MEAT. . . . Jacor's Randy Michaels tells the Cincinnati Enquirer he's stalking bigger game, maybe a deal the size of last year's \$770 million purchase of Citicasters. He attributes the recent appreciation in the stock price to a road show for investors. The annual meeting of Jacor shareholders also approved an employee stock-purchase plan, a new incentive plan for top management and issuance of stock to directors who aren't employees. **AND POTATOES** . . . Meanwhile, Jacor just can't quit buying in Idaho. The latest buying spree there adds a total of seven stations there, all to be acquired from John Lynch's Lartigue Multimedia. In the Twin Falls market, it's paying \$9.6 million for country KEZJ-FM, news/talk KLIX (AM) and oldies KLIX-FM, all licensed to Twin Falls. In Pocatello and nearby Idaho Falls, it's picking up news/talk KID (AM), Idaho Falls, country KID-FM, Idaho Falls, sports/talk KWIK, Pocatello and oldies KPKY, Pocatello. Combined price for those four: \$3.4 million.

ORION'S HOPE . . . Two stations broadcasting on the same frequency at the same time? It's not supposed to happen, but for 22-1/2 hours it was like the 1920s all over again as both Orion Communications and Biltmore Forest Radio played chicken on 96.5 MHz with their WZLS (Orion) and WZRQ (Biltmore Forest). Listeners in the Asheville, NC area probably thought there were just some weird atmospheric, but for the period between 12:01 a.m. and 10:30 p.m. on June 2, both former operator Orion and newly-designated coalition licensee Biltmore Forest were on the air. Orion finally backed down and signed its WZLS off the air. It had been operating on the frequency, but the Commission ruled it had built without authorization and ordered it to go silent. The skirmish won't be the last time these two square off: the FCC has only given Biltmore Forest temporary authority to broadcast, while the Commission continues its rulemaking on comparative hearings.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Beware of Greeks, seeking licenses? The Commission, under the gun because of the looming January 1, 1998 World Trade Organization deadline, is proposing an important relaxation of the foreign investment rules. The plan would lift the 25% cap on indirect foreign ownership and allow waivers of the current 20% limit on direct ownership -- for companies inside the 69-member WTO framework. The proposal would also streamline the current competitive-analysis process. The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking is FCC 97-195, IB Docket number 97-142. Comment date is July 9, with reply comments due August 12.

The Reverend Jesse Jackson turns up the heat on the FCC: The civil rights leader uses separate meetings with President Clinton and FCC Chairman Reed Hundt to appeal for more minority involvement in public life, and broadcast ownership. Jackson and Civil Rights Leadership Conference executive director Wade Henderson complained to Hundt about a "radical dropoff" in broadcast ownership by minorities under Clinton. Jackson said "We're now looking at the resegregation of the ownership of media. . .A very small number of industrial owners now are beginning to own all the radio and TV stations. . .We must have a moratorium on the present process."

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

It could be Uncle Sam versus the zoning board, if the FCC agrees with a new petition urging it to pre-empt state and local restrictions on new broadcast towers. The joint filing by the NAB and the Association for Maximum Service Television argues that the Commission should flex its already-granted powers to push the "ambitious digital TV build-out schedule established by the FCC." It also asks for pre-emptive relief for radio broadcasters. One big question is whether the various courts will back up the get-tough stance. Another question: Will court challenges by zoning boards and other ruling bodies make the whole issue moot? The NAB/MSTV petition asks for adoption of a rule pre-empting certain state and local government restrictions on the placement, construction and modification of both TV and radio facilities.

The FCC says this particular garden shouldn't be growing a radio tower. Everybody in New York except Donald Trump seems to have an opinion about whether WFUV's new tower will adversely affect the neighboring New York Botanical Garden -- which is a National Historic Landmark. In 1992 the FCC gave Fordham University's Bronx FM a CP to build a 480-foot tower to replace its old Keating Hall antenna, which substantially exceeds RF guidelines. Fordham's already spent \$750,000 on the job, but a well-publicized public uproar has stalled the project. There's also the opposition of the New York City Department of Buildings, which calls the tower an "unpermitted obstruction" and has forbidden completion. The latest chapter is a lengthy FCC letter and Findings of Fact/Conclusions of Law, and a meeting between the parties scheduled for June 18 to see if they can work things out.

Is it discriminatory when a licensee pays a \$250 "finder's fee" to employees or clients, when they refer an applicant who's later hired? The Commission addresses that question in handling another petition to deny filed by the National Rainbow Coalition. Rainbow claims the fee is mere "word of mouth" recruiting and "inherently discriminatory." While the licensee counters that the reward is available to the general public and has generated both minority and female applicants. Here's how the Commission saw it, in the case of five Michigan stations: using a finder's fee "in conjunction with broader recruiting from a variety of general recruitment sources" that have been productive in minority hires wasn't a problem. The Commission also said licensees don't have to use minority organizations or publications to recruit "where its general sources have been productive." Renewed, but with reporting conditions: WSJM/WIRX-FM, St. Joseph; WCSY/WCSY-FM, South Haven; and WYTZ, Bridgman. The FCC noted that the licensee's record-keeping was deficient because it didn't know the referral source of seven minority applicants, the gender of six more, or the race or ethnic origin of 193 applicants -- problems for "effective self-assessment."

Children's Broadcasting's Radio Aahs can now be heard by more New York residents -- at least in the daytime -- as a result of its newly-completed daytime-signal upgrade to the expanded band WJDM, Elizabeth, NJ. (As differentiated from the "old" WJDM at 1530 KHz.) The Children's Broadcasting Corporation daytime signal on 1660 KHz is now diplexed off tower #2 of WKDM, New York's site in the New Jersey Meadowlands. The expanded-band WJDM is at 1660 KHz, with a daytime strength of 10,000 watts and a nighttime signal of 1,000 watts. Because of the uncluttered nature of the frontier above 1610 KHz, you can pick up the signal far away from the New York metro. (Note that owner Children's is acting pursuant to an STA from the Commission.) Charles A. Hecht and Associates handled engineering on the project.

Following release by the FCC of a revised allocation plan for the expanded AM band, KXBT-EB, Vallejo, CA has changed its frequency. KXBT-EB, which had been transmitting on 1630 KHz, is now at 1640 KHz. The move marks a return to KXBT-EB's original frequency. The station was at 1640 KHz when it began in 1996 as part of the FCC's original expanded AM band frequency plan.

How low can the Commission go, when it comes to fining poverty-stricken pirates? In the case of Boston area FM pirate operator Lawrence Scott Gallagher, the bottom line is \$250 -- period. The FCC's Boston Field Office originally hit him with a \$750 forfeiture in 1991, then dropped that to \$250. But Gallagher stood on his soapbox and refused to pay up "without a proper hearing." He didn't have to dump tea in Boston Harbor -- but did wait years to get that day in court. Now the Commission concludes "the forfeiture amount of \$250 is warranted." Gallagher admitted operating unlicensed "WHDL" at 102.1 MHz from his home in Braintree, Mass. until he was busted by the FCC in 1991.

The Commission reinstated and issued a license to cover for canceled station WCEF (FM) in Ripley, WV owned by McWhorter Communications Corp. The station is currently on the air with a country format.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

Reed Hundt apparently intends for his legacy to include further pressure on broadcasters to keep hard-liquor ads off the air, and a newspaper-like system of ombudsmen in the news department. The departing FCC Chairman told a Museum of Radio & Television audience in Beverly Hills that broadcasters should emulate newspapers in having both a readers' advocate (the ombudsman) and a letters-to-the-editor section. In return, he suggests Congress could hold hearings on ways to keep journalists from being "chilled by the threat of litigation," a la the ABC News/Food Lion court case. RTNDA President Barbara Cochran sounds very cautious about the notion of a federal official coming up with ways to reform broadcast journalism. Hundt also told the MRT assembly he's asking the FCC staff to look into liquor advertising on radio and TV.

Permanent waiver of the one-to-a-market rule was granted to Kansas Capital Broadcasting, Inc. to allow common ownership of country KTPK (FM) and KTKA-TV in Topeka. The Commission also granted assignment of license for KTPK from Twenty First Century Broadcasting, Inc. to Kansas Capital.

ELSEWHERE

Lew Dickey, Jr. is buying more in Nashville, while a longtime minority owner cashes out: Dickey's DBBC, LLC says it's struck a deal to acquire R&B oldies WVOL, Berry Hill and urban contemporary WQQK, Hendersonville from Samuel Howard's Phoenix Communications. DBBC -- which is also working on getting a move-in on the air -- has already begun an LMA with the combo. It will eventually have a duopoly in Nashville when it succeeds in launching WNPL, Mount Juliet, at 106.7 MHz. Researcher/consultant Dickey's also involved in the new Cumulus group with former Chicago GM Bill Bungeroth, though this latest Nashville deal's being done by Dickey separately through the DBBC entity. Media Venture Partners' Charles Giddens brokered the sale of WVOL/WQQK.

Citadel breaks into Little Rock in a big way, with the \$25 million purchase of six stations, a CP and the Arkansas Radio Network. The stations are Little Rock-licensed news-talk KARN-AM; urban KIPR, Pine Bluff; CHR KESR, Sherwood; news KRNN-AM, North Little Rock; news-talk KARN-FM, Cabot, news-talk KKRN, Humnoke; and a CP for KAFN, Gould. Dub Snider and Cal Arnold own KIPR and KESR. Ted Snider, Sr. and Jane Snider own the remaining stations and the state network. "Dub" Snider is Ted's son, and Arnold is his son-in-law. Citadel President Larry Wilson worked in the Little Rock market in the early 1970s and was involved in Ted Snider's purchase of then-KARK-AM from then-KARK-TV. The radio station became KARN. Ted Snider, Sr. will join the board of Citadel. Wilson's company also says it's gotten FCC approval for its \$114 million acquisition of Tele-Media Broadcasting plus Tele-Media's own pending acquisitions. NationsBanc Capital Markets advised the Sniders and Cal Arnold in the negotiations.

Jacor is making an intriguing buy in Florida: The license of the now-silent WJCM, Sebring. It's licensed to operate at 960 KHz, adjacent to the 970 KHz frequency of Jacor-owned WFLA, Tampa. Sebring is due east of Tampa, and though this is sheer speculation, it's possible Jacor's interested in keeping WJCM silent permanently. Julio Rumbaut acted as both receiver for WJCM, Inc. and broker in the deal. An earlier agreement to sell WJCM to Concord Media Group fell through. But before we leave lovely Sebring, FL...there's Jacor again. The stack of proposed transfers at the FCC contains the \$700,000 purchase of adult standards WITS and CHR WYMR from Outback Broadcasters to Citicasters. Looks like more evidence that Jacor's continuing its regional strategy in Florida radiating out from its hub in Tampa. Combined with the purchase of now-silent WJCM, Jacor will hold the licenses of all three stations licensed to Sebring.

Non-commercial WFBE, Flint is about to play its first car-dealer ad -- Liggett Broadcasting is the successful bidder for the commercial-band FM being sold by the Flint Board of Education. The facility is a 50,000 watt FM at 95.1 MHz, and is currently being run as a non-commercial facility with a mix of classical, jazz and NPR programming. That could certainly change under new owner Liggett.

Ready for "Excellence in Webcasting"? Now Live On The Web, it's Rush Limbaugh. That's a 180-degree reversal of EFM Media's previous tough policy, with several Jacor stations now making Rush audible to anybody with a computer and the appropriate software. What's changed is that EFM is now owned by Jacor. Jacor stations like WGST, Atlanta no longer black out Limbaugh's three-hour daily talkshow. Other syndicators have been nervously looking at their options as more and more stations put themselves live on the web.

Connoisseur creates a duopoly in Canton, OH with the \$6,550,000 purchase of new rock WRQK-FM. Seller is Paul Rothfuss-run Sabre Communications. Jeff Warshaw's Connoisseur Communications is waiting for FCC approval to buy Salem-licensed adult standards WSOM and country WQXK in the Canton market. Blackburn's Dick Sharpe brokered the Connoisseur-Sabre transaction.

Mid-West Family Broadcast buys number four and number five in Madison, WI, with the \$6.4 million purchase of country WWQM-FM, Middleton and sports/talk WHIT, Madison. Seller: Enterprise Media Partners. William Walker's Mid-West group currently holds AC WMGN, Madison, rock WJJO, Watertown and talk WTDY, Madison in the same market. Broker is Blackburn's Dick Sharpe.

Veteran programmer and trade magazine editor Michael St. John is among the principals of Fun Media Group, Inc., which is acquiring WCRQ-FM, Arab, AL. The 92.7 KHz facility's in the Huntsville market and currently doing classic hits. Susan McKenney is president of Fun Media Group. Things have been pretty active in Huntsville lately: Capstar Acquisition/Southern Star just announced it's buying Griffith Broadcasting's three stations there.

The Christian Science Church may have found a new buyer for its Monitor Radio service -- but that's only a definite maybe. Reuters reports the church has a tentative agreement for Boston-based World Times to acquire the radio network -- but only if enough stations that now air Monitor Radio agree to continue airing it under the new ownership. That could get interesting, since National Public Radio announced plans to offer its own early-morning news show in the timeslot now occupied by Monitor. Monitor's been distributed by Public Radio International. World Times has published "The WorldPaper" in six languages since 1979 -- all outside the U.S. It has no broadcast operations at the moment.

New duopoly coming in Syracuse, as talk WOLF owner Craig Fox buys now-silent WZOS, Oswego for \$65,000 in a bankruptcy court auction. Mary E. Leonard is the bankruptcy trustee for the 96.7 MHz facility. Buyer Fox is involved with WSIV, East Syracuse and WVOA, De Ruyter through a separate company. Broker Ray Rosenblum participated in the sale of WZOS.

Looks like Montgomery County, Maryland won't be buying oldies WINX, Rockville, after all -- County executive Doug Duncan had the idea of using the 1600 KHz facility to broadcast traffic information, as an enhancement to the county's existing TIS network. That won't happen, and reports are that Duncan's trying to get the county's \$50,000 deposit back.

Harris Broadcasting puts itself in the middle of the global DAB market with the acquisition of the French company Innovation Telecommunications Image and Sound. It says it will use ITIS as an "advanced engineering center, developing and supplying digital equipment for the global broadcast and telecommunications market." ITIS will do R&D on both digital radio and TV, and will become part of Harris' Broadcast Division, but operate independently to serve its existing customer base.

SkyLight Satellite Network has upgraded delivery systems from SpaceCom's analog system to SpaceCom's Digital FM Squared technology. SkyLight began the process in February using both systems, then switching affiliates over after they'd installed their new Wegener digital audio receivers. Northwestern College-owned SkyLight serves about 200 stations plus another 140 translators with its non-commercial Inspirational music format.

Triathlon Broadcasting doubles its line of credit, from \$40 million to \$80 million, thanks to AT&T Commercial Finance and Union Bank of California. The group also closed on its \$38 million acquisition of news/talk KFAB and oldies KGOR, Omaha from American Radio Systems. That creates a four-station cluster with country KXKT, Atlantic, IA and modern AC KTNP, Bennington, NE.

Its name pretty much describes its mission: The "American Community AM Broadcasters Association" is a new non-profit group aiming to improve AM service through advocacy and provide a "nationally-recognized vehicle" so AM operators can voice their concerns. Bryan Smeathers (502-754-1380) is the President. Ed Crook (702-588-6175) is the Executive VP. Website: <http://www.broadcast.net/acamba>.

CHILDREN'S BROADCASTING TO TRY PLAN "B". . . Children's Broadcasting sells its 13 owned-and-operated AM stations - and blames ABC/Disney, which it's already suing. Details about buyer Global Broadcasting Company are in short supply -- except that CBC President/CEO Chris Dahl signed a letter of intent to sell Global his 13-station group for \$72.5 million. And that Greg Deieso is Global's president. Dahl promised to use the proceeds of the sale to find "ancillary audio streams for programming" and "pursue to its conclusion the ABC/Disney litigation while exploring other options." He also pledged to continue supplying programming to the non-owned affiliate stations. The M Street Database shows Children's with 19 non-owned affiliates for "Radio Aahs." Star Media Group's Peter Handy and Paul Leonard brokered the sale of the 13 stations. ABC/Disney pulled out of a cooperative arrangement with Children's last Fall. Children's filed suit, charging that ABC/Disney wanted to "misappropriate CBC's unique radio programming format and force Children's Broadcasting out of the children's radio market." ABC/Disney has since mounted an aggressive affiliation effort for its "Radio Disney." The current Fortune magazine profile of Disney execs says this about Bob Callahan's new boss, Steve Burke: "At ABC Radio, Burke's priority is the launch of Radio Disney for kids."

JUDGE RULES FAIR USE. . . Mel loses one in court - And a judge says Wayne Kirkwood isn't committing copyright infringement by running his Media Dial-Up monitoring, even if it includes audio from stations run by Mel Karmazin. Then-Infinity chief Karmazin filed suit against Media Dial-Up in the Fall of 1995, alleging piracy of programming from stations like WFAN, New York and the Karmazin-managed Westwood One. Kirkwood debuted his subscriber-supported dial-up listening service with his first subscriber in Fall 1993. He offered customers the chance to hear their choice of stations in the top-ten markets just by dialing his Dallas-based business. But two years after launch, Kirkwood tangled with Karmazin over his inclusion of "The Fan" in New York, and Karmazin sued. Kirkwood handled his defense himself. A judge in U.S. District Court in New York has now agreed that Kirkwood's service constitutes a legal "fair use" of the product, and dismissed the suit. Kirkwood says "I couldn't see how [the service] could hurt Mel." Media Dial-Up customers include advertisers, syndicators and group owners.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission rejected another set of National Rainbow Coalition/Operation PUSH petitions to deny renewal, this time in the case of three stations in the Ft. Wayne market: WHWD and WMEE, Ft. Wayne, and WQHK-FM, Decatur. The FCC did, however, nail the three stations for an \$8,000 Notice of Apparent Liability for EEO violations. It found "the licensee's program efforts during the entirety of its license term [to be] inadequate. Further, the stations did not maintain complete applicant and interviewee records for each vacancy." Operation PUSH had faulted the stations for not hiring any minorities between March 1, 1995 and February 29, 1996, but the Commission found no evidence of discrimination.

Build it (in the wrong place), and they (the FCC) will come....The Commission hits WUMX, Charlottesville, VA licensee Spectrum Broadcasting with a \$10,000 Notice of Apparent Liability, for constructing its facility at variance with the granted CP, and then running program tests for a year and a half without authorization. Spectrum has the usual 30 days to make a showing in response. The FCC upped the fine from a yardstick \$7,500 because it built its tower further away and mounted its antenna higher than the Rasa Communications case.

And the Commission stuck to its guns in another forfeiture, this one in a bid by Resort Broadcasting Company to reduce its already-announced \$15,000 fine against WGMD-FM, Rehoboth Beach, DE. The Commission found "unpersuasive" RBC's claims that the amount should be reduced or rescinded, based on what the FCC saw as failure to recruit for 28 of 52 vacancies and the absence of minorities in a "significant number of applicant and interview pools."

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

Authority to operate and call sign was reinstated for Stanley Broadcasting System, Inc.'s WTXY in Whiteville, NC through a petition for reconsideration of the license that was canceled in April.

The Commission canceled the license for Donald & Sharon Wiedeman's KHNC in Johnstown, CO this week. No details were given on the Public Notice.

N'Joy Broadcasting petitioned the Commission to amend its pending application for the class A allotment at 96.5 in Raton, NM to 97.7 A, without loss of cut-off protection. Petitioner and David F. Phillips are both applicants for the allotment and an additional allotment would accommodate both applicant's request for a class A channel at Raton and avoid the need for a comparative hearing.

It wasn't radio, but it did concern allegations of "lowest unit charge" violations by some prominent politicians: The Commission denied an Application for Review filed by Lawton Chiles, Bob Martinez, Bill Nelson and Jim Smith. The case goes back to the 1990 campaign cycle, and may now be over, as far as the FCC is concerned. The four candidates and their campaign committees claimed rate violations by WCTV (TV), Thomasville, GA. Now the Commission's upholding the earlier Order by the Chief, Mass Media Bureau, dismissing their complaint. Lowest unit rate cases will likely surface again for both radio and TV operators - whether or not there's also "free air time" for candidates.

There'll be a going-away party at 1919 M Street (or maybe at someplace more hospitable, nearby) for Compliance and Information Bureau Chief Beverly G. Baker. She announced her resignation last week after four years as Chief of CIB, and a total of 18 years at the Commission.

CANADA THIS WEEK

Power Broadcasting, Inc. is requesting Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) permission to implement a full time simulcast of its AM and FM stations in Oshawa, Ontario. Currently, CKDO simulcasts CKGE-FM's hot AC format from 6am to 12 noon and programs the Pelmorex satellite network's adult contemporary format at other times. Unlike in the U.S., full-time AM/FM simulcasting is seldom allowed in Canada.

ELSEWHERE

Onetime group owner Rusk sells its last three stations, and Cox claims those stations make it "the number one radio operator in San Antonio." Using Duncan's numbers the deal merges the market's #3 operator (Rusk) with the #4 operator (Cox Radio) to push the cluster past last year's top-billing entity, Clear Channel. Cox is shelling out \$30 million for album rocker KISS-FM, San Antonio, adult hits KSMG, Seguin and standards/sports KLUP, Terrell Hills. Atlanta-based Cox Radio first entered the market with the NewCity merger, and now owns country KCYX, San Antonio, smooth jazz KCJZ, Terrell Hills plus classic country KKYX, San Antonio. According to Jim Duncan's estimates those six stations combined billed about \$19 million of San Antonio's \$62 million in radio revenue last year. Clear Channel accounted for \$13.8 million and Heftel about \$11.6 million.

Citadel likes to be a really big player in its markets, and now it's adding two FMs in Providence: "Edge" new rocker WDGE, Wakefield and dance WDFG, Middletown. Larry Wilson's group is paying sellers led by Phillip Urso \$8.5 million for the two FMs, plus a local Internet Service Provider named Edgenet. Citadel Communications is in the process of acquiring four other Providence-market stations from Tele-Media Broadcasting: CHR WPRO-FM, talk WPRO (AM), adult standards WLKW and AC WWLI, all licensed to Providence.

American Radio is buying oldies station WMMA, Lebanon, for \$3 million. There aren't a lot of FMs left to buy in the Ohio area, but Steve Dodge is grabbing this one, which is sandwiched between Cincinnati and Dayton. The facility is a Class A at 97.3 MHz. M Street hears speculation that ARS is already working on some new engineering for the signal. Seller is McMurray Communications. Marilyn and Michael McMurray have no other broadcast interests. Brokers were Media Venture Partners' George Otwell and Elliot Evers.

A wedding in the Hamptons: Hot AC WBEA, Montauk is merging with adult progressive WEHM, East Hampton. The deal combines C&S Radio's WBEA with East Hampton Broadcasting's WEHM under the new banner of Hamptons Media Holdings, Inc. Hamptons Media Holdings will be managed by Derrick D. Cephas (a partner at Cadwalader, Wickersham & Taft) and Frederic Seegal (of Wasserstein, Perella & Co.) Zoe Kamitses remains GM at WBEA and Paul Conroy the same at WEHM.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

They're no longer going steady, they're engaged: GulfStar is ready to convert its just-begun LMA with rocker KZBB, Poteau, OH, in the Ft. Smith market, to ownership. "The Zebra" is currently owned by Arklahoma Communications and Booneville Broadcasting. Capstar subsidiary GulfStar recently picked up country KMAG and talk/sports KWHN in Ft. Smith, then cranked up the LMA with KZBB June 1. Note that in this latest transaction it's buying KZBB (FM) only, and not sister KEZU, Booneville, AR. Dale Daniels is GulfStar's Regional VP.

Here's one government that's getting out of the media - State-owned Jamaican Broadcasting has been sold for \$2 million to the publicly-traded Radio Jamaica. Reuters reports that the TV station was a "serious drain on the national budget." JBC also operates JBC-FM and one of the island's two AMs, JBC-AM; it's to be shut down temporarily and re-launched as a public broadcasting service.

Okay, maybe Jacor's got something different in mind from what the Journal speculated about last week - different, that is, for WJCM, Sebring, FL. Our thinking was that Jacor might keep the 960 KHz facility dark to help it maximize the 970 KHz signal of its WFLA, Tampa. But hold the phone: Now Jacor's filed for a CP to change power and make antenna system changes for WFLA, and also change frequency and make antenna system changes for WJCM. So it's unclear just what it has in mind. The Journal will publish details of the technical specs when they become available.

Something else different for Jacor's engineering department this week as it applies to drop in a new AM station in Casper, WY, under the nom-de-applicant of "Citicasters Co." The company already owns KTWO (AM) there, as well as FM AC KMGW. This proposed facility at 1400 KHz would be a duopoly with those two. The new AM would be one kilowatt day and night, non-directional.

The latest radio company to enter the tower-ownership business is Clear Channel, which just agreed to lay down \$32.5 million cash for a 30% share of American Tower Corporation, now operating 600 towers at 550 sites across 30 states. (Houston-based "American Tower Corporation" is unrelated to American Radio Systems' wholly-owned subsidiary called "American Tower Systems.")

Arbitron says operators in another five markets have dug down in their pockets to support the sample increase program it debuted nearly four years ago. They are: Spokane, Allentown-Bethlehem, Baton Rouge, Des Moines and Greenville-New Bern-Jacksonville (NC). The Radio Advisory Council has urged Arbitron to step up its efforts to get more markets on board with the program.

TM Century unloads its Ultimate Digital Studio operation to On Air Worldwide Media, Inc., whose parent has been handling European distribution of UDS for several years. TM Century President Neil Sargent says the company can now concentrate on music software products and services.

M STREET BAZAAR. . . PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING

The reorganization process at the combined Westwood/CBS has now come to the affiliate relations department, where Nick Kiernan becomes Senior VP, overseeing five Senior Regional Directors. There will continue to be a few specialists: Bob Bartolomeo (for the Imus morning show syndication), and Liz Laud (for Music/Special Event Programming). New Senior Regional people and their territories: Lynn McIntosh, Northeast. Bob Leeder, Southeast. Dino Masi, North Central. Mary McCarthy, South Central. Erle Younker, Western.

SFX creates a unique group level position for Jack Taddeo: "Senior VP/Programming Resources." He'll have lots of "resources" to work with, including SFX-owned morning show syndication projects Bob & Tom and John Boy & Billy. Not to mention recently-purchased concert promotion and production firms like Delsener-Slater.

More syndicated weekend talk, this time aimed at fans of old-time radio shows. The Chicago Sun-Times reports that syndicator Carl Amari's ready to roll out the one-hour "Radio Movie Classics", hosted by noted film critic Jeffrey Lyons, and the half-hour "Radio Super Heroes", hosted by Kris Erik Stevens.

MIDWEST SWAPMEET. . . . Kansas City for Dayton -- It's a nice, clean, straight-up swap between American Radio Systems and Jacor, as ARS gets the Jacor stations in K.C. and Jacor adds a boatload of stations in yet another Ohio market. Here are the stations involved: ARS receives country WDAF, rock KYYS, and CHR KMXV (all licensed to Kansas City, MO) from Jacor, and AC KUDL, Kansas City, KS. While Jacor becomes the instant owner of six stations in the Dayton market: adult hits WMMX, Dayton, rock WTUE, Dayton, soft AC WLQT, Kettering, new rock WXEG, Beavercreek, WBTT, Englewood and adult standards WONE, Dayton. Jacor's WLW, Cincinnati has maintained a sales office in the market for years. ARS Dayton GM Deborah Parenti kept up staff morale by suggesting that Co-COO Don Bouloukos arrive at the stations in the WTUE hearse. While Jacor executive David Crowl probably felt some history in the walls when he arrived there: His father once owned stations in the Dayton market.

FCC--FEDERAL CLONING COMMISSION . . . A construction permit to change frequency has spawned both a frequency change and the creation of a new AM radio station. In 1992, the FCC granted a CP to change the frequency of WCGR, Canandaigua, NY from 1550 to 1310 KHz, increase the station's power, add a directional antenna, and begin nighttime operation. When the 1310 KHz facility went into service this spring, engineers discovered that the new directional pattern stopped short of reaching some areas that WCGR's old 1550 KHz facility covered. To remedy this problem, WCGR asked for permission to broadcast on both the new 1310 KHz frequency and the old 1550 KHz frequency. In response to this request, the FCC "recharacterized" WCGR's application for a CP to change frequency as an application for a new station. Since no comments in opposition were received, the Commission dispensed with a comparative hearing for the "recharacterized" new station and awarded program test authority to station owner George W. Kimble. Kimble will be allowed to keep his 1550 KHz facility, now called WLKA, and simulcasting WCGR, following a showing that operation of both will not violate ownership rules.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

It was not a vintage week for KYEA, West Monroe, LA: Arbitron announced it's delisting KYEA from the Spring survey and has filed a surprise lawsuit alleging the station was buying diaries. Then the FCC rejected the latest in a series of KYEA legal maneuvers to bar the transfer of KLIP from Choctaw Broadcasting to New South Communications, based on a claim of unauthorized transfer of control. In the Arbitron situation, KYEA says Arbitron failed to follow its procedures for handling allegations of ratings distortion activities and says no executive officer had information about alleged improprieties before the Arbitron lawsuit.

How much will that be, officer? The FCC is finally getting back on the rate card, when it comes to fining licensees for violations. The Commission gathered Thursday morning to vote on just one agenda item -- the new Forfeiture Policy Statement. A detailed list of base forfeitures wasn't available at M Street's presstime, but the dollar amounts seem lower than the now-invalidated scale that brought howls a couple of years ago. The same idea governs: consideration of fines begins at a base level, and is adjusted up or down based on circumstances. As always, the Commission heavily penalizes licensees for misrepresentation -- and it has now upped that base amount to the max allowable. The NAB and others had successfully claimed the Commission improperly adopted the old forfeiture schedule, without going through the usual rule-making process. In the meantime, the staff has been using an ad-hoc process of relying on precedents.

Jacor wins license renewals for its WLW, WCKY and WOFX-FM, Cincinnati, despite the Rainbow Coalition's claim that their EEO program "appears to be a failure." Rainbow did concede that Jacor was "maintaining good records." The license renewal decision does include an admonishment (but no fine) for failing to recruit for nine employment vacancies, plus EEO reporting conditions. Three interesting items in the Order: #1, the Commission held up action on renewal of sister station WEBN-FM due to "other pending matters not related to EEO compliance." #2, it found that "informal recruitment" (through staff referrals, client referrals or friends) was acceptable because it produced four successful minority hires. And #3, it granted Jacor's request to keep the job titles of its inquiry response confidential.

Looks like Jacor is in the process of trying to create a new Rochester, NY-area FM for itself, with an application for a 95.5 MHz facility licensed to Albion. However: There's a competing application, filed by Calvary Chapel of the Westwide, Inc. The Spencerport, NY church group proposes to operate non-commercially. The Jacor app's being done through subsidiary Citicasters. Proposed city of license Albion, NY is located between Rochester and Buffalo. The limited 95.5 MHz class A signal appears to be a possible sister station/simulcast partner for Jacor's new rock WNVE, South Bristol, at 95.1 MHz. Jacor entered the Rochester market through last year's swap with American Radio Systems.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

Women's Broadcasters, Inc. won't be building in Montauk -- The Commission dashes WBI's hopes of building WVZC (FM), Montauk, NY by denying its application for review of a May 9, 1996 letter ruling. The FCC rejects the argument that circumstances beyond the licensee's control prevented it from building. WBI had been granted a couple of extensions, but said it was unable to nail down a tower agreement with WBEA, Montauk owner C&S Radio-Southfork. The Commission maintains that Women Broadcasters couldn't "shift responsibility to C&S for the lack of construction progress." The canceled license for WVZC was for a facility at 94.9 MHz.

Last week it was Rachele Chong playing the spoiler role for Reed Hundt's pet project -- but next time it may be Jim Quello's turn, when it comes to blocking action on the FCC Chairman's pet issue of launching an investigation of broadcast liquor ads. Word on M Street is that Quello may be ready to zing the item off the agenda for the July monthly Open Meeting, just as Chong did for the June 19 meeting. Chong and Quello have both questioned whether the FCC has the authority to move on liquor ads. They've also raised the issue of whether it's a double standard to continuing allowing advertising for beer and liquor, while forcing hard-liquor distillers off the airwaves. Here's some of what Hundt might be expected to propose: Requiring counter-ads or PSAs about alcohol abuse. Channeling ads away from times when children might be listening. And using the famous TV "V-chip" to screen out liquor.

The Commission sticks by its earlier decision in the case of WXJJ, Mt. Vernon, KY. It denied the Application for Review of a November 26, 1996 Mass Media Bureau decision to cancel WXJJ's CP, delete the call letters and grant the petition for reconsideration filed by WRVK, Mt. Vernon licensee Cumberland Media. WXJJ licensee William S. Daugherty III had gotten one modification, one extension and three reinstatements of his CP, each of which expired. His original application for a CP was granted April 30, 1990.

New Acting Director of the FCC's Office of Public Affairs is Brian Browdie, moving over from the Office of Legislative and Intergovernment Affairs. Cornell Law School alumnus Browdie has been with the Commission since 1991; he put in time at the Mass Media Bureau as well as OLIA.

The GOP may be splintered over Most Favored Nation status for China -- but they're warming up to the idea of expanding Radio Free Asia to full 24-hour operation and programming in more dialects. There's also talk about broadening Voice of America activities in the region. The AP says Radio Free Asia was launched last year with a budget of about \$10 million.

We reported last week that Donald & Sharon Wiedeman's KHNC in Johnstown, CO was canceled. The station advised us that they are currently on the air and working to have the license reinstated.

A license was previously issued for KQRS, Inc.'s KEGE-FM in Minneapolis, MN to operate its formerly authorized facilities for auxiliary purposes. This license was canceled this week at the licensee's request.

ELSEWHERE

Regent II -- yes, Terry Jacobs and Bill Stakelin are recycling the "Regent" group name -- is buying the 16-station Park Lane Group for \$23.5 million in cash. Park Lane operates stations in California and northern Arizona. Jacobs and Stakelin sold the original Regent Communications station group to Jacor, which is now allowing them to acquire and use the name for their new company. It launched late last year as "JS Communications." To that nascent group they'll add the Park Lane stations: News/talk KQMS and soft AC KSHA, Redding, CA. Rock KFMF, Chico. AC KPPL, Colusa. Country KALF, Red Bluff, CA. Country KROY, Victorville. Country KATJ-FM, George, CA. KVOY, Mojave, CA. KPFI, Tehachapi, CA. KOWL and KRLT, South Lake Tahoe. Talk/sports KVNA (AM) and AC KVNA-FM, Flagstaff, AZ. Country/talk KAAA and AC KZZZ, Kingman, AZ. And album rock KZGL, Cottonwood, AZ. Regent will start an LMA with "most" of the Park Lane stations on August 1. Park Lane's Jim Levy will take on a consulting role with Regent. Broker is Peter Handy of Star Media Group.

The new "Chancellor Media" mega-group has been talking with Bonneville -- and will increase its Dallas-market holdings with the acquisition of classic rock KZPS, Dallas and new rock KDGE, Gainesville. Chancellor Media will be the three-way joining of Evergreen Media, Chancellor Broadcasting, the Viacom radio group -- and now some added stations.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Four stations get sold in Buffalo for \$62 million, as Broadcasting Partners Holdings cashes out Mercury Radio Communications backers Greenwich Street Capital Partners. Mercury's Charlie Banta becomes President/CEO of the new Broadcasting Partners Buffalo, LLC and will continue to be an investor. The stations are: New rock WEDG, classic rock WGRF, and oldies WHTT (AM)/WHTT-FM. The buyer is backed by VS&A Communications Partners II, LP. The new Buffalo group becomes the third "platform company" for BPH, in addition to Spring Broadcasting, LLC and Pilot Communications, LLC. Lee Simonson is Chairman and CEO of Broadcasting Partners Holdings LP. Jeff Stevenson is President and General Partner of VS&A Communications Partners II. Star Media Group's Peter Handy brokered.

Connoisseur picks up Majac's four stations in Flint for \$18 million. That will add CHR WWCK/WWCK-FM, Flint and Owosso-licensed AC WAHV and standards WOAP to Jeff Warshaw's local cluster. Connoisseur Communications now owns Flint-licensed news/talk/sports WFDF and WDZZ there and has already begun LMAs with the Majac stations.

Make that 232 stations -- and counting, now that Capstar's bought three more stations in the Cedar Rapids market. It absorbs yet another operator, and this time the acquisition brings in a female executive. Quass Broadcasting President/CEO Mary Quass becomes President/CEO of Capstar Broadcasting Partners' "Central Star" Midwest division. She's also bringing her three stations to the ever-expanding Capstar: country KHAK, soft AC KDAT and religious contemporary KTOF, all licensed to Cedar Rapids.

American General Media is acquiring KLYD and KBID (both adult standards, both licensed to Bakersfield) for their fifth and sixth stations in the Bakersfield market. AGM is paying \$1.5 million. Seller is Curtis and Peggy Darling's Southpaw Communications; the Darlings have no other broadcast interests. American General Media adds KLYD/KBID to their Bakersfield-licensed KERN, KERN-FM, KGFM and KGEO. Broker on KLYD/KBID: Kalil & Company.

Joel Hartstone, a consultant, investment banker and principal in the onetime H&D group, is buying oldies WMNM, Port Henry, NY through Excalibur Media, Inc. He's paying \$608,000. A 1996 deal to sell WMNM to Pathfinder Communications was never consummated. Sellers Mark T. and Mary T. Brady retain sisters AC WFAD and classic rock WGTK, Middlebury, VT. Excalibur currently owns WSYB/WZRT, Rutland, VT, but says the WMNM acquisition doesn't create a duopoly. Broker: Kozacko Media Services.

Cox has dropped its proposal to use Georgia Tech student-run WREK, Atlanta to simulcast Tech's football and basketball games. It's looking for ways to reach fans who can't pick up the college games on Cox-run all-sports WCNN. Station management said it was hard to get a direct answer from the FCC about the legality of airing phrases like "The Atlanta Journal and Constitution Scoreboard" and "Delta Time Clock." Now Cox is looking at other options.

Could just one fire ant be worth \$100,000? Radio Savant's humorous spot for Ortho Antstop Fire Ant Killer just killed em at the sixth annual Radio-Mercury Awards, to walk away (on six legs?) with the \$100,000 top prize. The same commercial won the \$50,000 Grandy Award in April from the Advertising Club of New York. Other winners at the June 11 Radio-Mercury Awards: \$20,000 prizes were carried off by Cliff Freeman & Partners for a Little Caesar's spot; WHUD, Hudson, NY for best station-produced spot; Portland, Oregon's Radioland, for a Full Sail Brewing spot; Badillo Nazca S&S in San Juan for a newspaper ad; and the \$20,000 prize for music and sound design was split between Martin/Williams of Minneapolis and World Wide Wadio of L.A.

Ready for the Absolutely Perfect Radio Show? Only Martha Stewart could do it, of course, and she's just signed a new deal with Westwood that begins this summer. The ubiquitous expert and entrepreneur will offer up a couple of radio items: the daily "askMartha" feature, and a string of four live "multi-hour specials" featuring listener call-ins. Another angle in a deal that just bristles with synergy: Stewart already has a relationship with CBS TV's "This Morning" program.

Here's a new resource for stations doing musical formats like modern AC, alternative and CHR: An image and ID jingle package from Seattle's GMI Media Group, called Starpower. It's offered on a market-exclusive basis. GMI Media Group: (253) 839-9414.

GOOD GUYS. . . Charity begins at home -- and that's why local millionaire George Weiss is donating three radio stations, plus a background music company and a shopping center, to the Medical College of Georgia Foundation. The stations involved are hot AC combo WBBQ and WBBQ-FM and CHR WZNY, all licensed to Augusta. Mr. Weiss has recently been battling a neurological disorder called dystonia, and just discovered he also has lung cancer. The Augusta Chronicle says employees at the stations took the news of the philanthropy well -- though the GM is expecting the foundation to eventually turn around and sell off the radio stations. Jim Duncan's American Radio estimates that top-billing WBBQ/WBBQ-FM and #5 billing WZNY together accounted for about 30% of the market's revenues last year, for a total of \$3.5 million.

AND BAD GUYS . . . Don't touch that phone! At least not to make a callback for a promised \$20,000 order for a new beachfront hotel purportedly opening in the Dominican Republic. It looks like one of those callback scams where the station winds up paying a ridiculous per-minute rate to do the callback (in this case, faxback)...and there's no \$20,000 order. At least one group is warning its stations about a "too good to be true" memo it had gotten, inviting stations to fax rates to an (809) area code. That fax number allegedly belongs to an adult entertainment service.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Can you own ALL the commercial stations in a very, very small market? Here's how the FCC just ruled in a case involving the proposed purchase of a silent FM by the owner of the only other two commercial stations in the market: It decided that KOJM/KPQX, Havre (MT) licensee North Montana Broadcasting can indeed buy KRYK, Chinook through its Wild Horse Communications. The Commission was persuaded that Section 202 (b)(2) of the 1996 Telecommunications Act applies because of the "exceptional challenges" of operating in a market the size of Massachusetts that has just 24,000 residents. Chinook's about 20 miles from Havre, by the way. The Commission cited a long history of operating losses by current owner Rick David Davies, and his assertion that he's ready to go silent permanently if the sale weren't approved. So the Commission chose to approve the uncontested application to sell KRYK to Wild Horse, and leave all three of the area's commercial stations in the hands of one owner.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

We know indecency when we hear it... And the Commission decrees it heard legally indecent material on both WEBN, Cincinnati and WCMF-AM/FM, Rochester, enough to order a total of \$6,000 in fines. Though the Rochester Notice of Apparent Liability involves an incident that happened on the "Brother Wease" morning show nearly three years ago, on August 17, 1994. WEBN owner Jacor is facing a \$4,000 NAL for broadcasts by Bubba The Love Sponge on February 25 and 26, 1997. The FCC termed the WEBN broadcasts "willful and repeated violations" of the statute.

Radio Ingstad Minnesota wins a round at the FCC in the case of its KMFJ, Lake City, MN. At issue is the contention by Olmsted County Broadcasting and United Audio Corporation that KMFJ, as built, fails to provide the legally-required 70 dBu coverage to its city of license. The two petitioning parties didn't challenge the initial grant of the CP, but later filed a motion to deny based on terrain conditions. The latest development (FCC-97-199) is a Memorandum Opinion and Order denying the petition for reconsideration filed on August 19, 1996.

Even a hurricane can't save a licensee from the wrath of the FCC, if it doesn't file necessary paperwork. But since WSTX, Christiansted, VI was finally able to recover from the ravages of sea and Hurricane Marilyn and return to the air -- FCC Administrative Law Judge Edward Luton grants a motion for summary decision and renews Family Broadcasting's license. What bothered the Commission was the licensee's failure to notify the Commission that it was silent -- for 19 months -- because of circumstances beyond its control. So it was off the air without authority, but did manage to make it back into operation on January 18, 1997. Family's troubles began on October 15, 1994 when it reported "severe problems with equipment because of its close proximity and exposure to the sea." Then Hurricane Marilyn ripped the roof off the studio and destroyed some equipment in 1995.

The license for Media One Communications, Inc.'s WRNE on 980 KHz in Gulf Breeze, FL was canceled by the Commission this week. We have confirmed that WRNE is still on the air, but have unable to get anyone at the station to comment. License renewals were dismissed for MSP Communications, Inc.'s WITL on 1010 KHz in Lansing, MI and Upson Broadcasting Company's WSFT in Thomaston, GA. The Commission rescinded the renewal of license for Classic Communications, Inc.'s KWFX in Woodward, OK. The FM station grant was rescinded by letter.

A couple of commercial stations have received authority to change their status to non-commercial this week. Those stations are Educational Media Foundation's KLVJ in Julian, CA at 100.1 MHz and KSKD in Sweet Home, OR at 107.1 MHz.

The FCC's Lyndon Boozer is resigning to join a member of the Baby Bell Club, as Executive Director, Federal Relations for BellSouth. The four-year Commission employee had previously worked at the United States Telephone Association trade group. He's currently Special Assistant to the Director, Office of Legislative and Governmental Affairs (OLIA).

Another going-away party at the FCC: Mass Media Bureau Deputy Chief Mary Ellen Burns is leaving this month after three years to "pursue new opportunities and challenges." The Harvard and NYU Law School grad had been Chief Assistant Attorney General for the State of New York before joining the FCC as Division Chief of the Consumer Protection and Competition Division.

CANADA THIS WEEK

The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) has released its seventh set of data on radio revenues in Canada. The data serve primarily as a guide for determining the capacity of markets to support additional commercial radio stations. Gee, the \$693 million may help ease Bud Paxson's "sad" feeling about leaving radio -- It was the Big Radio Deal that crashed the headlines of the financial world last week, exemplified by the appearance of both Clear Channel patriarch Lowry Mays and Paxson himself on CNBC's "Bull Session" segment. The estimated 22-times cash flow purchase price was a surprise coming from the usually-cautious Mays. But it's a rare chance to own a commanding piece of Florida's radio future, as the Paxson group brings 42 Florida stations, 4 Tennessee stations, 526 outdoor display faces and even a minor league arena football and minor league hockey team. One more radio angle to the deal: state radio networks, which Paxson owns six of. Paxson's expected to use the proceeds from the radio/billboard sales to fuel its jag of TV-station buying.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Bonneville says "sayonara" to Dallas, and Chancellor Media's writing a check for \$83.5 million, to acquire its second and third FMs in the Dallas market. Chancellor Media-- the new entity combining Chancellor Broadcasting, Evergreen Media, Viacom radio and the remainder of the Gannett radio group -- already has a foothold in Dallas via CHR KHKS, Denton, being acquired from Gannett. The \$83.5 million is for classic rocker KZPS and alternative KDGE, Gainesville. Broker was Star Media Group's Paul Leonard.

Emmis shows some Panache -- actually, Jeff Smulyan's company is showing Panache Broadcasting the door marked "Exit", since urban-oldies WTLC (AM) and urban WTLC-FM, Indianapolis constituted Panache's final broadcast holdings. It sold talker WWDB, Philadelphia to Charlie Banta's Mercury a couple of years ago. Emmis is paying \$14,980,000 cash for WTLC-AM/FM. That adds a third FM and second AM to its hometown cluster, on top of AC WENS, Shelbyville (IN), oldies WNAP-FM and talk WIBC. There won't be an LMA prior to an expected Fall closing. Star Media's Peter Handy brokered the Emmis-Panache transaction.

Capstar keeps the checkbook open with the \$3.2 million purchase of CHR WZBQ, Carrollton, AL from Grant Radio Group, LLC. It'll become part of the Tuscaloosa station group operated by Capstar subsidiary Southern Star. That local group will also include country WTXT, Fayette, and Tuscaloosa-licensed rock WRTR and southern gospel WACT.

Mega Broadcasting buys WLAT, Manchester for its second AM in the Hartford market, and its fourth station overall. Mega President/CEO Alfredo Alonso says buying the 1230 KHz facility "fulfills our effort to service the minority communities of Hartford." New owner Mega recently took its WNEZ, New Britain to a "Jamz 910" urban format, and now will serve central Connecticut Hispanics with the new WLAT. Latino Broadcasting's Jeffrey Dressler will remain with Mega-Hartford as Chief Counsel. Mega VP/COO Gene Bryan will oversee WLAT. WNEZ PD Nomar Vizcarrondo will also handle programming at WLAT, which will be a "tropical-based music format."

All four stations licensed to the Kentucky state capital of Frankfort will be under common ownership, after the pending merger of Purchase & Franklin County Broadcasting, and Radio Enterprises of Kentucky. R. Lee Hagan's group, which owns standards WKED and AC WKED-FM, is buying oldies WFKY and classic rock WKYW for \$675,000. Local Hagan executive Ken Mitchell will oversee all four. The Hagan group also owns WTHQ and WCND in nearby Shelbyville, KY. Louisville-based brokerage Henson Media worked on the deal.

Ownership concentration continues to occur in the smaller markets, like the \$1 million deal last week in Helena, MT. STARadio Corporation, which will also own country KHKR, East Helena, is now buying news/talk KCAP and classic rock KZMT. KCAP/KZMT owner One-On-One Sports recently announced a deal to sell them to American Cities Broadcasting as part of a multi-market transaction. Now the contract for KCAP/KZMT's being re-assigned to STARadio. Broker is Media Services Group's Greg Merrill.

Correcting last week's item about the sale of WMNM, Port Henry, NY to Joel Hartstone's Excalibur Media: Excalibur did buy only WMNM. Sellers Mark T. Brady and Mary T. Brady retain only WFAD, Middlebury. They had once owned WGTK, Middlebury but sold it to Dynamite Radio, Inc. in 1991. Pathfinder had an FCC-granted deal to buy all three (WMNM, WFAD and WGTK) last year, but never closed on them.

Mel Karmazin just hates to lose, whether it's in the ratings, in revenues, or in court. Infinity Broadcasting has filed an appeal in the Media Dialup case, asking the Second Circuit Court of Appeals to look at why Dallas-based Media Dialup should be allowed to continue including its stations (and Westwood One programming) in Media Dialup's monitoring service. Karmazin sees it as copyright infringement. The lower court judge called it "fair use."

Music Unlimited's "Blues Deluxe" syndicated show observes its 500th anniversary with the show airing the week of July 27-August 2. That program will honor another milestone: the 50th anniversary of the Chicago-based Chess record label. The one-hour weekly "Blues Deluxe" plays rock-oriented, alternative and traditional blues music. Music Unlimited: (800) 999-3520.
