**CHANCELLOR V. UNCLE SAM.** . . Chancellor Media defies DOJ to become the poster child for antitrust, and it's forcing the Department of Justice to file suit to halt a proposed deal on Long Island. What may be just as important as Chancellor's defiance is the change in psychology -- Will Wall Street see the fight as a signal that radio has topped out? At issue is the swap of SFX/Chancellor of stations in Jacksonville and Nassau-Suffolk. The DOJ claims Chancellor would hold as much as 65% of the local Long Island radio revenue as a result. Justice particularly focused on the anticompetitive potential in the 25-54 demo in Suffolk County. And it isn't buying Chancellor's contention that New York City and Long Island are one big market. Chancellor has decided to take its chances in court, where it may have to eat some of its own words. The DOJ complaint quotes Chancellor executives saying things that give corporate attorneys heartburn, like: the merger "will result in less competitive 'undercutting'....and ad rates "will increase as a result of removal of competitive pressure." The legal tug of war will be closely watched by other groups -- and by Wall Street. Investors (probably overreacting) drove Chancellor stock down 4-5/32 last Thursday. More on the Dodge City showdown between Chancellor and the feds inside this week's M Street Journal.

**HONEY, I SHRUNK THE NETWORK.** . . Affiliates of Children's Broadcasting-syndicated Aahs World Radio got the bad news last week that the service will disappear next January 30. It wasn't a total shock: CBC has been scrambling to re-shape itself and stay viable ever since ABC withdrew from their partnership about a year ago. Children's CEO Chris Dahl puts the blame squarely on Disney: "We have been forced to alter our business plans and operations by ABC/Disney's method of entry into the children's radio market." Other factors, as M Street sees it: inability to grow same-station revenues; lack of 2+ [not "12+"] ratings; less than full-market signals for some affiliates; and the fact that the CBC financials included both Radio Aahs stations and its other owned stations, which do brokered religious programming. CBC says it will stay active in the children's programming arena through its website, other syndicated programs -- and possibly satellite DAB. Next January is also the time when CBC expects to close on the \$72.5 million sale of its owned-and-operated stations to Global Broadcasting.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

"Liquor is quicker" -- It's certainly jumping to the top of the agenda of new FCC Chairman Bill Kennard. Looks like we'll be hearing a lot about a future FCC investigation of hard-liquor advertising on radio and TV. It was a pet issue of former Chairman Reed Hundt, and Kennard immediately revived it when he met with reporters last Monday. Sample soundbites: "Not one person has told me that more distilled liquor advertising is a good thing for the country." Kennard acknowledges the "difficult legal and constitutional problems" in regulating liquor ads. But says, "I believe that we ought to have this debate." That's the line of the Clinton administration and Attorney General Janet Reno. And with Jim Quello and Rachele Chong now off the Commission, Kennard's ready to start lining up votes. The current regulatory push is being framed around the issue of protecting children -- a constant mantra out of the White House. It's also possible Kennard will be looking at the amazing pace of ownership concentration in radio ownership; he mentioned that issue in his press conference last Monday.

On the 8th Floor at the FCC it's out with the old, in with the new: New Chairman Bill Kennard and the three other new Commish-people are rolling out their new staff appointments. FCC-watchers know that those folks are the crucial senior-level staffers who make things run from day to day. First: Kennard names former Reed Hundt advisor and Associate General Counsel John Nakahata to be his Chief of Staff; Nakahata worked for Senator Joe Lieberman's Committee on Government Affairs before joining the FCC in April 1995 as a special assistant to Reed Hundt. Also in the Chairman's office: Kennard brings associate Susan Fox upstairs as his Senior Legal Counsel. He taps Thomas Power and Ari Fitzgerald as Legal Advisors. And he also brings along confidential assistant Eldoris "Cricket" Jackson from the General Counsel Office to serve him as Chairman.

Meanwhile, at the office of new Commissioner Michael Powell, there are more new nametags going up: Jane E. Mago becomes Senior Advisor (specializing in mass media and cable). Pete Tenhula becomes Legal Advisor. Former Rachele Chong Common Carrier Advisor Kathleen Franco stays on for now as Interim Legal Advisor. And Toni McGowan becomes Confidential Assistant to Powell. Powell assumes the Chong seat, and his term expires June 30, 2002.

Next door, where they're putting the tongue-twisting name "Harold Furchtgott-Roth" on the door, Steve Kaminer becomes Interim Senior Legal Advisor. Katie King is Interim Legal Advisor. And Ginger Clark is Confidential Assistant. Furchtgott-Roth takes the seat vacated a while back by Andrew Barrett. His term expires June 30, 2000.

And over at Gloria Tristani's office, Tristani takes the remaining months of former Chairman Reed Hundt's term; her own five-year term runs July 1, 1998 through July 1, 2003. In the Tristani office, Rick Chessen is Senior Legal Advisor, Karen Gulick is Legal Advisor (wireless and international issues) and Paul Gallant is Legal Advisor (common carrier). Helen Hillegass will serve as Tristani's Confidential Assistant; Hillegass is a former director of Children's Safehouse and a partner in an Albuquerque law firm.

More Faces In New Places at 1919 M Street: Christopher Wright succeeds Bill Kennard as General Counsel. Current Deputy General Counsel David Solomon gets "expanded responsibilities." Paula Michele Ellison is named Deputy General Counsel. Veteran Mass Media Bureau attorney Bob Ratcliffe becomes Acting Deputy Chief of the Bureau. Current MMB Deputy Chief also gets those "expanded responsibilities." Karen Kornbluh is Deputy Bureau Chief. In a role that has her signing a whole of paperwork, Magalie Salas becomes Secretary of the Commission. Ruth Dancy is named Assistant Secretary of the FCC. Downstairs, in the Office of Public Affairs, Elizabeth Rose will become Director.



**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)**

Now the ACLU (at least the Massachusetts chapter) is ready to take on the Commission and help defend a pirate radio operator. The ACLU's Sarah Wunsch says it hasn't officially taken the case, but is "planning to represent" the folks at "Radio Free Allston" in a First Amendment case. The Boston Globe writes the dramatic story of two Commission agents busting Radio Free Allston while Pastor Rose Aubourg was reading from the Bible. Operator Steve Provizer had been on the air with 20 watts at 106.1 MHz for about eight months. What Provizer and many pirates want is for the FCC to allow low-power community stations to operate. The ACLU in California has apparently shown some interest in the case of Berkeley pirate Stephen Dunifer, but M Street believes the Massachusetts case may be the first one officially taken up by the ACLU.

The National Hispanic Media Coalition sure knows how to get attention: It staged a press conference at the entrance to Disney Studios in Burbank to protest radio's poor record of performance in hiring Latinos. Alex Nogales' group is challenging the licenses of a total of ten California stations, including Disney/ABC-owned KLOS, KABC and KTZN, Los Angeles. The NHMC has also filed Petitions to Deny against two other L.A. stations -- for alleged obscenity. Those are Howard Stern affiliate KLSX and Spanish-language KKHJ. The L.A. Times quotes Nogales charging that KKHJ has "out-Sterned Stern" when it comes to obscenity.

What do you do, if you're a daytime AM operator in a community that doesn't have either a full-time AM or an FM? WGEN, Geneseo, IL operator Roger Coleman is one of those folks pushing the Commission to award such daytimers an FM translator. One time sister WGEN-FM has been sold to Connoisseur, and now simulcasts the sports programming of KJOC, Davenport, IA. So -- there's no local radio service to handle school closings, local weather and local sports play-by-play. NAB Radio Board member Coleman hears the idea will appear on the agenda of the January Board meeting. In the meantime, he's trying to drum up more support for the idea. It's not a perfect solution: for one thing, it would make Arbitron's job more difficult, since it doesn't track translators, and since it measures listening to discrete radio stations, not "services."

Connoisseur Communications hits the "Out" door at the Department of Justice with an approval (but some different stations) for its deal in Youngstown. The Ohio Attorney General also got into the action on this case, as Justice and the state AG clear Connoisseur's \$13.5 million purchase of country WQXX, Salem, OH and standards WSOM, Salem from the Lincoln Group. But check the paperwork: Jeff Warshaw's Connoisseur Communications agrees to spin oldies WBGG and talk/sports WRTK (both Youngstown-licensed), which will keep Connoisseur's share of the radio advertising market where it was before the Lincoln Group deal.

Also at the Commission:

The license renewal for White Construction Co., Inc.'s WLQH-FM, Chiefland, FL was dismissed, with no reason given. License to cover modification was granted.

Way out there in Guam, the Commission returned the license renewal of KSTO, Agana, GU, apparently for something related to the fee section of the FCC regs.

Also returned, per fee section, was the license renewal application of KFLS, Klamath Falls, OR.

**ELSEWHERE**

There's about to be one less commercial FM on the FM dial in the Indianapolis market: group owner and non-commercial religious syndicator Moody Bible Institute enters Indy with the \$5.5 million purchase of the Anderson, IN-licensed WHUT/WXXP combo. WHUT currently does standards, and WXXP (FM) averages a 0.5 share 12+ in the Indianapolis Arbitron doing Adult Contemporary. Those are likely to change under new owner Moody. Chicago-based Moody Bible operates an extensive network of non-commercial FMs in both the commercial and non-com bands. Seller in this deal is Anderson Radio, G.P., which doesn't own any other radio properties. Moody's an old hand in the radio business: It has operated flagship WMBI, Chicago since 1926. Broker on WHUT/WXXP: Mitt Younts of Media Services Group.

In Chicago, it's another case of a TV station acquiring an AM property, as Channel 50 owner Newsweb acquires WSBC, Chicago from longtime Windy City broadcaster Dan Lee. (Lee previously sold his WXRT/WSCR, Chicago to Westinghouse. Ethnic radio fixture WSBC was his last radio property.) Newsweb's Fred Eychaner is paying \$5,550,000 for the 1240 KHz WSBC. Broker on the sale of WSBC: Michael Bergner. The Chicago Sun-Times reports that Eychaner was also busy last week literally giving money away: He handed out \$25,000 checks to three local non-profits.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

In the Ft. Smith market, Capstar is adding the top-rated station in town, and thus corrals the biggest competitor of its newly-acquired country KMAG, Ft. Smith. The newest deal is for locally-owned country combo KTCS/KTCS-FM, Ft. Smith, currently held by the Harper family under the name "Big Chief Broadcasting." The five stations of the future Capstar cluster in Ft. Smith would've combined for a 39.2 share 12+ in the Spring Arbitron. Broken down: KTCS-FM was number one with a 17.8. KMAG was second with a 13.9. CHR KZBB, Poteau, OK was seventh with a 4.6. News/talk KWHN scored a 2.9. And KTCS (AM) didn't scratch. Paul Swint is market manager for Capstar in Ft. Smith (Arbitron market #170). San Antonio-based John Barger handled the brokerage duties for Capstar.

Just what are the chess pieces of the Chancellor/SFX swap that Justice is trying to stop? The Long Island stations are: SFX-owned AC WALK-FM and soft AC WALK (AM), both licensed to Patchogue. And Chancellor-owned CHR WBLI, Patchogue, rock WBAB, Babylon, WBAB simulcast partner WHFM, Southampton, and news/talk WGBB, Freeport. Assistant Attorney General Joel Klein says "These stations have been locked in a daily competitive battle." M Street notes that the truth is that Chancellor has already been operating the WALK/WALK-FM combo for many months under an LMA. (Footnote: On the southern leg of this swap are CHR WAPE-FM, Jacksonville and rock WFYV-FM, Atlantic Beach, FL. They, too, have been in a longstanding LMA with the proposed buyer. Justice has no problem with the Jacksonville deal, even with a Duncan-estimated 47% revenue share.) The DOJ suit was filed in Federal District Court in Brooklyn, where a judge is going to hear a lot of arguments about what the relevant market is -- just radio? Just Long Island radio?

Will "All Things Considered" get married to "Prairie Home Companion" with wedding music provided by "Performance Today"? Apparently the two powerhouses in American public radio are considering a merger. Here's how M Street hears it: National Public Radio approached Minneapolis-based Public Radio International about the possibility of a merger. The PRI board thought it over. A PRI spokesperson says "the ball is back in their [NPR's] court." As of deadline time, PRI says there is "no imminent merger." Stations who currently choose from the menus of both NPR and PRI may not like the prospect of having just one cafeteria to shop in.

"Forints"??? How will those Emmis budgets look in "forints"? M Street will do the math for you: a consortium led by U.S. broadcaster Emmis is paying \$4.5 billion forints (about \$20 million U.S.) for one of two commercial seven-year radio licenses just awarded in Hungary. "Hungaria Radio" gets a new station that should reach 81% of the country's 10.5 million listeners. The other license went to a group led by the U.K.'s DMG Radio, a venture of the Daily Mail and General Trust, PLC. It paid slightly less for a currently-operating station (Danubius Radio) that reaches fewer Hungarians. Among the disappointed American bidders: John Kluge's Metromedia International and a group that included Clear Channel in combination with Ireland's Independent Newspapers. The Emmis-led "Hungaria Radio" group includes Credit Suisse First Boston, Magyar Hirlap Rt. and Kvantumbank. Longtime U.S. broadcaster Randy Bongarten will be Emmis' man in Hungary.

It's back to the hutch for the PRI-syndicated weekly children's story-telling series called "Rabbit Ears Radio." Despite being aired on about 250 public stations for the past three years, it wasn't able to raise funding for the next cycle of programs. The Rabbit Ears project was notable partly for the caliber of Hollywood stars it attracted -- past program hosts included Mel Gibson and Meg Ryan. Kevin Bacon had agreed to host the next cycle.

Westwood's Generation-X sports personality Scott Ferrall has been called "off the bench" to handle sports for MTV. (He'll continue to do his late-evening show for Westwood.) The hoarse-voiced talker starts his MTV assignments with the upcoming "Sports and Music Festival."

They don't like radio commercials in France -- imagine that! French radio group NRJ releases a research study that blames "the deficit of creativity" for radio's poor showing. Turns out that 51% of French people like billboard advertising, 48% magazine ads, 42% the ads in movie theatres, 37% the TV ads, while radio ads trail behind at 29%.

Let's see: There was Alice Kramden...there's Alice the radio station (in Denver, San Francisco and other markets)...and now there's "Alice" the trade mag. Publisher Jim Kerr just launched a new fax publication aimed at the burgeoning modern AC market, and it's called "Alice." (Kerr says the name is an inside joke for those in the format.) **TRULY -- ALL THINGS CONSIDERED.** . . . "'All Things Considered' brought to you by the Ku Klux Klan"??? Public station KWMU, St. Louis rebuffed a Missouri Ku Klux Klan chapter that tried to become an underwriter for its programming. Now the Klan has gone to court and filed a lawsuit, calling it a First Amendment issue. After all, it notes: KWMU airs underwriting announcements from organizations like the Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays. And the station is owned by the state-supported University of Missouri, and shouldn't discriminate against groups which advocate social causes. KWMU says it has the right to refuse underwriting it thinks is inappropriate -- and it does consider the Klan's offer inappropriate. Here's the wording rejected by the station: KWMU programming made possible in part by "The Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, a white Christian organization, standing up for the rights and values of white Christian America since 1865."

**ALL THINGS OWNED.** . . . Voila! A seven-station cluster, quietly assembled from the holdings of four different owners in Palm Springs, CA. That makes the third market for privately-held Morris Communications. Morris previously acquired the former Stauffer radio stations in Topeka and Amarillo. This new quartet of deals in the California desert will form the basis of the Morris-owned "Desert Radio Group." The seven stations involved and their current owners: Talk-formatted KPSL, Thousand Palms (owner: Franklin Communications). Standards KCMJ, Palm Springs and Classic Hits KCMJ-FM, Indio (from Westminster Broadcasting). Regional Mexican KCLB and Rock KCLB-FM (both licensed to Coachella, CA and both owned by Coachella Valley Broadcasting). And Adult Hits KSES, Yucca Valley and news/talk KNWZ, Thousand Palms (from Country Club Communications). It may look like a lot of trouble to enter Arbitron market #150 -- but Morris is now set as a heavyweight operator there. Morris Communications is a true family operation: W.S. Morris III is Chairman/CEO. Will Morris IV is President. The brokerage duties in Palm Springs were handled by Media Services Group's Tom McKinley and Austin Walsh.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

New Commissioner Harold Furchtgott-Roth fills in some vacancies on his new staff, naming current Intel policy man Paul Misener as Senior Legal Advisor...current Office of the Independent Counsel attorney Kevin Martin as Legal Advisor for common carrier and wireless...and current Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher associate Helgi Walker as Legal Advisor, specializing in mass media and cable.

The FCC's War on Pirates continues, this time in Kansas City, MO. The unlicensed "KCMG" had its equipment confiscated after the FCC got a complaint about its operation on 107.3 MHz.

That pesky pirate in Berkeley, California has bought himself some more time to operate: District Judge Claudia Wilken has just asked for further briefings in her review of the government's case against "Radio Free Berkeley" operator Stephen Dunifer. The delays are exasperating for folks on the other side. NAB President Eddie Fritts pronounces himself "extremely disappointed with yet another delay in a case that was argued 19 months ago. Pirate radio stations are illegal and should be put out of business." Far as M Street can tell -- Dunifer remains on the air.

Get that Taxpayer ID number handy, for the next time you need to file something at the Commission that's subject to a fee. Get the revised FCC Form 159-159-C from the FCC's website (<http://www.fcc.gov/formpage>) or by calling the FCC forms line at (800) 418-3676.

**CANADA THIS WEEK**

Howard Stern becomes Howard "le terrible" -- though there's not much the industry self-regulation group called the Broadcast Standards Council can do about him. It said his various comments "surpassed the permissible" and violate the Canadian broadcast code. The Council also doesn't think his act is humorous. Especially the part where he came on the air in Montreal referring to French-Canadians as "peckerheads" and "pussies." It's just not the usual polite Canadian fare. The Council doesn't have the power to levy fines on stations who violate the code, though it might revoke their membership. The next body that could consider the thousand-plus complaints about Howard Stern does have greater powers: the government's Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission. Stern's syndicated morning show is carried on CHOM, Montreal and CILQ, Toronto.

**ELSEWHERE**

One station sale this week involves Howard Stern's "Private Parts": WCCC-AM/FM, Hartford, which figures prominently in both Stern's career and his "Private Parts" book-and-movie. Most folks figured local owner Sy Dresner would keep the combo forever, but now (after 28 years) he's selling it to classical operator Marlin Broadcasting. Dresner tells the *Hartford Courant* it's "time for younger ownership with fresh ideas." New owner Marlin tells the paper it will keep both WCCC-FM's rock format and the syndicated Howard Stern morning show. Stern's return to the market last year on WCCC-FM has greatly helped the Dresner bottom line. What may change with the new owner is the simulcast; Marlin tells the paper it may opt for separate programming for the 1290 KHz AM. Broker: Tony Rizzo of Blackburn.

Abilene, TX gets a new owner, as the fast-growing Cumulus shows up at the city limits there. Cumulus picks up two FMs, plus an option to purchase a third, via separate deals. #1: It's buying country KBCY, Tye, TX from Tye Broadcasting and CHR KCDD, Hamlin from a related entity called Big Country Broadcasting. Price on KBCY/KCDD combined is \$1,812,000. #2: Cumulus also gets an option to purchase current LMA partner KHXS, Abilene (classic rock), from Larry Hickerson's IQ Radio; that's worth another \$375,000. Broker on the Abilene deals: Norman Fischer & Associates.

Athens, GA-based Southern Broadcasting adds two more stations in the Rome, GA market with the pickup of news/talk WRGA, Rome and AC WQTU, Rome from McDougald Broadcasting. Southern currently owns southern gospel/black gospel WTSH, Rome and country WTSH-FM, Rockmart. It began an LMA with the McDougald stations last Friday (November 14). Southern says it will own a total of 11 stations across north Georgia.

Regional Mexican broadcaster Lazer Broadcasting -- operating in the Oxnard-Ventura market -- is buying LMA partner KXBS, Santa Paula from KXBS Broadcasting. There will eventually be a larger audience for regional Mexican KXBS: The current 87-watter has a CP for more power. Lazer already owns regional Mexican KXLM, Oxnard and uses it to originate programming for co-owned KXRS, Hemet and KXSB, Big Bear Lake. Alfred Plascencia is president of Lazer. Broker on KXBS: Media Services Group's Robert Maccini.

Sony makes some important moves with its SW Networks: It's selling all of its long-form programming, which includes "Personal Notes", "hardDrive" and "Country's Most Wanted" and the full-time classical network. It's adding three new programming services (one for CHR stations, an entertainment news network, and "SW Entertainment Express", focusing on movie, TV and celebrity news). It's also re-parking SW under the "aegis of Sony Music Entertainment", instead of Sony Corp. of America. And -- just maybe -- it's keeping digital-friendly SW ready to play a role in distributing other Sony product -- like music, and maybe future Mariah Carey radio specials. Sony isn't commenting on that speculation, but it makes good economic sense. Employment in New York may have improved under newly-re-elected Mayor Giuliani...but there was a wave of pink slips last week at SW Networks, though SW insists the actual number of layoffs was under 20. The syndicator also says there will be new hires (some possibly outside New York) as part of its restructuring. SW Networks President/CEO Dan Forth now reports to Sony Music Senior VP Ron Urban. SW Networks' previous place at the family table had it reporting to parent Sony Corporation of America. Current SW offerings include format-specific programming suites for Alternative, Urban, Country, AC, Modern AC, Classic/Album Rock and Talk. Sony wasn't talking about a possible buyer for the long-form offerings -- and there's unconfirmed speculation that a separate buyer may be found for the full-time classical format.



ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Citadel now owns ten stations in the greater Little Rock market. You read right: M Street confirms that Citadel has now closed on all ten stations it had planned to buy. The group says it's allowed to keep that many stations (over the usual eight-station limit) because of the signal overlap situation. Several of its new stations have limited signals. For the record, M Street notes all ten from the M Street Database, starting with the seven FMs: urban KIPR, Pine Bluff; adult hits KURB, Little Rock; news/talk KKRN, Humnoke; CHR KESR, Sherwood; news/talk KARN-FM, Cabot; soft AC KVLO, Sheridan; and brand-new modern AC "Alice", the former KYTN, Wrightsville. The three Citadel AMs are news/talk KARN, Little Rock; adult standards KEZQ, Little Rock; and news KRNN, North Little Rock.

Don't be surprised if American Radio Systems winds up owning radio stations again -- AFTER it sells its current station group to Westinghouse/CBS. M Street hears it's a distinct possibility that Steve Dodge will again be a station owner, and might even end up with some current ARS stations that may be spun by CBS. It's unconfirmed, but M Street hears that ARS doesn't have a non-compete with CBS as far as radio ownership. American Radio Systems executives did tell analysts during a conference call last week that it's still anticipating a second-quarter 1998 closing on the CBS merger -- though that event might come earlier in Q2 than first thought. ARS praises CBS exec Mel Karmazin as a man who "knows how to get stuff done" with the Department of Justice, in terms of structuring deals that will get cleared. ARS also says Karmazin is "disinclined to pick a fight" with Justice -- which M Street reads as a reference to Chancellor Media, which IS picking a fight over its Long Island acquisition plans.

Score it "ARS to Capstar" -- though American Radio System wasn't confirming it at presstime, it has indeed filed to spin two FMs in the Portsmouth, NH market to Capstar. Price: \$5.5 million. The stations are CHR WERZ, Exeter and oldies, WQSO, Rochester. The ubiquitous Capstar is already a player in the market with rock WHEB, Portsmouth, modern AC WXHT, York Center (ME), and sports WTMN, Portsmouth.

And tracking ARS in Florida -- It's filed a transfer app with the FCC to sell all-news WEAT (AM), West Palm Beach to James Crystal Enterprises, LC for \$1.5 million. Note that American Radio retains soft AC WEAT-FM, West Palm Beach.

\$500,000 in "Sunny Day Fund" money is making life far from sunny for mother-and-son team Cathy Hughes and Alfred Liggins -- the principals in D.C.-based group Radio One. Maryland Governor Parris Glendening is being criticized for his proposal to use Sunny Day Fund cash to help underwrite Radio One's relocation from the District to Prince George's County. Some legislators see it as an attempt to do some politicking with black voters. Both the Baltimore Sun and the Washington Post have been carrying blow-by-blow coverage of the battle. The latest development: Glendening is supporting a revised version of the loan that got shot down last Summer. Radio One owns stations like talk WOL and urban WKYS in Washington, plus various urban-formatted outlets in Baltimore and Philadelphia.

Lots of format-specific info in Arbitron's brand-new study called "America's Top Stations: A Format Profile." Arbitron has done P1 (most preferred listener) studies before, but it calls this one a "groundbreaking report." Most likely usage: Programmer comparing their own stations against industry averages for their format.

Big Brother is listening -- and in several languages. London-based Xtreme Information launches as a monitoring service for radio and TV commercials in the U.S., Europe and elsewhere. Xtreme principals Dan Levin and John Gordon began a similar monitoring service years ago, then sold it to giant Pearson PLC. Now -- their three-year non-compete has expired, and they're jumping back in.

USA Digital says 1998 will be the year of testing for its planned in-band, on-channel Digital Audio Broadcasting system...and one of the steps along the way is a new mobile test in the Washington, D.C. area. The FCC has authorized it to conduct "characterization" tests on the vacant Channel 6, transmitting special tones that help the techs study multipathing. (M Street notes that the transmission will be from a backup site for CBS-owned WARW, Bethesda. That same site will be used later for actual IBOC testing.) Bell Labs is working with USA Digital on the testing.

**ELSEWHERE (cont'd)**

Now sports is jumping from the internet to the radio: internet content provider SportsLine and radio syndicator SportsFan Radio Network announce a new multi-year collaboration that brings two SportsLine shows to radio. What's significant is that the new venture involves weekday programming, not fringe-time shows. The SportsLine shows are "Sports Uncensored" (with Craig Carton and C.J. Silas) from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Eastern time; and "The Drive" (with Scott Kaplan and Sidney Rosenberg) from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. They'll displace SportsFan's current "Sports Central" and "Pigpen" (which moves to mornings). Global Media Sales will handle national sales (for the 5 minutes per hour of national spots). AVI will assist Winstar's Bob Dunn with affiliations. The official kickoff of the internet/radio schedule is December 1.

Want to get into radio in the U.K.? The Sunday Telegraph and Reuters report that London's Melody Radio is on the block. Seems that British building materials group Hanson PLC is ready to exit the radio biz and concentrate on bricks and mortar. The financials: About 500,000 pounds in profits this year. Other radio operators, like Scottish Radio Holdings and Capital Radio, may be interested bidders.

Big [Ad] Spender in 1997, so far, is General Motors. Competitive Media Reporting says GM shelled out \$1.1 billion on its advertising (in all media) for the first six months of 1997. That's a 21.9% increase over the year before. Top advertised single brand? McDonald's, at \$287.7 million. Six of the top ten brands advertised were fast food companies. Biggest movie advertiser: Disney's Buena Vista, with Columbia coming up fast on the outside.

**M STREET BAZAAR. . . PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING**

Legendary New York programmer and personality Frankie Crocker recently finished his third tour of duty through WBLS -- but you can still hear his music on the internet. The New York Daily News says "FrankieCrocker.com" offers "R&B, Quiet Storm, jazz, classical, rock, country and other styles -- primarily for people working at computers."

Another new computer-related competitor to radio is online giant AOL. It's launching an "AOL Radio" channel, that will offer music and no commercials, to as many as 100,000 subscribers at once. Probably no coincidence that former radio programmer Bob Pittman is now working with America Online.

Forget the \$5 parking fee at Opryland -- CRS-29 is moving out of Opryland and right into downtown Nashville. Sponsor Country Radio Broadcasters is predicting a turnout of about 2,300 for the next CRS. Dates: February 25-28, 1998. Check the CRB's website at <http://www.crb.org> for details.

That's not just any classical composer you hear on NPR -- it's Paul McCartney, who will be on hand for (and interviewed during) the American premiere of his new symphony called "Standing Stone." The special two-hour version of NPR's "Performance Today" is hosted by Martin Goldsmith and airs live at 9 p.m. Eastern time on Wednesday, November 19. (M Street checks the Billboard classical chart and notes that "Standing Stone" has been #1 on the chart for the past six weeks.)

**CHRISTIE'S, SOTHEBY'S, AND THE FCC?** Who's the high bidder? FCC Chairman Bill Kennard says comparative hearings to award contested broadcast licenses were "a process that just didn't work", and he's moving toward auctions -- fast. That's possible now because of the Balanced Budget Act of 1997, which requires the Commission to use auctions to decide mutually exclusive commercial broadcast cases. The Commission has been logrolling since the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals struck down its comparative hearings policy in the 1993 "Bechtel" decision. What's at stake: 292 radio licenses, sought by more than 1,200 applicants, in cases filed since Bechtel. Plus another 27 licenses that linger from the days before Bechtel. There still might be a hearing mechanism for cases that got an Initial Decision by an Administrative Law Judge or a Commission decision issued before Bechtel. The Commission is also going to be flexible about some "settlement agreements" -- which means that some contests will be resolved by checkbook, with one party agreeing to pay more than just settlement expenses to buy out the others. Note: Ownership diversity is coming back as an issue. Commissioners Powell and Tristani urged the Commission to get more women and minorities into station ownership. (Notice of Proposed Rulemaking 97-397)

**THE HIGH COST OF CHILD CARE.** . . Kids (and kids radio) cost money: ABC Radio continues to write big checks to further its kids crusade on behalf of "Radio Disney." It just installed "Radio Disney" in Boston (on the former WPZE, now owned by Hibernia)...it just struck a deal to buy Seattle affiliate KKDZ for \$1.2 million...and now it's ready to enter San Francisco by acquiring R&B oldies KDIA, Oakland from Jim Gabbert's Pacific FM, Inc for an estimated \$6 million. ABC is now confirming earlier speculation that it will use its third Bay Area AM to air Radio Disney, beginning December 16. ABC says it's now got the Radio Disney format in 13 markets, counting San Francisco. Broker on the sale of KDIA: Kalil & Company.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

Rule #1 from the Pirate Radio Handbook: Don't blab to the local FCC Field Office about operating without a license. That's apparently what Michael Gonzalo Calderon did, when he was operating an unlicensed facility across the street from a Kansas City, MO police station. He'd gotten a complaint letter from a local station about interference and taken it to the Kansas City Field Office. The Commission representative told Calderon to quit broadcasting. But he didn't. Now he's had his equipment confiscated. Calderon was broadcasting on 107.9 MHz before his equipment was taken by K.C. Field Office staffers and U.S. Marshals.

Translator licensee Jerry Turro may have won his latest battle with the FCC, but Gettysburg or even Appomattox may lie around the corner. The Commission is granting his Petition for Special Authority to Take Deposition, so he can take a rare oral -- not written -- deposition from FCC field engineer Serge Loginow, Jr. Turro's fighting quite serious Commission allegations about the relationship between his FM translators in Ft. Lee, NJ and Pomona, New York and Monticello Mountaintop Broadcasting-owned WJUX, Monticello, NY. He claims that Loginow is uniquely qualified to answer questions about an inspection he carried out, and that only the give-and-take of an oral deposition will elicit the truth. So Turro gets to depose Loginow -- but there's a Show Cause hearing ahead on whether to revoke the license of "Jukebox Radio" WJUX.

Another week, another couple of dismissed license renewals from the FCC. They are: WBEU, Beaufort, SC (960 KHz, silent). And KLSR, Memphis, TX (1130 KHz), which is giving back the license. KLSR's FM remains on the air.

**CANADA THIS WEEK**

No more "black holes" for the CBC: Victoria, British Columbia is the only provincial capital that doesn't have a local CBC presence, but that's about to change. (CBC called the coastal area a "black hole" for CBC Radio One local service.) The CRTC has just okayed CBC's application to bring Radio One local service to the market, via a new signal at 90.5 MHz, and rebroadcast for the Sooke/Metchosin area on 99.5 MHz. CBC expects to be on the air in Victoria next September.

ELSEWHERE

This "Caribou" has gone hunting again, and just bagged its fourth FM in the Oklahoma City market. Kent Nichols' Caribou Communications is paying Bott Broadcasting \$5,250,000 for religious-formatted KNTL, Bethany, OK. (Sister station KQCV, Oklahoma City, also doing religion, is not part of this deal.) KNTL becomes Caribou's fourth FM in the capital city of the Sooner State: It now owns rock KATT-FM, Oklahoma City; jazz KTNT-FM, Edmond; and modern AC KYIS, Oklahoma City. Caribou's other market is Honolulu. Rich Bott and his father may be selling KNTL, but actually have even bigger plans in Oklahoma: They're building a new Class C FM licensed to Shawnee, OK they claim should cover much of both Oklahoma City and Tulsa. It's a 95.1 MHz facility, called (for now) KABH; Broker on KNTL: Kalil & Company.

Make that a five-station cluster in hometown Tucson for Jim Slone and his Rex Broadcasting: His company is buying out local owners Dr. Christopher Maloney and Tom Hassey. So Rex -- which already owns Tucson-licensed country KIIM-FM, country KOAZ (the former KCUB) and classic hits KHYT -- will fold in another dance CHR KSJM, Oro Valley and talk/sports KTUC, Tucson. Duncan's American Radio says they're not major billers at this point, but they do push Slone's local group past SFX for market leader in terms of revenue. Broker on the sale of KSJM/KTUC: Kalil & Company.

Goodbye, "Westinghouse" and hello "CBS Corporation" -- CBS celebrates the corporate name-changing event with a promotion at the doors of the New York Stock Exchange, as its new name becomes official on Monday, December 1. (It's also celebrating the re-taking of the "CBS" stock symbol, which Cort Business Systems dropped a couple of months ago.) CBS executive Mel Karmazin made a different kind of headline last week on the avidly-read "Page 6" of the New York Post. Seems Karmazin ordered CBS-owned WINS, WCBS-AM and WFAN to pull an advertising schedule they were running for Crain's New York Business. The star of the ad -- and that week's issue of Crain's -- was Karmazin himself, called "the most powerful and feared man in radio." The Post says Karmazin "ate" about \$22,000 in ad revenue from the cancellations.

Michael Medved has been a familiar fill-in voice for Rush Limbaugh -- now Salem Radio Network is giving him his own three-hour syndicated radio show, to air right after Limbaugh. Medved's new show launches next March in the 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. Eastern timeslot. Current Medved homebase KVI, Seattle will serve as flagship, which gives SRN President Greg Anderson a nice major-market base to build on.

Warning to stations like KGO, KYW and WGN -- Arbitron is admitting there's a problem with Maximiser 97, version 4.0, that affects three reports in the Programmers Package. The problem is: Those stations don't show. That's right -- a software glitch means that stations with just three call letters just don't exist on the screen. Arbitron is mailing letters to clients in 47 metros, and promises a fix in Version 4.1, early next year. It's also offering to run those sections itself, for subscribers who request it. The three problem sections: Average Age Trend; a monthly tracking utility; and Recycling By Daypart.

New Spanish network operator Radio Unica strikes an aggressive deal with longtime group owner Lotus Communications involving four of its properties: Radio Unica will LMA and provide programming for KVCA, Simi Valley (Los Angeles) and KZDC, San Antonio as of January 5, 1998. It has also signed affiliation agreements for some of its programming with Lotus-owned WTAQ, La Grange (Chicago) and KGST, Fresno. Radio Unica's satellite-delivered fare includes long-form talk, sports shows and news, with a national launch date of January 5.

The Americans are coming, the Americans are coming: Arbitron secures a solid beachhead in the U.K. and Europe with the acquisition of London-based Continental Research. That positions Arbitron to be a strong bidder for the British radio audience research contract to be awarded by RAJAR -- which stands for "Radio Joint Audience Research." Continental Research already relationships with Capital Radio, Classic FM, CNN International, Cable & Wireless, Royal Mail and Rupert Murdoch's BSKyB. Arbitron says Continental had revenues last year of about \$5 million; it didn't disclose the purchase price or terms.

Should classical music stations start playing the blues? Are things THAT bad for classical? The answer: It's not as bad as you think. True, last week Greater Media blasted away 37 years of classical music on WQRS, Detroit. And true, it did the same thing to WFLN, Philadelphia two months ago, leaving both markets with no full-time commercial classical outlet. And true, SW Networks has just notified its classical-format affiliates that it's dropping the service next February. But M Street digs a little deeper, and suggests that most of the SW stations may be able to find replacement programming if they choose to stay in the format. (The Chicago-based Beethoven network operation is one possible substitute.) M Street notes that the number of commercial classical stations has ranged between 52 and 39 in the last nine years, and now (with the disappearance of WQRS) stands at 43. On the non-commercial side, the number of stations using doing classical/fine arts has dropped from 306 to 117, as public radio stations have added more talk and information to the mix. It's possible that the hole for classical music in some markets may cause some public stations to re-consider the format.

More Christmas programming for country stations: Fruit of the Loom and Backstage Productions are offering their third annual one-hour special, called "The Fruit of the Loom Christmas Card '97." Backstage says all 2,500 country stations in the U.S. should have gotten the CD in November. The show's available via barter. If you need a copy, reach Backstage at (615) 726-2274.

Memo to "M Street Directory" subscribers: We know you're anxious to get the new edition in your hands...and it's COMING, we promise. We apologize for the wait, and we appreciate your patience. Why the delay? Basically, more than 90% of all U.S. stations have changed hands at least once since our last Directory. That means we've got to check office and mailing addresses, phone/fax numbers and key personnel for all those stations. That's more than 100,000 entries. M Street has always had a high reputation for accuracy, and we're striving to keep and improve that. So we promise: the new 8th Edition Directory IS on the way. (And note that we're already publishing the various charts of the yearly National Format Trends in this and other M Street Journals.)

On page twelve, the second of our series of five format statistic charts, which shows that the two leading categories of commercial stations -- Country and Adult Contemporary -- have both lost some momentum. It's the first time since the pre-Garth Brooks era of 1989 that Country has dropped below 2,500 stations, though the recent decline is solely an AM-band phenomenon. The dropoff in Adult Contemporary since 1991 is a different story: the decline has been both steady and startling (from 2,088 to 1,508). The most amazing growth category is the combined News, Talk, Business, Sports: It's shown a steady march from 1989 (308) stations to 1997 (1,331) -- more than quadrupling the number of stations doing some form of talk and information programming. Other strong growth categories: Religion (Teaching and Music), now featured on more than 1,000 stations. The combined Album, Modern and Classic Rock formats (more than doubling since 1989). Oldies (almost doubling). And Spanish and Ethnic, reflecting the country's changing demographics.

In the non-commercial universe, Religion (combining Teaching and Music) has doubled from 302 stations in 1989 to 628. "News, Talk, Business, Sports" exhibits a huge increase, based on more public radio stations expanding the hours of "Morning Edition", "All Things Considered" and the increased clearance of shows like "Car Talk" and "Whad'Ya Know?" That has often tipped the balance at block-formatted public stations away from a heavy reliance on Classical/Fine Arts, thus the dip in that column.
