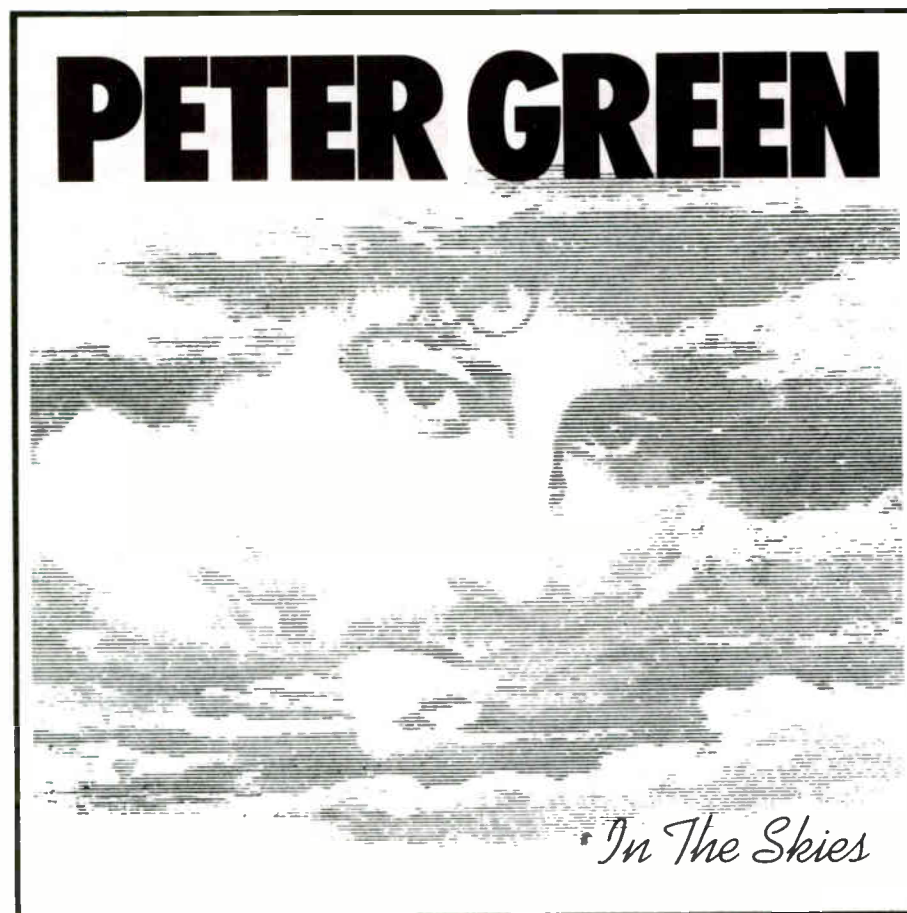

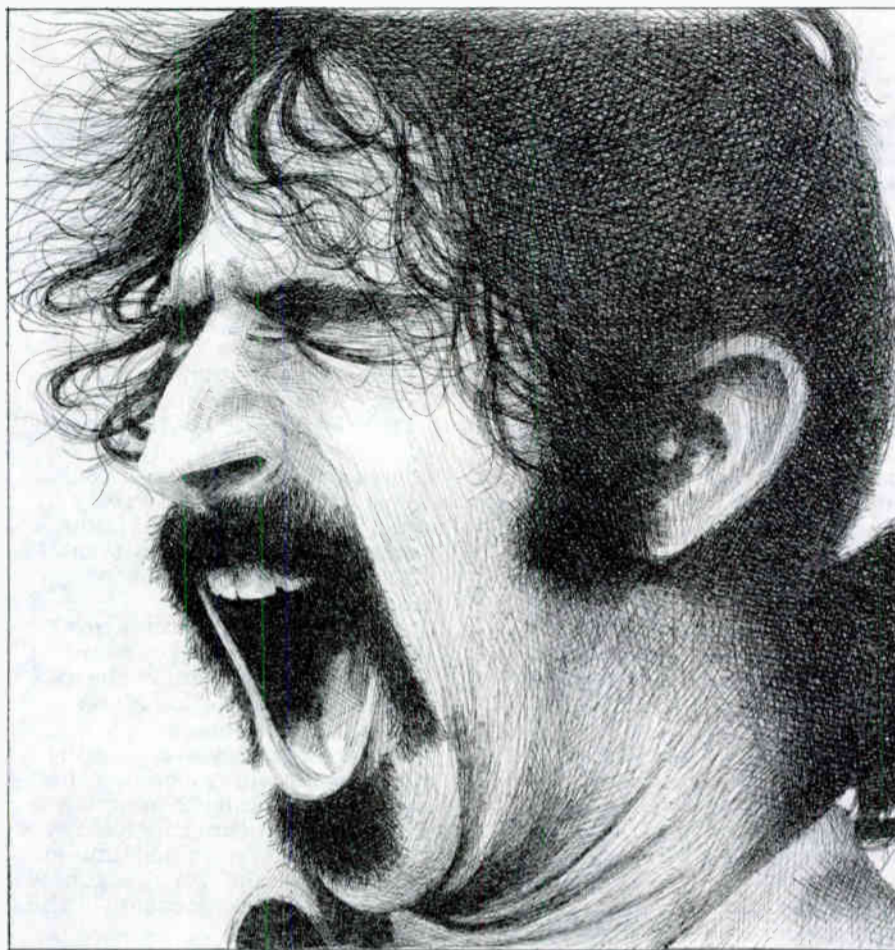

ZAPPA PLAYS DEEJAY FOR A WEEK: After years of talking about it, but not doing anything, Mr. "Kill Ugly Radio" himself, Frank Zappa got his chance to put his money where his mouth is when he was handed the 4-6PM weekday time slot at WPIX for a week. Zappa's programming choices reflected his unique and highly eclectic musical taste, ranging from old rock'n'roll to avant-garde experimentation. The New York airwaves will never be the same.

INMATES DIRTY WATER IN FORTY U.S. CITIES: No, it's not a new crime wave (or even a new wave crime). Actually, Polydor has just issued slightly differing versions of the Inmates' first single, the old Standells' number "Dirty Water," to radio stations in 40 big city markets. Each locale gets its own city's name and that of the river that runs through it substituted for the original "River Charles/Boston" coupling, which the Inmates have changed to "River Thames/London" on their standard version, the one that will actually be available to the public on the single. This is not the first time individualized records have been issued to radio stations in different areas: most readers will probably recall "Life Is A Rock (But the Radio Rolled Me)," a big hit a few years back which received similar treatment.

McLAGAN'S TROUBLEMAKER TO FEATURE NEW BARBARIANS CUT: Keyboard player Ian McLagan, veteran of the Small Faces, Faces and New Barbarians and still an auxiliary Rolling Stone, has his first solo album, **TROUBLEMAKER**, issued by Mercury in mid-December. The record will feature the only available recorded work of the New Barbarians, who appear together on a song called "Truly." Featured elsewhere on the album are performances by Ronnie Wood, Bobby Keys, Jim Keltner and Ringo Starr.

RAMONES GO ALL THE WAY IN FEBRUARY: We've already reported the completion of the Ramones' Phil Spector-produced LP in this column and its scheduled February release, but an earlier working title has now been changed to **ALL THE WAY**. In addition, we now know that tracks will include a reworking of Spector's Ronette's classic "Baby I Love You," a remixed version of "Rock'n'Roll High School," the

Johnny Thunders and the Heartbreakers anthem, "Chinese Rocks," which Dee Dee Ramone co-wrote, plus one cut which asks the musical questions: "Do You Remember Rock'n'Roll Radio?" Well, do you?

BITS'N'SPECIES: Sha Na Na drummer Jocko Marcellino is moonlighting with his own new wave band the Movers, who just made their live debut at Trax here . . . Dead Boys have reunited for a few gigs around town of late . . . Burgeoning rock-disco scene here celebrated at two mid-November parties. After Dark Magazine held soiree at Heat to celebrate its special rock-disco issue, while Hurrah held festivities to honor its own third anniversary . . . Expect a two-record live Kinks set some time in the new year . . . Dwight Twilley's new single, "Somebody to Love"/"Money" is issued as a 12" to radio only.

IN THE STUDIO: Black Sabbath, with ex-Rainbow lead vocalist Ronnie James Dio replacing Ozzy Osbourne, are at Criteria with Martin Birch producing . . . Marshall Tucker Band at Hit Factory here with Stuart Levine at the board . . . Jeff Baxter mixing Nazareth's **MALICE IN WONDERLAND** at Cherokee in L.A. for late January release on

A&M . . . Private Lighting recording in Montserrat with Robin Cable for February A&M release; he'll mix it at Cherokee . . . Squeeze producing themselves in England.

COMING SOON: From Polydor in December comes Sham 69's **HERSHAM BOYS**, which will appear here in its actual British edition, with imported pressings being purchased by U.S. Polydor for domestic marketing . . . Phillips and MacLeod's second, Saga's **IMAGES AT TWILIGHT** and Lenore McNally's **FIRST BE A WOMAN** . . . Epic expects the new Heart album for St. Valentine's Day release. Isn't that cute . . . From Arista in January expect Iggy Pop's **SOLDIER**, recorded at Rockfield Studios in Wales, and D.L. Byron's **THIS DAY AND AGE** . . . MCA's got **BEST OF's** on Lynyrd Skynrd and Frankie Valli (separately, I need not add) in December, Merry Clayton (remember her?) in January and Steely Dan (tentatively) set for February . . . Mercury has new Bob Gaudio find Richard Fagan in December, Rush's **PERMANENT WAVES** in January and maybe even a new George Burns album . . . Coming from IRS/A&M in January are the Cramps'

SONGS THAT THE LORD TAUGHT US and the Buzzcocks' **A DIFFERENT KIND OF TENSION**.

LOS ANGELES

RONSTADT RIDES A NEW WAVE (SORT OF): Linda Ronstadt's currently winding up work on her early 1980 Peter Asher-produced LP. All reports have it that the record marks a significant departure for Linda. Album cover artist Kosh is creating "a more startling image" for the California croonette. Long-time lead guitarist Waddy Wachtel has been replaced (Wachtel's forming his own group, The Boys, with several other Ronstadt alumni) by Cretones guitarist/songwriter Mark Goldenburg—The Cretones being an L.A. New Wave outfit. And Ronstadt's apparently recording some New Wave-ish material this time around: Bay Area poet and Rolling Stones Records artist Jim Carroll gets a song covered, Moon Martin has one, Elvis Costello is represented with a new tune, and don't be surprised if a couple of Cretones compositions get in there as well.

SPEAKING OF CRETONES: The band, comprised of (mainly) Wendy Waldman's old back-up boys (there's a dollop of old school L.A. country rock intertwined with their New Wave stance), is on the verge of signing their own recording deal with Richard Perry's Planet label.

OTHER LOCAL SIGNINGS (AGAIN): A bidding war akin to the one preceding The Knack's Capitol deal has just ended the exact same way for Shandi, a punkish singer/songstress who used to be a country singer—Shandi Cinnamon—with a single out on Elektra. Shandi, purple hair and all, has inked with Capitol, and word is out that Knack producer Mike Chapman will be steering her debut . . .

AND STILL MORE SIGNINGS: Dutch group Garrison and Van Dyke to Atco, with their self-titled debut just out . . . Amy Holland to Capitol, the Doobie Brothers' Michael McDonald to produce . . . Singer Sandra Steele to United Artists . . . Boston's The Fools (responsible for the Talking Heads spinoff "Psycho Chicken") pacted with EMI America . . . Jimmy Pursey inked to Polydor as a solo artist as well as with his British band Sham 69 . . . Ex-Thin Lizzy (Continued on page 19)

Who's Who

AUGIE BLUME PROMOTION

He is one of the best. Maybe the best. Augie's business is independent record promotion. It is a business for sharks.

But Augie Blume is a teddy bear. He is the nice guy who finishes first.

Finishes sweet but not saccharine. Just real sugar. Augie makes it hard to say "no." Find a peedee that can tell Augie "no" and you've found the Richard Nixon of radio.

But once upon a time everything was Nixonized. Back in 1954, H.L. Mencken's hometown of Baltimore had a law that said if you're black, you can only serve booze to black customers. White clubs had a white liquor license.

This racial schizophrenia was a standing injury to jazz clubs who were barely able to draw enough to stay open anyway. So Augie and some firebrands started up The Interracial Jazz Society and sued and won and overturned Maryland's separate-but-equal alcohol law.

Jazz was Augie's catechism. He churched with Charlie Parker and Bud Powell records. Other denominations of music as well. "I grew up in a home where we heard a lot of music," Augie says, "like Duke Ellington, Hank Williams and Enrico Caruso. We had shortwave radio. Even got the BBC."

It is a memory of a family as warm as the tubes in back of an old radio. It is a family of music.

In 1957, Augie turned the family into a job. He got paid \$100 a week and 6% commission to wheel and deal in Jacki Wilson, Argo, Jerry Lee Lewis, Chess, Carl Perkins, Sun and more. In 1959, Augie was hired by Hugo and Luigi and by 1960, he was on the payroll at RCA.

Augie and RCA were partners for just about a decade. He took a brief, involuntary sabbatical in 1963 when RCA decided it didn't need Augie or anybody else in promotion. That's when Columbia sent him to Minneapolis. Then RCA hired him back and Augie found himself running National Promotion.

In 1969, Augie won a big battle

with RCA to reissue a single by the Youngbloods called "Get Together." Day after week after month after three years and finally Augie got Number One. No small accomplishment in the internecine convolutions of record companies.

After 11 gold singles in 1969, after a Gavin Award, after hundreds of miles of gut busting, RCA fired Augie in 1970.

It was exactly what he wanted. Because the Jefferson Airplane wanted to break new ground by starting up their own record label. Augie was hired to work promotion. And Augie's wife, Nancy, ran sales.

That's about when we met. About is three years later. Before Airplane was Starship and Tuna was Hot. Circa 1973 just before the release of Burgers.

Picture this. Tuna used to have a song called 99 Year Blues and it made a sound like Okies playing a beat up guitar through a busted amp to make some kinda rock 'n roll yo-yo that slowly swung back and forth between the high and low register. It sounded like a skin of weatherbeaten varnish on good wood. On top there was this noise like rust (if rust could squawk), bottoming out deep and slow into rock 'n roll molasses. It sounded like this: Chirp, Chirp, Chirp, Boom.

This stuff is here because Augie is in here somewhere. Close to the good wood, putting his chin on his chest and inching it up on the Chirp, Chirp, Chirp so the chin is up to eye level and then drops down again on the Boom. Like your head is dancing in slow motion on the feet of your neck.

This dance isn't done until Augie quits Grunt. Too many musical chairs and Augie says "we never had a full meeting of everybody."

When he leaves it signals the arrival of Augie Blume & Associates in 1974. Which today is Augie Blume and Ron Middag & Associates.

It means working 300 radio stations a week providing customized western regional promotion. It means clients like Willie Nelson, A&M, George Thorogood, and Mushroom Records. "If I do say so myself," Augie says, "we're superb at crossover."

Time to let Augie do the talking. "It's infinitely harder to

do my job today," he says. "I used to walk into a station, talk to the peedee, even walk into the studio. They knew who you were.

"Nowadays, music is distant. Less personality gets through.

"It's frightening when people hand over their station to management teams that don't live in the same town. Pretty soon you won't have anybody from the same community on the radio. You know who loses? People lose.

"God bless the secondaries. They don't have the pressure. There's time to be more than a jukebox. Great radio means caring about people.

"I believe in the human spirit and I see music as a part of the spirit of humanity. I'm interested in ethnomusicology, the prehistory of music, music from around the world, and how all music is an expression of the human spirit."

All of this is from a guy who never went to college. Twenty years in the music business and what Augie remembers is that he never went hungry. In a business of sharks, he was never eaten. Never compromised. Never gave up. Somehow Augie outsmarted the fast lane. He got to the teddy bear's picnic and back. He got what he wanted, a dance that may never stop.

NORM WINER RADIO

Will Rogers had a funny line about it. "You know Chicago," he'd say, "that city just north of the United States." Think stockyards, railroads, Richard Daley, and the graveyard of the Democratic Party in 1968.

There's more. Radio may have been born in Pittsburgh but the baby grew up in Chicago. Coon-Sanders Nighthawks, Your Show, Godsen and Correl a.k.a. Amos 'n Andy broadcasting over WEBH, WGN, and WMAQ.

Chicago was nothing short of the Bethlehem of radio comedy. Network broadcast stockyard radio all across the country in the mid-1920's. Chicago was like a ghost howling in the ear of transistors thousands of miles away; smoke in the cab of a truck running a long haul.

That's early history in the city that played locomotive to the long train of radio. Engine, boxcars, caboose, and a spur. New history. The junction is WXRT and Norm Winters.

Old history knows him as Norm Weiner. He says "I wondered what everybody in

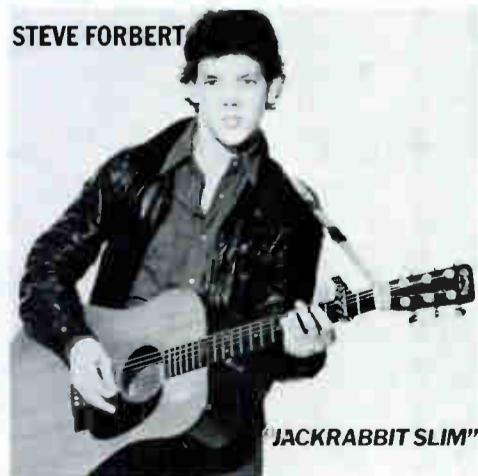

Because of your response we are moving this strong suit to the front of Walrus. The combination of being weekly and the Quick Starters move forces out of our budget some of the flashier things we've been doing. Effectively, Walrus now becomes the tightest and, therefore, the most focused radio tool in its history.

CHART ANALYSIS

BY GEORGE MEIER

A point made in the last analysis bears repeating. That is, an unusual number of non-rock albums are getting strong sales response. Especially in the Northeast and West, it is necessary to go down to the 25th or 30th record to get a rock Top 15. This does not imply that other musics are gaining in importance. Rather, it suggests the true softness of the marketplace. Since rock dominates the charts, and other musics like MOR, R&B and country tend to remain fairly stable, their apparent gain really means that the rock market is soft. Other musics are less volatile.

Further, the conservative buying pattern of the 1973-74 recession seems to have returned. The over-the-counter intensity centers around 3 or 4 big records, lead by Eagles who managed another 1,000, this time in the West. Another 3 or 4 records do O.K. and still a few more do especially well in only one region. So, after the first 7 or 8 records, there is really very little else to talk about.

Radio is different. There is more going on because of the strong regional pushes and pulls. It starts at the top as Tom Petty powers into the first spot with extraordinary Midwestern airplay intensity. Notable too is the fact that Fleetwood Mac never made it to number 1. Even Eagles didn't stay there endlessly as they have before.

Again, the Northeast supports its characteristic bands: The Police, Joe Jackson, Blondie, Steve Forbert, Talking Heads and Bonnie Raitt. The West Coast shares some of them, like The Police, Joe Jackson and Bonnie.

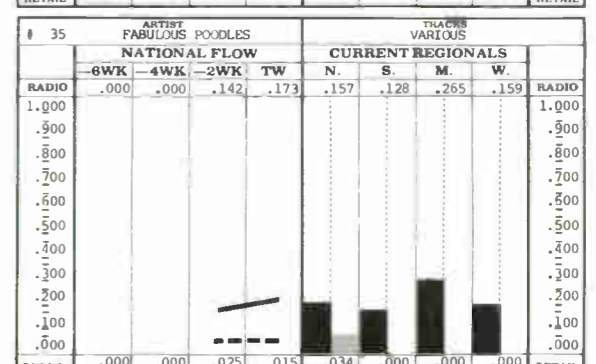
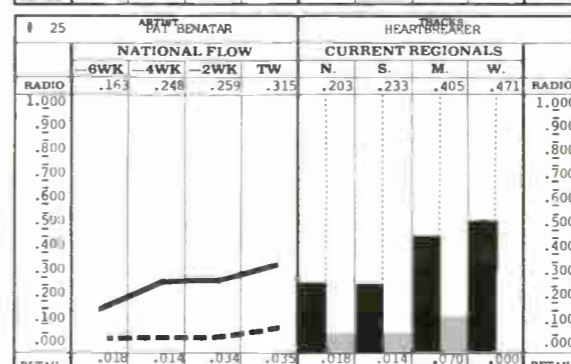
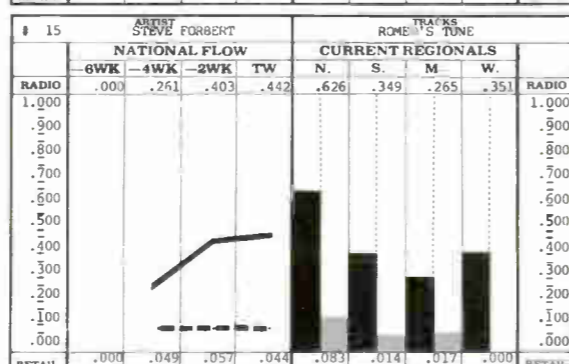
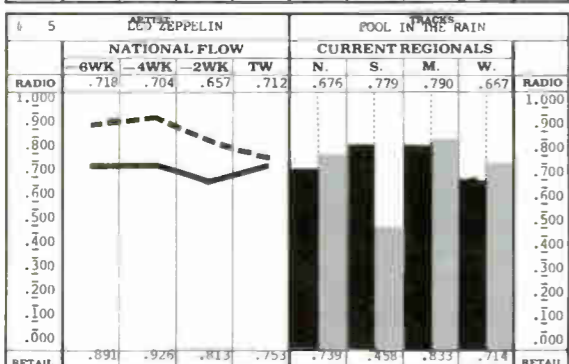
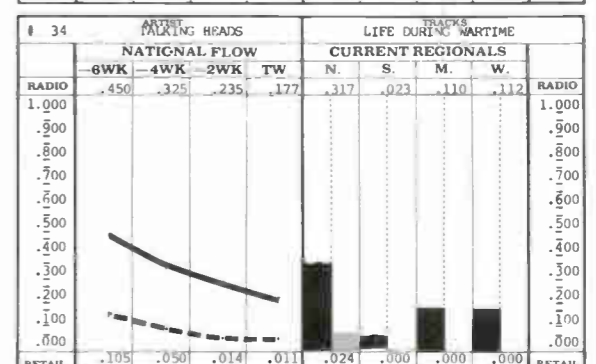
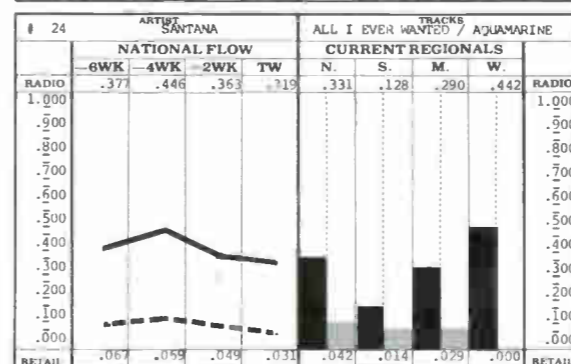
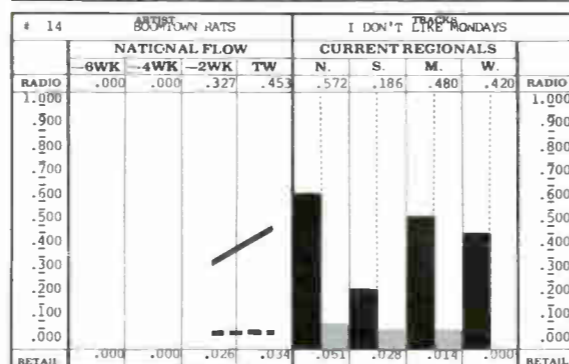
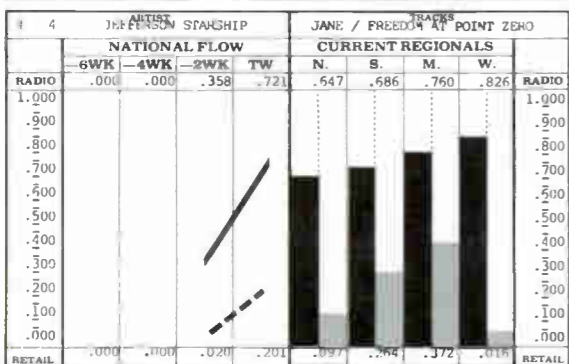
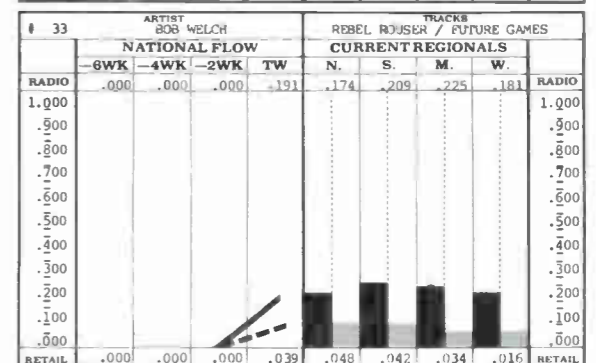
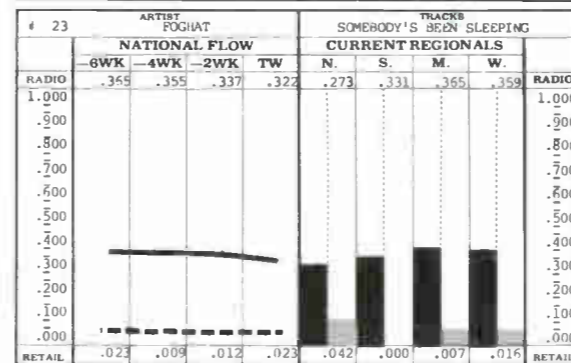
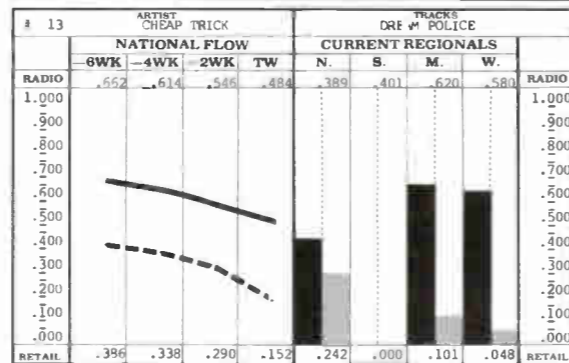
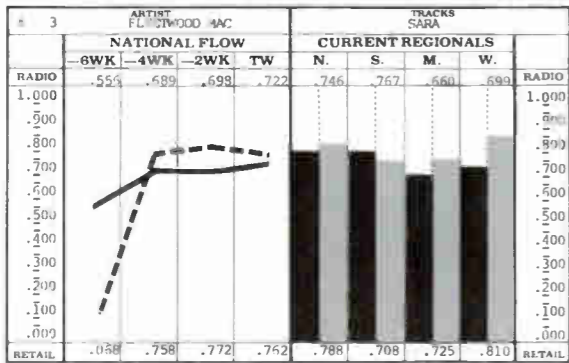
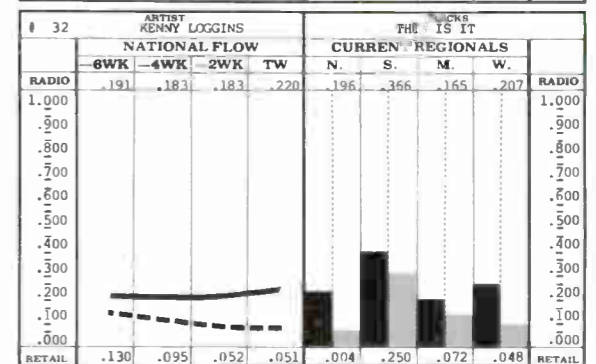
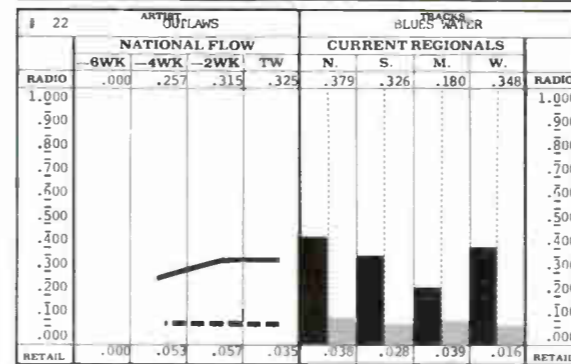
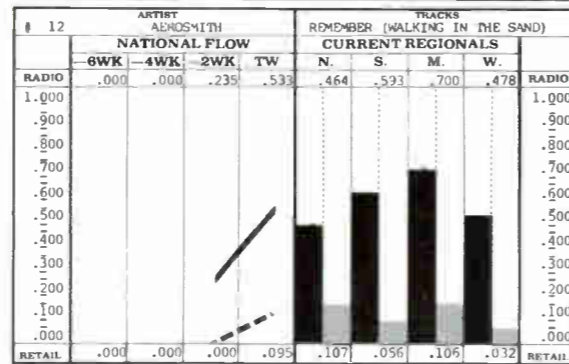
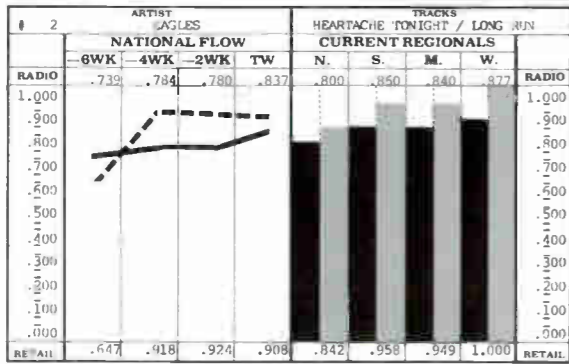
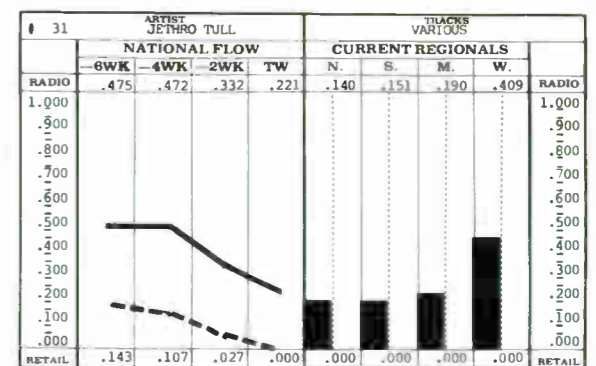
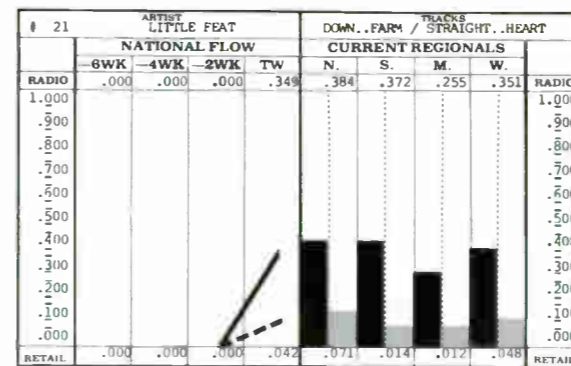
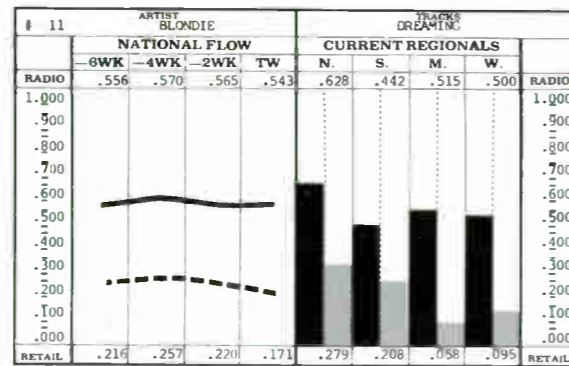
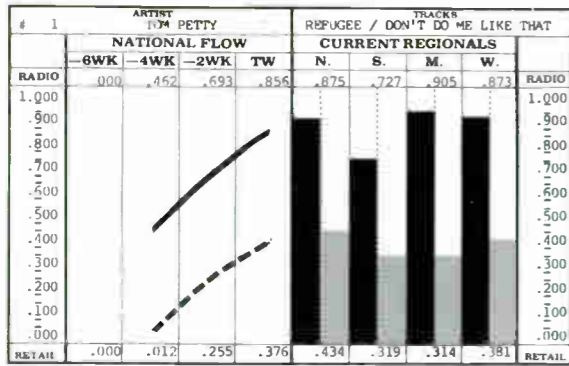

YACHTS SAIL HOME WITHOUT RADAR:

Polydor/Radar quartet The Yachts capped off their first U.S. tour in L.A. with a two-night sold-out Whiskey engagement. The snappy foursome were joined on stage by fellow Anglo Joe Jackson, who proceeded to deliver a frantic version of Dusty Springfield's "Twenty-Four Hours from Tulsa." The Yachts then returned to England to discover their label, Radar Records, had met with its demise—swallowed up and squelched by its corporate overseer, WEA. That leaves The Yachts and Radar mates Elvis Costello, Nick Lowe, Bram Tchaikovsky, Loudon Wainwright and The Inmates (temporarily) label-less. The Yachts, The Inmates and B. Tchaikovsky's U.S. deals with Polydor are expected to stay intact no matter the British outcome, while Costello and Lowe (still on Columbia here) can write their own ticket in England.

IN THE STUDIO: At Pasha Music House producer Spencer Proffer is guiding O'Kelsey & The Pulse through their debut disc for Polydor... At the Record Plant producer Craig Leon (Moon Martin) is working with Warner country artist Rodney Crowell... Also at the Record Plant, The Rockets, with producer Johnny Sadin... Waylon Jennings, who has been touring with the original Crickets, recorded their Omaha, Nebraska show for a possible live LP...

NEW RELEASES: Atlantic winds up '79 with Abba's a Virgin re-release of Mike Oldfield's TUBULAR BELLS and the soundtrack to the Bette Midler flick, THE ROSE... The Ramones' Phil Spector-produced project is due from Sire in early February... Elektra/Asylum is leaping into the '80s with new ones from Jackson Browne, Warren Zevon and Danny Kortchmar. Custom label Planet Records submits its first entry in the L.A. New Wave race in January: Sue Saad & The Next... The Jam's fourth, SETTING SONS, due from Polydor in January... SILVER METEOR is the name of late guitarist Clarence White's collection of unreleased solo material, shipping in February from Sierra/Briar.

LITTLE PIZZAS OF INFORMATION: Richard & Linda Thompson's very rock sounding release, SUNNYVISTA, is being shipped to U.S. labels. Released on Chrysalis in England, the label's U.S. office decided to pass on it... Is Devo manager Elliot Roberts making grumbling noises about the KROQ DEVOTEES album? It seems the Rhino Records release of Devo-inspired material is too close for comfort for the legal people. Nonetheless, rumor has it that Devo will let some of these Devo clones open for them on various dates of their upcoming West Coast tour... The Firesign Theatre, who also have a new release on the offbeat Rhino label, have been signed by the National Public Radio network to do satirical commentary on the 1980 political campaign.

LATE FLASH: 999 INKS WITH POLYDOR: 999, who had been the last announced signing of Radar Records before its recent upheaval, have signed on directly with Polydor Records in the States. 999 (the British dial-a-cop emergency phone number) are wrapping up work on their LP, THE GREATEST PRIZE IN SPORT, and Polydor's tentatively slated the disc for January release.

Chicago thinks about." The answer is not in railroads or stockyards but in a weather forecast.

Winters is Norm's alibi on the air. The job is Program Director. The history is a long train.

Brooklyn Depot to WFAS. Flag Beantown, Red Sox and WBCN. The moment is 1969. It is nothing short of a revolution. A revolution working out of the back room of Beantown's answer to the Fillmores, The Boston Tea Party. The clarion call is "Kill Ugly Radio!"

Norm's battle with the Ugliers started with a part time airshift until he was drafted as News Director in 1970. He remembers a busted key on the Rueters machine and getting beaten up during demonstrations against Nixon's Cambodian "incursion."

If this was a baptism of fire, there was also a baptism of mind at The Alternative Media Conference at Goddard. Norm says "it was a total exchange of drugs and ideas. None of us have been the same since." Goddard burned into his brain the idea that radio was both privilege and responsibility.

Goddard to Montreal and CKGM. This was the first time Norm ran a radio station. The ratings multiplied almost geometrically until a shoe salesman, hired by management to sell KGM, stuck his foot down the throat of the station.

Back to Beantown in the spring of 1971. Norm was installed as peedee. At this point, the story of WBCN was the story of replacing local ad dollars with national bucks. Big business and hip capitalism. But BCN's real wealth was a coin of reputation that could purchase entry just about anywhere in radio.

Take KSAN. San Francisco was always hard to turn down

and Terry McGovern's departure turned into a job overture. Station to station, as though legends were nothing more than boxcars with jumping hobos in between.

Norm says KSAN was "the most fun I've ever had." The worst of times was not far behind.

"Changes that were necessary," Norm says, "were not made." You already know how this story ends. It must have been like watching family die, slowly.

The new cycle began at WXRT. Listen to Chicago. It's as though they've re-invented radio. Three powerful heavyweights pivoting for the title. Not just heavyweights but Godzilla meets the Disco Monsters over at the Loop.

Norm calls Chicago "radio at its best, battling for dominance, in the best possible way." It also means taking stock of what WXRT has been. Norm wants to preserve that reputation for breaking new artists and new music. But nothing stays the same.

"What was progressive radio," Norm says, "is stagnant. We used to think our audience slept to noon, didn't have jobs, and couldn't afford a car. Now we know they need traffic, news, and sports."

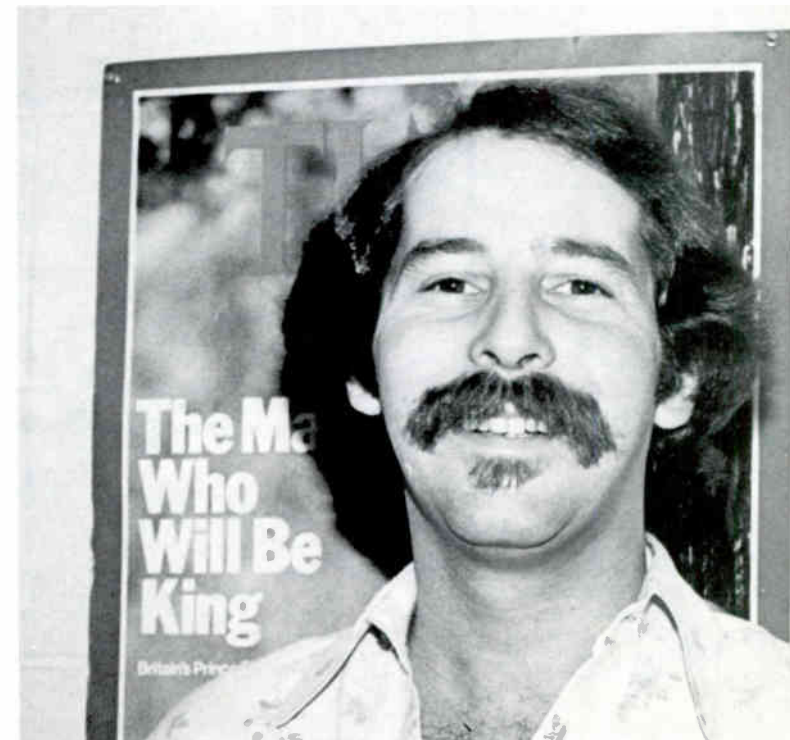
New history demands radio customized to accommodate the uniqueness of a market. In Cook County it means keeping a lid on the slick and sanitized. It means Chicago blues. And a variegated menu of rock 'n roll.

Norm says the Loop serves up a "one dimensional" diet of music. He also makes the case that "if only one of us can be number one, then we'll be number two, but we'll still be the best radio station in Chicago."

Put it on the line. Norm argues that "Chicago is an important battleground for the future of progressive radio. If it can't work here, it can't work anywhere."

There must be brass just north of his knees. Just north of the star spangled and Will Rogers. In stockyard country. Cow-catcher radio and speedwagons of rock 'n roll.

RADIO CITY

Rock Radio has gone through some heavy changes in years past, but 1979 was a corker. New Music made its way on to the airwaves and certainly made its presence felt. And 'The Wave' is still breaking as even the tightest of AOR stations have decided to get in the swim. We survived the Disco deluge and surfaced all the better for it, focusing on New Music which is unquestionably the Future of Rock'n'Roll, by definition. From a programming standpoint, the new stuff has given AOR cause to analyze the old stuff, the History Rock which blends well enough to make a station sound consistent. What philosophy goes into this kind of decision? Which of the old standbys fit best? What's the best way to travel in a different direction?

One station which has taken a giant leap in this different direction is WPIX in New York City. MD, Dan Neer explains, "The new music has made programming better and easier. The music which is becoming more popular today is based on the initial feeling, energy and roots of rock'n'roll. Therefore, it's much easier to program old music to show where the new music is coming from. And it's real neat to program because a talented programmer can get the older folks into the new music, and then turn the younger kids on to the old music by programming all of it properly. It's an education; past, present and future. Some groups we exclude, clone groups like Boston. Others we simply de-emphasize, like Jethro Tull, Yes and Genesis to some degree. There's even room for some kick ass country stuff, but Southern boogie, like the Allmans doesn't work that well for us anymore. The old music that seems to work best for us is Elvis Presley, Chuck Berry, Eddie Cochran, Buddy Holly, The Yardbirds, Searchers, Stones, Who, Dave Clark Five, early Beatles, the old Stax and Motown stuff—all of that music is very vital to our format. The point is to offer variety and to keep the energy up."

Dave Einstein at WHFS in the nation's Capital: "I honestly don't feel there have been many changes in rock'n'roll since Buddy Holly, except for production changes. White rock'n'roll is a very simple form of music, so it's bound to recur. If you cut off your roots to it, if you don't allow yourself to go back and program old Stones or old Them records, if you cut yourself off from that stuff then you have no basis to analyze what's happening now. It's difficult to program one cut in an isolated fashion, like a Ruts cut with J.D. Souther on one side and Foreigner on the other. Those styles of musical approach are much different. Consequently, programming the new music is not something you can get into part time to really make it effective. You have to take it on as a facet of your programming personality. We made our most aggressive step towards that last May and it has affected our programming to a large degree since then. New music amounts to about 40% of our playlist. In light of that we've had to narrow down



our scope of old albums. We still keep our image groups like Tom Waits, but instead of keeping three or four of his records in recurrent, now it's only one or two. But our most played old albums include the Zombies, Them, early Kinks and Flamin' Groovies—you hear more Buddy Holly here than Springsteen. And we also play Everly Bros. and rockabilly types of things. It all fits, it's all part of the cycle."

Way out West the story is the same, but with slightly different characters according to Henry Jay, MD at KLAY in Tacoma. "The thing that has always made us different from our competition is that we play a different kind of oldie. We play a little bit of Sabbath, Grateful Dead, the good standards from the mid sixties—good progressive stuff. I like the new music since it's changed because it reminds me of the early rock. A lot of the old tunes are being re-done like the Flying Lizards with 'Money' and the Inmates with 'Dirty Water.' It's back to basic rock. And what that does for us is to make us sound even stronger because we were already there. In the last year we've been heavily playing Zeppelin's old LPs, Beatles, Bad Co., a lot of Steppenwolf, standards like the Who and Stones. Those things are normal programming. You have to play them. It's mass appeal. Some of the new bands which we find that merge well with that older music are AC/DC, Triumph and Tom Petty."

From Chicago, Dave Benson gives us the WMET story: "Some old bands just sound a lot better on the radio these days. The Doors sound much more relevant now, as do the early Kinks. The Stones are stronger now because of new attitudes than they were a few years ago. Not necessarily from what they did on 'Some Girls,' but that certainly gave them a shot

in the butt. The Who is a classic example of a band which didn't do anything new on their last album, but their time has come again. Then again, some bands have been excluded by nature of new music, like James Taylor and Linda Ronstadt. And that's due to a lack of product and or no change in sound. We play little if none of artists like Cat Stevens. Even the new Fleetwood Mac, which is a good album, has caused some programming problems due to a lack of anything you could consider to be rock'n'roll. There are a few mainstay bands for us which include Led Zeppelin, Stones, Who and early Beatles. Those are the biggies. And some of the new things which fit well with those are Cheap Trick, Knack, Tom Petty, etc. I think bands like Yes and Genesis would have a hard time breaking today. Evidence of that is Camel, whose new LP is very tasty but a little left of center. It just doesn't fit well with everything else."

Jim Kinney, MD at WYDD in Pittsburgh: "For certain artists, the amount of airplay has decreased a lot. James Taylor was and still is an accepted AOR artist, but his music is a bit too soft for him to get as much airplay as he did before. Billy Joel is still a valid artist but we've cut back on some of his tunes. Everybody still plays the Beatles, but it's a question of which songs you play by them. Instead of 'Yesterday' it's 'Ticket To Ride.' Generally, softer things are suffering. 'Abbey Road' was a big album for us this year along with 'Hot Rocks' by the Stones and Led Zeppelin IV. New bands like Cheap Trick have slid in nicely with those, but any band which is any more new wave than that doesn't seem to have much of a following in Pittsburgh."

There seems to be a bit of 'Turn of the Decade' nostalgia in Dallas according to KTXQ's MD, Tim Spencer: "When I talk to people about requests, they usually want to know what we're getting requests for by new artists. Well, that's a real tough question because all people ask for are old Doors, old Hendrix, old Seger, Stones and Zeppelin. And it may seem a little surprising but a lot of those calls are from teens. I don't know if it's just Dallas, but the teens here are just bananas over Hendrix. And the Doors too. And that's healthy because we can please the teens and the upper demographic at the same time. As a result, we're playing more old albums than ever before, but we're going deeper into them than we had originally. What I'm feeling right now is more of an artist consciousness than a cut consciousness. We're not avoiding the big cuts, but I feel that people want to hear a certain artist more than a certain song. We do give some new bands a decent shot but there seems to be somewhat of a backlash in Dallas against some of the new music. I get that feeling simply from asking questions of people on the phone or on the street. We tried asking record buyers, but we couldn't find any."
