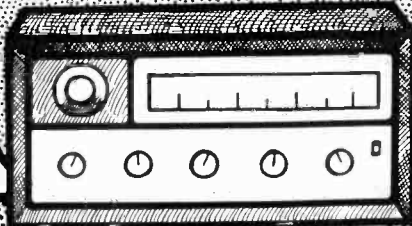

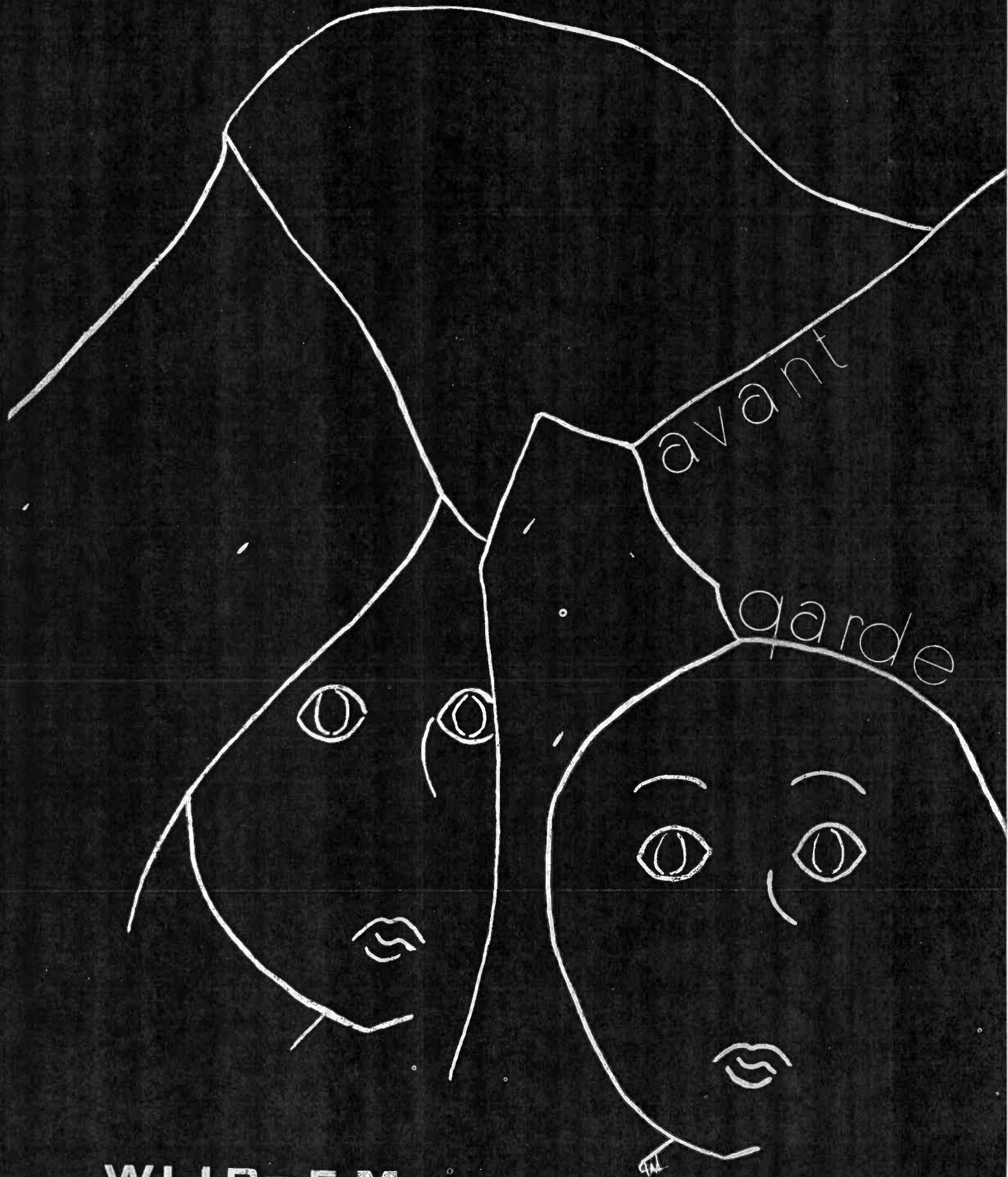

During this past year Tandberg has introduced three new tape recorders; the 1600X and just recently the 3000X. The 1600X was Tandberg's initial venture into the mass market with a quality, two-headed stereo deck priced at \$249.00. The design of the machine was based on European styling with typical European features. However, with the introduction of the three-headed 6000X and 3000X Tandberg will market tape decks that are specifically designed for the American Market. The 6000X is the flagship of the Tandberg line retailing at \$499.00. The newest deck, the 3000X, while engineered to the same high quality standards as the 6000X, has a few less features and sells for \$299.00. . . . **MIKE-MIXING** in any model is the latest innovation to be introduced by **KENWOOD** as a stereo luxury feature with the new KR-6160. It comes complete with its own dynamic microphone and sound level control whereby "live" performance can be mixed with phono, tape, or broadcast reception to achieve a "Sing-Along-With-Kenwood" new dimension of fun in creative stereo. For convenience, the mic plugs into the front panel. . . . The appointment of **ROCCO M. LAGINESTRA** as **PRESIDENT OF RCA** was announced by Julian Goodman, President of the National Broadcasting Company. "Mr. Laginestra has demonstrated outstanding executive and administrative ability in overseeing the expansion of RCA Records in domestic and foreign markets," Mr. Goodman said in announcing the appointment. . . . On October 16, 1970 six **PHILIPS** artists will be presented with six of the twenty-five **DUTCH EDISON AWARDS** for 1970, granted annually by the Dutch Commission for Collective Record Publicity for excellence in recording. The Award recipients are chosen from among entries made by record companies by an independent jury of record critics. . . . **DEUTSCHE GRAMMOPHON** celebrated the kick-off in a sales campaign for its seventy-five record, twelve-volume tribute to the **200th BIRTHDAY ANNIVERSARY OF LUDWIG VON BEETHOVEN**. For what the Wall Street Journal calls "The grandest offering of all," **DEUTSCHE GRAMMOPHON** has collated the works of Beethoven, both major and most of the less familiar, and combined them into "the most comprehensive collection ever assembled." The performances are by DG's roster of internationally famous artists, including Herbert von Karajan and the Berlin Philharmonic (Whose recording of the nine symphonies was awarded the coveted *Grand Prix du Disque*), Karl Bohm, Karl Fichter, Wilhelm Kempff, Geza Anda, Christoph Eschenbach, Yehudi Menuhin, David Oistrakh, Christian Ferras, Henry Szeryng, and Pierre Fournier. Vocalists included are

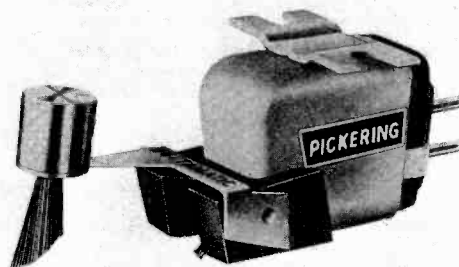
Janowitz, Jones, Mathis, Ludwig, King, Wunderlich, Berry and Fischer-Dieskau. Ensembles participating are Amadeus Quartet, Dresden State Opera, Trio Italiano d'Archi, Vienna Choral Society and the Munich Bach Choir and Orchestra. . . . **CBS-FM FLAGSHIP WCBS-FM** is due to begin editorializing in mid-October, with station manager Herbert McCord as editorial voice. The editorials will concentrate on local issues, though dealing occasionally with national and international affairs. The WCBS-FM editorials will be researched, written and delivered separately from WCBS-AM. Thus, just as WCBS-AM has at times differed editorially with WCBS-TV, it will now be possible for WCBS-FM's position to disagree with that of WCBS-AM. . . . The **WOMEN'S LIBERATION MOVEMENT** is now also in the disk groove. **DECCA** is rushing into release this week two songs "I Am A Woman" and "Liberation Now" which it hopes will become the anthem of the distaffers. The disk incidentally, was produced by two males, Tom Morgan, Decca's artist & repertoire chief, and Joe Rene. "**I AM A WOMAN**" is narrated by Sandy Duncan. "**LIBERATION NOW**" was coauthored by female militant Betty Friedan, Jackie Reinbach and Rene. . . . **KAREN AUSTIN** has been named to the newly created post of manager of pop publicity for **POLYDOR RECORDS**. She will be assisted by Sandra Trim. . . . On September 17, **THE SONY CORP.** became the first Japanese company with a listing on the N.Y. Stock Exchange, with trading in 40,380,000 American Depository Shares. Each ADS represents two shares of common, par value 50 yen each. Tokyo-based firm is a top manufacturer of electronic equipment including audio and videotape recorders, transistor radios, teletext and calculators. . . . **JAY BERNSTEIN** selected for exclusive representation of the A & M film, "**JOE COCKER/MAD DOGS AND ENGLISHMEN**", in all fields of publicity and information. . . . **GUITARIST ELLIOTT RANDALL** made his Polydor recording debut with an LP entitled "**RANDALL'S ISLAND**" early in September. The album features all original material by Randall with lyrics by Paul Fleisher. The album was co-produced by Randall and Edwin H. Kramer, and was recorded at **JIMI HENDRIX'S** new million dollar Electric Lady Studios in New York's Greenwich Village. It is one of the first LP's to be completed at the elaborate new recording complex. . . . Spearheaded by **VETERAN MUSICIAN CHARLIE MARIANO**, the inventive seven piece rock group, **CALLED OSMOSIS**, exploded onto the National scene with its debut RCA album "Osmosis" (LSP 4369). With a combination of Mariano's maturity and musical development and the talents of the extraordinary young writer and lead vocalist, **BOBBY KNOX**, Osmosis produces a musical sound it calls "heavenly improvised dramatic rock" to give

voice to Knox's feelings about life and death and war and peace, particularly in the young singer's personally heartfelt "of war and peace". . . . **FREDA PAYNE** is a lady of luxurious elegance, a beautiful woman, a true soul sister. She is also one of the finest jazz singers to come around in a long time, with a natural, earthy style and a delivery that is nothing short of dynamic. On or off the stage, she has complete command of her audience. She's got presence. A total entertainer. . . . **POINT OF INFORMATION:** Did you know that the "Don't Walk" light at the corner of 44th and Fifth Avenue blinks 13 times—this according to **MARLYS SHERMAN OF MARCH ADVERTISING**. . . . Music for the new **SIDNEY POITIER** picture, "Call Me Mr. Tibbs," was composed and conducted by **QUINCY JONES**. Jones' album "Walking in Space" is on the nation's bestseller list. . . . **FM STEREO ANTENNA PATENTED** a compact new indoor antenna, designed to provide

frequency modulation stereo reception in situations—such as apartment houses—where outdoor antennas cannot be used, has been granted Patent No. 3,523,251. **WILLIAM S. HALSTEAD**, vice president for engineering for RTV International, a consulting firm, invented the antenna, which is a spirally wound metallic ribbon in a plastic tube one foot long and one inch in diameter. A transistor amplifier is included. Mr. Halstead, who was active in the development of multiplex broadcasting two decades ago, said that the new antenna can be placed to eliminate "multipath" distortion affecting FM stereo reception in large buildings. The antenna also achieves good results in automobiles and aircraft. One form of the antenna, for use by background music broadcasters, already is being manufactured by McMartin Industries, of Omaha. Mr. Halstead is considering licensing production for the home market.
