JACOR BUYS ALL OF JACKSONVILLE (OR AT LEAST IT SEEMS THAT WAY) Jacor Broadcasting will have a third FM in Jacksonville by purchasing UNC Media's urban WJBT, Green Cove Springs and its sister, urban oldies WZAZ, Jacksonville, for \$3.75 million. The deal is legal because the city grade contour of WJBT does not overlap the other station it's buying, urban WHJX-FM, Brunswick, GA. Jacor owns country WQIK-FM and talker WJGR, both Jacksonville.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Even though the Emergency Broadcast System now allows stations to shorten the two-tone attention signals, the Commission is encouraging some broadcasters to keep the longer tones. Last year's Report & Order phasing out EBS required all EBS decoders to be modified by July 1, 1995, so that they are activated after receipt of three to four seconds of two-tone signal. However, the Commission has received questions about the hundreds of consumer grade EBS decoders that require more than eight seconds of the two-tone signal. Most of these decoders are used in tornado-prone areas and near nuclear power plants.

Therefore, the Commission "encourage[s] broadcast stations to continue to transmit the longer two-tone signal when they know that these consumer grade decoders are in their coverage area and tuned to their broadcast frequency." Under the new rule, stations can transmit a two-tone signal as short as eight seconds or as long as 25 seconds. The Commission plans to release a new Emergency Alert System Operating Handbook, which will include procedures for operating the old EBS equipment and the new EAS equipment with appropriate test script examples.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

The Commission granted Pacific FM's request for waiver of the one-to-a-market rule and the assignment of KDIA, Oakland, CA from 1310, Inc. Pacific FM had to file a request for the waiver because it owns KOFY (AM), San Mateo, and UHF television stations KOFY-TV, channel 20, San Francisco.

Anthony L. Williams, Director of the FCC's Office of Communications Business Opportunities, will be leaving the Commission August 1 to become President/CEO of Broadcast Capital Fund, Inc., better known as BROADCAST. BROADCAST provides direct and indirect financing, management and technical assistance, and training to minority entrepreneurs who seek to acquire and operate broadcasting properties.

The FCC now accepts all fees and payments by wire transfer through Mellon Bank in Pittsburgh. It has issued specific guidelines on how to make these payments via wire transfer. For more info, call (202) 418-1995.

The Commission deleted the call letters of WASY, Gorham, ME. The AM station on 1590 kHz has been silent for three years.

ELSEWHERE

A DC Court of Appeals has ruled the safe harbor period for indecent programs should start at 10 pm rather than 8 pm. The decision also says children under age 18 must be protected from indecency. The NAB expressed dismay at the ruling and, along with others, challenged the constitutionality of banning indecent speech. The NAB is undecided on whether to appeal to the Supreme Court.

Chicago-based One-On-One Sports is buying another of its Las Vegas rivals. One-On-One says Ice Age Entertainment's SportsRadio Network has already handed over its affiliate line-up. One-On-One now claims 290 affiliates. In 1993, One-On-One bought Vegas-based Sports Entertainment Network and moved it to Chicago.

In the Santa Barbara market, Criterion Media Group is doubling up by purchasing AC KSBL, Carpinteria, CA from Great Electric Communications for \$1.325 million. Criterion owns talker KQSB and album rocker KTYD there. No word on what will happen to Great Electric's AM construction permit for KNZS, Montecito, or the sales agreement currently in place with Atmor Properties' KTMS/KHBY, which share their studio space with KSBL.

After Interep signed exclusive deals this year with Infinity and Shamrock, Katz Radio Group has signed a long-term group-exclusive deal with Evergreen Media Corp. Katz previously represented four of Evergreen's 20 stations. Katz President Stu Olds believes the 16 new stations will increase Katz's annual gross billings by more than \$35 million--approximately five percent of Katz's gross billings. Unlike Interep's handling of Infinity and Shamrock, Evergreen will not have its own rep firm. The business will be split among Katz's Banner Radio, Eastman Radio, and Christal Radio.

TM Century and Computer Concepts are teaming up to couple TM's GoldDrive digital pre-loaded music libraries with Computer Concepts DCS digital hard drive systems. TM President Neil Sargent said it will also provide weekly HitDisc service and music scheduling software in the package. Since both companies use the same hardware dealers worldwide, the alliance should help boost international sales as well. For more info, call (800) 937-2100.

In a major effort to ensure that the new auto lease radio advertisement requirement complies with the laws of each state, Interep has released a report that shows that the new lease ad law complies with every state except California. The law was passed in 1994 as part of the Riegle Community Development and Regulatory Improvement Act, which allows radio stations to broadcast a toll-free number to explain the automobile leasing information in lieu of the extensive lease disclaimers at the end of ads. Automobile manufacturers were concerned that each state may have stricter requirements than the Riegle Act. Interep's study is a result of contacting each state's attorney general. California's Mosconi Act requires disclosure of buying options, depreciation, lease inception payments, and other lease terms.

Fairbanks Communications' WRMF, Tampa, FL, has agreed to pay Custom Productions \$110,000 after the station used a television spot campaign that Custom said was "virtually identical" to one created by the Santa Monica, CA company. The settlement also makes permanent an injunction barring the station from using any campaign that is substantially similar.

He's also charged with filing false tax returns for his Broadcast Management Corp., which holds the licenses on his radio stations. Bloch already faces SEC charges of defrauding listeners as well as generating several civil complaints.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

DAB is back in the news as AT&T had a chance to show off its new compression technology to the NAB's DAB Task Force during a recent meeting. The technology would allow transmissions to be fed through existing phone lines at 64 kb per second. A demo may be available in New Orleans during the Fall Radio Show. Inside Radio reports the task force was in for other surprises during the meeting. The Canadian system may utilize technology similar to the European L-Band system--significantly different from what they were considering last year. The meeting was the first formal gathering for the task force since early 1994.

The Canadian proposal for digital radio would provide all CRTC radio licensees with an experimental three-year license to simulcast its programming utilizing the digital technology it chooses. The CRTC issued a public notice in mid-June outlining its plans, which will also provide digital band space to non-broadcast interests. However, broadcasters will have priority access. After the three-year test phase, the CRTC will conduct a "broad public consultation process" related to DAB's long-term effect on the radio industry, including technical standards, coverage areas, transmitter facilities and regulatory issues.

Maranatha Radio's KRGN, 103.1 MHz, Amarillo, TX has officially changed its status from commercial to non-commercial.

ELSEWHERE

KTOZ, Springfield, MO, thought it was getting back on the right track. The 500 watt daytimer barely makes enough money to keep the lights on, but its biggest fans don't care. They're volunteering their time just to keep it on the air. Everyone's happy. Right? Everybody except one guy who's got a job to do . . .

Maybe he doesn't like adult standards. Maybe he needs to make a quota. Whatever the reason, US Department of Labor investigator Charles Morgan is determined to make sure the employees of KTOZ, Springfield, MO get paid--even though they're all volunteers and they've all said they don't want any money to keep their favorite radio station on the air.

KTOZ was purchased out of bankruptcy last year by a group of listeners who wanted to keep the only standards outlet in town on the air. Many listeners volunteered their time as air talent, managers, and office help. The station's GM and major shareholder, Ron Johnson, is unpaid. Some listeners even donated their record libraries. But, when DOL investigator Charles Morgan got wind that a for-profit entity was using volunteer help (which is against federal labor laws), he decided to investigate. If he determines the law has been violated, he could make the station pay all of its employees back wages and, more importantly, get to collect all of those FICA taxes.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Since this debacle began, the station has received thousands of calls, letters, and faxes offering assistance. More than 100 attorneys have offered to take the case pro bono. The station's lead attorney is the mayor of Springfield and is also working free of charge. Congressmen are trying to help the station. Listeners who volunteer their time with government organizations like the U.S. Park Service find it hard to distinguish the difference between the government's ability to hire volunteers and the station's right to stay in business.

Johnson has promised to fight this to the U.S. Supreme Court. If the DOL wins, it could have huge ramifications on all small businesses who have family members or other volunteers help out in time of need. KTOZ's address is 2607 W. Bennett, Springfield, MO 65807.

Crawford Broadcasting continues to put together a solid AM contingent by doubling up in Portland, OR. It's buying BayCom's country KUPL for \$2 million to combo with religion KPHP, Lake Oswego, OR.

The latest Katz Radio Group effort to sign exclusive group deals has brought on the three EZ Communications stations it was missing--new rock-based CHR WEZB, New Orleans; CHR WBZZ, Pittsburgh; and 70's oldies WZPT, New Kensington, PA (Pittsburgh)--from Interep's Major Market Radio. The three will be repped by Eastman and Banner.

There's good news for radio advertising all the way around this week. The Radio Advertising Bureau reports a 10% gain in May for combined local and national spot revenue over the same month in 1994. Local was up 12% while national was up only 4%. Interep reports national spot is experiencing the longest sustaining growth upturn in 20 years. RAB President and CEO Gary Fries expects continued gains will boost radio's revenues by \$1 billion by the end of this year. In an analysis of national spot billings compiled from Radio Expenditure Reports, Interep says national spot billing has shown continual gains since June, 1992.

Benchmark Communications is doubling in the Roanoke-Lynchburg market. It's buying oldies WROV (AM) & rocker WROV-FM, Martinsville, VA from Lisa Broadcasting for \$5.8 million. The purchase will give Benchmark three FM's in the area, as it will also take over Lisa's LMA-to-purchase talker WLNI, Lynchburg. Benchmark already owns country WYVD, Amherst, VA. Broker on the deal was Michael Bergner of Boca Raton, FL.

Seattle listeners who get their news fix on Bonneville's KNWX, 1090 KHz, will have to reprogram that button on their radio soon as Bonneville and Heritage Media plan to swap frequencies. The result will put Heritage country outlet KRPM on 1090 KHz and allow KNWX to take advantage of KRPM's lower 770 KHz frequency. This deal came about after an exchange that would allow KRPM to use KNWX's antenna system. At that time, KNWX was given first right of refusal on the 770 KHz frequency.

The Electronic Industries Association continues its campaign to sign major market broadcasters to RBDS technology which allows radio stations to broadcast text and data onto a screen on the radio itself. The program, which launched in April of this year, provides large-market broadcasters with the technology free of charge in exchange for advertising or underwriting credits to be used in RBDS consumer awareness campaigns. The EIA is focusing on L.A. area broadcasters this week. New York, Dallas, Houston, Washington, Baltimore, and Boston fill out the schedule through October. RBDS is now available in ten of the top 25 markets. Through recent efforts in Chicago and San Francisco, RBDS reaches 60% of FM listeners in each market. Ultimately, 500 stations in the top-25 markets are targeted to add RBDS capabilities.

At a company not known for its complacency, Randy Michaels' Jacor Communications has home pages on the Internet World Wide Web. At WEBN, Cincinnati, not only has it reserved its call letters to use as part of its web "address," but it's reserved its competitors' call letters, too. The result, which will probably have to be settled by attorneys, might force competitors to pay Jacor to use their own call letters in their addresses, should they decide to go on the Web. In an article in the Cincinnati Business Courier, Michaels touts, "It sounds delightfully clever to me." He denied he knew anything about the stunt, which is credited to WEBN's PD Marc Chase.

Shamrock's country combo KNEW, Oakland, CA and KSAN, San Francisco have won the rights to this season's NFL Oakland Raiders broadcasts. The Raiders are returning to the Bay Area after spending 15 years in L.A. Oakland fans last heard their Raiders on KNEW in 1981.

EVERGREEN, LIKE OLIVER, WANTS SOME MORE. . . Apparently, 1995 is radio's year of the mega-deal as yet another huge merger goes down this week. Evergreen Media swallows up Pyramid Broadcasting for \$306.5 million--cash. Most of the money goes to retire debt and other obligations and redeem some preferred stock. Vestar Equity Partners, Pyramid's largest stockholder, will get the lion's share of the proceeds. The rest goes to stockholders. The deal gives Evergreen 34 stations--a group, ranking it third behind Family Stations and Clear Channel Communications. in number of radio properties. The company will have to spin off stations in Chicago (they now own seven there--with a combined 16.4 share) and Charlotte to meet the current FCC regs. The deal should close in early 1996. JONES ENTERS THE LUCRATIVE CHRISTIAN MUSIC SEGMENT. . . Jones Satellite Networks moves closer to becoming a syndicator of Biblical proportion this week as they will handle marketing and sales with Colorado Springs-based contemporary Christian format The Word in Music. The deal brings the total number of formats Jones syndicates to twelve. Programming will continue to come from Word's Colorado Springs studios. Jones claims the deal will push its affiliate count to nearly 1,000.

Royce filed a petition for reconsideration of the decision, alleging that it had learned from a reliable source that Brown intended to evict Royce's station from the White Rock, CA antenna site that Brown owns.

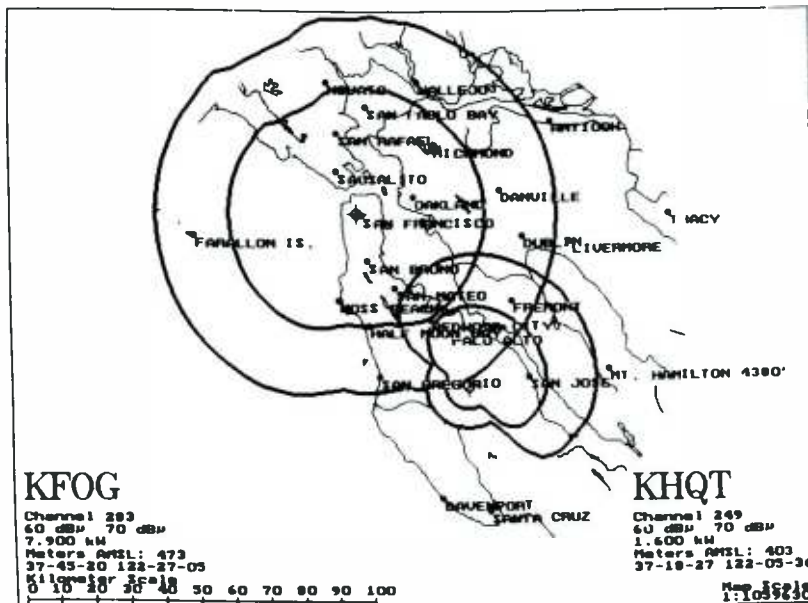

Premiere Radio Networks have a new partner--it's the Fox Network's parent News Corp., which has acquired a "significant interest" in Archon Communications, one of Premiere's largest shareholders. Back in January, 1995, Archon agreed to invest \$14.825 million in Premiere. They're upping the ante to just over \$17.5 million. When the deal is done, Archon will own 22.7% of Premiere's common stock. The deal is scheduled to close July 26. Premiere will look to Archon and News Corp. to help them grow internationally. Fox Television's President & COO David Evans will join Premiere's board of directors.

Never mind translators to get your FM signal through the Bay area. . . Susquehanna has announced it will buy KHQT, San Jose to simulcast KFOG, San Francisco's alternative format through Santa Clara County. Susquehanna will buy the dance-CHR outlet from SBR Broadcasting for an undisclosed price. Expect the simulcast to begin soon under an LMA.



John Douglas has scarfed up another station in a good market. His OIA Broadcasting will pick up Family Stations' KECR-FM, San Diego for \$12.5 million. KECR is a non-commercial operating in the commercial band at 93.3 MHz. Family Stations will continue to operate Christian-formatted KECR (AM), San Diego.

People's Radio Network is taking a bold step into station ownership. They've filed to buy a silent AM in Jacksonville, AL--WJXL, a 50000 kw days/500 w nights station on 810 kHz. WJXL is currently owned by Bussey-Hayes Communications, Inc. Look for PRN to pick up other properties soon and for WJXL to pick up PRN talk programming when it returns to the air.

The Corporation for Public Broadcasting is establishing an \$11 million "Future Fund" to "... provide strategic assistance to the public broadcasting system by increasing its efficiency and reducing its dependency on Federal tax dollars." The fund will offer incentives to stations to raise non-tax source income and to streamline operations. In the first year, two-thirds of the fund - \$7.25 million - will have tapped the CPB's \$29 million discretionary budget with the remainder from the \$176 million Community Service Grant pool. In FY 1997 and thereafter, the Future Fund will be allocated equally between the two sources.

Speaking from the left side of the aisle, liberal T. J. Walker moves his daily talk show from the former Independent Broadcasters Network to the Sun Radio Network. The "T. J. Walker Snow," from noon to 3 p.m. ET daily. T.J. claims his intent is to "stand out from the conservative political correctness currently dominating talk radio." You can contact T. For its coverage of the Northridge earthquake, KFWB-AM of Los Angeles has won the 1994 Associated Press Broadcasters Award for Best Radio Spot News. Louisville's WHAS-AM earned the APB award for Best Radio Enterprise for "Her Brothers' Keeper: A Portrait of Sister Kathleen," which documented the operator of a day-care center for the homeless. The stations will be honored on September 8 in New Orleans in conjunction with the Radio-Television News Directors Association international conference and the National Association of Broadcasters Radio Show.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC handed out a few waivers this week of the one-to-a-market rule. In Detroit, Capital Cities/ABC, Inc. got a waiver to buy Media Communications Partners' WTVG-TV, Toledo, OH, and WJRT-TV, Flint, MI. The two television stations are in the massive 2 mv/m contour of Capital Cities' WJR, Detroit. In granting the waiver, the Commission noted the widely separated markets and one "minimal local presence" of WJR in Toledo and Flint.

Flinn Broadcasting has won a waiver in the planned purchase of KFTH, Marion, AR. Flinn owns WFBI-TV, Memphis, as well as WNWZ (AM) and WHBQ (AM), Memphis. The Grade A contour of the television station encompasses the entire community of Marion. Flinn demonstrated that KFTH has operated at a loss for the past three-and-a-half years, and if the stations were combined, it could cut costs and enhance news and public affairs programming.

In Tampa, Citicasters used basically the same reasoning to win a waiver for its purchase of WTBT, New Port Richey, FL. Citicasters owns WXTB (FM), Clearwater and WTSP-TV, St. Petersburg. Even though Citicasters request met the "top 25 market/30 voice standard," it had to be reviewed under the Commission's five part case-by-case standard because the proposed assignment of license also required a showing under the local radio ownership rules.

Port Allen Educational Broadcasting Foundation's WZFL-FM, Centreville, MS is seeking non-commercial status. It has been operating as a non-profit entity and is currently silent pending its sale.

The NAB has wooed the US Equal Employment Opportunity Commission into allowing broadcasters who must file the 1995 EEO-1 form to file data from the first quarter payroll period. Each year, both the FCC and EEOC require broadcasters to report their staff profiles, including job categories and minority classifications. However, the data used for each survey come from different payroll periods--forcing broadcasters who are required to file with both agencies to do two separate surveys within six months of each other. For 1995, the EEO-1 form, which must be filed by September 30 by broadcasters who employ 100 or more people, can use the same data used to fill out the FCC forms. The EEOC will decide at a later date whether to let the practice continue after this year.

ELSEWHERE

There are a lot of happy campers at Arbitron this week. An analysis of the first 52 Spring 1995 radio survey markets posted a 10.1% improvement in "proportionality" in the Male 18-24 demo--up to 90.3%. The Spring 1994 book's proportionality rate was only 80.2%. The proportionality of a demo indicates the "percent of goal" for the in-tab sample for that demo. Historically, this demo's proportionality ranges from 65 to 81%. Markets seeing the most gain in this demo so far are Ann Arbor, South Bend, and Boston. In each of these markets, Arbitron used "sample enrichment" which allowed them to garner respondents from group quarters near colleges and military bases in order to up the sample in this demo. Seven markets lost ground over last year, most of them in New Jersey and Connecticut.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

O.J. Simpson is a big hit among radio listeners according to a Katz Radio Group study of radio stations carrying gavel-to-gavel coverage. The Christal Radio Division study shows that these stations experienced gains of 173% over previous total-week AQH levels among adults 25-54. During the prime 6 am to 7 pm daypart, these gains were even stronger--up to 371%. Maggie Hauck, VP/Research and Marketing for Christal, says most of the hard-core O.J. listeners come from urban and country formats, followed by AC/gold and news/talk.

Rhody Bosley's Research Director, Inc. has just released a study showing that more people listen to the radio in their cars than any other location, but more actual listening time occurs at work. This differs from previous studies that showed at-home listening with the largest share of total listening. Out of 183,339 Arbitron diaries from Winter '92 to Winter '95, 72.9% of the diaries reflected in-car listening locations, followed by at-home with 50.9% and at-work with 22.9%. However, at-work garners the highest percentage of quarter-hours listened with 35.5%, followed by at-home with 32.4% and in-car with 30.1%. Bosley points out that even though programmers focus on getting listeners to listen longer, "the data indicates that the average duration of listening does not vary by very much." Therefore, encouraging more occasions of listening may be more important. Bosley said the study also points out that First Preference listeners contribute most of the listening to the station.

CBS "Sunday Morning" host Charles Osgood will be the target of the tenth annual John Bayliss Broadcast Foundation Roast. The black tie event will be held October 25 at New York's Waldorf-Astoria hotel. Each year, the event roasts a distinguished media personality with proceeds funding scholarships for outstanding college broadcast students.

CBS and Dow Jones are among those companies that will be on the Internet offering real-time audio soon. Seattle-based Progressive Networks is acting as the distributor of the audio services by offering free listening software to Internet users. Over 200,000 users have downloaded the software since April of this year.

ABC Radio Networks is introducing a new audio compression technology that will allow the web to offer more satellite channels and digital audio storage. The Scientific Atlanta MPEG-based audio compression works with the SEDAT compression system to make it easier to interface with ABC's network systems.
