They are identified as 0-Original; A-Adaptations; AU- Author Unknown; (R)-Repeat. The (R) may be omitted if the entire group in the series consisted of re-runs or repeats.

Shows which terminated before December 31, 1958 carry a Last Show date. Local showings are listed on the basis of first run. The only re-runs recorded are network shows.

Properties by free-lance writers on TV shows with the same running character leads or regular supporting roles are listed together in a separate section beginning on P. 13.

Staff-Written programs are listed in the section beginning on P. 20. One shot programs of various kinds are listed on P. 18.
