scattered throughout the album keep returning Andy to acceptable. The pop arranging can be sidetracked easily in this up-beat bright production.)

Asleep at the Wheel/THE WHEEL/Capitol ST-11620 (The edge is off. Texas swing is a low-key music but, Asleep at the Wheel always managed to lean into it. That extra spark seems to go wanting here. They are still lots of fun.)

Balcones Fault/Cream CR-1004 (Breaking the first rule of good communication, Balcones Fault works in a vast array of styles. Their performances are credible in each situation but the Lp amounts to a collection of random ideas. Unity and wholeness are missing. The best tracks respect the oldest musical traditions.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

George Brooks/PLAY IT AGAIN, SAMMAMA/Pirrama A-1002 (Easy-going rhythm and blues singer George Brooks starts with a positive first step. An unmanaged production seems to have the right idea but, doesn't always get the best performance possible. Brooks has a future.)

Brownsville Station/Private Stock PS 2026 (Brownsville Station makes an album. They have been known to release demos in the past. Here they conjure some thoughtful rock and roll music. They labored for this one. Good show.)

The Jack Bruce Band/HOW'S TRICKS/RSO 1-3021 (Previously reviewed as an import. Inconsistent song-writing puts the Bruce Band in an artistic limbo. The rock and roll, though blasting, often seems forced. Side two supports the whole effort with "Baby Jane" the strong element on side one.)

Jack DeJohnette/PICTURES/ECM 1-1079 (With his skill, Jackie is masterful, some consider him our top drummer. Yet his album, with all of its playmanship and exquisite sound quality, isn't very moving. The first track had the firmest grasp on musical truth. Sterile perfection.)

Faith Band/EXCUSE ME.../Village VR-7703 (Veterans of the Terry Knight debacle, the Faith Band returns, this time deserving our faith. This album is based on good music and nothing more, no gimmicks, no hypes. Straight ahead rock and roll enjoyment. Write: 6325 Guilford, Indianapolis, Ind. 46220.)

Art Farmer/CRAWL SPACE/CTI 7073 (This articulate, mellow cruise creates a pleasing aura. Steve Gadd's percussive drumming brings it out of the past. The tracks are long and marked by a graceful subtlety.)

Steven Fromholz/FROLICKING IN THE MYTH/Capitol ST-11611 (Skip to side two. The first side is polluted with arranging garbage which brings into question the validity of the artist. Is he Eddy Arnold or is he real? Side two passes.)

Gale Force/Fantasy F-9527 (Schooled on the less fluid rockers of England, like Free, the Gale brothers press on. Their best music comes at the end of each side, an incongruous country version of Tom Waits' "Rosie" and Len Gale's lovely "Amourena.")

Chuck Howard/Cream CR-1005 The properly grizzled voice of Chuck Howard is the prominent feature here. Similar to Kristofferson's, it belches out some nice tunes and some mediocre ones, while some are sweetened too much. Stick to the organically sewn.

David Liebman/LIGHT'N UP, PLEASE!/Horizon SP-721 (Super heated rhythm generates mega-thrust. We all know of Liebman's skill but, where are the enduring, ear pleasing, memory making melodies? "Slow Dance On the Killing Ground" is the only track which really puts together the proper mixture of combustibles. Side two is generally better.)

Lionhart/Hutch HP 2101-0676 (Though not even a millisecond of originality is displayed this Grand Funkish band gets by. They do it with consistently energetic presentation of their passable material. Nothing memorable except in "Dragon Lady.")

Rough Diamond/Island ILPS 9490 (Rough Diamond is rough but, not many faceted. The lead guitarist shines through the power band glare. Fair writing holds them back.)

Southside Johnny & The Asbury Jukes/THIS TIME IT'S FOR REAL/Epic PE 34668 (Miami Steve manages to make a state of the art studio sound like a juke joint. Shades of Phil Spector. However, the concept for the Lp is better than the execution of it. For example, the use of the Drifters was wiser than the use made of either the Five Satins or the Coasters.)

Sweet/OFF THE RECORD/Capitol STAO-11636 (Though side two bogs down, Sweet powers a dynamic rock album. Their name is almost a joke in contrast to that relentless spray of sound which they generate. A few good songs too.)

Johnny Guitar Watson/A REAL MOTHER FOR YA/DJM DJLPA-7 (Uncluttered arrangements in a nicely made album create an unusual feel. Watson just lays it out there with very little attack. It's low-keyness borders on anemic. Programming counterpoint.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality, which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

Tornader/HIT IT AGAIN/Polydor PD 1-607 (Much of the Tornader Lp is very mild by twister standards. Imitation disco rhythm pieces which add nothing to the earscape excite little enthusiasm. They can call it real, we have to call it imitation.)

Fred Wesley And The Horny Horns/Atlantic SD 18214 (A weak sister to Parliament and Funkadelic. They tried to straighten out that zany style and they emasculated it. Wesley is humorless and seems to have some difficulty managing the complex arranging he needs to pull it together. Some solacements.)

Dorian/Amerama A-1001 (Not up to standard. After a fair front cover things do downhill. Sonically inferior the music never gets a chance to sound as good as it could. And the music just isn't there. Dorian is not believable in his act and the songs are a losing struggle with the elements.)

Musica Orbis/TO THE LISTENERS/Longdivity LD1 (A case of fairly good players who can't identify good melodies from bad. Their tunes are ponderous and convoluted while their lyrics are uninspired.)

FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

Arthur Adams/MIDNIGHT SERENADE/Fantasy F-9523 Rhythm pieces of the activated R&B style. They tend to consume Arthur Adams' guitar. As an artist he disintegrates.)

Paul Bogush, Jr./EXPECT TO HEAR FROM ME AGAIN!/Private Stock PS 2025 (Both the production sound and the touch of Frankie Valli in Paul's voice sends the Lp to the fringes. But, it's close. Some tracks are usable, all are well supported by the L.A. studio cliché.)

The Brecker Brothers/DON'T STOP THAT MUSIC/Arista AL 4122 (The Brecker Brothers don't seem to have any self identity, they don't seem to know how to play foreground music. They are the leaders and they are playing studio horn section fillers. Randy's "Sounds" and "Tabula Rasa" are the only horn pieces on the Lp and they end each side. The album is well made but, is conceptual mashed potatoes.)

England Dan & John Ford Coley/DOWDY FERRY RD. /Big Tree BT 76000 (Their formula quite obviously works well, so why alter it. Folk-MOR is merely an extension of the sweet sounds of the Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young school. Well crafted.)

Michael Howell/A LONE/Catalyst CAT-7615 (You'll find Michael adventurous on the guitar but, only rarely does he try to liberate the instrument. He is only moderately musical but, he's always pleasant.)

Mark Levine/UP 'TIL NOW/Catalyst CAT-7614 (A 1958 stew is concocted here. An illogical mix which understates the drum kit and overstates the cymbals and a bad pressing interfere with the enjoyment. No new directions here.)

Don Menza/FIRST FLIGHT/Catalyst CAT-7617 (Tinny. Sonic impurity and a screwy mix give Don's first album a weird slant. There is no bottom end while the mid-range and highs are overemphasized. Meanwhile, Don seems capable of stretching. This format doesn't permit much of that. The Lp's prettiest track is the "Ballad of the Matador" and its hottest number is "Samba De Rollins.")

Lalo Schifrin/TOWERING TOCCATA/CTI CT17-5003 (Presented with great care. Schifrin's work is so associated with theme music that it all takes on that essence. He smartly uses some fine players from outside the standard cliché of studio players.)

Soul Children/WHERE IS YOUR WOMAN TONIGHT?/Epic PE 34455 (The pop R&B of the 60's has an artistic credibility that the newfangled stuff doesn't. Soul Children represent that tradition without sounding outdated. Try "Diamond in the Rough" and "You Don't Need a Ring.")

Joe Tex/BUMPS & BRUISES/Epic PE 34666 (The thrust of this album leans to the more jive of many R&B trends of today. But, a minority report should be filed for the real, the venerable Joe Tex and his music. Find comfort in "Leaving You Dinner", "We Held On", "Hungry For Your Love" and "There's Something Wrong.")

Hamiet Bluiett/ENDANGERED SPECIES/India Navigation Co. IN 1025 (Obtuse and abstract. Unlike the advanced music of the 60's, the current new wave rarely arrives at a musical home base. Adrift in space. Write: Box 559, Nyack, N. Y. 10960.)

The Firesign Theatre/JUST FOLKS. /Butterfly FLY 001 (Enter the bent world of Firesign Theatre. Of course, their bent world is really ours. They only work with top quality material.)

Alex Haley/ROOTS/Warner Bros. 2BS 3036 (You won't be able to lift the stylus as Alex Haley spins his amazing tale describing how his personal story got told. You and your audience will be less for not hearing it.)

Mother Mallard's Portable Masterpiece Co./LIKE A DUCK TO WATER/Earthquake EQ0002 (Synthetically generated MMPMC's music operates in a way similar to Phillip Glass' revolving music. Repeated phrases continually evolve. The key is that the phrase must be melodically valid. Of the range of advanced music, this is the good stuff. Write: Box 842, Ithaca, N. Y. 14850.)

4. REST OF THE NEWS - 306 E. State St., Ithaca, N.Y. 14850. They've been going for a number of years producing tapes reflecting "Movements Issues," "Native American Struggles," "Attica," etc.
5. POSSIBLE TAPE EXCHANGE - 304 Hill Thomas, 705 N. Lincoln, Urbana, Ill. This exchange operates primarily for non-profit stations affiliated with the National
